

## **VDOT/VIMS** Partnership

"This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) provides for coordination among the Virginia Institute of Marine Science (VIMS), the Chief Resilience Officer of the Commonwealth of Virginia (CRO) and the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) in developing a proactive strategy for understanding and addressing sea level rise, land subsidence and recurrent flooding impacts on existing and planned road infrastructure as well as how that infrastructure will impact natural ecosystems in Virginia's coastal zone as the climate changes."







## **Study Goals**

- 1) Assess climate vulnerability and adaptation of transportation infrastructure
- 2) Assess ecosystem use conflicts of transportation infrastructure under rising sea levels
- 3) Assess current policy and regulatory requirements potentially affecting VDOT

- MOU between VDOT and Secretary of Natural Resources: signed June 2019
- Official start date: October 2019
- Anticipated completion date: September 2024
- Timeframe covered: 2020 2080
- Study Area: Virginia's Coastal Zone (Tidewater Virginia)
  - 46 localities: 29 counties and 17 cities
- Sea Level Rise Curve: NOAA 2017 Intermediate High






# Task 1. Determine Transportation Infrastructure Vulnerability

- Examine all roads with respect to FEMA Flood Hazard Zones
- Analyze road elevations and Return Flood Frequency (RFF) relative to the best available tide gauge data for the area
- Perform Road Network Analysis (RNA) to evaluate vulnerability of major VDOT infrastructure
- Determine most useful method of making data available both for VDOT and those outside of VDOT








Average Annual Flooding: 2050




Average Annual Flooding: 2000-2017




Average Annual Flooding: 2050





Average Annual Flooding: 2100





# ROAD NETWORK ANALYSIS: Inaccessible roads








Task 2. Study Ecosystem Impacts of Transportation

Infrastructure

- Forecasting habitat distribution shifts for target species
- Assess the potential conflicts for existing and planned local land use changes and transportation infrastructure





#### Task 3. Policy and Regulatory Requirements




- Determine how resiliency related policy and regulatory requirements have been handled by other states
  - Example: Chapter 51 of 2021 Acts of Assembly requirement to include resiliency in design standards; no formal definition
- Analyzing legal framework informing duties to maintain and authority to abandon


#### Motivation







## Transforming Rail in Virginia Program



### Roanoke / Lynchburg Route Background



- Amtrak Regional daily service began in October 2009 with one round trip between Lynchburg and Boston annual ridership forecast of 33,100
- Service more than tripled the ridership forecast in the first full year
- Service expanded to Roanoke in November 2017
- Route carried over 220,000 passengers in 2019



- One of the most profitable routes in the country prior to the COVID-19 pandemic
- Based on the route's proven success, the Commonwealth and Norfolk Southern (NS) have negotiated an agreement to further expand service to Roanoke and New River Valley

# Virginia and NS Main Business Terms

#### **Increase and Expand Service**

- Add a second Amtrak round trip between Roanoke and Boston (2022)
- Expand both Amtrak round trips to the New River Valley upon the completion of capital improvements in ~5 years
- Allow for a third round-trip between Roanoke and the New River Valley
- Allow for excursion service between Roanoke and the New River Valley
- Allow potential for a future Bedford Station
- Introduces scaled performancebased payments to NS based on customer OTP





# Virginia and NS Main Legal Terms – NS Key Duties over V-Line

- NS performs maintenance between closing and introduction of passenger service
  - Thereafter, VPRA may contract with NS (or others)
- Dispatching Performed by NS unless balance of corridor sold or removed from service
- PTC services coincident with NS dispatching; compensation in addition to fee
- NS compensation to VPRA for Use of V-Line
  - Guaranteed minimum annual payments for five years; actual usage after





# Virginia and NS Main Legal Terms – Environmental Liability

- Pre-Close Due Diligence
  - Phase I, Phase II, NS contractual duty to disclose any reportable releases
- Pre-Existing Conditions Discovered after Close
  - NS and VPRA share remediation costs 50/50
  - NS share capped at \$3.5M
  - Cost sharing commitment for 5 years
- Releases by NS after Close
  - NS duty to remediate at its initial costs





## Acquisition and Infrastructure Costs



- \$206.2M to NS for acquisition and capital grants along the NS corridor from Manassas to the New River Valley:
  - \$38.2M for acquisition of the V-Line from Salem to New River Valley
  - \$36.5M for improvements to facilitate the passenger trains moving through the Roanoke Yard
  - \$131.5M Western Virginia Rail Initiative Fund: includes \$50M for Nokesville to Calverton double track; equal payments over 10 years for capital improvements and program maintenance on western Virginia lines
- ~\$51M estimated for a New River Valley passenger station and service facility (subject to change based on location)


## Intercity Passenger Rail Service Improvements

- Additional round-trip between Roanoke and NEC in 2022
- Amtrak extension from Roanoke to the New River Valley on V-Line
- Two round trips between the New River Valley and NEC in 2026
- 80,000 net new riders along the whole corridor estimated in first year after extension





Ongoing: New River Valley Passenger Station Feasibility



- Timeline: Fall 2021-Winter 2022
- Scope:
  - Station Study Area considers five potential station locations that were previously studied in the region
  - Four station locations were identified as feasible
    - Underway: Each concept is being evaluated through an environmental & feasibility screening
    - Public Outreach
      - Survey 1: 12/22/2021-1/31/2022
      - Property Owner Mailing & Key Regional Stakeholder Outreach: 12/29/2021
      - Public Meeting: February 2022
      - Survey 2: February 2022
- Next Step: FRA NEPA Class of Action Determination
- Future agreement with NRV Passenger Rail Station Authority on funding contribution for station

## Ongoing: Due Diligence Toward Financial Close

There are various obligations by both parties, known as Conditions Precedent, that must be completed before Financial Close, including:


- Title Work for the V-Line
- Phase 2 Environmental Site Assessment
- Funding for grants to Norfolk Southern appropriated and included in VPRA Budget
- Approval of governmental entities, such as clearance of the rail acquisition by the Surface Transportation Board as a "State of Maine" transaction











- "Soft launch" will illuminate signs, but speeds will not change
- Will start mid-week
- Algorithm will be activated the following week




# Public communications plan: Key messages Prepare to adjust your

- Prepare to adjust your speed when there's a need
- New variable speed limit signs are posted on I-95 northbound between Exit 110 (Ladysmith) and Exit 130 (Fredericksburg).
- When traffic and weather conditions call for reduced speed, or there is a crash or work zone ahead, these electronic signs will display reduced speed limits to gradually slow vehicles down
- Slowing traffic down before an incident, or congestion, helps everyone keep moving and arrive safely (rice jar)
- Seeks to avoid sudden halts and stop-and-go bottlenecks that I-95 travelers encounter approaching Fredericksburg area
- Speed limits are <u>always</u> enforceable, whether they are posted on an electronic or static sign
- Virginia State Police will use mobile technology to monitor variable speed limits, and enforce them as needed
- The system has been intensively tested since late fall using current traffic data, including Thanksgiving week, to demonstrate ability to predict and react to emerging conditions on the road
- A soft launch will let motorists adjust to the presence of the electronic signs for several days, with consistent posted limits, before activation of variable speeds
- Action step: Visit improve95.org/vsl

## Plan for Building on the I-95 VSL Deployment

#### Near Term

- Leverage the large volume of corridor individual vehicle data using AI and machine learning techniques to:
  - Better understand impact of weather, incidents, and work zones on roadway capacity and flow
  - Develop predictive methods to better identify precursors to crashes and congestion so interventions could be applied before conditions worsen
  - Refine methods to evaluate future VSL deployments

#### Longer Term

- Explore opportunities to use connected and automated vehicles (CAVs) to provide infrastructure light speed harmonization
  - Reduce infrastructure by using CAVs as sensors and distributing messages in-vehicle
  - Provide speed guidance to automated vehicles so speeds are controlled to maximize system effectiveness by increasing compliance with speed limits



### **SHSP Update**

  - » Statewide, multimodal highway safety plan
  - » Coordinated framework that identifies Emphasis Area factors to focus resources
  - » Required to be updated every five years
  - » Federal and state partner's with regional, local and private stakeholder's input.







# **Background on JLARC Review**

- In 2020 the Joint Legislative Audit and Review Commission directed staff to review—
  - Infrastructure condition
  - Funding sources
  - Challenges facing transportation system
  - Trends affecting transportation
  - State's preparedness to adapt to changes in transportation needs

# **Background on JLARC Review**

# JLARC undertook a multi-pronged approach to the review, including—

- Interviews and surveys
  - State, regional, and local transportation organizations; CTB members; subject-matter experts
- Data analysis
  - Distribution of funds; historical and projected transportation revenues; conditions of road and transit infrastructure
- Document review
  - Tax structure in Virginia and other states; Virginia laws and transportation plans, policies and procedures

# **Key Findings of JLARC Review**

- Recent legislative changes increased revenues to address near- and long-term funding concerns
- State infrastructure condition has been improving, but bridges are aging and locally maintained roads need further improvement
- Transportation needs are identified through a data driven process that engages key stakeholders, but a few regional corridors in rural areas may be not be adequately included

# **Key Findings of JLARC Review**

- SMART SCALE, Virginia's main program for funding system improvements, is appropriately based on objective benefit and cost data
- Longer wait period for revenue sharing program, due to COVID response, will no longer be necessary if revenue forecast improves as expected
- Virginia transit assets are generally in serviceable condition, but systems face potential capital and operating funding shortfalls

# **Transportation Revenue**

- Fuel tax changes likely to offset any revenue lost from declining fuel consumption over next decade
- Highway use fee and mileage-based user fee supplement revenues in the near term and, over the long term, could potentially offset declining fuel tax revenues
  - Highway use fee generated \$43M in FY21 but could generate up to \$700M by 2040
- General Assembly may want to consider—
  - Adding privacy provisions related to the mileage-based user fee
  - Establish a 'regional' highway use fee for the regional fuel taxes
  - Applying the highway use fee to (i) electric vehicles over 10,000 lbs and (ii) fuel efficient vehicles between 10,000 and 26,000 lbs

# Road Condition and Maintenance Funding

- Virginia ranks 13<sup>th</sup> among states for pavement condition and 17<sup>th</sup> for bridge condition
- VDOT maintenance funding appears sufficient to improve condition and meet performance targets
- Local road and bridges are not in as good condition as the VDOT system
- General Assembly may want to consider—
  - Modify the State of Good Repair program to implement the investment strategy identified by VDOT in the comprehensive review
  - Change how maintenance program funds are distributed to cities and towns by eliminating current city street maintenance payment formula and directing CTB to develop a new one based on different drivers of maintenance costs like use, age, etc

# **Planning for Improvements**

- State effectively evaluates long-term trends and prepares as needed to adapt for the future
- Virginia's process to identify needs is well designed but could be extended in rural areas
  - There may be some congestion and reliability needs not capture on certain corridors in rural areas
- State has been studying many needs and is revising study selection process to target highest priorities
- State monitors system performance to support planning and investment decisions

# **Improvement Funding**

- SMART SCALE is an objective and apolitical process, and funding outcomes generally appear fair
  - Funding outcomes generally appear equitable across regions and project types, despite local concerns
  - Board should change policy to require locals to prioritize applications
  - Board may want to consider a pilot to also consider a monetized costbenefit analysis for larger projects
- Revenue Sharing changes in response to pandemic appear to have been reasonable and necessary but some changes could be reversed
  - General Assembly should consider accelerating funds to FY23-FY24 if revenue forecast increases in December

# **Transit Condition and Funding**

- State transit agency assets generally reported to be in better condition than U.S. transit assets
- State capital assistance may not be enough to meet needs
  - Federal infrastructure bill may address these needs
  - CTB should direct \$39.8M from FY21 CTF surplus to transit capital
- Transit agencies have sufficient operating funds in the near-term but their long-term sustainability is uncertain
  - Lost fare revenues could lead to service reductions when federal relief funds are used if ridership has not recovered
  - DRPT should monitor ridership recovery and consider options for changing MERIT operating funding formula

# **Moving Forward**

- Secretary has directed VDOT to undertake a holistic review of State of Good Repair and maintenance program to evaluate mechanisms to allow for the bridge investment strategy to be implemented
- Secretary has directed VDOT to review local maintenance program
  - First, work with localities that maintain their own roads to evaluate roadway conditions and establish a baseline condition assessment of all roads
  - Second, evaluate formula used to distribute city street payments and determine if modifications are appropriate

# **Moving Forward**

- Secretary has directed DRPT to conduct the 3-year review of the MERIT operating assistance program, as required by the Code to evaluate whether any modifications are necessary due to pandemic related changes and to promote access to low-income areas
- Secretary has directed DRPT to review the MERIT capital assistance program to determine whether any modifications are necessary to help fund minor enhancements


# **Understanding – Multi-use Trails Workgroup**

- > The working group shall evaluate and recommend -
  - (i) a prioritization process for the identification of new multi-use trail opportunities
  - (ii) master planning process, and
  - (iii) funding needs assessment
- → OIPI to report on the recommendations of the workgroup to the Chairs of House Appropriations and Senate Finance
- OIPI also engaged
  - Consultant team, led by Cambridge Systematics
  - Stakeholders (including national, statewide, regional, and local)
  - Peer states



# **Background – Multi-Use Trails Definition**

- The workgroup defined multi-use trails as:
  - » Serving non-motorized users
    - Primarily people on foot, bicycle, wheelchair, or horseback
  - » Falling predominately in their own rights-of-way
    - Utility corridor or former rail line
    - Located within road ROW, alongside or on the roadway (separated from vehicle traffic)
  - » Meeting VDOT design standards for accessibility and "shared use paths"
    - Includes hard surface, stone, asphalt or concrete
    - Minimum width for safe two-way operation

# **Background – Multiple Agencies Manage Trails**

## No single agency oversees or manages trails

#### **VDOT**

- Manages over 450 miles of shared-use paths, mostly along VDOT roads
- Administers construction of paved paths meeting design standards
- Focuses on pedestrian and bicycle transportation infrastructure
- Bike/Pedestrian Program and bicycle facility inventory

#### **DCR**

- Manages trails within state parks
- Administers trails conforming to Architectural Barriers Act (ABA)
   Outdoor Developed Area Guidelines
- Focuses on recreational trails with ecological, scenic and historic value

# Regional organizations and local governments

- Examples include the Capital Trails Coalition and Roanoke Valley Greenway Commission
- Facilitate planning and coordinate with localities and nonprofits to implement and maintain



Facilitates coordination with railroads and other stakeholders for Rails to Trail projects



# **Background – Assessment Findings**

# Lack of single agency oversight

» Missing a single vision and structure of a comprehensive plan

## No sustained trail funding

- » Full potential constrained by resource limitations, agency roles and responsibilities
- » Missed partnership opportunities with localities, federal partners and private entities

# Longer regional trails are challenging to fund

» Existing programs support shorter trail segments

# Incomplete data

» No single map or database identifying and tracking the complete trail network that includes both recreation and transportation



# Recommendations – Three primary implementation actions

Establish a State Trails Office or staff the Office of Outdoor Recreation

Recommend ramping-up to 5 FTEs during FY 2023


Develop a State Trails Plan

Initiate plan in 2022, led by the State Trails Office in coordination with VDOT, DCR, and the State Trails Advisory Committee

Implement the State Trails Program

Commit an additional \$20 million annually to implement three grant programs managed by the State Trails Office

All funding recommendations are in addition to existing resources committed to VDOT and DCR and programmed capital investments through existing transportation and recreation funding sources.





# Recommendation – Establish State Trails Office

The State Trails Office develops the State Trails Plan, coordinates a State Trails Program, and works with trail partners and stakeholders to strategically support the development of trails throughout the Commonwealth.

- Establishes strategic direction
- Institutes implementation policy
- Leverages VDOT and DCR resources
- Coordinates investment and project priorities
- Markets multi-use trails and works with partners
- Reports on progress

Next Step: Set aside funding to staff and provide resources to the State Trails Office as soon as possible

**Resources: 5 FTEs starting in FY 2023**

# Recommendation – Develop State Trails Plan

The most critical step in identifying and prioritizing a multi-use trail network in Virginia is to establish a comprehensive, interagency, State Trails Plan.

- Unified vision and goals
- Defines multi-use trail system
- Clarifies responsibilities
- Initiates a trails master planning process
- Establishes standards and data
- Prioritize needs and investments
- Engages stakeholders and public
- Creates a state trails database

Next Step: Set aside funding to develop the inaugural State Trails Plan starting in CY 2022

Resources: Additional \$2 million to support plan development, marketing, and outreach by the State Trails Office in 2022 – 2023



# Recommendation – Implement a State Trails Program

Funding recommendations operationalize a State Trails Program to enhance planning practice, develop consistent standards and leverage resources to advance projects at different stages of development and delivery.

- Organizes the funding approach
- Maximizes potential of new funding sources
- Leverages existing sources
- Develops and implements grant strategy
- Distributes new state funding

Next Step: Assign new funding in FY 2023 to establish grant programs and technical assistance opportunities

Resources: Additional \$20 million annually to implement three grant programs: planning, construction, maintenance



# Recommendation – Other Considerations



- New initiatives and funding represent a surge in federal, state, and local funding opportunities and partnerships
  - Sovernor's introduced budget earmarks \$207M for Fall Line Trails, Shenandoah Valley and Eastern Shore Rail Trails
  - » Transportation Alternatives funding increase recommend CTB to retain additional \$55M for regional trails for discreet investments plus \$10 million from 2021 Transportation Initiative
- Reinforce the importance of report recommendations and urgency to implement
  - to position to compete for discretionary grants, build new partnerships, and market the economic and public health value of trails



## **Economic Development Access Policy Discussion**

Proposed Policy: Maximum allocation to a locality within any one fiscal year would be \$850,000 with \$700,000 unmatched and \$150,000 matched dollar for dollar.

 How will increase of proposed maximum impact those non-distressed localities which might request the maximum?

Proposed Policy: Reduced the Capital Investment Requirement from 5X to 4X/3X for distressed and double-distressed localities.

How will proposed reduction of Capital Investments Requirements impact distressed localities?

Proposed Policy: Provide Credit for Capital Investments for "retained" employees (\$1,000 per employee) for existing expanding facilities.

How is retained employees determined/Need for Policy?



## How will increasing the max. allocation affect project in Non-Distressed localities?

- The proposed policy is to increase the maximum allocation available from \$650,000 to \$850,000.
- Since 2017, there have been five EDA (regular) Projects completed in Non-Distressed localities.
  - Four of these projects submitted sufficient capital investment documentation that would have exceeded the capital investment requirement for the newly proposed maximum allocation of \$850,000
  - One of these projects submitted capital investment documentation until the minimum capital investment requirement was met



# What impact would the new Capital Investment Requirement have on Distressed localities that have paid back funds to VDOT?

- The proposed Policy is to base the amount of capital investment documentation needed from a locality on the locality's level of distress
- Over the last 15 years, Six localities have paid back funds to VDOT for EDA projects in which the locality did not have sufficient capital investment documentation
  - Of these six localities, only two localities had EDA projects where capital investment documentation was submitted for approval
  - Under the proposed new EDA Policy, the capital investment documentation submitted by these localities would have been sufficient to meet the EDA Program requirements



## Provide Capital Investment Credit for Jobs Created & Retained

- The proposed Policy is to provide a capital investment credit for each new full time job created and each full time job retained
  - Modeled on Illinois/Ohio Programs
  - If a business is relocating or expanding within the State, all jobs not considered "new jobs" would be considered "retained jobs"
- There have been two EDA Projects where a business has expanded within the State since 2017
- Due to Lack of need, recommend removing proposal and continue evaluation for potential future inclusion

- 10. Environmental mitigation focused on wildlife protection or habitat connectivity







Applicant has not historically demonstrated the ability to meet 4-year CN deadline.

<u>Title: Policy for Selection of Transportation Alternatives Projects and Process for Transportation Enhancement/Transportation Alternatives Program De-allocation, Project Transfer, and Inactive Projects</u>

WHEREAS, the federal Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Act (MAP-21) provides for a statewide Transportation Alternatives Program, using federal transportation funds and state or local matching funds; and

WHEREAS, from federal funds appropriated to the Transportation Alternatives (TA) program the Commonwealth Transportation Board (Board) shall approve the selection of projects on an annual basis and in accordance with §33.1-12(5) of the *Code of Virginia* and MAP-21; and

WHEREAS, the Board has expressed a desire to establish a selection policy in order to conform with MAP-21 required policies and to ensure timely allocation of Transportation Alternatives funds; and

WHEREAS, after reviewing the proposed policy changes, the Board believes the policy for selection of Transportation Alternatives project should be adopted as set forth below; and

WHEREAS, in association with the changes under MAP-21 relating to funding for the projects eligible under the Transportation Alternatives Program, it is necessary to adopt a replacement for the current "Enhancement Program De-allocation, Project Transfer and Inactive

Resolution of the Board Policy for Selection of TA Projects July 17, 2013 Page Two

Project Process" in order to ensure that funding for Transportation Alternatives Projects is utilized within certain timeframes.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Commonwealth Transportation Board hereby rescinds its previous Interim Policy for Selection of Transportation Alternatives Projects adopted on October 17, 2012 and adopts the following policy and criteria governing the selection of Transportation Alternatives Program projects:

- 1. As required by MAP-21 the MPOs representing urbanized areas with populations greater than 200,000 (the Transportation Management Areas) will select Transportation Alternatives projects in their areas up to the amount of funding provided them in MAP-21.
- 2. The Secretary and CTB At-Large members will select Transportation Alternatives projects with the funds made available for population areas less than 200,000, up to the amount provided in MAP-21 for that requirement.
- 3. Statewide Transportation Alternative funds (remaining 50% of allocation and available for use anywhere in the state) will be apportioned equally among the District CTB members up to total amount of \$9M. The District members will select eligible Transportation Alternatives projects with these funds.
- 4. If the statewide funds mentioned in item 3 above exceed \$9M, the Secretary and CTB At-Large members will collectively select projects that address statewide funding gaps or needs up to the amount of the additional funding.
- 5. All projects selected must be under construction within four (4) years of the project's first allocations availability, unless that time is extended for a documented reason.
- 6. All projects selected by the Board shall receive not less than 50% of the amount of Transportation Alternative program funds requested in the application. In addition, all projects selected by the Board will be fully funded to the requested Transportation Alternatives Program amount, if that amount is \$200,000 or less and such amount is all that is required to complete the project.
- 7. Once various project selections have been made in accordance with the foregoing process, the project list will be presented to the full Board for its consideration and approval.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Board approves the Transportation Enhancement/Transportation Alternatives Program De-allocation, Project Transfer, and Inactive Project Process dated June 26, 2013 and attached hereto to guide the Department's efforts in ensuring that funds for Transportation Alternatives Projects are utilized within the established timeframes and hereby rescinds the Enhancement Program De-allocation, Project Transfer and Inactive Project Process previously approved by the Board on December 8, 2010.

### Transportation Enhancement/Transportation Alternatives Program De-allocation, Project Transfer, and Inactive Project Process

#### **De-allocation Process**

#### Identification of Projects Subject to De-allocation:

- Project is subject to de-allocation if not under construction within 4 years from the date federal funding is available for the project's first allocation. Funding availability is defined as the beginning date of federal fiscal year.
- Project is subject to de-allocation if the initial project agreement is not executed within 12 months of presentation to the project sponsor.
- Project is subject to de-allocation if no funds are reimbursed within 24 months of initial funding availability or if the project fails to progress through project development

#### **Process for De-allocation:**

- Local Assistance Division (LAD) Program Staff will request by letter, the status along with an action plan for completion (to include a timetable for project development) for any projects subject to de-allocation. The letter will request a response within 45 days.
- Projects acknowledged by the project sponsor as complete or needing to be cancelled will be closed and any remaining allocations transferred to the District Balance Entry account for re-allocation.
- Project sponsors that do not respond to the 45 day letter will receive a follow-up letter stating that the project has been closed-out and any remaining allocation balance will be transferred to the District balance entry account and made available to the District CTB member for re-allocation to active projects.
- Projects that provide a request for an extension of time and timetable for project development will be reviewed by LAD Program staff. If the proposed timetable for project development is acceptable, a new deadline will be established. If unacceptable, the project will be discussed with the District CTB member to determine if de-allocation is necessary.
- The District CTB members will be advised when de-allocated funds become available and those de-allocated amounts will be re-allocated within the same district to existing active projects or placed in the District balance entry account.
- Pre MAP-21 de-allocated funds can be re-allocated to old Transportation Enhancement projects that are not currently eligible under MAP-21.

#### **Project Transfers**

Project sponsors may request that allocated funding be transferred to another existing project within the same locality or administered by the same project sponsor. Such transfer requests must be made in writing. These transfers will be made in coordination with the District CTB representative.

In order to advance project development and/or project completion, project sponsors, VDOT staff or CTB members may request that funding be transferred to a project in another locality

#### **ATTACHMENT 3**

within the same district. These transfers will be made in coordination with the appropriate District CTB member.

#### **Process for transfer:**

- LAD Program Staff reviews project allocations, expenditures, and pending VDOT charges to determine amount available for transfer (in coordination with Programming Division)
- The District CTB member is consulted for concurrence with the request.
- If the District CTB member concurs, the project funding is transferred.
- A letter is sent to the project sponsor indicating whether the funding transfer has been approved or denied. Project agreements are modified as necessary and transmitted with the approval letter.

Additionally, as projects are completed and a final voucher is processed through FHWA, any remaining funds will be transferred to the District Balance Entry account for re-allocation by the District CTB member.

#### **Inactive Project Review**

- LAD Program Staff will initiate a final voucher for all completed or cancelled projects
- The District Project Coordinator will review all projects on a quarterly basis to determine if regular billing is taking place. The District Project Coordinator will contact the project sponsor to request prompt billing if no billing has taken place over the past 12 months (1st contact can be informal letter/email, 2nd contact to be formal letter).
- LAD Program Staff will emphasize the importance of timely billing in program workshops, project meetings, and other program guidance.
- Projects that remain inactive will be subject to de-allocation.

### What is Safe Routes to School?

A generation ago, 90% of students living within a mile of school walked or biked to get to class. Today the percentage is much smaller -- just over 10% of students walk and bike to school.

Walking and biking to school benefits both the students and the community in several ways. Students who walk and bike get more physical activity, have more time to socialize with their friends, and develop a sense of independence and self-reliance. Some studies have shown a correlation between increased physical activity before school and improved academic performance.\*

The community benefits from reduced pollution and traffic congestion. Safe Routes to School strategies also address both traffic safety and personal security.

Many Virginians want to get back to their roots and foster communities that are walkable and bikable. The Safe Routes to School Program is a part of this effort. 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### **Transportation Alternatives Program Fact Sheet & Timetable for FY23/24 Allocations**

### **Summary of Applications**

- ➤ 179 Pre-Applications were submitted in July 2021, resulting in 15 screen-out decisions and 45 conditional screen-in decisions.
- ➤ 133 Full Applications were submitted in October 2021, resulting in 5 additional screen-out decisions due to project ineligibility, and 2 applicant withdrawn applications.
- > 126 Full Applications met eligibility requirements and were scored for funding consideration.
- ➤ The attached scorecards reflect the average score for each application, as well as how the project compared to the average score within each respective VDOT District and the statewide average score. The maximum score is 300 and projects were scored based on criteria outlined with the VDOT Transportation Alternatives Program Guidelines. The average score for this round of applications is 154.
- At least three (3) staff members from VDOT that are familiar with the Transportation Alternatives Program and locally administered projects reviewed and scored each application.
- A Priority status score of 1-6 is also provided for existing projects that gives an indication of the progress made on the project. A rating of one (1) indicates a project that has completed project development activities and is ready for construction, or very close. A rating of six (6) indicates a project that has just begun the project development process for that phase.
- Five (5) applications were received for the Safe Routes to Schools Non-Infrastructure Program administered by VDOT's Transportation Mobility Planning Division (TMPD), and are noted on the associated scorecards.
- ➤ The total amount requested is approximately \$119.5M with an average request of approximately \$950,000.
- ➢ By federal statute of the funding available for allocation over the 2-year cycle, 50% must be distributed by population and 50% can be used statewide. Board policy provides \$2M to each of the nine (9) District CTB members (\$1M for each federal year), the five (5) At-large CTB members/Secretary select projects using the population based funding, and the high population MPO/TMA's select projects within their respective eligible areas of the Commonwealth. Of the anticipated ∼\$44M in allocations, the current tentative distribution is as follows: MPO/TMA Areas = ~\$13.3M; District Members = \$18M (\$2M per District); At-Large Members/Secretary = ~\$12.7M. All funding amounts may change based on budget updates.


Reliability is measured by variability in travel time along a corridor and the data shows the travel time variability is low.

- With the updated revenue assumptions for the current year, this transfer will reverse direction.
   HMOF will provide \$57.5 million to the Construction Fund, representing revenue in excess of budgetary allocations needed.
- With current assumptions, the budgeted transfer will revert back to Construction Fund to HMOF in FY 2023. (Current estimate of \$49.9 million)

- ☐ The Six-Year Financial Plan (SYFP) identifies the planned funding for allocation to Highways, Rail, Transit, Ports, Aviation, DMV, and Space Flight
- ☐ The Recommended Fiscal Years 2023 2028 SYFP allocates \$51.9 billion
- ☐ Includes the use of bond proceeds totaling \$1.7 billion, representing GARVEE Bonds, Route 58 Corridor Bonds and I-81 Debt Assumptions.
- □ Transfers \$5.3 billion to the three regions for transportation improvements and \$818 million in dedicated revenue for WMATA Capital Fund
- ☐ Includes \$489 million of dedicated fuel tax revenue for the I-81 Corridor Improvements
- Dedicates \$14.9 billion for Maintenance and Operations
- ☐ Provides \$17.1 billion for Construction (Funds for new programs currently assumed in Construction for planning purposes)
  - Approximately \$3.2 billion of Construction Funding represents Local and Regional Funding for Projects

#### Major Program Changes from previous assumptions

- Revenue Sharing Recommendations assumed adopted by General Assembly. Upcoming allocations from years 3 and 4 of SYIP, FY 2025 and 2026.
- New federal programs continue with modest growth after IIJA period
- Construction Formula Distribution Fully implemented to codified distribution
  - State of Good Repair (30%)
  - High Priority Projects SMART SCALE (20%)
  - Construction District Grant Program SMART SCALE (20%)
  - Interstate Operations and Enhancement Program (20%)
  - Virginia Highway Safety Improvement Program (10%)



#### Major Program Changes from previous assumptions

- Base rate of growth for VDOT's Highway Maintenance and Operations Program is also used for Payments to Localities
  - CPI from FY 2022 to FY 2023 is 4.2%. Remaining years average 2.1%
- The Innovation and Technology Transportation Fund (ITTF) funding from the High Priority Projects Program is \$25 million annually, the maximum allowed under § 33.2-1531 of the Code of Virginia.
- Unpaved Roads funding is \$25 million annually from the District Grant Program, the maximum allowed under § 33.2-359 of the Code of Virginia



#### **GARVEE Program Update**

- GARVEE bonds are allocated to SMART SCALE projects
- GARVEEs are sold for specific projects and the debt service is attributed to specific projects. Updates to these assumptions are carefully coordinated with FHWA.
- In most cases, GARVEE allocations on a project are in addition to other types of funds, federal and state funding.
  - Demands to obligate and spend federal and state funding have factored into decisions on advancing bond sales.



#### **GARVEE Program Analysis**

- Though VDOT has allocated GARVEEs annually, the project activity has not necessitated annual sales of GARVEE bonds.
  - The project schedules and the need to obligate other federal funds on projects has not required an absolute annual sale schedule.
  - Our last sale was in September 2020 and, tentatively, our next sale may push into calendar year 2023.
- GARVEE bonds are currently allocated over the period
- VDOT will provide additional analysis on the using bond proceeds in comparison to additional revenue sources anticipated



#### **Next Steps**

- Continued monitoring of federal guidance provided for IIJA Implementation, including opportunities for grant funding
- Items to be considered for future update to assumptions before adoption of FY 2023-2028 SYFP and SYIP
  - Inflationary impact on project estimates, immediate and future awards
  - Continued use of GARVEE Bonds in SYIP time period
  - Derive cost estimates for implementation of VTrans Strategic Actions and identify appropriate funding sources
  - Impact of 2022 General Assembly Session budgetary actions will need to be incorporated, if approved
    - Proposed employee raises
      - 5% effective 6/10/2022 (FY 2023)
      - 5% effective 6/10/2023 (FY 2024)
    - Estimates to conduct evaluation of condition of city streets
    - Proposed investments in trails and other initiatives

#### **Revenue Sharing Program**

- Accelerates funding for previously selected projects to FY22-FY24 instead of FY25 and FY26
  - \$30M in FY22 for projects that can spend funds immediately
  - \$170M in FY23-24
- Shifts future Revenue Sharing Program awards to years 3 and 4 of the Six-Year Improvement Program
  - Projects under consideration this cycle will be awarded funding in FY25 and FY26 if General Assembly adopts recommendations

#### FY21 General Fund Surplus - \$115.8M

- \$30M for improvements at the Spaceport to support new and existing customers
- \$25.8M for 3 trail initiatives
- \$20M for Air Terminal Interchange in Norfolk
- \$20M for the 64 GAP with priority for improvements that address the full 29-mile corridor
- \$10M for the Transportation Partnership Opportunity Fund to support VEDP's economic development efforts
- \$10M for address loss of wildlife habitat in Hampton Roads

#### **Trail Initiative**

- Provides \$233M to fully fund 3 regional multi-use trails
  - Eastern Shore Rail-to-Trail
  - Fall Line Trail
  - Shenandoah Rail-to-Trail
- Existing regional multi-use trails have demonstrated meaningful economic benefits
- This allocation is supported by study completed by OIPI at the direction of the General Assembly

#### **New Federal Programs**

- Board is required to develop a plan for allocation of additional federal bridge funds
  - Develop investment strategy based on previously adopted by Board strategy in 2019
  - Local bridges must be eligible for funding
- Board is required to develop a plan for allocation of electric vehicle charging infrastructure
  - Must consider designated EV charging corridors and consider opportunities to partner with the private sector

#### **City Street Maintenance Payments**

- JLARC found that city street conditions are worse than VDOT's and recommended evaluation of the program
- VDOT is directed to review the following—
  - Condition of city streets
  - Formula used to distribute funds
  - Opportunities for efficiency through partnerships with VDOT
  - Recommendations, if any, to formula to distribute city street payments
