**Title: Recreational Access (De-allocation) – Fauquier County, Project 0866-030-335, N501
Central Fauquier Sports Complex**

WHEREAS, § 33.1-223 of the Code of Virginia sets forth that the General Assembly of Virginia has found and declared that it is "...in the public interest that access roads and bikeways for public recreational areas and historical sites be provided..." and sets aside highway funds for such purpose, and further provides that "The Commonwealth Transportation Board, with the concurrence of the Director of the Department of Conservation and Recreation, is hereby authorized to make regulations to carry out the provisions of this section."; and

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board, at its October 16, 2002 meeting, allocated \$320,450 from the Recreational Access Fund to provide access to the Central Fauquier Sports Complex, Project 0866-030-335, N501, off Route 643, subject to certain contingencies; and

WHEREAS, Fauquier County has advised the Department of Transportation that budgetary constraints have delayed the development of the Central Fauquier Sports Complex and the Recreational Access Fund allocation will not be utilized, and

WHEREAS, it is deemed that the administration of the Recreational Access Program can best be served by the return of this allocation to the Recreational Access Fund.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the aforementioned action of the Commonwealth Transportation Board on October 16, 2002 is hereby rescinded.
