- (C) Mr. Myers stated he would be absent from the next two CTB meetings and therefore wished to comment on a number of issues: (1) Requested clarification from the CTB subcommittee studying the design project and consultant contract recommendations, as presented by staff at the July workshop; (2) urged the Board to approve, as soon as possible, the location, from Route 460 south to Route 29 south, for the Madison Heights Bypass; and (3) regarding a break-in-access issue in Rappahannock County, he is working with staff and a local attorney for a solution.
- (D) Ms. Lionberger expressed concern over the number of projects that appear to be unduly effected by outside influences, which abrogate the public need. Mr. White concurred.
