MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE STATE
HIGHWAY COMMISSION OF VIRGINIA,
RICHMOND, VA. JANUARY 5, 1928.

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On the morning of January 5th, the State Highway Commission, consisting of Messrs. H. G. Shirley, Commissioner, Wade H. Massey, Secretary, Hugh B. Sprout, L. Walker Traxton and H. C. Gilmer, met at their office, State Office Building, Richmond, Virginia. The meeting was called to order by the Commissioner.

A Committee representing the contractors of the State, consisting of Messrs. H. P. Baker, C. S. Luck, G. P. Clay, C. W. Beckler, M. A. Gonda and G. T. Franklin, came before the Commission in regards to certain conditions affecting the contractors of the State.

Mr. Baker presented the following:

First - Bonds. They requested that the Bonding Companies be required to establish a rate for highway contract bonds in keeping with the losses in the state, which were very small, and not use the profit made here to liquidate losses in other states. This rate to be based on the losses to the bonding companies in the State for the past five years. If this could not be done they recommended that the Commission request the Legislature to pass an act authorising the Commission to bond contractors on State highway work and to create a reserve fund to liquidate any loss and when this fund increased to reduce the rate on bond, the state to stipulate the amount of bond required, not to exceed 30% of the total amount of the contract, or to accept collateral, liens, etc. in lieu of bond.

Second - Convict Force. They requested that the State, where convicts are to be used, bid on the work just the same as the contractors and

the work be let to the low bidder and final cost of work determined.

Third - Removal of Stumps. That in securing right of way there be inserted a provision in deed or agreement with the property owner, to set aside a certain plot or area on which stumps could be left. At present the contractor is required to burn the stumps which is quite difficult, or if the Commission desires the stumps burned that the contractor be allowed the timber which is cut from the stump for that purpose.

The Commission advised the Committee that they would be very glad to give serious consideration to their requests.

A Committee from West Point appeared, headed by Mr. W. C. Gouldman, and requested the Commission that in taking over the Gresham Bridge to secure an option on the Bruce Bridge over the Pamunkey River so that the Commission could take over the Bruce Bridge before the expiration of the five year period by paying for the bridge as provided in Chapter 2, Acts of 1927, plus the loss on operation, if any, from the opening of the bridge. They further stated that they had had a conference with the Bridge Company the day before and that this provision would be satisfactory to the company.

The Commission advised them that if there was no objection the Commission would be glad to write such a provision into the contract.

The minutes of the meetings of the Commission held October 27th in Richmond, November 12th Farmville, November 23rd Norfolk, and December 7th, 8th, and 9th, at Pulaski, Charlottesville, and Petersburg, respectively, were read and it was moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. Truxton, that they be approved. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that the request of the E. T. Gresham Company, Norfolk, Virginia, for an extension of time on Project 312D, Route 39, Bridge over South Anna River, be denied as per recommenda-

tion of Chief Engineer Mallon. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. Sprout, that the Commissioner be authorized to purchase a new car for the Commission and also to construct two buildings, one at Staunton, the other at Lynchburg, for district offices, at an approximate cost of \$4,000.00 each, charging same against the State Highway Commission fund. Motion carried.

Haag of Huntington Station, New York, for a new casing and inner tube for automobile due to steel plate placed over hole left after core had been removed, cutting and ruining his tire, as it was purely an accident over which the Commission had no control. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Macie, that the Commission reject the claim of Captain Edwin H. Johnson, amounting to \$56.15, on account of running into a snow plow on Route 31, as the Commission has no right under the law to make settlement for such claims. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that the Commission

recd the resolution passed November 1st, awarding the contract for the construction of Project 393A, Route 14, Covington-Crown, to the low bidder, Central Construction Company, as this Company was unable to give bond, and confirm the action of the Commissioner in awarding this contract to the second low bidder, Hall and Mitchell at their bid of \$30,680.00, setting aside 10% additional to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, \$800.00 for detours and \$4,422.68 for guard rail, making a total of approximately \$40,000.00 chargeable to this Project, the Central Construction Company forfeiting check of \$1,000.00. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sprout, that the Commission sublet 1.5 miles of grading on Route 14, Project 465, Allegheny County Line - East, to Marye and Blackship at their unit prices bid on their contract from Station 501+00 to Station 570+38, so that the grading can be completed by spring and be ready for surfacing. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the Commissioner be authorized to proceed with the work on Route 101, from Lynnhaven to Ocean View with the understanding that \$2,000.00, or as much as necessary, will be guaranteed for right of way through the Brissell property and as stated in a telegram received from Dr. Southgate Leigh, J. W. Hough and A. Brooke Taylor. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sprout, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that the State Highway Commission acknowledge with thanks the resolution passed by the Democrats of Appomattox County passed in a mass meeting November 6th, 1927, expressing their confidence in the Commission. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sprout, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the Commissioner investigate the location of Route 14 south of Lynchburg, and report back to the Commission which line in his judgment is most feasible. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the State Highway Commission recommend to the Governor that Route 14 be changed from its present location to run as follows - Starting at Glasgow running along the east side of North River to Buena Vista and thence to Lexington, with a connection from Glasgow to Natural Bridge. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sproul, that the Commissioner be authorized to write into the agreement taking over the Graham Bridge that the Commission will have a right to take over the Bruce Bridge previous to the five year period under similar terms plus the loss in operation up until that date, if any. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that the Commissioner be authorized to enter into an agreement taking over the Point of Rocks Bridge on Route 32. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the request of Mr. John E. Buck to be allowed to reproduce the map of the State Highway Commission be granted provided there is no advertisement whatever on same and that the proof be submitted to the Commissioner for approval before being published. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Massie, that a survey be made of the Lee Boulevard as far as Fairfax Court House from the end of the present road. Motion carried.

Move Right Street No. 10-2

Moved by Mr. Maggie, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that the Commissioner be authorized to condition the ditches and shoulders where the Board of Supervisors of Arlington County were granted permits to lay water and sewer mains, charging the cost of same against the check for \$3,000.00 deposited by the County as a guarantee for such purpose. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Truxton, that the irregularity of not reading the bid of the Power Oil Company be waived and that the bids for gasoline be awarded as follows -

To the Sinclair Oil Company, Richmond, Virginia, on approximately 338,000 gallons at 17 $\frac{1}{2}$ ¢ per gallon, Bristol, Salem, Staunton, Culpeper, Richmond, Fredericksburg and Suffolk Districts, and to the Power Oil Company, Lynchburg, Virginia, on approximately 75,000 gallons at 17-1/8¢ per gallon in the Lynchburg District;

Also that the bids on Grade "A" Lubricating Oils be awarded as follows -

Car load lots to the Power Oil Company, Lynchburg, Virginia, for all Districts and on less than car load lots to the Harwood Brothers, Richmond, Virginia, in the Richmond, and Fredericksburg Districts. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that the remaining allocation on Project 421, Route 21, Shenandoah River - New Market, of \$12,000.00 be transferred to Route 332 to complete the work in Rockingham County between Route 33 and Broadway. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Truxton, that the allocation of funds be amended and confirmed as follows: -
