

Minutes of the Meeting of the State Highway  
Commission of Virginia, Held in  
Richmond, January 31, 1933.

On the morning of January 31, 1933, the State Highway Commission, consisting of Messrs. H. G. Shirley, Wade H. Masie, Secretary, L. Wilkes Truxton, L. G. Gilmer and Mr. H. Hart, met in its office in the State Office Building, Richmond, Virginia.

The meeting was called to order by the Commissioner.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. Hart, that the minutes of the meeting of December 3rd be approved. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. Hart, that the minutes of the meeting of December 17, 18, 19 and 21, be approved. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that the contract for the construction of two one story brick veneer office buildings, one at Culpeper and one at Fredericksburg, be awarded to the combined low bidder, Culpeper Planting Mills, Culpeper, Va., at the combined bid of \$11,224.00, plus 10% for incidentals, making a total of approximately \$12,346.00 chargeable to this work. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. Masie, that the Commission confirm the award of contract for the construction of Project 20454, Route 18, Bridge over Malatto Creek, to the low bidder, Alley Construction Co., Bristol, Va., at their bid of \$7,760.00, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, making a total of approximately \$8,536.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. Hart, that the Commission confirm the award of contract for the construction of Project 5710A1, Route 19, Intersection Three Chept Road-.17 Mile N. Fussel's Creek, to the low bidder, Hallie L. Year, Durban, N.C., 6,028 miles of gravel road, at his bid of \$16,848.55, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work; \$4,485.00 for guard rail; \$1,520.00 for gravel piles; \$5,324.50 for surface treatment and \$1,168.25 for outside slopes, making a total of approximately \$26,900.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that the Commission confirm the award of contract for the construction of Project 5180A1, Route 12, 0.268 Mi. E. N.C. Franklin-N.C. Franklin, to the low bidder, Fredericksburg Bridge Company, Fredericksburg, Va., at their bid of \$15,179.76, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work and \$305.00 for guard rail, making a total of approximately \$15,900.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Masie, seconded by Mr. East, that the Commission confirm the award of contract for the construction of Project 57190B2, Route 19, 0.17 Mile N. Tuckahoe Creek-0.398 Mi. W. Masiekin, for gravel and soil, to the second low bidder, Elyths Brothers Company, Charlotte, N.C., at their bid of \$50,447.00, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work; \$3,544.00 for guard rail; \$15,634.00 for gravel pits; \$7,994.00 for surface treatment and \$2,829.00 for outside slope stakes, making a total of approximately \$70,000.00 chargeable to this project. The bid of the low bidder being based on labor at 15½¢ per hour, which is lower than has been paid on any work and the second low bidder being only \$151.00 above the low bidder, agrees to pay 20¢ an hour, thereby bringing to labor between two and three thousand dollars more in wages, at a very small cost to the state. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. East, seconded by Mr. Masie, that the Commission reject all bids on Project 57009B6, Route 597, Bridge over Bent Creek, as the location of the structure was changed to cut down the cost and it is not now desired to undertake this construction. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Frereton, that the Commission confirm the award of contract for the construction of Project P5550B1, Route 18, 0.51 Mile N. Pedlar River-Buckridge County Line, to the low bidder, Jones Cain and Co., Elkins, West Virginia, at their bid of \$94,265.00, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, and \$3,418.00 for outside slope stakes, making a total of approximately \$108,000.00 chargeable to this work. The contract to be submitted to the U. S. Forestry Department for approval. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Masie, that the Commission confirm the award of contract for the construction of Project 57404B1, Route 515, Page County Line-Milton, to the low bidder, E. G. Lassiter & Co., Norfolk, Va., at their bid of \$21,447.00, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work; \$1,045.15 for guard rail; \$6,355.00 for surface treatment; \$12,666.00 for gravel pits and \$730.00 for outside slope stakes, making a total of approximately \$40,000.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Masie, seconded by Mr. East, that the Commission confirm the award of contract for the construction of Project 57424B1, Route 720, Intersection Route 31-Mount Vernon, to the low bidder, Starkevether Contracting Company, Great, Va., at their bid of \$25,972.04, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work; \$1,402.00 for gravel pits; \$704.00 for guard rail; \$6,065.00 for surface treatment and \$5,000.00 for outside slope stakes, making a total of approximately \$39,000.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that the Chairman be directed to notify the Union Securities & Realty Corporation, Richmond, Virginia, that the State Highway Commission proposes to purchase the Bruce Bridge over the Pocahontas River at West Point as of March 1, 1935. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that the fine paid by A. J. Peake, patrolman, of \$2.75, be refunded, as his arrest and fine was a mistake on the part of the state police as he was not required to have a drivers license. Motion carried.

Mr. Willie Schmidt, Mr. Stanley Clarke and Mr. Davis, appeared before the Commission in regard to a proposed change in the location of Route 18, Three-Cheat Road-West. Mr. Lancaster also appeared before the Commission relative to the same route, asking that the survey as laid out be adhered to and the change asked for by Messrs. Schmidt, Clarke and Davis be not made.

A public hearing was held on the location of Route 39 from Pendleton to Negro Foot, in Hanover and Louisa Counties. Mr. Roswell Page, Senator Mathews, and a large delegation requested that the road be so located as to pass through Montpelier and along the present road as now laid out, cutting off the sharpest curves. Mr. J. E. Pinder, representing the Richmond Chamber of Commerce made the same request. There were also present Mr. Gray, Mr. Gee, Mr. Blake, Mr. C. H. Ford, of Gilmer Church and many others, making similar requests.

Mr. W. C. Bibb, Mr. Dan Porter, Mr. Perkins and others were present and requested that the line be run as straight as possible between the points mentioned, and be located as a main trunk highway.

Moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. Massie, that permits #10500 and #10502, Roanoke County, issued to Mr. S. G. Vest, be cancelled as the property involved is being condemned for right of way purposes. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Hart, that the request for an extension of time by the Pendleton Construction Co., Wytheville, Va., on Project 55951, Route 37, N.C. Winchester-5.6 Miles W. Berryville, be denied, as per recommendation of the Chief Engineer. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that the request for an extension of time by J. J. Battershill and Son, on Project 571A, Route 18, N.C. Emporia-Wrenswick County Line, be denied as per recommendation of the Chief Engineer. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the request of Boatwright, Russell and Linton, Monongahela, Va., for an extension of time on Project 45541, Route 37, 2 Miles E. Fredericksburg-Fredericksburg, be granted to date of completion and the penalty of \$100.00 returned to them, as per recommendation of the Chief Engineer. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. East, that the request of the Rich-Brocksmith Construction Company, for an additional allowance of approximately \$2000.00 on Project #2004, Routes 204 and 205, W.L. Brewster - 0.08 Miles W. of W.L. Brewster, be rejected and the case be allowed to take its course through the courts. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that the claim of Mr. V. B. Throder, R.J.D. 1, Amherst, Va., for the death of cow caused by eating dried wild cherry leaves cut down by survey party, be settled. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the request of Captain Ashbury, brought to the attention of the Commission by Mr. East, for a rehashing on the location of Route 35 at Fancey Hill, could not be granted. The Commission being advised by their attorney that under a resolution of the Commission the road had been located and could not be changed. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. East, that the State Highway Commission notify the Conservation and Development Commission that they will be very glad to paint and maintain their historical markers at actual cost. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the State Highway Commission agree to settle the bill in behalf of Mr. E. H. Hollaway, for loss by fire on Route 19 in Suffolk District, for \$450.00 in full settlement, and such recommendation be made to the Legislature. Motion carried.

A public hearing was given all those interested in the location of Route 18, through Pekin County, following line "A". Mr. M. F. Bedford, Commonwealth's Attorney, presented a resolution from the Board of Supervisors requesting that the road go through Pekin Court House. Mr. J. B. Pickett, Mr. Jas. A. Tillman, Jr., and others were present and made the same request.

Mr. A. W. Winfrey approved of line "B" now being run. Also present were Mr. T. G. Timberlake, Mr. A.H. Godwin and many others in the interest of line "B".

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the Chairman be directed to put a bill into the Legislature changing the designation of Route 48 to Chilpeper-South towards Orange County Line, instead of from Route 39 near Winfrey towards Orange County Line. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the request for an extension of time by Brooks Construction Co., on Projects #2004-00007, Routes 19 and 207, W.L. Portsmouth-Bowers Mills, be granted for 40 days, returning \$400.00 liquidated damages; as per recommendation of the Chief Engineer. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. East, seconded by Mr. Truxton, that the request for an extension of time by Meadowview Construction Co., on Project P641HI, Route 59, 5.35 Miles E. EGL Waynesboro-1.77 Miles N. Christians Creek, be granted to date of completion, as recommended by the Chief Engineer. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. East, that the request of the Pocahontas Construction Co., for additional extension of time on Project 2670A, Route 600, 2.434 Miles N. EGL Covington-Covington, be not granted, as recommended by the Chief Engineer. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the original line on Route 18, Patterson Avenue-West, be adhered to as the final location of this highway. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that whereas the State Highway Commissioner has certified under Chapter 213, Acts of 1936, that for public safety and convenience, it is necessary to close the grade crossings on State highway route 10, between Moocasin Gap and Hilton Station by the relocation of the highway, the following notice be given.

Application having been made under Chapter 213, Acts of the General Assembly of 1936, to close the following grade crossings on State Highway Route 10, across the Southern Railway Company's tracks, between Moocasin Gap and Hilton Station, by the relocation of the state highway to the south side of the Southern Railway Company's tracks:

Crossing No. 1 just east of railroad mile post 41, to be closed, except for farm use.

Crossing No. 2 west of railroad mile post 41, to be closed, except as farm or private crossing.

Crossing No. 3 west of railroad mile post 42, to be closed, except as a farm crossing.
