MINUTES OF MEETING OF THE COMMONNEALTH TRANSPORTATION BOARD

Richmond, Virginia

January 15, 1987

The first meeting of the body known as the Commonwealth Transportation Board was held in the Central Office in Richmond, Virginia, on January 15, 1987, at 10:00 a.m. The chairman, Mr. Ray D. Pethtel, presided.

Present: Messrs. Pethtel, Bacon, Beyer, Davidson, Guiffre, Howlette, Humphreys, Kelly, Leafe, Malbon, Musselwhite, Quicke and Smalley and Mrs. Kincheloe and Dr. Thomas.

The chairman introduced the new Board members appointed January 1, 1987; Messrs. Donald S. Beyer, Jr. and Joseph A. Leafe, urban at-large representatives and Dr. Daphyne Saunders Thomas, rural at-large representative.

During the public comment portion of the meeting, State Senator Baniel W. Bird. Jr. addressed the Board regarding the US 460 Sypass at Bluefield, Virginia, and requested the Board's consideration of an on/off ramp on the Sypass at the Bluefield Industrial Park.

On motion of Mr. Bacon, seconded by Mr. Malbon, permits issued and canceled from December 18, 1986 to January 14, 1987, inclusive, as shown by the records of the Department, were approved.

Moved by Mr. Davidson, seconded by Mr. Musselwhite, that the Board approve additions and abandonments to the Secondary System from November 20, 1986, to December 24, 1986, inclusive, as shown by the records of the Department.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Musselwhite, seconded by Mrs. Kinchelde, that

WHEREAS, Route 86 in Pittsylvania County has been altered and reconstructed due to construction of Route 265 as shown on plans for Project 6265-071-101, P-402; and

WHEREAS, three sections of the old road are no longer necessary as a public road, the new road serving the same citizens as the old and the three sections of old road are no longer necessary for purposes of the State Primary System;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33.1-144 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, 0.24 mile of the old location of Route 86, shown in yellow and designated as Sections 1A, 2 and 3 on the plat and project referred to hereinabove, be discontinued as a part of the State Primary System.

Moved by Mr. Musselwhite, seconded by Mrs. Kincheloe, that

WHEREAS, by proper resolutions, the Board of Supervisors of Lancaster, Patrick and Pittsylvania Counties have requested that certain roads which no longer serve as a public necessity be discontinued as parts of the Secondary System of Highways;

MOM, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33.1-150 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, the following roads be discontinued as parts of the Secondary System of Highways, effective this date:

WKEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Prince George County adopted a resolution and presented same to the Department of Transportation endorsing the establishment of a continuous State Primary Route numbering, between U. S. Route 460 in Petersburg and State Route 249 at Talleysville; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Charles City County adopted a resolution requesting the transfer of Secondary Route 605 and a section of Secondary Route 609, between the New Kent County Line and State Route 156 near the Benjamin Harrison Memorial Bridge, to the Primary System of Highways; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of New Kent County also adopted a resolution and presented same to the Department of Transportation requesting the transfer of sections of Secondary Route 609, between State Route 249 at Talleysville and the Charles City County Line, to the Primary System of Highways; and

WHEREAS, based on these requests, the department's engineers have determined that the Primary route designation extension and the transfer of Secondary routes to the Primary System is justified;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Commonwealth Transportation Board does hereby declare the Primary Route designation for state Route 106 be extended as described; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Commonwealth Transportation Board, in accordance with authority entrusted under Section 33.1-34 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended, does hereby declare that Secondary Route 609 Secondary Route 605 and sections of Route 609 as herein described be transferred to the Primary System of Highways; and

BE IT ALSO FURTHER RESOLVED, that this route, as described herein, shall be designated as State Route 106.

Moved by Mr. Musselwhite, seconded by Mrs. Kincheloe, that

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board is authorized under Section 33.1-41.1 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, to make payments to cities and certain towns for street maintenance purposes; and

WHEREAS, certain Principal-Minor Arterial Roads or Collector-Local Streets within the corporate limits of the Town of Chase City are eligible for such payments; and

WHEREAS, under authority of said Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the Town of Chase City for maintenance payments on additional Local Streets meeting the required criteria;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that quarterly payments be made to the Town of Chase City for additional Local Streets totaling 0.07 centerline mile and meeting the required criteria under the aforementioned section of the Code effective July 1, 1987. The additional Local Streets are described on the attached tabulation sheets numbered 1 dated December 11, 1986.

The Local Streets addition totaling 0.07 centerline mile increases the total mileage to 16.76 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments.

WHEREAS, by resolution dated May 17, 1984, this Board (formerly Commission) designated a list of qualifying highways for the operation of the larger trucks under the STAA of 1982; and

WHEREAS, this same resolution provided that from time to time as appropriate and with due notice, this Board may modify any of the stated provisions and may, as well, add or delete designated and qualifying highways.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the following route is designated as a Qualifying Highway for operation of Targer trucks under the STAA:

Moved by Dr. Howlette, seconded by Mrs.Kincheloe, that

WHEREAS, in response to a formal request by the Chesterfield County Board of Supervisors that Route 1624 between Route 145 and Route 1625 be considered for restriction of through truck traffic pursuant to the provisions of Section 46.1-171.2 of the Code of Virginia, this matter has been carefully reviewed; and,

WHEREAS, the routes in question traverse a predominately residential neighborhood; and,

WHEREAS, Route 1624 incorporates poor alignment and marrow pavement; and

WHEREAS, a restriction of the proposed route would not present any undue hardship; and

WHEREAS, proper notice was given by publishing a notice to receive written comments for the proposed restriction; and,

WHEREAS, careful consideration has been given to the recommendations received, the available alternate route and the past practices of the Department.

MON, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Route 1624 between Route 145 and Route 1625 be restricted to through truck traffic in accordance with Section 46.1-171.2 of the Code of Virginia.

Motion carried, Mr. Guiffre voting no.

Moved by Mr. Humphreys, seconded by Mr. Quicke, that

WHEREAS, Section 131(f) of the Federal Highway Beautification Act of 1965 provides for the erection of official highway signs within Interstate rights-of-way furnishing specific information for the traveling public; and

WHEREAS, the Virginia Department of Transportation has had a program to provide travel services signing on various Interstate highways since 1972; and

WHEREAS, prior to July 16, 1981, the cost of providing background signs and structures for displaying individual business signs was provided by Federal and State funds; and

WHEREAS, on July 16, 1981, a policy was implemented by the Department which required that a business desiring to participate in the program must pay all costs of any new or modified background signs which may be necessary after the original installation of such signs; and

WHEREAS, the Department has become concerned with the substantial funding currently borne by some participating businesses and desires to have a more equitable distribution of program costs; and

WHEREAS, it is reasonable to require each participating business to provide an appropriate share of the cost of both administration and maintenance of the signing program;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Commonwealth Transportation Board proposes to amend the policy for participation in travel services signing program to include the following:

1. Each participating business shall pay an annual fee of \$300 per direction of travel on the Interstate route per 12-month period of participation.

- 2. Any currently participating business which, since July 16, 1981, was required to pay any costs associated with the background panel(s) to which its logo(s) is affixed shall have those costs refunded, less the cost of installing the business logos. In this manner, all businesses desiring to participate would start out on an equal basis.
- 3. When a business must be deleted from the program because it exceeds the maximum number allowed to participate by virtue of the subsequent qualification of a similar type business closer to the point of measurement at the Interstate interchange, it shall only be deleted at the end of the 12-month period for which its fees have been paid.
- 4. If any participating business at any time fails to meet the minimum criteria by which it qualified for participating in the logo program, or fails to pay all fees as directed, the Department will remove the business signs therefrom, and the business will not receive a refund of any fees rendered.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a public hearing shall be held to receive input on this proposed policy for consideration by the Board prior to final action on the proposal.

WHEREAS, in accordance with Department Policy, a firm proposal has been received from the consulting firm of Parsons, Brinckerhoff, Quade and Douglas, Inc. for the preparation of plans for the retrofit of the Midtown Tunnel between Portsmouth and Norfolk identified as:

Project 0247-9072 Route 58 under the Elizabeth River

WHEREAS, we do not have the technical expertise or the organization in the Structure and Bridge Division necessary to prepare these plans without seriously jeopardizing other schedule work; and

WHEREAS, compensation for the agreed upon services is on the basis of cost plus a net fee; and

WHEREAS, careful consideration has been made of the required services and just compensation for same as established and set forth in the Memorandum of Agreement;

NHEREAS, Section 33.1-223 of the Code of Virginia sets forth that the General Assembly of Virginia has found and declared that it is "... in the public interest that access roads to public recreational areas and historical sites be provided by using highways funds"; provides \$1,500,000 from highway funds for such purpose; and further provides that "The Commonwealth Transportation Board and the Director of the Department of Conservation and Historic Resources are hereby authorized to make regulations to carry out the provisions of this section."; and

- Roanoke County submitting documentary evidence indicating that the eligible construction costs for the access road constructed, in accordance with approved plans and estimate, exceeds \$281,056. However, in no case will reimbursement from the Recreational Access fund exceed \$240,528.

WHEREAS, the Director of the Department of Conservation and Historic Resources and the Commonwealth Transportation Board have adopted a joint policy to govern the use of recreational access funds pursuant to Section 33.1-223 of the Code of Virginia; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Tazewell County and the Bluefield Town Council have by resolutions requested the use of recreational access funds to construct the access road to the Graham Recreational Park in Tazewell County, and the said access is estimated to cost \$292.950; and

WHEREAS, this request has been considered by the Director of the Department of Conservation and Historic Resources and has been found to comply fully with the provisions of Section 33.1-223; and

MHEREAS, the Director of the Department of Conservation and Historic Resources has recommended the construction of the aforementioned access.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that \$246,475 from the Recreational Access Fund be allocated to provide an access road within the Graham Recreational Park for the Bluefield Town Council and said park being located in Tazewell County, Project 1530-092-329, M501, contingent upon:

- all necessary right of way and utility adjustments being provided at no cost to the Commonwealth; and
- all project cost exceeding \$200,000 being halved between the Bluefield Town Council and the Recreational Access Fund. However, in no instance will the matched amount exceed \$100,000.

AND FURTHER, this access road will be designated as a "Virginia Byway".

Motion was made by Mr. Smalley, seconded by Mr. Humphreys that recreational access funds for Project 2114, 061-260, N-501, City of Suffolk, Western Branch Boat Ramp, Western Branch Lake, be denied. Substitute motion was made by Mr. Malbon, seconded by Mr. Bacon that action on the request be deferred.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Musselwhite, seconded by Mr. Bacon, that

WHEREAS, Section 33.1-221 of the Code of Virginia provides a fund to "... be expended by the Board for constructing, reconstructing, maintaining or improving access roads within counties, cities and towns to industrial sites on which manufacturing, processing or other establishments will be built under firm contract or are already constructed and to publicly owned airports;"; and

WHEREAS, the Henry County Board of Supervisors has, by resolution, requested airport access funds to serve the Blue Ridge Airport via Routes 695 and 698 located in Henry County, and said access is estimated to cost \$180,000; and

NHEREAS, it appears that this request falls within the intent of Section 33.1-221 and has complied with the provisions of the Commonwealth Transportation Board's policy on the use of airport access funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE 1T RESOLVED, that \$120,000 of the Airport Access Fund be allocated to provide a 22-foot bituminous concrete surface to the expanding Blue Ridge Airport by the improvement of Route 695 between Route 58 and Route 695 and Route 698 from Route 695 to the airport entrance in Henry County, Project 0695-044-275, C501, contingent upon:

- all necessary right of way and utility adjustments being provided at no cost to the Airport Access Fund; and
- all project construction cost in excess of \$120,000 being borne by the Secondary Road Improvement funds of Henry County.

Moved by Mr. Guiffre, seconded by Mr. Kelly, that

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board has on its own motion expressed its desire to name the bridge over the James River, on U.S. Route 17-258, between the City of Newport News and Isle of Wight County; and

WHEREAS, this bridge is known as the James River Bridge; and

WHEREAS, this bridge was never officially designated as the James River Bridge by the Department;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOVEED, that the Commonwealth Transportation Board, in accordance with the authority entrusted under Section 33.1-12 of the Code of Virginia, does hereby declare that the bridge over the James River, on U.S. Route 17-258, be named the James River Bridge; and


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that appropriate markers, as directed by the Department's Engineers, shall be placed calling attention to this designation.

The allocation of \$50,000 to be taken from the Route 28, Fairfax. project (Project 0028-053-102, PE101, RW201, C501, B601).

Submitted herewith is the Revised Fiscal Year 1986-87 Budget for the Department of Transportation which was approved on January 15, 1987. This is the first budget for the renamed Department of Transportation and incorporates the legislation and Increased revenue from the 1986 Special Session of the General Assembly.

The significant change to the budget is the allocation of \$204,591,400 in additional revenue. The revised budget provides funds to implement the new Transportation Trust Fund, and also includes an additional allocation for Mass Transit from the Mass Transit Fund as well as new allocations to the other modes of transportation, which are the Aviation Fund and Ports Fund. The mast notable revision is the increase of \$159.4 million in the Primary, Secondary and Urban Systems construction allocations.

I will be glad to answer any questions you may have concerning the revised budget.







NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board authorize the Commonwealth Transportation Commissioner to negotiate with the firm of Public Financial Management, Inc. to serve in the capacity of financial advisor to the Commonwealth Transportation Board and to execute such contract with the firm on behalf of this Board.
