WHEREAS, based on a request from the Brunswick County Board of Supervisors, the Commonwealth Transportation Board allotted \$125,000 in Industrial Access Railroad Track funds in September 1998, to the Brunswick County Industrial Development Authority to serve Extraction Technologies, LLC;

WHEREAS, the Brunswick County Board of Supervisors has, by resolution, shown support for request of an additional \$426,940 in Industrial Access Railroad Track funds for Extraction Technologies of Virginia, LLC; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 464, Item 523.A.1., of the 1998 Acts of the General Assembly, funding is provided for Industrial, Airport, and Rail Access projects; and

WHEREAS, it appears that this request falls within the intent of Section 33.1-221.1:1 and is in accordance with the provisions of the Commonwealth Transportation Board's policy on the use of Industrial Access Railroad Track funds; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the funding formula established by said policy, funding may be allocated to this project; and

WHEREAS, the Hanover County Board of Supervisors has conducted a public hearing on this restriction; and

WHEREAS, the route in question traverses a predominantly non-commercial area; and

WHEREAS, a restriction on the proposed route would not present any undue hardship; and

WHEREAS, proper notice was given by posting signs and publishing notices advising the public of the proposed restrictions and requesting written comments; and

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board is authorized under Section 33.1-12 (4) of the Code of Virginia, as amended, to give suitable names to State Highways, except such roads as have been or may hereafter be named by the General Assembly; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Chesterfield County and Henrico County did each adopt a resolution in which the Commonwealth Transportation Board was petitioned and requested to designate Route 895, beginning at Interstate Route 95 in Chesterfield County to Interstate Route 295 in Henrico County, in honor of Pocahontas; and

WHEREAS, Pocahontas, daughter of Chief Powhatan, played an integral role in the development and continuity of the early English settlement in Virginia; and

WHEREAS, Pocahontas lived in the Citie of Henricus, formerly in Henrico County and with her husband, John Rolfe, within the area now known as Varina in Henrico County; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Commonwealth Transportation Board to honor this Native American daughter.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Commonwealth Transportation Board concurs with the Boards of Supervisors and does hereby name Route 895 in Chesterfield County and Henrico County, as previously described herein, as the "Pocahontas Parkway"; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that appropriate markers, as directed by the Department's engineers, be placed calling attention to this designation.

WHEREAS, the governing body of Campbell County elected to participate in this program for Fiscal Year 1991-92 and, with the Department, identified a specific eligible item of work to be financed from the special fund account; and

WHEREAS, the governing body of Campbell County has, by appropriate resolution, requested these funds be reallocated to another specific eligible item of work, as indicated herein; and

WHEREAS, the governing body of Hanover County elected to participate in this program for Piscal Year 1996-97 and, with the Department, identified specific eligible items of work to be financed from the special fund account; and

WHEREAS, the governing body of Hanover County has, by appropriate resolution, requested these funds be reallocated to another specific eligible item of work, as indicated herein; and

WHEREAS, these items of work fall within the intent of Section 33.1.75.1 Code of Virginia, and comply with the guidelines of the Department for use of such funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Commonwealth Transportation Board hereby approves the reallocation of these funds as set forth and indicated herein.

Moved by Mr. Martin, seconded by Mr. White, that

WHEREAS, the Hampton Roads Center Parkway, in the City of Hampton, was designated as a limited access highway by the Commonwealth Transportation Board on February 20, 1986; and

WHEREAS, designated access points were allowed when the Parkway was declared a limited access facility which included an access break right of Station 176+00± for right turns from the Hampton Roads Center Parkway to the Hampton Roads Center South Business Park; and

WHEREAS, the continuing development of the Hampton Roads Center South Business Park as well as the potential for additional economic development in the area creating a significant number of new jobs necessitates additional access; and

WHEREAS, the City of Hampton has requested that the existing aforementioned access break be expanded to allow for an at-grade signalized T-intersection with median break from the Business Park to the Hampton Roads Center Parkway; and

WHEREAS, the City of Hampton is responsible for the operational control and maintenance of the Parkway; and

WHEREAS, Department staff have conducted a traffic impact study for this development and it has shown the capacity and safety of the Parkway will not be adversely affected.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that in consideration of the above conditions, the existing limited access break on the Hampton Roads Center Parkway right of Station $176+00\pm$ be adjusted to provide for the requested at-grade intersection conditioned that the City of Hampton agrees to construct, at its own expense, the intersection along with all associated amenities and agrees to the final design details and traffic control measures required by the Virginia Department of Transportation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the City of Hampton will monitor traffic conditions at this location and should unsafe conditions develop, the City will take corrective steps to ensure safe traffic flow.

The Commonwealth Transportation Commissioner is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents to comply with this resolution.

Motion carried; Mr. Cogbill disclosed that he is a practicing attorney with the firm of MdGuire, Woods, Battle and Boothe, L.L.P., and the firm has had some involvement with this project. Mr. Cogbill disqualified himself and did not participate in the discussion or vote on this limited access break.

Item 13:

Moved by Mr. Humphreys, seconded by Mr. White, that

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Transportation has developed a series of technology standards for the development of Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS); and

WHEREAS, the National Transportation Communications for ITS Protocol (NTCIP) was developed to facilitate the transfer of data between roadway technology devices; and

WHEREAS, the states of Iowa, Virginia, Colorado, Arizona, Minnesota and Washington have formed a group known as ENTERPRISE to promote ITS technologies and standards; and

WHEREAS, the ENTERPRISE group has developed a project to test the NTCIP protocols for dynamic message signs and environmental sensor stations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Commonwealth Transportation Board hereby approves the execution of the Memorandum of Understanding with the Iowa Department of Transportation to engage in a cooperative demonstration to procure, test and integrate the National Transportation Communications for ITS Protocol (NTCIP) for dynamic message signs and environmental sensor stations.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Commonwealth Transportation Board authorizes the Commonwealth Transportation Commissioner to execute the Memorandum of Understanding on behalf of the Board and to administer the project.
