## MEETING OF THE COMMONWEALTH TRANSPORTATION BOARD

Richmond, Virginia

February 16, 1989

The monthly meeting of the Commonwealth Transportation Board was held in the Central Office in Richmond, Virginia, on February 16, 1989, at 10:00 a.m. The Chairman, Mr. Ray D. Pethtel, presided.

Present: Messrs. Pethtel, Bacon, Beyer, Davidson, Howlette, Humphreys, Kelly, Malbon, Quicke, Smalley and Waldman and Nrs. Kinchelos and Dr. Thomas.

Absent: Mesere. Leafe and Musselwhite.

During the fall of 1988, the Department of Transportation sponsored a citizen survey to obtain public input from Virginia residents. The survey was conducted by the Survey Research Laboratory of Virginia Commonwealth University. The purposes of the survey were to: determine the extent and nature of personal contacts with the VDOT; test the general public awareness of VDOT services; assess public satisfaction with VDOT services and programs; seek public opinion to VDOT policies and practices; obtain driver perceptions of selected safety measures; analyze and present findings cross-tabulated by relevant demographic characteristics; and compare the survey results with a similar survey conducted in 1986. Mr. Daniel M. Johnson, Project Director, provided the Board members with an overview of the findings and results of the survey. A copy of the survey is on file in the Department's Management Services Division.

WHEREAS, by proper resolutions, the Boards of Supervisors of Accomack, Brunswick, Fauguler and Ployd Counties have requested that certain roads which no longer serve as a public necessity be discontinued as parts of the Secondary Bystem of Highways;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33.1-150 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, the following roads are discontinued as parts of the Secondary System of Highways, effective this date.

Accomack County - Route 628 - Prom Station 10 + 75 to Station 13 + 91; Prom Station 18 + 18 to Station 21 + 56; Prom Station 21 + 56; From Station 21 + 56 to Station 28 + 60; From Station 63 + 60 to Station 69 + 61; Prom Station 69 + 61 to Station 82 + 00.

Brunswick County - Route 644 - From Station 10 + 12 to Station 16 + 19.12. 0.11 mi.

Srunswick County - Route 721 - From Station 34 + 89.75 to Station 38 + 12.68. 0.06 Mi.

Fauquier County - Route 661 - From Route 28 to 0.12 mile West Route 28. 0.12 mi.

Ployd County - Route 758 - Sections 3, 5 and 10 of old location Route 758. 0.15 Mi.

WHEREAS, four sections of the old road are no longer necessary as a public road, the new road serving the same citizens as the old, and two sections of the old road are to be transferred from the Primary System to the Secondary System;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33.1-144 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, 0.86 mile of old Route 460, designated as sections 1, 4, 5 and 6 on the plat dated August 10, 1988, Project: 6460-015-104,G-302,P-402, be discontinued as a part of the State Highway System; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33.1-35 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, 0.36 mile of old Route 460, designated as Sections 2 and 3 on the plat and project referred to hereinabove, be transferred from the Primary System to the Secondary System of Highways.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33.1-148 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, 0.43 mile of Route 8, designated as Sections 2 and 3 on the plat dated August 11, 1988, Project: 0008-031-102,C-504,C-507, be abandoned as a part of the State Highway System; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33.1-35 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, 0.83 mile of Route 8, designated as Sections 1. 4. 5 and 8 on the plat and project referred to hereinabove, be transferred from the Primary System to the Secondary System of Highways.

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board is authorized under Section 33.1-41.1 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, to approve payments to cities and certain towns for street maintenance purposes; and

WHEREAS, certain Principal-Minor Arterial Roads or Collector-Local Streets within the corporate limits of the Town of Culpeper are eligible for such payment; and

WHEREAS, under the authority of Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the Town of Culpeper for maintenance payments on streets meeting the required criteria;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that quarterly payments be made to the Town of Culpeper for streets to be increased by 0.20 centerline mile. This increase is a result of additions of local streets as described on tabulation sheet number 1 for the Town of Culpeper dated January 18, 1989. The tabulation sheet is on file in the Department's Urban Division.

The street additions totaling 0.20 centerline mile increases the total mileage to 25.57 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments.

WREREAS, under the authority of Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the City of Poquoson for maintenance payments on streets meeting the required criteria;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that quarterly payments be made to the City of Poquoson for streets to be increased by 0.30 centerline mile. This increase is a result of additions of local streets as described on tabulation sheet number 1 for the City of Poquoson dated December 13, 1988. The tabulation sheet is on file in the Department's Urban Division.

The street additions totaling 0.30 centerline mile increases the total mileage to 33.00 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments.

WEEREAS, under the authority of Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the City of Richmond, for maintenance payments on streets meeting the required criteria;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that quarterly payments to the City of Richmond for streets be increased by 2.72 centerline miles. This increase is a result of additions of local streets as described on tabulation sheets number 1 thru 2 for the City of Richmond dated January 23, 1989. The tabulation sheets are on file in the Department's Urban Division.

The local street additions totaling 2.72 centerline miles increases the total mileage to 607.81 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments.

WHEREAS, the adjacent landowner has requested that the Commonwealth convey the lands, so acquired, for the Service Road so that the adjacent lands may be fully developed; and

NOW, THEREFORE, the conveyance of the said land, so certified, in accordance with the provisions of Section 33.1-149 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, is approved and the Commonwealth Transportation Commissioner is hereby authorized to execute in the name of the Commonwealth a deed without warranty conveying same to the adjoining landowner of record for a consideration satisfactory to the State Right of Way Engineer and subject to such restrictions as may be deemed requisite.

WHEREAS, in connection with State Highway Project 0023-097-116, RW-201, Route 23 was designated as a Limited Access Highway in accordance with the provisions of Article 3, Chapter 1, Title 33 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended; and

WHEREAS, a site has been chosen by the Department in the Town of Wise comprising, in part, of certain lands originally acquired for said Project 0023-097-116, RW-201 to replace an office site being taken by Project U000-146-104, RW-201 in the Town of Norton; and

WHEREAS, to improve the access to the proposed State Police office site, it has been proposed that the limited access rights along Business Route 23 be eliminated and released across the frontage; and

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Commissioner has certified in writing that the limited access rights on the north side of Business Route 23 between approximate Station 16+60 (centerline Connection Route 23) and the terminus at approximate Station 20+40.25 (centerline Connection Route 23) are no longer necessary for the uses of the State Highway System.

NOW, THEREFORE, the limited access rights, so certified, are eliminated, thereby releasing access restrictions affecting the adjacent property.

WHEREAS, Section 33.1-221 of the Code of Virginia provides a fund to "...be expended by the Board for constructing, maintaining or improving access roads within counties, cities and towns to industrial sites on which manufacturing, processing or other establishments will be built under firm contract or are already constructed and to publicly owned airports...; " and

WHEREAS, the Botetourt County Board of Supervisors has, by resolution, requested industrial access funds to serve the Blue Ridge-Bonsack Industrial Site located in the vicinity of the Route 220 (Alternate) intersection with Route 460/221, and said access is estimated to cost \$368,000; and

WHEREAS, it appears that this request falls within the intent of Section 33.1-221 and has complied with the provisions of the Commonwealth Transportation Board's policy on the use of industrial access funds.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that \$334,000 (\$300,000 unmatched and \$34,000 matched) of the 1986-89 Fiscal Year Industrial Access Fund be allocated to provide adequate access for the Blue Ridge-Bonsack Industrial Site located off Route 460/221 in Botetourt County, Project 1400-011-223,N-501, contingent upon:

- all necessary right of Way and utility adjustments being provided at no cost to the Commonwealth;
- the execution of an appropriate contractual agreement, with acceptable surety, between Botetourt County and the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT), to provide for:

- a. the design, administration and construction of this project;
- Botetourt County contributing the required \$34,000 matching funds;
- c. Botetourt County bearing any ineligible project costs and the entirety of the project's eligible costs in excess of \$334,000;
- d. Botetourt County bearing all project costs not justified by appropriate capital expenditures under policy of the Commonwealth Transportation Board: if by February 16, 1991, qualified industrial development has not expended or entered into firm contract to expend at least \$3,680,000 for eligible capital items on parcel(s) within this site whose sole access to a road in the systems of state highways is by virtue of this project, then
- (1) an amount equal to 10% of eligible capital expenditures and/or the eligible capital outlay under firm contracts will be credited toward the project's allocation, up to a maximum of \$3,000,000 of such expenditures and/or contracts, and
- (2) an amount equal to 5% of eligible capital expenditures and/or the eligible capital outlay under firm contracts totaling between \$3,000,000 and \$3,580,000 will be credited toward the project's allocation.

e. VDOT determining eligible project costs and eligible capital expenditures in accordance with current policy and procedures.

WHEREAS, Section 33.1-221 of the code of Virginia provides a fund "...be expended by the Board for constructing, reconstructing, maintaining or improving access roads within counties, cities and towns to industrial sites on which manufacturing, processing or other establishments will be built under firm contract or are already constructed and to publicly owned airports....," and

WHEREAS, the Pulaski County Board of Supervisors has, by resolution, requested industrial access funds to serve the proposed facilities of Warner-Lambert Company located off Route 643, and said access is estimated to cost \$171,000; and

WHEREAS, it appears that this request falls within the intent of Section 33.1-221 and has complied with the provisions of the Commonwealth Transportation Board's policy on the use of industrial access funds.

NOW, THEREPORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that \$171,000 of the 1988-89 Fiscal Year Industrial Access Fund be allocated to provide adequate access to the proposed processing and distribution facilities of Warner-Lambert Company located in the Pulaski County Corporate Center off Route 643 in Pulaski County, Project 0812-077-165,M-503, contingent upon:

 all necessary right of way and utility adjustments being provided at no cost to the Commonwealth; and  satisfactory documentary evidence provided by Pulaski County that the industry has expended, or is under firm contract to expend, in excess of \$1,710,000 for eligible capital outlay and will operate its facilities on the subject site.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Malbon, seconded by Mr. Bacon, that

WHEREAS, Section 33.1-223 of the Code of Virginia sets forth that the General Assembly of Virginia has found and declared that it is "...in the public interest that access roads to public recreational areas and historical sites be provided by using highway funds...," provides \$1,500,000 from highway funds for such purpose; and further provides that "The Commonwealth Transportation Board and the Director of the Department of Conservation and Historic Resources are hereby authorized to make regulations to carry out the provisions of this section...; and

WHEREAS, the Director of the Department of Conservation and Historic Resources and the Commonwealth Transportation Board have adopted a joint policy to govern the use of recreational access funds pursuant to Section 33.1-223 of the Code of Virginia; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Prince George County has by resolution requested the use of recreational access funds to construct the access road into the Route 156 Park in Prince George County, and the said access is estimated to cost \$122,000; and

WHEREAS, this request has been considered by the Director of the Department of Conservation and Historic Resources and has been found to comply fully with the provisions of Section 33.1-223; and

WHEREAS, the Director of the Department of Conservation and Historic Resources has recommended the construction of the aforementioned access.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that \$122,000 from the 1988-89 Piscal Year Recreational Access Fund be allocated to construct the access road within the Route 156 Park in Prince George County, Project 0660-074-181,N-501, contingent upon:

- all necessary right of way and utility adjustments being provided at no cost to the Commonwealth;
- the County providing adequate assurance of full funding for Phase I of this Park's development to permit its construction to commence in 1989; and
- 3. the Board of Supervisors' official acknowledgment of this project's designation as a "Virginia Byway" and pledge to use its good office to reasonably protect the aesthetic and cultural value of this road.

Motion carried.

Mr. Quicke, Chairman of the Internal Audit Committee, presented a report on the Committee's meeting of January 18, 1989. On motion of Mr. Quicke, seconded by Mr. Bacon, the Board adopted the report, as follows:

The Commonwealth Transportation Board's Internal Audit Committee met on January 18, 1989, with members of the Internal Audit Division. The committee reviewed the Construction Division Report and the Budget Division Report and accepts as adequate the actions taken, or to be taken, on the reports. Follow-up information on the Urban Division Report, Inventory Report and previous Construction Division Report was also presented. The committee accepts as adequate the action taken, or to be taken on these reports.

Mr. Morey Rothenberg, representing JHK & Associates, and Mr. John Fowler, representing Dewberry and Davis, presented an overview of the consultant team's draft Interim Report on Phase II of a Capital Beltway study commissioned by the Board in 1987. Copies of the final interim report should be available in 30 to 60 days.

Mr. Pethtel presented to the Board another alternative in the toll structure for the Richmond-Petersburg Turnpike. This alternative would mean commuters who regularly use the turnpike and buy commuter tickets would see no increase in commuting costs. The Board is considering a number of alternatives to fund a revenue shortfall when the tolls come off the turnpike at the completion of I-295 in 1992. Action on this issue should occur within two to three months.

The Virginia Department of Transportation and the counties of Fairfax and Loudoun were recognized by the Federal Highway Administration as winners of one of five Honorable Mention Awards for innovative financing for the establishment of the Route 28 Primary Improvement District. The award was presented to Mr. Pethtel by Mr. James M. Tumlin, FHWA Division Administrator.

Mrs. Kincheloe, Chairman of the Activities Committee, presented a proposed listing of Board activities for 1989. On motion of Mrs. Kincheloe, seconded by Mr. Bacon, the listing was approved.

Mr. Humphreys asked that the Board consider delaying action on reinstitution of the tolls on the Coleman Bridge to allow exploration of other methods of financing for the York River crossing project.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:45 a.m.

The next meeting will be held in Richmond, Virginia on March 16, 1989.
