OF

MBETING OF THE COMMONWEALTH TRANSPORTATION BOARD

Richmond, Virginia

February 15, 1990

The monthly meeting of the Commonwealth Transportation Board was held in the Central Office in Richmond, Virginia, on Pebruary 15, 1990 at 10:00 a.m. The chairman, Nr. Ray D. Pethtel, presided.

Present: Messrs. Pethtel, Bacon, Beyer, Humphreys, Leafe, Malbon, Musselwhite, Quicke, Smalley and Waldman and Mrs. Kincheloe and Dr. Thomas.

Absent: Messrs. Davidson, Howlette and Kelly.

Following an introduction by Mr. Pethtel, Col. Robert L. Suthard, Secretary of Transportation and Public Safety, addressed the Board. Col. Suthard is the former Superintendent of the State Police and was appointed to the Governor's Cabinet in January by Governor Lawrence Douglas Wilder.

On motion of Mr. Quicke, seconded by Dr. Thomas, the minutes of the meetings of November 16, and December 21, 1989 and January 18, 1990 were approved.

On motion of Mr. Quicke, seconded by Dr. Thomas, permits issued and canceled from January 18, 1990 to February 14, 1990, inclusive, as shown by the records of the Department, were approved.

Noved by Mr. Quicke, seconded by Dr. Thomas, that the Board approve additions and abandonments to the Secondary System from January 1, 1990 to January 31, 1990, inclusive, as shown by the records of the Department.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Quicke, seconded by Dr. Thomas, that

WHEREAS, by proper resolution, the Board of Supervisors of Amelia County have requested that a certain road which no longer serves as a public necessity be discontinued as a part of the Secondary System of Highways;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33.1-150 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, the following road is discontinued as a part of the Secondary System of Highways, effective this date.

Amelia County - Route 682 - From Station 23 + 50 to Station 33 + 00.

WHEREAS, Route 52 in Carroll County has been altered and reconstructed as shown on plans for Project 0052-017-005 (Old Projects 2017-05 and 405 E); and

WHEREAS, one section of the old road is no longer necessary as a public road, the new road serving the same citizens as the old;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33.1-148 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, 0.12 mile of Route 52, designated as Section 2A on the plat dated February 27, 1959, Project 0052-017-005 (Old Projects 2017-05 and 405 E) be abendoned as part of the State Highway System.

Motion carried.

Moved by Dr. Thomas, seconded by Mr. Quicke, that

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board is authorized under Section 33.1-41.1 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, to approve payments to cities and certain towns for street maintenance purposes; and

WHEREAS, certain principal-minor arterial roads, collector roads and local streets within the corporate limits of the Town of Bridgewater are eligible for such payment; and

WHEREAS, under the authority of Section 33.1-41.1 request is made by the Town of Bridgewater, for maintenance payments on local streets meeting the required criteria;

NOW, THERSFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that quarterly payments to the Town of Bridgewater, for local streets be increased by 0.53 centerline mile. This increase is a result of additions of local streets as described on tabulation sheet number 1 for the Town of Bridgewater dated January 17, 1990.

The tabulation sheet is on file in the Department's Urban Division.

The local street additions totaling 0.53 mile increase the total mileage to 10.75 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments.

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board is authorized under Section 33.1-41.1 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, to approve payments to cities and certain towns for street maintenance purposes; and

WHEREAS, certain principal-minor arterial roads, collector roads and local streets within the corporate limits of the City of Colonial Heights are eligible for such payment; and

WHEREAS, under the authority of said Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the City of Colonial Heights for retroactive maintenance payments beginning July 1, 1989 due to certain streets not being hard-surfaced at time of submission for annual street additions, however, these streets were paved prior to June 30, 1989; additionally, other certain streets meeting the required criteria transmitted between the City and the VDOT Residency which were delayed due to misinterpretations;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that quarterly payments to the City of Colonial Beights, for local streets and collector roads be increased by 2.42 centerline miles. This increase is a result of additions of local streets and collector roads as described on tabulation sheets numbered 1 through 2 for the City of Colonial Heights dated December 28, 1989.

The tabulation sheets are on file in the Department's Urban Division.

The collector road additions totaling 0.98 mile increases the total mileage to 6.21 centerline miles of approved roads subject to maintenance payments.

The local street additions totaling 1.44 miles increase the total mileage to 64.06 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments.

Moved by Dr. Thomas, seconded by Mr. Quicke, that

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board is authorized under Section 33.1-41.1 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, to approve payments to cities and certain towns for street maintenance purposes; and

WHEREAS, certain principal-minor arterial roads, collector roads and local streets within the corporate limits of the City of Manassas are eligible for such payment; and

WHEREAS, under the authority of Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the City of Manassas, for maintenance payments on local streets meeting the required criteria;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that quarterly payments to the City of Manassas, for local streets be increased by 2.16 centerline miles. This increase is a result of additions of local streets as described on tabulation sheets numbered 1 through 4 for the City of Manassas dated October 18, 1989.

The tabulation sheets are on file in the Department's Urban Division.

The local street additions totaling 2.16 miles increase the total mileage to 61.89 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments.

Moved by Dr. Thomas, seconded by Mr. Quicke, that

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board is authorized under Section 33.1-41.1 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, to approve payments to cities and certain towns for street maintenance purposes; and

WHEREAS, certain principal-minor arterial roads, collector roads and local streets with the corporate limits of the City of Newport News are eligible for such payment; and

WHEREAS, under authority of Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the City of Newport News, for deletion of maintenance payments on local streets no longer meeting the required criteria;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that quarterly payments to the City of Newport News, for local streets be decreased by 0.43 centerline mile. This decrease is a result of deletions of local streets as described on tabulation sheet number 1 for the City of Newport news dated January 8, 1990.

The tabulation sheet is on file in the Department's Urban Division.

The local street deletions totaling 0.43 mile decrease the total mileage to 332.10 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments.

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board is authorized under Section 33.1-41.1 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, to approve payments to cities and certain towns for street maintenance purposes; and

WHEREAS, under the authority of Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the City of Poquoson, for maintenance payments on local streets meeting the required criteria;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that quarterly payments to the City of Poquoson, for local streets be increased by 0.27 centerline mile. This increase is a result of additions of local streets as described on tabulation sheets numbered 1 through 3 for the City of Poquoson dated December 19, 1989.

The tabulation sheets are on file in the Department's Urban Division.

The local street additions totaling 0.27 mile increase the total mileage to 33.27 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments.

At its January 18, 1990 meeting, the Board approved a request from Wyatt Development Company, Inc., for a break in the limited access right of way to provide an entrance to the property on the north side of Route 460 between Routes 688 and 720 (Project 6019-092-107, RW-202 and Route 460, Bluefield Bypass, Tazewell County). A rehearing on the access break was requested by the Bluefield Citizens for Planned Progress and the Board's Ground Transportation Regulation Committee met on February 14 to consider the request. Mr. H. R. Humphreys, Jr., Chairman of the Committee, indicated no new evidence had been presented during the meeting and the Committee felt the action taken at the January Board meeting was appropriate. On motion of Mr. Bacon, seconded by Mr. Quicke, the Board voted against a rehearing of the request.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this \$155,000 be reassigned to Project 0646-046-203, N501.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Musselwhite, seconded by Mr. Bacon, that

WHEREAS, Section 33.1-75.1, Code of Virginia, prescribes the annual allocation of state funds to provide an equivalent matching allocation to any county for the designation of certain local funds by the governing body, to be placed in a special fund account known as "... County primary and secondary road fund"; and

WHEREAS, the governing bodies of the counties electing to participate in this program for Fiscal Year 1988-89 did, jointly with the Department, identify specific eligible items of work to be financed from the special fund account; and

WHEREAS, this Board has previously approved the allocation of such funds in accordance with the recommendation of the local governing bodies and the Department, including the assignment of \$122,000 to Route 8000, Budget Item 5603 - City of Suffolk; and

WHEREAS, the Suffolk City Council has subsequently advised that due to changes in the status of the improvements proposed to be funded under this program, it desires to amend its earlier request whereby the allocation to Route 8000, Budget Item 5603, would be reduced to \$30,000 and the resultant \$92,000 reassigned to Project 0647-061-P47, N501; and

WHEREAS, it appears that this request falls within the intent of the applicable statute and guidelines for administering the "...County primary and secondary road fund".

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Commonwealth Transportation Board hereby amends its action of July 21, 1988 and March 16, 1989, to reduce the allocation of the City of Suffolk Secondary Road Fund for Route 8000 - Budget Item 5603 to \$30,000.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that \$92,000 be reassigned to Project 0647-061-P47, M501.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Musselwhite, seconded by Mr. Quicke, that

WHEREAS, in accordance with its needs and schedules for implementing the Route 58 Corridor Program objectives, the Department has determined that in order to perform the required activities and meet those objectives, it is necessary to supplement the Transportation Planning and Location and Design Divisions' staffs to accomplish the corridor studies including development of traffic projections, conceptual engineering plans, environmental evaluation, public involvement, an economic development evaluation and monitoring system from west of Jonesville in Lee County to Martinsville in Henry County in the Bristol and Salem Districts, Projects 0058-961-E01, PE-100; 0058-961-E02, PE-100; 0058-962-E01, PE-100; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Department Policy and State Procurement procedures, a firm proposal has been received from Maguire Group, Inc., for said services; and

WHEREAS, careful review and consideration has been made of the necessary work and services required and just compensation has been established for these services and are set forth in the Memorandum of Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board authorize the execution of the Agreement with the firm of Maguire Group, Inc., which establishes a compensation of \$2,061,685.00 for services and expenses plus a net fee of \$97,918.00 making the maximum total compensation not to exceed \$2,159,603.00.

Motion carried.
