WHEREAS, proper notice was given in advance, and all those present were given a full opportunity to express their opinions and recommendations for or against the proposed project as presented, and their statements being duly recorded; and

WHEREAS, in connection with Route 746, the Commonwealth acquired certain lands from Roy Bailey and Minnie Bailey, et al, by Omnibus deed dated July 2, 1951, recorded in Deed Book 54, Page 127, in the Office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Buckingham County; and

WHEREAS, Route 746 was relocated and the new location serves the same citizens as the old location; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 33.1-155 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended, sections of old Route 746 were abandoned by the Board of Supervisors of Buckingham County at its meeting of June 11, 1990; and

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation
Commissioner has certified in writing that a portion of
lands so acquired containing 2.82 acres, more or less,
and being a 40 foot strip of land lying between Route 24
and relocated Route 746 a distance of 0.21 mile and
being a 40 foot strip of land lying north of Route 746
for a distance of 0.37 mile do not constitute sections
of the public road and are deemed by him no longer
necessary for the uses of the Secondary System of State
Highways; and

whereas, the adjoining landowner has requested that the excess right of way be conveyed.

NOW, THEREFORE, in accordance with the provisions of Section 33.1-154 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, the conveyance of said lands, so certified, to the adjoining landowner is approved and the Commonwealth Transportation Commissioner is hereby authorized to execute in the name of the Commonwealth a deed without warranty conveying same for a consideration satisfactory to the State Right of Way Engineer, subject to such restrictions as may be deemed appropriate.

WHEREAS, in response to a formal request by the Prince William County Board of Supervisors that Route 2000 (Smoketown Road) between Route 640 (Minnieville Road) and Route 641 (Old Bridge Road) be considered for restriction of through truck traffic pursuant to the provisions of Section 46.2-809 of the Code of Virginia, this matter has been carefully reviewed; and

WHEREAS, the Prince William County Board of Supervisors has conducted a public hearing on this restriction; and

WHEREAS, the route in question traverses a predominantly non-commercial area; and

WHEREAS, a restriction on the proposed route would not present any undue hardship; and

WHEREAS, proper notice was given by posting signs and publishing notices advising the public of the proposed restriction and requesting written comments; and

WHEREAS, careful consideration has been given to the recommendations received, the available alternate routes and the past practices of the Department.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Route 2000 (Smoketown Road) between Route 640 (Minnieville Road) and Route 641 (Old Bridge Road) be restricted to through truck traffic in accordance with Section 46.2-809 of the Code of Virginia.

Moved by Mr. Porter, seconded by Dr. Thomas, that

WHEREAS, in response to a formal request by the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors that Route 2671 (Hontgomery Street) between Route 648 (Edsall Road) and Route 620 (Braddock Road) be considered for restriction of through truck traffic pursuant to the provisions of Section 46.2-809 of the Code of Virginia, this matter has been carefully reviewed; and

WHEREAS, the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors has conducted a public hearing on this restriction; and

WHEREAS, the route in question traverses a predominantly residential area; and

WHEREAS, a restriction on the proposed route would not present any undue hardship; and

WHEREAS, proper notice was given by posting signs and publishing notices advising the public of the proposed restriction and requesting written comments; and

WHEREAS, careful consideration has been given to the recommendations received, the available alternate routes and the past practices of the Department.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Route 2671 (Montgomery Street) between Route 648 (Edsall Road) and Route 620 (Braddock Road) be restricted to through truck traffic in accordance with Section 46.2-509 of the Code of Virginia.

Motion carried.

Item 12:

Moved by Mr. Porter, seconded by Dr. Thomas, that

WHEREAS, Section 33.1-223 of the Code of Virginia sets forth that the General Assembly of Virginia has found and declared that it is "...in the public interest that access roads and bikeways for public recreational areas and historical sites be provided...," reserves \$3,000,000 from highway funds for such purpose, and further provides that "The Commonwealth Transportation Board, with the concurrence of the Director of the Department of Conservation and Recreation, is hereby authorized to make regulations to carry out the provisions of this section"; and

WHEREAS, the Director of the Department of Conservation and Recreation and the Commonwealth Transportation Board have adopted a joint policy to govern the use of Recreational Access Funds pursuant to Section 33.1-223 of the Code of Virginia; and

WHEREAS, the Lee County Board of Supervisors has, by resolution, requested the use of Recreational Access Funds to provide adequate access to Karlan State Park, located off Route 58 in Lee County, and said access is estimated to cost \$275,000; and

WHEREAS, the Director of the Department of Conservation and Recreation has designated Karlan State Park as a public recreation area and is in full support of this request.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that \$275,000 from the 1995-96 Fiscal Year Recreational Access Fund be allocated to construct the access road to Karlan State Park in Lee County, Project 0923-052-236,N501, contingent upon:

- all necessary right of way, environmental assessments and mitigation, and utility adjustments being provided at no cost to the Recreational Access Fund; and
- 2. the payment of all ineligible project costs and of all eligible costs in excess of \$275,000 from sources other than the Recreational Access Fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the project constructed in accordance with this resolution shall hereafter be known as a "Virginia Byway."

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Porter, seconded by Mr. Prettyman, that

WHEREAS, Section 33.1-221 of the Code of Virginia provides a fund to "... be expended by the Board for constructing, reconstructing, maintaining or improving access roads within counties, cities and towns to industrial sites on which manufacturing, processing or other establishments will be built under firm contract or are already constructed and to publicly owned airports;" and

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board, in its resolution dated January 17, 1991, resolved that the maximum time limit for a bond be three years from the date of the Board's initial allocation of funds to a bonded industrial access project; and

WHEREAS, on January 28, 1993, this Board allocated industrial access funds, under the bonded concept, to provide access to the Pretlow Industrial Park in the City of Franklin, designated as Project 9999-145-102,C501; and

WHEREAS, the bonded period for this project expires on January 28, 1996; and

WHEREAS, the requirements of this Board's policy regarding bonded industrial access projects will not be met, in that no industry will have constructed its facilities within the three-year bonded period on a site served by the industrial access road; and

WHEREAS, the City of Franklin has invested considerable City funds in the development of the industrial park and intends to construct an industrial shell building within the first six months of 1996; and

WHEREAS, the City of Franklin has requested that the bonded period be extended to January 28, 1997; and

WHEREAS, it is the recommendation of this Board's Access Roads and Ground Transportation Committee that said extension be granted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that this Board hereby grants an exception to its policy and extends the bonded period for Project 9999-145-102,C501, to January 28, 1997, contingent upon:

submission to the Virginia Department of Transportation by the City of Franklin of an appropriate surety on or before January 28, 1996, to expire no sooner than February 28, 1997; and

2. a firm contract for construction of a shell building being presented to the Virginia Department of Transportation by April 18, 1996. In the event such contract is not presented by that date, the City of Franklin will reimburse the full amount of industrial access road funds expended on the project; and

3. documentation of eligible capital outlay by an industry acceptable to the Board being submitted by the City of Franklin no later than January 28, 1997.

Motion carried.
