WHEREAS, VDOT desires to discontinue use of its own wastewater and well facilities at the I-85 Mecklenburg County rest area and to connect to the Warren County system; and

WHEREAS, a Utility Contract from Warren County, North Carolina has been received and reviewed and just compensation for these services has been established and is set forth in the Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board authorizes execution of this Agreement with Warren County, North Carolina which establishes a compensation for \$65,000 for an 8" water main, \$400,000 for water hook-up, and \$600,000 for Sewer hook-up, making the maximum total compensation \$1,065,000.

Item 15:

Moved by Mr. Newcomb, seconded by Mr. White, that

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Section 33.1-46.2 of the Code of Virginia, the Commonwealth Transportation Board may designate one or more lanes of any highway in the Interstate, Primary, or Secondary System as commuter lanes for the exclusive use of buses and motor vehicles transporting multiple occupants to facilitate the rapid and orderly movement of traffic to and from urban areas during peak periods; and

WHEREAS, the portion of the I-95 reversible HOV-lanes from just north of Opitz Boulevard to just south of Route 234 was opened to traffic on February 7, 1997; and

WHEREAS, the occupancy requirements and hours of operation must be established and communicated to elected officials, commuters, and the media upon the lanes' opening; and

WHEREAS, the existing section of the I-95/I-395 reversible HOV-lanes from just north of Opitz Boulevard to the 14th Street Bridge are currently restricted to HOV-3+ vehicles and motorcycles during the hours of 6:00-9:00 a.m. and 3:30-6:00 p.m.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Commonwealth Transportation Board directs the Virginia Department of Transportation to adopt the same hours of restriction for the new segments of HOV-lanes from just north of Opitz Boulevard to just south of the Route 234 interchange. Explicitly, the hours of restriction for the I-95/I-395 HOV-lanes between the 14th Street Bridge to just south of the Route 234 interchange shall be 6:00-9:00 a.m. northbound, and 3:30-6:00 p.m. southbound during weekdays. During these restricted hours, the median HOV-lanes are open to buses, motorcycles, and vehicles carrying three or more persons. During non-restricted hours, all vehicles are allowed to access the HOV-lanes.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board directs the Department to advise the public of the designation and to sign the facility to reflect the designation.

BE IT FURTHER RESCLVED that the Board directs the Department to provide the Virginia State Police with a copy of this resolution and request their cooperation in enforcing the new designation.

Item 16:

Moved by Mr. Rich, seconded by Mr. White, that

WHEREAS, Route 19 Lebanon Bypass, from 1.34 miles east of Route 660 to 0.227 mile east of intersection Route 19 Business, is currently under construction as part of State Project 6019-083-106,PE-105,C-505 in Russell County, and was designated as a Limited Access Highway by the Commonwealth Transportation Board on May 21, 1970; and

WHEREAS, a request was received from the Town of Lebanon and the Russell County Industrial Development Authority for a break in the limited access right of way to provide an entrance that would be located on Route 19 Bypass northbound approximately 4500 feet north of the Route 654 interchange with Route 19 Bypass in Russell County; and

WHEREAS, the proposed entrance would provide access to the Cumberland Plateau Regional Industrial Park, Lear Corporation, Reynolds Wheel Plant, and the American Electric Power Service Center, as well as supplement the existing interchange at Route 654; and

WHEREAS, such break in limited access would support the economic development for Russell County; and

WHEREAS, VDOT has concluded that providing the entrance on Route 19 Bypass will meet design criteria and will not present a safety hazard to the traveling public; and

WHEREAS, any and all right of way required for the construction of this ramp would be donated by the Cumberland Plateau Regional Industrial Park and any other businesses which may benefit from its construction.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED in consideration of the above mentioned condition, the Commonwealth Transportation Board hereby grants a break in the existing limited access line. The Commonwealth Transportation Commissioner is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents needed to comply with this resolution.
