MINUTES OF THE TRETH MEETING OF THE STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSION HELD IN RICHARD, VA. MARSH 26th, 27th, and 28th, 1923.

On March 26th, the Commission, consisting of Mesers, R. G. Shirley, Chairman, Wade H. Massie, Secretary, H. B. Sproul, I. Welke Truxtum, and R. K. Sanders, met at 8:45 in the office of the State Highway Commission at Richmond, Virginia, and gave hearings to all interested on the ellocation of funds for the year 1923.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman.

A delegation from Rosmoke, consisting of Mesers. James A. Bear, M. P. Augustus, Murry, Sink, Birch, Villiams, Rocher, and others, requested the Commission to make an elicotion to the read between Rosmoke and Booky Mount. They stated that this was one of the most important roads in the State, being the most direct Route north and south from Maryland down the Valley of Virginia to North Carolina, and that thousands of tourists come through Virginia by this Route and that during the winter months this road was absolutely impassable and people all over the Country telked of the terrible condition of this road. It has cost the State more adverse criticism than any other road in its system.

A delegation from Petersburg and Vicinity, represented by Masars. Smith, Drewry and Harrison, appeared before the Commis-

Hert Mark WA 19-7 met Walter Co. sion and requested them to add to the State Highway System the road leading from Petersburg over what is known as the Halifax Road to Morth Carolina. This would give a direct route to North Carolina and as it effects Virginia and North Carolina is one of the most important roads in the State. They also stated that when the Highway System was first laid out this road was one to be included, but through some error, when the bill was passed, this road was left out and is order not to block the whole bill and also with the assurance that it would be added at some future date, there was no amendment introduced to this bill.

Senator Boland E. Chase of Clintwood, Virginia, came before the Commission and requested them to make an allocation of approximately \$40,000.00 to complete the two miles of road from Clintwood, west. He stated that Dinkenson County had advanced \$400,000.00 under the Robertson Act and needed approximately \$40,000.00 more to complete the road from Clintwood west, State Highway No. 11.

Hr. Gibson from Culpoper County, appeared before the Countssion and requested them to make an allegation for the section of road between Ellowed and Remington, this being about the worse piece of road in the County.

A delegation from Buckingham County, represented by Mesure.

J. B. Hostwright, H. M. White, Perkins Clover, and C. D. Davidson, appeared before the Commission with the request that they make an allocation to the road from Dillwyn by Gold Hill to New Canton. This road is impassable and during winter weather it is

necessary to go as much as thirty miles out of the way in order to avoid the mud.

Mr. A. L. Witt from Viss County came before the Commission and requested them to allocate sufficient money to build an 18' concrete road between Big Stone Cap and Appelachia on Route 11, approximately 21 miles. There is very beary traffic over this read and according to a census taken for two days from 6:00 A.M. to 6:00 P.M., there were 262 automobiles, 197 trucks, 15 one-horse vehicles and 48 two-horse vehicles, making a total for the first day of 886; and for the second day there were 574 automobiles, 183 trucks, 18 one-horse vehicles and 57 two-horse vehicles, making a total of 832.

Mr. Henry Boberts appeared before the Commission and requested the Commission to have another survey made from Forton one and one-half miles to the west, on the other side of the Railroad as in his epinion this will help to get the rights of way straightened out.

A delegation from Limenburg County, represented by Meters.
Onlin, Waddill, Kennedy, Eppes and Turnbull, come before the Commission and requested them to allocate funds for the construction of the road from Limenburg C.H. to Reyeville. This road is impassable and to take it over for maintenance would mean really reconstruction as there is nothing there to maintain, it is simply a trail with no bottom to it. An ellegation of from \$50,000.00 to \$60,000.00 would be required for this road. It was the opinion of the delegation that there would be no trouble

Berje Shout tile, fis-P 1914 Philippy Co. in securing the rights of way on this road as the people would be glad to done to them as they are very anxious to get this road constructed.

A delegation from Morfolk County, represented by Dr. A. M. Burfoot and Mr. Greene, appeared before the Countssion in regards to the location of Route 27 from Merfolk to the Morth Carolina line. They claimed that this road had been definitely located by Countssioner Coleman Several years ago around by Fentress and that this Countssion had no jurisdiction over its location.

Mr. J. T. McAllister of Not Springe, Virginia, appeared before the Commission and requested them to allocate funds for the
improvement of the road from Covington to the Top of the Alleghany Mountain, and also from Covington to Clifton Forge, this road
would be of great benefit to the people going to the Thite Sulphur Springe, the Hot Springe and other summer resorts.

A delegation from Amelia, Powhaten and Cumberland Counties and Patersburg, represented by Mesers. J. G. Jefferson, Robsen, and others, appeared before the Commission and requested them to add to the State Highway System the section of road from Morven to some point on State Highway No. 13, a distance of approximately five or six miles. They stated that this would greatly help the people in that section and save them from going all the way around by Farmville and Burkeville to get from one State Highway to the other.

Mr. Dickenson and Son. Epps, appeared before the Commission and requested them to allocate funds to Boute No. 2 between Farm-

Derk Mari He. 47 and Tilling Co. wills and Hampdon Sidney as this road is impassable in bad weather and it would develop that section of the State a great deal.

A delegation from Buchanan County consisting of Mesers. Combs Stinson, and Harmon, appeared before the Commission and requested that an allocation be made to grade the road from Grundy towards Taxonell so the people of Buchanan could have an outlet. They are sut in on all sides by mountains and are greatly in need of an outlet.

Representatives of the Truck Owners Association, consisting of Mesare. Parrish, Hagan, Horner, Hobson and Vinchester, come before the Commission relative to the rules and regulations governing the load on trucks. They requested that they be revised so as to allow a heavier load and stated they would try and comply with them to the fullest extent.

A delegation from Carroll County, represented by Mr. Vane of Galax, Virginia, some before the Commission and requested that an appropriation be made for the construction of the read leading into the town of Galax.

A delegation from Alleghamy County, represented by Mesars, McAllister, Gracus and Layman, appeared before the Commission and requested that an allocation be made to the read between Covington and Clifton Torge. They also requested them to add to the State Highway System the read from Grows to the West Virginia Line.

Mr. B. J. Woodville appeared before the Commission and request ed them to make an allocation to Route Eq. 2 between Orange and Culpaper and also requested them to add to the State Highway SysMark Mark No. 16-7 cold Wildley Co. tem the road leading from Grange to Predericksburg.

The Commission then recessed for Lunch and returned at 2:00 P.M.

A delegation from Morfolk, represented by Mesers. Ling, Mayers, Cooks, Lessnier, appeared before the Commission and requested that they add to the State Highway System under the 256 Clause, the road leading from Virginia Beach to Fort Story. This addition would greatly develop that meetion of the State and be of great convenience to the people living in this section.

Observed before the Commission and requested an appropriation to construct the bridges over the open streems on Boute 10-Y between Labanon and Manson-ville, there being six of these bridges. To construct the four most important ones would cost approximately \$15,000.00. Whenever there is a heavy rain in this section, these streems rise to such an extent that it is impossible to cross them for several house and this retards traffic very much.

Er. Teaver from Page County appeared before the Commission and requested an allocation of \$0.50,000.00 for the road from Luray to the Top of Blue Ridge Hountain. He stated that they were completely shut in and that they were greatly in need of this road.

Mr. Henry Roberts again appeared before the Commission and requested them to add to the State Highway System the road from the Tennesses State Line north by Holston Bridge to Moscasia Cap under the 24% Clause, also requested them to allocate funds for

Soph March Std. 48-2 egytt Walkley Co. the construction of the road from Roancks west on Route 10 and from Bristol west, he stated that the Board of Supervisors of Scott County would donate \$11,000.00 for grading the road in this vicinity if the Commission saw fit to make an allocation to this road.

Er. Robertson from Manascas, Virginia, appeared before the Gamission and requested that they allocate funds for the road between Manascas and Fairfax, this road being in very bad chape. He stated that this road could be used as a detour during the construction of the Lee Highway.

General Sale, Mr. Saunders, Mr. Johnson and Mr. Chemning, appeared before the Commission in behalf of the Sun Tree Road. They requested the Commission to add this road to the State Highway way System under the 200 Clause, from Sun Tree on State Highway Me. 1, to Contesville. This request was made by reason of the relocation of Roate No. 1 over what is known as the Old Telegraph Road instead of over the Mountain Boad.

A delegation from Bedford, represented by Messrs. Lewrence, Baker, Smith, and Miller, appeared before the Commission and requested an allocation for the road just east and west of the town of Bedford, State Highway No. 10. The road leading into Lynchburg and a road leading into Bonnoke has been constructed and the tendency was to draw traffic to these two points rather than to Bedford and had worked a hardship on them. If the road adjacent to Bedford could be constructed, it would bring trade there instead of having it go to either Lynchburg or Boanske.

Spain State 20s. 66-7 onto Washing Co. Er. W. T. Ashe, of Gloucester Point, Virginia, appeared before the Commission and requested that they make an allocation to
the section of road between Gloucester C.H. and Gloucester Point
in addition to the \$65,000,00 which will be put up under the Robertson Act. so that this piece of road can be let in one contract.

A delegation from Gerroll County and Rillsville, represented by Mesers. "Gwards, Wilkerson, World, Martin and Felts, appeared before the Commission and requested that an allocation be made to the read between Hillsville and Jackson's Ferry and from Rillsville to the Borth Carolina Line.

After hearing all these delegations, the Commission took up the matter of exerding contracts.

Moved by Mr. Sandare, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that the bid of W. P. Midkiff, Ivanhoe, Virginia, secunting to \$198,736.39 for the construction of the read between Claypool and Resedale, Pre-joot No. F271B, Route 11, being the lowest bid received, he accepted, and that 105 additional he set aside to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering, making a total of \$218,610.02 chargeable to this Project, provided, however, that the contractor he not permitted to start work on this Project until after the plans have been approved by the Bureau of Public Reads. Motion carried,

Moved by Mr. Mausie, seconded by Mr. Sproul, that the bid of C. H. Oliver, Doswell, Virginia, amounting to \$27,320.17 for the constituation of the read between Cooper's Store and Fork Union, Project 5214, Boute 2, being the lowest, be accepted, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of contingencies and Hark Chart (SA 66-7 part Thillip Ch. engineering, making a total of \$30,052.18 chargeable to this Project. Motion carried.

Noved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sproul, that the sliefnate bid of Burgess and Atkisson, Scottsville, Virginia, enounting to \$64,162.66 for the construction of the road between Columbia and Fife, Project 209, Route 19, being the lowest, be accepted and that 10% additional be set saide to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering, making a total of \$70,578.92 chargeable to this Project. Motion exprised.

Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the bid of Burgess and Atkieson, Scottsville, Virginia, emounting to \$1375).4D for the construction of the bridge over Bird Creek, Project 209, Boute 19, being the lowest, be accepted, and that 10% additional be set saids to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering, making a total of \$15,128.74 chargeable to this Project. Motion carried.

Hoved by Mr. Sandars, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that the bid of Reyer-Perguson Company, High Point, M.C. smounting to \$312,067.56 on Project 1608AC, Route 5, Carreville-Suffolk, be accepted, being the lowest received, and that there be set aside 10% additional to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering making a total of \$343,274.31 chargeable to this Project, previded the contractor will not start this work until the plans have been approved by the Bureau of Public Roads. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxtum, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that the bid of R. Stuart Royer, Greenwhore, M.C. on Project 16084C, Route 5,

Opis Plant Hy. 18-7 pril Tribby Co. Bridge over Kingsale Swamp near Carrsville, emounting to \$5.544.70 be accepted, being the lowest received, and that there be set aside 10% additional to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering, making a total of \$6.099.17 chargeable to this Project, provided the contractor will not start work on this Project until the plane have been approved by the Bureau of Public Roads. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. Senders, that the alternate bid of E. M. George, Jr., and Son, Sickword, Virginia, amounting to \$161,507.03 on Project F157, Soute 9, Teams-Diasound Creek, be accepted, being the lowest received, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering, making a total of \$177,657,73 chargeable to this Project. Motion carried.

Noved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sproul, that the bid of Ferkins and Barnes, Blackstone, Virginia, on Project 8155, Route 2, Comminghan's Greak to Cooper's Store, be accepted, being the lowest received, amounting to \$12,853.04, and that 105 additional be set aside to opper the cost of contingencies and engineering, making a total of \$14,138.34 chargeable to this Project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massis, seconded by Mr. Truxtum, that all bids be rejected on Project 287, Route 11, Dickenson County Line to Donkey on account of irregularities in bidding, and that this Project be immediately readvertised calling for grading and drainage only. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxtum, accouded by Mr. Sproul, that all bide

Berle Mari Ro. 6-7 men Markéy Co. be rejected on Project 178, Route 1, Bridge over Grassy Creek, on account of bids being too high, and that this Project be immediately readvertised. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Truxtum, that all bids be rejected on Project 265, Route 11X, Grundy-Manger, and that the Chairman be authorized to enter into an agreement with the low bidder, Starkweather Contracting Corporation, Crosst, Virginia, at their unit price for grading and drainage with the surface quitted Motion carried.

The Commission then adjourned until 9:00 A.M. March 27th.
MARCH 27, 1923.

At 9:00 A.M. on "erch 27th, 1923, the Commission met at their office, Tenth and Marshall Streets, all members being present, and the meeting was called to order by the Chairman.

Hoved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Bantars, that in submitting bids the contractors will be required to put up a certified or cachier's check for \$500.00 on contracts assuming to less then \$100,000.00 and \$1,000.00 on contracts assuming to \$100000.00 or more. Motion carried,

Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Banders, that the Chairman be authorized to work up some arrangement and make a recommendation at the next meeting of the Commission in regards to Surety Bonds. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Sanders, that the agreement with the Board of Supervisors of Tythe County to advance \$75,000,00 under the Robertson Act for the construction of the

Acres Short Sign St. P. cont. Worldge Ch. the road between Wytheville and Snyth County Line, after an equal amount had been spont on this section of road by the State, be cancelled, and that the money set stide by the Commission for the construction of the bridges on the Lee Highway be used in lieu of the money promised by Wythe County, and therefore, the bridges cannot be constructed. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sanders, that the lecation of Route 26 between Wytheville and Bland C.H. be adopted by what is known as the Sharon Route. Motion carried,

Hoved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the Commission reinstate the read leading from Appelachie to the Kentucky State Line to connect with the Kentucky State Highway System at Lynch as a State highway and that they take over the deed granting a right of way from the Turnpike Company free of cost to the State and scoops the advancement of \$175,000.00 under the Robertson Act offered by Wime County for the construction of this section of road as far as the money will go. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sproul, that the Commission accept the advancement of \$35,000.00 under the Robertson Act for the construction of the Wild Cat Road in Wise County. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Sandare, that the convict camp now being operated in Greensville County for the purpose of supplying stone for Norfolk County be discontinued. Motion parried.

Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Truxtum, that the following Traffic Officers be appointed: Design Marris Ma. IS-P ppe Tolky Co.

Mr. J. C. Carpenter, Bureau of Public Roads,

Mr. B. P. Marrison, Assistant Engineer in charge of Surveys,

Mr. B. P. Appel, Purchasing Agent, Mr. C. C. Davis, Resident Engineer,

Mr. J. H. Walker, Resident Engineer, Mr. R. B. Duvall, Besident Engineer, Mr. F. M. Tellett, Resident Engineer,

being Federal and State employees. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxtun, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the contractor on Project 153-B. Route 2, Red Cak-Blue Stone Creek, be granted an extension of time to May 1st, 1923, provided the contractor will increase his force and put on a competent forces se that the work can be completed by that time. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sanders, that the State Highway Geomission hereby give notice that all contractors doing work in the State of Virginia, must immediately get to work on their contracts and completethen within the time specified in the contract and that if the contracts are not completed on time the penalty set forth in such contracts will be expicitly enforced. Motion carried.

The Commission them left for an inspection of the road between Bichmond and Charles City C.H. returning to Kichmond late in the afternoon.

MAROH 28, 1923.

On the morning of the 28th, the Commission, all members bev ing present, assembled at their office and the meeting was called to order by the Chairman.

Col. Deans, appeared before the Commission and requested that an allocation be made to the road leading to Smithfield, State

Regit (Clark Mis. 98-2) and Worldon Con Highway Wo. 10, and also from the Isle of Wight County Line to Suffolk. He stated that this road was much traveled and in his opinion was a very important stretch.

Col. White of Loudous County, appeared before the Commission and requested them to add to the State Highway System the section of road between Leesburg and Hamilton, under the 2% Clause. He stated that one mile of this road has been constructed under the State Aid Law and if the Commission will build the small uncompleted section, it would make available nine miles of good road and put them within seven miles of the Clarke County Line and they will have a fairly good road from Leesburg to Greensville.

Mr. G. P. Coleman, appeared before the Commission and requested them to make an allocation to the section of Route 9 between Cobian and Travillans. Both Louisa and Albemarle Counties having advanced money under the Robertson Act, and whereas there was no definite provise that the State would construct this link, it was understood that the Commission would make an effort to put up additional funds to complete this section of road during 1922 and 1923.

The minutes of the last meeting of the Commission were then read and approved.

A delegation from Forton appeared before the Commission and requested them to make an allocation for the construction of an 18' concrete road between Morton and the forks of the road going to Blackwood and said they would guarantee that the right of way cost on this section would not exceed \$10,000,00 and in case the

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Benders, that the Commission resoind their motion made July 5th, 1922, laying out the Right Construction Districts and that these Districts consist of the following Countiess (Map Atlacked)



Subject to Change se Between Points Designated in Act


