COMMISSION HELD, RICHWORD, VIRGINIA, MARCH 4, 5, and 6, 1924.

On the morning of March 4th, the State Highway Commiseion, noneleting of Messre. H. G. Shirley, Chairman, Made H. Massie, Secretary, H. B. Sproul, R. E. Sanders, and I. Walks Truxtum met at their office SM State Office Building, Richmond, Virginia, and held hearings from all parts of the State both on allocations and additions to the State Highway System under the 24% Clause.

Sanator S. L. Fergus on and Hon. John R. Horaley, appeared before the Commission in bahalf of the road leading from Boute
10 to the Bailroad Station at Vera, a distance of approximately
three-quarters of a mile. They also requested that heavy maintenance or commission if possible be done on the section of Route
10 east of Appenattox, and also that the section of State Highway
No. 10 between Appenattox and Concord, a distance of approximately
8 miles, be constructed, which they estimated would seet \$200,000.
The section between Concord and Lynchburg, Rouge 10 was in need of
grading.

Er. J. Sinclair Brown and Senator Holman Willie, of Roanoke, Virginia, them came before the Commission and requested that they continue maintenance on the Bent Mountain Road,

A delegation from Boydton, Virginia, and vicinity consisting of Mesers. Wright, Jeffreys, Smithey, Trumbull, Geo, Rainey, Wesson and others requested the Commission to construct five miles leading from the improvement out of Lawrenceville towards Petersburg, Route 31, They stated that they proposed to Such Khayt Ho, M-P and Madding Co. cometrues a toll bridge under the State Rights Specifications over the Boancke River so that when they requested that this be taken over by the State it would be in accordance to the specifications of the Commission, this would give the nearest route from Richmond to Raleigh, F.C.

A large delegation from Bedford and vicinity come is ting of Messie. Landon Lowry, S. S. Lambeth, Jr. O.L.C.Radford, Hichols, Laste, Dinwiddle and others, came before the Commission and requested an allogation on Route 10 between Force and Montvale. If the Commission could not take this entire stretch of highway they would prefer that any allocation that they might get to be put on the section between Bedford and Porest, starting at Bedford. They also requested that the section of read leading from Bedford to Rocky Mount be added to the State Highway System under the 245 Clause. They agreed to put their convict force on this road and also guaranteed the right of way from the Staumton River through Bedford County free of cost and if condemnation proceedings are necessary they will bear the expense. They also requested that the Commission have their engineer make a survey of this road and Mr. Tabler, County Engineer, of Redford County, would cooperate with him in every may possible. Mr. Bigholmon of Franklin County stated that while he could not guarantee the right of way free of host he was sure there would be no trouble in scouring it.

Mesors . George A. Bowles , Michols , C. B. Harris . Walter Les and Dr. Les appeared before the Commission and requested them to take into the State Highway System a section of the Three Chop Rock Short No. 16-P cell Walder Co. Road starting at Oilville and coming in over Broad Street to Richmond. If the entire distance of about 20 miles could not be added at this time they would appreciate the addition of the section from Oilville to the improved road.

A delegation from the Northern Nock headed by Judge Chinn, Mr. Lewis, Mr. Herris, Mr. Wright, Mr. Mayo, and Mr. De-Shields, came before the Commission and requested that the section of road leading from Wareaw to the Tappaharmook Perzy, and also the section of road from Totunky Bridge to Callac be added to the Stat Highway System under the 24% Clause.

Senator W. W. Smith, Jr. and Mr. Bernard Miller of Culpaper then came before the Commission and requested that the read
leading from Route 37 at Stavemburg by Raccoon Ford. Locust Greve,
and on to Mineral where it would intermed Houte 39, a distance of
approximately 35 miles, be added to the State Highway System under
the 255 Clause.

A delegation from Hanover, and King William Sounties headed by Mr. Cardwell, Mr. Rosewell Page, Mr. Shelton and Mr. Redd, appeared before the Commission and requested that they take into the State Highway System the section of road leading from Route 31 near Pine Camp via Washington-Henry Academy and Sudley to somest with Route 13, under the 25% Claume.

Mr. Page also requested the addition of the road from Coates ville to Locust Creek where it would connect with Route 39.

The Commission than recessed for lunch.

At 2:00 P.K. the Commission again assembled at their office and heard a large delegation from Isle of Wight, Mannemons.

Pack Rheet No. 84-7 nos Walder Co. and vicinity, headed by Columbi Parks Deam, Gen. J.P.Jervey, Lieutement Governor J. E. West, Mr. Birdsong, Mr. Chas.B.Godwyn, Colonel J.B.Pinner, Mr. Causey, Mr. T.P.Thompson, General C. C. Vaughan, Jr. Mr. Walter Taylor and Mrs. Foremen Ellis, and requested an allocation to Route 10 on the 18 miles of unimperoved road between Suffolk and Smithfield.

A delegation from Marfalk and Princess Anne County
headed by Mr. Baldwin Myers, Mr. Paul Veodhouse, Mr. Millhower,
Mr. Boyd, Mr. R. D. Cooke and Mr. Old and requested that the road
leading from Princess Anne Court Rouse to comment with Route Mo.10
be added to the State Hinkway System under the 24% Clause, a distance of approximately 7.5 miles.

Mr. Wilbor Hall came before the Commission and requested that the section of road leading from Purcellville to Castleman's Pridge be included in the State Highway swien under the 24% Clause a distance of approximately 6.5 miles.

A large delegation from King and Queen, Middlesex, and Gloucester Counties, represented by Attorney General John R. Saunders, Mesers, H.C.Hall, Bagby, Mitchell, Stubbs, and requested the Commission to add to the State Highway System the section of read leading from King and Queen C.H. to Shackelfords, a distance of approximately 12.0 miles.

A committee from Shemandoch, headed by Mr. C. E. Wine, Secretary of the Chamber of Commerce, requested the Commission to allocate funds sufficient to commerce about 5% miles of Route 212 an the couthern end of Page County beginning at Verbens Mill, thems Back Dank No. 16-P ary Rollier Co. in a northern direction through the fown of Shenandcah to the Bridge across the Shemandcah River at Grove Hill.

Measrs. Paxton, Whitemore, and others from Buena Vista and vicinity, appeared before the Commistion and requested that the section of road from the corporate limits of Buena Vista to McCormick's Gate, a distance of approximately 3.1 miles, be added to the State Righway System under the 245 Clause.

The minutes of the meeting held at Richmond, Virginia, February 4th and 5th, 1924 were read and it was moved by Mr. Sanders, seconded by Mr. Sproul, that they be approve. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Messie, seconded by Mr. Sanders, that the application of the Town of Kenbridge to advance \$25,000.00 under the term of the Roberts on Act for the construction of the read beginning at the intersection of Falls Read and Route 20 extending south in the County of Lunenburg for a distance of three-quarters miles, be approved. Mation carried.

Hoved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Truxtum, that an opinion having been given in writing by the Attorney General that the Commission had the right to continue maintenance on the Bent Methods Road between Route 33 near Starkey in Roanoke County and Route 23 near Floyd Court House, that same be done. Metion carried

Hoved by Mr. Truxtum, seconded by Mr. Sproul, that the request of the Auto Directory and uide of Virginia to use the plate of the map of Virginia showing the State and County highway eyetems be granted, provided it will be a facinile of this map. Motion carried.

le Rock Ebert Ko. 45-7 ransta Welfery Co. Moved by Mr. Massis, seconded by Mr.Sanders, that the informal tid of the Maloney Paving Company of Ellerson, Virginia, on Project P-1660, Route 13, 2.9 miles wat of Manquin to 6.6 miles east of Machanicaville, by accepted, amounting to \$44,782.35, and that 10% additional be set uside to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering, making \$49,260.58 and also that \$700.00 for detours and \$823.66 for overhaul be added, making a total chargeable to this Project of \$50.784.24. Motion carried.

Noved by Mr. Truxtun, seconded by Mr. Sanders, that the resolution passed December 16th, 1922, referring to the granting of a permit to the Virginia Railway and Power Company to lay tracks on Route 31 from a point near Stop 65 Colonial Reights south to the North abutment of the proposed bridge be reconsidered by resected in error. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that by reason of an error the sum of \$75,000.00 stated in the resolution passed December 16th, 1922, as a charge against the Virginia Rail-way and Power Company for permit to lay their tracks on Route 1, now known as 31, from a point near Stop 65 Colonial Heights south to the north abutment of the proposed bridge screes the Appenditor River, be emitted and \$75.00 substituted in lieu thereof. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Messie, seconded by Mr. Truxtum, that the Following permits be grapted under the usual rules and regulations:

To erect gas tank, pumps and connecting lines, Route 13, C. R. Sanderson, Farmville, Virginia.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sanders, seconded by Mr. Truxtum, that immemuch as it has come to the attention of the State Highway Commission that Mr. W. R. Winner, State Traffic Officer No. 162, has been conducting himself in a manner that is not for the best interest of the State and it is the opinion of the Commission that his appointsent be annualled, and the same is hereby ordered. Notion carried.

Back Shink St. M.P Jest Tubby Co. Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Truxtum, that the State Highway No. 391 be established from Lebenon Church to Lee Hall intersecting Me. 39 at that point. Motion carried.

A delegation from Lee County, represented by Mr. Russell and Mr. Laningham, requested the State Highway Commission to add to the State Highway System under the 24% Clause the section of road leading from Pennington Gap north to the Kentucky State Line, and stated they would advance the money under the Roberts on Act for its construction.

A delegation from Wise County headed by Messes . Lay, Frank, Chalkley, and Dickemon, appeared before the Counts ion and requested an allocation on Route No. 11 between St. Paul and the Lee County Line, and also requested that 4000 feet of road which has not been improved between Donkey and Pound be hard surfaced.

The meeting them adjourned until the next day.

MARCH 5th. 1924.

On the morning of March 5th, all members of the State Highway Commission, assembled at their office, and the meeting was called to order by the Chairman.

A large delegation interested in the road between Chase City and Burkeville, represented by Messrs. Epes, Jeffreys, Oslin, Gohagan, and Patterson, requested that this road from Chase City to Rehaboth, Lumenburg, Victoria, to Burkeville be taken into the State Highway System under the 24% Clause.

Mesers . Amos , Rew, and Mathems from Accome County re-

Back Blook No. 88-7 THE Worldby Co. quested the Commission to construct Route No. 34 starting at the Maryland Line and running south.

A delegation from Orange County and vicinity, headed by Resers. Shackelford, Robertson and Judge Browning, came before the Commission and requested that the section of road from the end of State Highway No. 374 near Rhodes ville to Vilderness be added to the State Highway System under the 256 Clause.

Mesers. William, Palling, Powell, Lay, Norris, and Ball appeared before the Commission and requested them to add to the State Highway System the section of road leading from Leasburg to Washington.

A delegation from Patrick County, represented by Mr. Clark, requested an allegation on Route No. 12 west of Stuart.

The Buchanan County delegation represented by Mesers.

Saundors and Combs, requested an allocation on Bouts 111 between Raven and Grundy.

A delegation from Scott County, headed by Hesers. Dodson Quillen, St. Martin and Johnson, requested that the section of road leading from Gate City by Dangannon to Goeburn be added to the State Highway System under the 216 Clause.

Major Grump and Mr. Saunders, appeared before the Commission in behalf of the Montpelier Road from Solomon's Store by lies Allen to Montpelier and requested that this road be included in the State Highway System,

Mr. Lane of Altavieta, Virginia, came before the Commission and requested that the section of road leading from Altaviata Real Mart No. 18-7

wast by Huddleston and Moneta to Roanoke be added to the Highway Typitem under the 21% Clause.

Hoved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that \$10,000.00 be appropriated to connect up the road from Matural Tunnel to Station 90, Route 116. Motion carried.

Mesers. Lewis, and Asha, appeared before the Commission and discussed again the Gloucester Point Ferry and Mr. Asha a tate ed that he had no objection to the Commission making a valuation of his ferry.

Mesure. Fromdes, Smith, Wright, and Judge Fleet, from King and Queen County, requested the Commission to take into the State Highway System the read leading from Route 13 at St. Stephens to the Caroline County Line.

The Commission then adjourned for lunch.

Mesore. Davice, Payne, Baker, Letcher, White, and Hellinger, appeared before the Commission and requested that an allocation be made to Route No. 14 between Clifton Forge and Lexington.

Hess Re. Landreth, Pelts, Carr, Beamer, McClain and others from Carroll and Grays on Counties, appeared before the Commission and requested that they add to the Highway System the road leading from Galax by way of Low Gap to the North Carolina Line under the 24% Clause.

Er. T. M. Gathright of Covington, Virginia, came before the Commission and requested; first, an allocation on Route 17 between Combon and Warm Springs; second, an allocation on Route from Sink that No. 18-7 are Walter Co. State line by Grown to Covington; and third, an allocation to close up a gap between Covington and Low Meor.

Senator Layman then appeared before the Commission and requested that the read from Millbero to Longdale, a distance of approximately 12 miles, be added to the State Highway System under the 21% Clause, also a section from Hagle Rock to Fincastle, and in Giles County a section one and three-eights miles long from Rich Creek to Peterstown, West Virginia.

A delegation from Predericksburg, Colonial Beach and vicinity represented by Mesars. Mason, Williams, Perkins and Sen. Downing, requested that the section of road leading to Colonial Beach from Route 37 be taken into the Highway System under the 245 Clause.

Mesers. Carter, Shelton, and Dr. Day, appeared before the Commission and requested an allocation on Route 31 between Richmond and Washington.

Moved by Mr. Truxtum, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that the Chairman be authorized to notify the Board of Trustess of Mary Baldwin College, Staumton, Virginia, that the Commission will sell fine five norm of land situated in Beverly Manor District, Augusta County, north of Staumton about two miles on the north side of the Valley Pike, to the School for the sum of \$3,000.00, the price placed on this property by Massis. Sanders and Massis. Motion carried. Mr. Sproul not voting.

Senators Barksdale, Booker, and Mr. Adams, came before the Commission and requested that a sufficient amount be allocated Reck Klayl Me. W-P Joyc Wadder Co. to complete Route No. 20 through Charlotte County between Charlotte Court House and Brookness, and stated that they would be satisfied with a gray soil road.

Memore. Miller, Pres, Taylor, Lee McGue, Tayland, and Carroll from Albemarle County, requested an allocation on Route 28 in Albemarle County sufficient to complete the seven mile section.

The meeting then adjourned until the next day.

MARCH 6th, 1924.

On the morning of March 5th, all members of the State Highway Commission assembled at their office and the meeting was called to order by the Chairman.

A large delegation from Reports, Jarratt, Stony Greek, Camon, Petersburg and Richmond, represented by Mosset. H. E. Gaodwin, W. R. Cate, J. L. Vincent, Tiller, John Buck. B. F. Jarratt, Peter B. Howard, Dr. Prevry, Gawthrop, Senators, Rogers, Goode, General C. C. Vaughan, Jr. Hon. San. D. Rogers, Dr. Jos. H. Smith, Hohaman and Dan Hollenger, appeared before the Commission and requested that the Halifax Road leading from Petersburg to Emperia be added to the Righmay System under the 24% Clause, a distance of approximately 43 miles.

Messus. Cato. Eanes, Tiller and Vincent, requested that an allocation be made for the bridge at Emporia, this bridge being in a very dangerous condition and stated they thought the Board of Supervisors would be willing to advance the money under the Roberts on Act.

Peck West No. 18-P

Mr. Morris of Imposter requested an allegation on Route 37 from Lancaster Court House, North.

Mr. D. B. Ryland, Secretary of the Chamber of Commerce of Lynchburg, Virginia, requested an allocation on the north and south roads leading out of Lynchburg, either the road leading to Aften or Natural Bridge.

Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Sanders, that the Commission accept the offer of Mr. D. B. Ryland of Lynchburg to advance \$175,000.00 under the terms of the Robertson Act for the commitmetion of Route 18 between Clifford and College. Motion carried.

Here we Rudas 111, White and Gibson, requested the addition to the State Highway System under the 246 Clause, the read between Culpoper and Marrenton. The Board of Supervisors agreed to expend the Culpoper gas tax on this read.

Mr. Rollinger and Dr. Hart requested that the section of road between Coates ville and Locust Creek be added to the State Highway System under the 21% Clause.

Mr. Proffett of Floyd County, requested an allocation on Route 23 between Christiansburg and Floyd, stating at Floyd C. H. to the amount of \$200,000.00.

The Mayor of Radford and Mr. Jordan, appeared before the Commission and requested that the road leading from Route 23 near Riner to Route 10 at Radford, be added to the State Highway System under the 24% Clause, a distance of approximately 54 miles.

Mr. Johnson, Colonel Deam, and General Vaughan, re-

Mich March Mp. 49-2 1911 Tables Ch. quested the Commission to add to the State Highway System under the 21 Clause, the acction of road from Route 10 to Walters, a distance of approximately six miles.

Herare. Catewood, Edward Meets, and Peyton R. Evans, from Amberet County, appeared before the Commission and requested that the section of road leading from Buckingham C.E. by Gladetone to Amberet be added to the State Highway System under the 256 Clause. Mr. Gatewood also requested that the section of road from Route 18 near Amberet to Allwood be added to the System under the 256 Clause for maintenance.

Mrs. Egbert Leigh came before the Commission and requested them to add the section of road between Grange and Rapidan to the Righway System under the 245 Clause.

Senator Goolrick and Mr. Hunter, requested that the read leading from Route 37, known as the King's Highway to the Faval Proving Grounds at Dahlgren, be added to the Highway System under the 23 Clause.

The Commission then recessed for lanch.

Sermitore Leanier, Rogers, General Vaughan and Mr. Campapered before the Commission and requested an allocation on Route 35 of at least \$200,000.00.

General Yaughan, Mr. Edwards and Mr. Pace also requested that a bridge be committeed over the Nottonay River at Smith's Ferry which they estimate could be committeed, with the approaches for \$100,000.00.

Mr. Walker, member of the Board of Supervisors of Bor-

Rack Mark Ma. 18-17 Jern Walkly Co. thunberland County, requested an allocation for his County.

Dr. Chinn, Mr. Moss and Mr. Newton, appeared before the Commission and requested an allegation on the highway leading out of Fredericks burg down the Morthern Neok.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the contractor, W. C. Campbell, Weshington, Virginia on Project 357A&B Route 21, Bridges over Big and Little Cattail Run, be granted an extension of time to March let, 1924, as per recommendation of Mr. C. S. Mullen, Acting Commissioner. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxtum, seconded by Mr. Sproul, that all bids be rejected on Project 326, Route 40, Deep Oreck-Morth Carolina Line, and that the Chairman be authorized to enter into a contract with the Road Commission of Norfolk County if some satisfactory agrangement hould be made whereby this road could be constructed. Motion carried.

Thereas, all bids received for the committation of Route 40, Project 326. Deep Greek-Horth Carolina Line, having been rejected on account of being too high, it was moved by Mr. Truxtum, escended by Mr. Sanders, that the informal bid of the Road Commission of Horfolk County for the committation of this Project be accepted and a contract be entered into with said Road Commission of Horfolk County for doing this work, their bid amounting to \$306,753.60, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering, making \$337,428.96 and also that \$5,000.00 be set aside for detour, making a total chargeable to this Project of \$342,428.96. Motion carried.

ou Walle Co.

A delegation from Yorktown, York County and vicinity, headed by Mosers. Floyd Holladay, Dovell, Henley, Holt and Millstead then came before the Commission and requested that the section of road leading from Yorktown to Sinclair's Cate, be added to the Highway System under the 24% Claure, a distance of about nine miles.

A number of people interested in the Montpelier Road then came before the Commission and requested that this road from Soluments Store by Olen Allen to Montpelier be added to the State System under the 215 Clause.

The Board of Supervisors of Arlington County, Senator Ball and Judge Clarks, appeared before the Commission and requests ed that the Globe Road leading from Chain Bridge to Alexandria, a distance of approximately 9.4 miles, be added to the Highway Systen under the 21% Clame.

General Pickings and Mr. Langbourne Villiams then came before the Commission in behalf of the road leading from Route 37 to the Mayal Proving Grounds at Dablgren. They requested that this road beadded to the Highway System under the 246 Clause.

Moved by Mr. Sanders, ascended by Mr. Sproul, that the Chairman be authorised to purchase the gravel pit in Chapterfield County if the owners will not agree to extend this option. Motion carried.

The meeting then adjourned, subject to the call of the Chairmana
