### MINUTES OF MEETING OF STATE HIGHWAY AND TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION

### Richmond, Virginia

### March 20, 1975

The monthly meeting of the State Highway and Transportation Commission was held at the Central Highway Office in Richmond, Virginia, on March 20, 1975, at 10 a.m. The Chairman, Mr. Douglas B. Fügate, presided.

Present: Messrs. Fugate, Beeton, Crowe, Fralin, Glass, Hall, Rassell, Hooper, Janney, Landes and Roos.

On motion of Mr. Hassell, seconded by Mr. Crowe, the minutes of the meeting of February 20, 1975, were approved.

On motion of Mr. Hassell, seconded by Mr. Crowe, permits issued from February 20, 1975, to March 19, 1975, inclusive, as shown by records of the Department, were approved.

Motion was made by Mr. Hassell, seconded by Mr. Crowe, that cancellation of permits from February 20, 1975, to March 19, 1975, inclusive, as shown by records of the Department, be approved. Motion carried.

Mr. John Wray. Director of Operations, presented an up-to-date report to the Commission on the highway situation resulting from the heavy rains over the State.

Mr. Harwood informed the Commission about an agreement for purchase of sand from the property of one of our employees, Mr. George B. Edwards, Emporia, since this is the only material in the area and the price is in line with what we had been paying for this type of material. Motion was made by Mr. Beeton, seconded by Mr. Landes, that the Commission authorize execution of the agreement.

Moved by Mr. Beeton, seconded by Mr. Landes,

that

WHEREAS, under authority of Section 33.1-43 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, request is made by the Town of Poquoson for maintenance payments on additional streets meeting required standards;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that quarterly payments be made to the Town of Poquoson on additional streets, totaling 0.52 mile, and meeting required standards under the aforementioned section of the Code, effective April 1, 1975, for the quarterly payments due after June 30, 1975. The additional streets and mileage eligible for payment are described as follows:

The additional streets and mileage eligible for payment are described on attached tabulation sheets numbered 1 through 5, dated January 1, 1975.

These additions, totaling 6.00 miles, increase the total mileage in the City of Buena Vista from 24.67 miles to 30.67 miles of approved streets subject to payment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33.1-144 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, 0.13 mile of old Route 522, shown in yellow and designated as Sections 1 and 4 on the plat dated January 2, 1975, Project 0522-034-101, C-503, be discontinued as a part of the State Highway System; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33.1-35 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, 1.23 miles of old Route 522, shown in red and designated as Sections 2 and 3 on the plat and project referred to hereinabove, be transferred from the Primary System to the Secondary System of Highways.

WHEREAS, the Highway and Transportation Department has received requests for the erection of signs on Interstate Highways for Information Stations; and

WHEREAS, to date requests have come from a City and an Association sponsored by thirteen Counties; and

WHEREAS, the State Travel Service of the Conservation and Economic Development Department is in accord with the development of Information Stations; and

WHEREAS, these Information Stations provide a definite service needed by motorists; and

WHEREAS, the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices of the Federal Government allows signing on Interstate Highways for Information Stations provided a policy is adopted that incorporates the same signing principles as used for stations located on the Interstate; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that criteria governing the approval of such signing is necessary;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the following criteria are established for approval of signs for Information Stations located off Interstate rights of way:

- Facility must be operated by or sponsored by one or more local governmental units and as a non-profit organization.
- Must be open 8 hours daily, seven days a week.
- Information available for attractions in Virginia.
- Operation and need for station must be approved by Commissioner of State Travel Service of the Department of Conservation and Economic Development.
- If located in a city, the city must agree to trailblaze from Interchange to station location.
- In the event that the station is not operated or maintained to the satisfaction of the Highway and Transportation Department, the signs will be removed.

WHEREAS, Interstate Route 77 in Bland County has been constructed on new location as shown on plans for Project 0077-010-102, C-504; 103, C-501; and

WHEREAS, the construction of Interstate Route 77 necessitates alterations on the Interstate System and on sections of U. S. Route 21, one section of existing Route 21 is no longer necessary as a public road, the new road serving the same citizens as the old, four sections are no longer necessary for purposes of the State Highway System, and one section is to be transferred to the Secondary System of Highways;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33.I-148 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, a total of 0.10 mile of present Route 21, shown in blue and indicated as Section 4 on the plat dated October 8, 1974, Project 0077-010-102, C-504; 103, C-501, be abandoned as a part of the State Highway System; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33.1-35 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, 0.55 mile of present Route 21, shown in red and indicated as Section 7 on the plat and project referred to hereinabove, be transferred from the Primary System to the Secondary System of Highways; and

WHEREAS, Section 33.1-221 of the Code of Yirginia provides a fund of \$2,500,000 to "... be expended by the Commission for constructing, reconstructing, maintaining or improving access roads within counties, cities and towns to industrial sites on which manufacturing, processing or other establishments will be built under firm contract or are already constructed."; and

WHEREAS, as a result of a request by the Town Council of Alberta and the Brunswick County Board of Supervisors, this Commission did by resolution of February 15, 1973, allocate \$60,000 to provide access to the new facility of Servicemaster Equipment and Materials Company, in Alberta in Brunswick County; and

WHEREAS, this allocation was contingent upon the industry's entering into a firm contract for the construction of its facility; and

MHEREAS, since Servicemaster Equipment and Materials Company has recently expanded another of its facilities in Cairo, Illinois, and does not now have definite plans for locating in Alberta, the Town Council of Alberta and the Board of Supervisors of Brunswick County have by resolutions of February 10, 1975, and February 24, 1975, respectively, withdrawn their request for this allocation;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the allocation of \$60,000 from the 1972-73 industrial access fund to provide access to the new facility of Servicemaster Equipment and Materials Company. In Alberta in Brunswick County, Project 1424-012-161, C-501; 1424-161-162, C-501, is hereby withdrawn and reassigned to the unallocated industrial access fund.

WHEREAS, Section 33.1-22? of the Code of Virginia provides a fund of \$2,500,000 to "... be expended by the Commission for constructing, reconstructing, maintaining or improving access roads within counties, cities and towns to industrial sites on which manufacturing, processing or other establishments will be built under firm contract or are already constructed."; and

WHEREAS, as a result of a request by the Board of Supervisors of Lunenburg County, this Commission did by resolution of May 20, 1971, allocate \$22,000 from the industrial access fund to provide proper access to the expanding facility of Commonwealth Tobacco Company, Incorporated, on Route 748 in Lunenburg County; and

WHEREAS, this allocation was contingent upon the necessary right of way and adjustment of utilities being provided at no cost to the industrial access fund; and

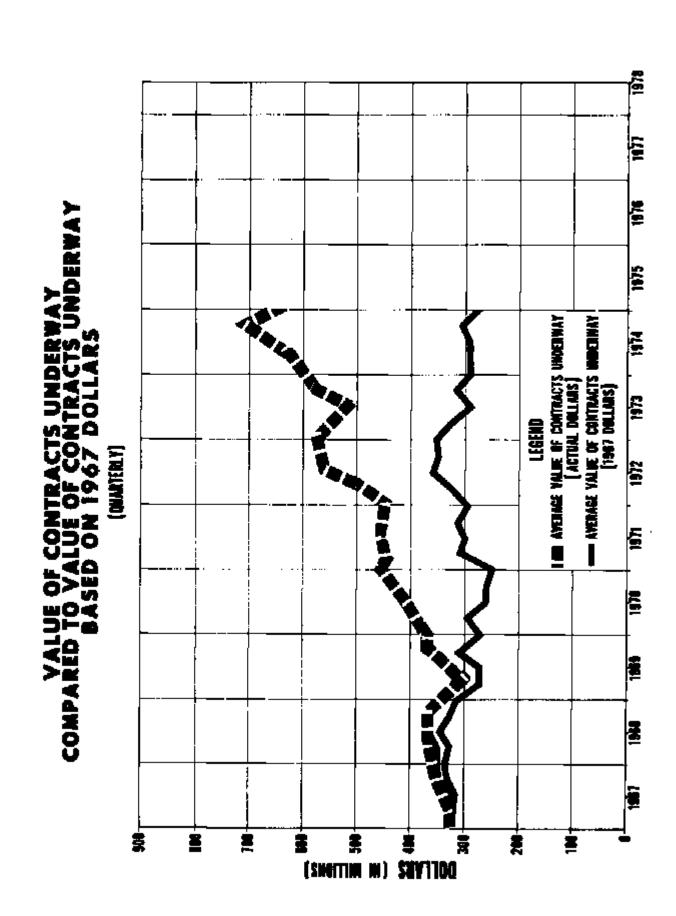
WHEREAS, the Goard of Supervisors of Lunenburg County has by resolution of January 10, 1975, rescinded its original resolution of request dated April 9, 1971, because the right of way cannot be provided in accordance with the contingency of the Commission's resolution;

MOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the allocation of \$22,000 made from the 1971-72 industrial access fund to provide proper access to the expanding facility of Commonwealth Tobacco Company, Incorporated, on Route 748 in Lunenburg County, Project 0748-055-140, C-501, is hereby withdrawn and reassigned to the unallocated industrial access fund.

### MOTION CARRIED

In regard to the financial situation, Mr. Fugate reported that it has not changed from the projection that was made last fall. He pointed out that we are two months along the blue line on the chart, from January 1975, and that the balance at the end of February was \$1.5 million and that he didn't see any change in the next few months. He said the income picture looked a little bit better than we might have expected because as yet there has been no action at the Federal level to impose additional taxes or to implement the full tariff that the President proposed putting on some imports of petroleum. Therefore, the gasoline taxes in January, which is the last figure we have, were 6% higher than January of 1974, which had been 6% lower than January 1973. The plan still remains that if after a real close analysis of 1975 revenue through March, and another look at the probable future course of Federal action to reduce consumption of petroleum, we will advise the Governor as to the wisdom of borrowing about \$25 million against 1976 revenues so advertising of contracts may begin in May rather than September. There has been a great deal of misinformation going around as to how much Federal aid money Virginia has and whether or not we are going to lose it. etc. We have \$48 million of 1974-75 funds and that is out of a total of \$187 million. So we have used out of that available for this fiscal year all but \$48 million. There is no chance of our losing this money--it will be available for three years from June 30, 1976. We have always been ahead in our program and as you can see, Virginia has now dropped because we haven't advertised any projects in the last few months--dropped from first to third place. Missouri and Alabama are ahead of us. Any rumor that we are going to lose funds is entirely without foundation. We haven't used it because, first, we didn't have the matching funds; second, if we did have the matching funds, a sizeable amount of the \$48 million is for safety projects, such as railroad crossing protection, which take time to implement, and the remainder is for urban construction which requires environmental statements, coordination with local officials and other time-consuming planning. In addition to the \$48 million, we have 1975-76 Federal-aid now available; and we can start collecting right of way costs and construction estimates on contracts under way after July 1.

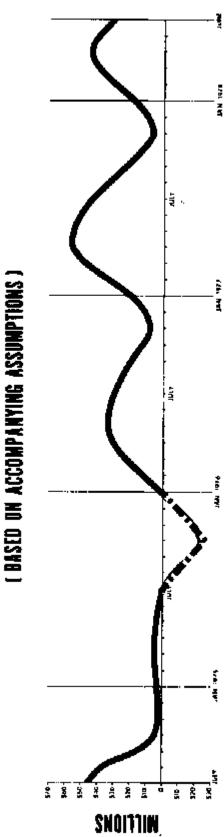

WHEREAS, in connection with Route 119, now Houte 419, State Highway Project 0119-080-102, C-502, the Commonwealth acquired certain lands from P. D. Gravett by deed dated August 7, 1963 as recorded in Deed Book 725, Page 93 in the Office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Roanoke County; and

WHEREAS, the owner of the edjoining property has requested that we convey to him any excess land lying in the southwest corner of the intersection of Route 713 and Route 419; and

WHEREAS, the plans have been revised to show a revised southwest proposed right of way line from a point opposite Station 137+43 (proposed S.B.L. centerline) to a point opposite Station 138+65 (proposed S.B.L. centerline); and

WHEREAS, the State Highway and Transportation Commissioner has certified in writing that the land lying between the southwest revised proposed right of way line and the southwest proposed right of way line from a point 58 feet opposite Station 137+43 (proposed S.B.L. centerline) to a point 98 feet opposite Station 138+65 (proposed S.B.L. centerline) does not constitute a section of the public road and is deemed by him no longer necessary for the uses of the State Highway System.

NOW, THEREFORE, the conveyance of the said parcel of land in accordance with the provisions of § 33.1-149 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended, is approved and the State Highway and Transportation Commissioner is hereby authorized to execute in the name of the Commonwealth a deed conveying same, without warranty, to the adjoining landowner of record for a consideration satisfactory to the State Right of Way Engineer and subject to such restrictions as may be deemed requisite.

WHEREAS, in connection with the Richmond-Petersburg Turnpike, now Route 95, State Highway Project 7095-020-101, RW-202, the Commonwealth acquired certain lands, a portion of which lies outside of the normal right of way line, from Sam A. Mason, II and Venita F. Mason by deed dated July 19, 1957 as recorded in Deed Book 530, Page 50 in the Office of the Clark of the Circuit Court of Chesterfield County; and

WHEREAS, the County of Chesterfield is constructing a sanitary sewer line and a water line and in so doing wishes to acquire a 16 foot permanent easement and a 20 foot construction easement for a sewer line and a 20 foot permanent easement and a 10 foot construction easement for the water line. These easements will cross over, upon and beneath the lands of the aforesaid lying east of the east proposed right of way and limited access line of Route 95; and

WHEREAS, the State Highway and Transportation Commissioner has certified to the Commission that he deems it expedient to convey to the County of Chesterfield the easements for the said sewer and water lines.

NOW, THEREFORE, in accordance with the provisions of § 2.1-6 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended, the State Highway and Transportation Commissioner is hereby authorized to execute a deed in the name of the Commonwealth conveying such easements to the County of Chesterfield in such form and subject to such restrictions and conditions as he may deem proper.

Motion carried.

Mr. Janney said he would like to comment on the fact that our personnel had really been working toward keeping up with the problem of reduced revenues, as evidenced by the many explanatory reports prepared.

After a presentation of right of way procedures by Mr. A. S. Mattox, Mr. Hooper commented on the smoothness with which the Department personnel worked with the power companies, etc.

The next Commission meeting will be April 17, 1975.
