# MINUTES OF MEETING OF STATE HIGHWAY AND TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION

# Richmond, Virginia

March 21, 1985

The monthly meeting of the State Highway and Transportation Commission was held in the Central Office in Richmond, Virginia, on March 21, 1985, at 10:00 a.m. The chairman, Mr. Harold C. King, presided.

Present: Messrs. King, Bacon, Brydges, Forrester, Guiffre, Humphreys, Quicke, Smalley, Smith and Vaughan and Mrs. Kincheloe.

Absent: Mr. Davidson.

On motion of Mr. Brydges, seconded by Mr. Smalley, the minutes of the meetings of January 17, 1985, and February 21, 1985, were approved.

On motion of Mr. Brydges, seconded by Mr. Smalley, permits issued from February 21, 1985, to March 20, 1985, inclusive, as shown by records of the Department, were approved.

Motion was made by Mr. Brydges, seconded by Mr. Smalley, that cancellation of permits from February 21, 1985, to March 20, 1985, inclusive, as shown by records of the Department, be approved.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Brydges, seconded by Mr. Smalley, that the Commission approve additions to the Secondary System from February 21, 1985, to March 20, 1985, inclusive, as shown by records of the Department.

Moved by Mr. Brydges, seconded by Mr. Smalley, that

WHEREAS, Alt. Route 57 in Henry County has been altered and reconstructed as shown on plans for Project 7057-044-104, PE-101, M-501, RW-201; and

WHEREAS, the construction of Alt. Route 57 necessitates alterations on sections of Alt. Route 57, one section of the old location of Alt. Route 57 is no longer necessary as a public road, the new road serving the same citizens as the old and two sections are no longer necessary for purposes of the State Highway System;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33.1-148 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, 0.04 mile of old location of Alt. Route 57, shown in blue on sketch no. 1 and designated as Section 1 on the plat dated November 29, 1984, Project 7057-044-104, PE-101, M-501, RW-201, be abandoned as a part of the State Highway System;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33.1-144 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, 0.21 mile of the old location of Alt. Route 57, shown in yellow and designated as Section 2 on sketch no. I plat dated November 29, 1984, and Section 1 on sketch no. 2 plat dated October 3, 1984, and project referred to hereinabove, be discontinued as a part of the State Highway System.

- Shall provide full service vehicle services including fuel, oil, tire repair, free compressed air for tire inflation and water for battery and radiator. Availability of full service vehicle services shall be made clearly evident to motorists by the posting of conspicuous signs on the premises of the business establishment.
- Shall provide separate public rest rooms for male and female persons, and each such rest room shall contain sink with running water for hand washing and flush toilet.
- 4. Shall provide a drinking water fountain for public use.
- Shall be in continuous operation at least 16 consecutive hours daily, 7 days a week.
- Shall provide public telephone.

WHEREAS, on November 26, 1957, the State Righway Commission established rules and regulations governing use of the Hampton Roads Tunnel, as provided by Section 33-252 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended: and

WHEREAS, on October 29, 1970, the State Highway Commission adopted the Rules and Regulations Governing the Use of Big Walker Mountain Tunnel and East River Mountain Tunnel on Route I-77; and

WHEREAS, under Section 33.1-19 of the Code of Virginia, any such rule or regulation shall have the force and effect of law; and

WHEREAS, traffic and engineering studies undertaken by the Department of Highways and Transportation have revealed that twenty-two (22) tractor-trailer truck accidents involving four (4) fatalities and sixteen (16) injuries have occurred on Route 17 between the interchange of Interstate 66 near Marshall and the intersection of Route 29/15 in the Town of Warrenton since April 1, 1962; and

WHEREAS, because of the serious problem of tractor-trailer truck involvement in accidents on this highway which poses an ongoing problem given the ten foot (10') travel lanes and horizontal alignment of this rural two lane highway; and

WHEREAS, the occurrence of such accidents has dramatically increased since an initial safety study was completed by VDH&T in April 1982 regarding this roadway; and

WHEREAS, due to a similar problem on Route 15 from the interchange of Interstate 66 near Haymarket to the intersection of Route 29 that would arise because of the steps taken in reference to Route 17; and

WHEREAS, the portions of Route 17 and Route 15 described above are part of the state highway system and under the jurisdiction of the State Highway and Transportation Commission; and

WHEREAS, on November 15, 1984, the State Highway and Transportation Commissioner temporarily restricted the use of a 10.35 mile section of Route 17 in Fauquier County between the interchange of Interstate 66 near Marshall to the intersection of Route 29/15 in the Town of Warrenton and a 3.13 mile section of Route 15 in Prince William County between the interchange of Interstate 66 near Haymarket to the intersection of Route 29 by prohibiting the operation of vehicles which have two or more axles and six or more tires on those highways; and

WHEREAS, on January 15, 1985, the Commissioner extended the temporary closure to allow for the further study of the unsafe conditions, the effect of the temporary restriction, the receipt of public comment, and full consideration and final action by this Commission, and

WHEREAS, a comprehensive, in-depth analysis undertaken since the temporary closure has revealed that the closure imposed no appreciable negative impact on other area highway facilities, and has confirmed that the restriction as to tractor trailers is necessary for the safe use of the traveling public on the roadways in question:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that, based on the above reasons, traffic and enignearing studies undertaken by the Virginia Department of Highways and Transportation prior to and since the temporary vehicle restrictions imposed on Routes 17 and 15, and public comment received, those sections of Routes 17 and 15 referred to above are hereby closed, effective this date, to the operation of tractor truck trailers and tractor truck semitrailers as defined in Section 46.1-1 of the Code of Virginia, until the reconstruction of Route 17 from Warrenton to Marshall as a four lane, divided roadway is completed, or until this regulation is otherwise modified, amended or repealed by the Commission; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Dixon was possessed of boundless energy which he channeled for providing the improvement of the quality of life for the citizens of Rockbridge County; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Dixon was a member of the Rockbridge County Board of Supervisors and certainly his efforts on the Board have benefited Rockbridge County as a whole; and

WHEREAS, Richard S. Kline, Inc. has made restitution to the State of Maryland for damages incurred as a result of their collusive activity on public contracts in that state, has adopted an antitrust compliance program so as to prevent future collusive activity by its employees, has cooperated with the Attorney General's Office in its investigation of bidrigging and has represented it was not involved in any collusive activity in Virginia;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Rule 10 (D) of the Policy and Procedures for Debarment of Contracorts that it is in the public interest that Richard S. Kline's debarment be modified to permit reinstatement to VDH&T's list of prequalified bidders based upon the above recited reasons; and
