Messrs. Howard H. Newlon, Jr., Research Director, W. T. McKeel, Jr., Research Scientist, W. S. Ferguson, Senior Research Scientist, and M. A. Perfater, Research Scientist, reported to the Board on the Highway and Transportation Research Council's Program.

Messrs. J. S. Hodge, Director of Engineering, and John M. Wray, Jr., Chief Engineer, previewed for the board their presentations to be given to the Governor's Commission on Transportation in the 21st Century on March 22, 1986, regarding preconstruction and construction activities.

Mr. Bacon discussed the plans of the National Park Service to restore the Cumberland Gap area in Southwest Virginia. He is concerned that the plans of the Park Service now call for a two-lane entrance to the Cumberland Gap area from Virginia while Tennessee and Kentucky will have access by four-lane highways. After discussion, it was decided that the Highway and Transportation Department will assemble information on this project and forward it to the Board. Our attorneys will be asked to draft an appropriate resolution for Board action as soon as possible to request consideration of providing Virginia with a four-lane highway on Park Service property for access to the Gap area.

Following a discussion of urban maintenance payments for all cities and towns, motion was made by Mr. Davidson, seconded by Mr. Quicke, that the Board approve the reporting requirements as contained in Mr. Pethtel's letter of March 24, 1986 to all municipalities, copy attached.

Motion carried.

The next regular meeting will be held in Richmond on April 17, 1986. A workshop will be held following the regular meeting.

The meeting adjourned at 12:10 p.m.

Urban Maintenance Payments

(TO ALL MUNICIPALITIES)

I am writing in regard to the meetings that have been held between the department, the Virginia Municipal League, representatives of the cities of Christiansburg, Charlottesville, Lynchburg, and Richmond, and the Auditor of Public Accounts concerning Urban Maintenance Payments. The items of concern that were discussed relate to the definition of maintenance, reporting requirements, record keeping and audit requirements, and fund carryover provisions.

The purpose of this letter is to inform you of my decision with regard to each of these items. You will receive more detailed information and instructions at a later date from the State Urban Engineer.

EXPANDED DEFINITION OF MAINTENANCE

Consistent with the statutory authority granted to the Commissioner, I have agreed to expand the definition of maintenance to include the following categories.

- 1. Storm drainage replacement for undersized culverts
- Minor payement widening where tractor trailers run off the pavement or intersection radii need to be increased to accommodate turning movements
- Reconstruction or replacement of roadbeds or sidewalks where they are deteriorated beyond repair
- Plant mix overlays for streets previously only surface treated
- Higher grade materials, such as traffic signs and paint, than originally used

- 6. High-intensity pavement marking devices on roadways
- 7. Traffic control devices upgrading and replacement
- Barriers or guardrails to protect traffic control cabinets when the barrier or guardrail is immediately adjacent to the cabinet.

These categories will be added to the list of Authorized Ordinary Maintenance and Maintenance Replacement Activities for Eligible Municipal Streets dated July 1, 1985.

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

With the concurrence of the Highway and Transportation Board, our previous reporting requirements will be amended. In the future, municipalities will be required to report quarterly to the department only the total amounts expended by two categories, Arterial and Collector/Local streets. Each municipality will still be required to certify that none of the money received has been expended for other than maintenance of the streets.

AUDIT AND RECORD KEEPING REQUIREMENTS

The Code of Virginia requires an annual audit. Therefore, in order to support the audit requirement, municipalities will be asked to record the receipts and expenditures related to maintenance on eligible streets in a separate account or fund. The account or fund should contain sufficiently detailed information to determine the sources of all receipts and identify all expenditures of such montes. Expenditures should be identifiable with the particular system and eligible street or identified by other cost coding mechanisms such as project numbers, workorder numbers, etc. (The accounting for State urban maintenance payments is anticipated to be similar to those procedures already followed by localities for individual federal grant funds.)

The records maintained by each municipality must meet reasonable audit tests to support the municipality's statutory certification requirement and the Department of Highways and Transportation's statutory audit requirement. Auditors of this department will continue to make annual audits in this regard until such time as the Auditor of Public Accounts can include this requirement in the audit specifications for CPA firms conducting audits of cities and towns.

CARRYOVER PROVISIONS

With regard to the discussion of fund carryover, I am pleased to inform you that a carryover may be authorized to the extent that a municipality has contractual obligations which have anticipated payout after the end of the fiscal year. In the event a municipality has an extraordinary maintenance requirement for which a contractual obligation is not feesible, such items may be. authorized for carryover on a case-by-case basis.

I am pleased that we could work cooperatively on clarifying this matter, and I appreciate the time and effort of all of those who participated in these discussions and meetings.
