MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE STATE HIGH-  
WAY COMMISSION HELD AT RICHMOND, VA.,  
APRIL 1st, 1926.

The State Highway Commission consisting of Messrs. H. G. Shirley, Chairman, Wade H. Maxie, secretary, Hugh B. Spreul, I. Wilke Truxton, and A. J. Huff, met at their office, State Office Building, Richmond, on April 1st, 1926.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman.

Messrs. E. A. Sneed, Captain, Letcher, Ben McNamee, Moore, T. M. Gathright, and others appeared before the Commission and requested that the Commission complete the link between Lexington and Longdale, Route 14. They stated that West Virginia was ready to let a contract to the West Virginia - Virginia Line and that tourists from many parts of the country would go over this route as it is the central route of the United States. Below the snow blocked routes of the north. Also that if this route had been constructed many years ago to the Ohio and Mississippi Valleys the New York of the country would have been at Hampton Roads. They considered it the most important link on any through highway in Virginia and would be of benefit to the whole State as well as locally.

The minutes of the meeting of the Commission held March 3, 1926, were read and it was moved by Mr. Huff, seconded by Mr. Spreul, that they be approved. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Huff, that the contract for the construction of a concrete road in the Town of Altavista, Route 14, Project #1340, be awarded to the low bidder, Moore and Brooks, Staunton, Virginia, at their bid of \$34,400.05 and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the

cost of contingencies and engineering and \$400.00 for detours, making a total of approximately \$39,000.00 chargeable to this Project, and that an allocation of \$3,000.00 additional be made available from the Motor Fuel Tax to cover the State's portion of this work in addition to the \$30,000.00 advanced under the Robertson Act, and the amount put up by the Town. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Huff, that the contract for the construction of a bituminous macadam road, Route 102, Project S-428, Intersection Route 10 to the Tennessee line, be awarded to the low bidder, E. V. St. Martin, Gate City, Virginia, at his bid of \$42,338.75, setting aside 10% additional to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering and \$600.00 for detours, making a total of approximately \$48,000.00 chargeable to this Project, and that an allocation of \$3,000.00 additional be made out of funds available to complete this contract. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the contract for the construction of a bridge over Roanoke River, 1.8 Miles East of Salem, route 10, Project F-432, be awarded to the low bidder, Roanoke Iron and Bridge Works, Roanoke, Virginia, at their bid of \$15,620.25 and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering, making a total of approximately \$18,000.00 chargeable to this Project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Truxton, that the contract for the construction of a Bridge over Mud Lick Run, 3.8 Miles East of Salem, Route 10, Project F-433, be awarded to the low bidder, Clark and Lewis, Luray, Va., at their bid of \$5,227.05 and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering and \$100.00 for detour, making a total of approximately \$6,000.00 chargeable to this Project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Huff, seconded by Mr. Truxton, that the contract for  
the construction of a bridge over Beaver Dam Creek at Damascus, Route 12, Pro-  
ject S-437, be awarded to the low bidder, Meadowview Construction Company,  
Meadowview, Virginia, at their unit prices bid, provided they will take this  
contract on a new design, the town agreeing to pay for the cost of the side  
walks, and that an allocation is hereby made from funds available to cover  
this contract. Motion carried.

A delegation representing Danville, Chatham, Greene, Alta Vista, Lynch-  
burg, and Pittsylvania County, consisting of Messrs. Starling, Holland, Glass,  
Riner, Handley, Adams, Watson, and Ramsey, appeared before the Commission re-  
questing that all funds coming to the Lynchburg District be allocated to Route  
14 as they considered this the most important road in the District and should  
be completed just as soon as possible.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Truxton, that the Chairman be  
authorized to immediately return to Louisa County the \$200,000.00 advanced un-  
der the Robertson Act for the construction of a section of Route 39 from near  
Penleton to the Albemarle County line. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sproul, that the request of the  
Board of Supervisors of Mathews County that the agreement to advance \$50,000.00  
under the Robertson Act be cancelled, be granted. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the Commission ac-  
cept an advancement of \$200,000.00 under the Robertson Act for the construction  
of a section of Route 212 in Page County, as provided by a special act of the  
1926 legislature. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Truxton, that, whereas the Com-  
mission offered by resolution on February 25, 1925, to accept an advancement of

\$50,000.00 from the Board of Supervisors of Bath County under the Robertson Act for the construction of a section of Route 17, from Top of the Mountain towards Warm Springs, and whereas, this offer has not been accepted, it be hereby withdrawn and the Board so notified. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. Huff, that an extension of time be granted Atkinson and Williams on Project 385, Route 24, Bridge over the Meherrin River at Emporia, to December 15, 1925, as per recommendation of Chief Engineer Mallon. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sproul, that an extension of time be granted E. E. Cornett and Company, on Project 3-245, Route 115, Laurel Commission - Kentucky State Line to September 30, 1925, as per recommendation of Chief Engineer Mallon. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Truxton, that the following Permits be granted under the Rules and Regulations of the Commission:

To T. W. Ayers, Draper, Virginia, to erect 60 poles along Route 10 between Draper and Meadow, Virginia.

To Town of Berryville to lay a pipe line across State Highway No. 376 in the North end of Berryville,

To E. A. Brizzolara, Orange, Virginia, to grade bank on Route 32 for a distance of 600 feet near Woodberry Forest Road,

To Butler Brothers, Portsmouth, Virginia, to install a  $\frac{3}{4}$ " pipe at residence of R. G. Thompson on Route 40,

To Central Virginia Power Company, Roanoke, Virginia, to cross Route 322 approximately 3 miles south of Amherst with electric power line,

To Virginia Electric & Power Company, to erect 250 poles along Route 39 between Williamsburg and Toano,

To Virginia Electric & Power Company, to erect 150 poles along Route 391 between Lee Hall and Yorktown,

To Virginia Electric & Power Company, to erect 300 poles along Route 39 between Williamsburg and Camp Eustis. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Masie, seconded by Mr. Truxton, that R. W. Wehrs, Roads Engineer, be appointed Special Traffic Officer in place of C. W. Blake, deceased. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. Masie, that the Chairman be authorized to cooperate with our neighboring States and the U.S. Government in working out and marking Interstate Routes and revising the State Route Numbers so as to conform therewith. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Masie, that the Chairman be authorized to cooperate with the Department of Agriculture in the inspection of gasoline and pay \$100.00 a month to assist in this work. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. Sproul, that the Commission approve of the stand taken by the Chairman in upholding the action of the District Engineer in laying off Patrollers Damson in Giles County as it is their opinion that such action was for the best interest of the Department and the upkeep of the roads of the State. Motion carried.

Captain Savage appeared before the Commission in regards to the road between Wakefield and Dendron, requesting 7.2 miles be taken into the State System.

Dr. Smith of Independence then came before the Commission and stated that North Carolina was ready and anxious to build their part of the bridge on Route 96 at the State line over New River and requested that the Commission make an allocation for Virginia's part of the work. He also stated that if the Commission would grade the road from Independence to New River they would surface it with gravel at their own expense.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Sproul, that if the people of Sherrills Ford agree to 50' clear right of way through their Town without cost to the Highway Commission, the Commission will build the road through their town with the understanding that the 60' right of way owned by the State will in no way be abandoned and that at any time any buildings are rebuilt they will be set back on the 60' line, but for the present will be allowed to occupy the 5' strips until such time as this width may be needed. Motion carried. Mr. Truxton voting - Nay.

A delegation from the Suffolk District consisting of Mr. Birdsong, Mr. Everette and Mr. Gentry of Gates County, North Carolina, appeared before the Commission and requested that the road from Suffolk to the North Carolina Mine via Whaleyville and Somerton be added to the State Highway System. It being one of the most important roads connecting the two States. They also requested that an overhead crossing at Murray on Route 103 be erected.

Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Huff, that the increases in salary provided by the Legislature be approved and the Chairman be authorized to put such into effect for all employees recommended and are worthy of the increase as provided. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Huff, that in accordance with Chapter 403, Section 5, Acts of 1922, the Commission specify the terminal of the sections of roads added under the 2½ Clauses to the State Highway System,

be as follows:
