

Minutes of the Meeting of the State Highway
Commission of Virginia, Held in
Richmond, April 14, 1952.

On the morning of April 14, 1952, the State Highway Commission,
consisting of Messrs. H. G. Shirley, I. Walks Truxton, H. G. Gilmer and
W. E. East, met in their office in the State Office Building, Richmond, Va.

The meeting was called to order by the Commissioner.

Moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. East, that the minutes
of the meeting of March 26 be approved. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Truxton, that the State
Highway Commission cooperate with the Federal Government in providing the
proper road from Prospect Wharf to McGuire's Wharf, if the present draw
span over Bonnini Creek on Route 371 can be closed. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that request of
Mr. H. C. Watson, Oakley, Va., to remove tree on Route 54, in Accomac
County, be turned down. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that permit #7424, Dickenson County, be granted the Ritter Lumber Company, Fremont,
Va., to construct six truck crossings over Route 121, between McDowell
and Bearin Park, for a period of seven years. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. Truxton, that permit
#11215, issued the George Transfer Co., on Route 31, in Arlington County,
be cancelled, as requested. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Truxton, that permit #11209,
issued the W. E. & P. Company, Richmond, Va., on Route 41 in
Buckingham County, be cancelled as requested. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. East, that permit #11206,
issued the W. E. & P. Company, Richmond, Va., on Route 10, in Goochland
County, be cancelled as requested. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that contract for
purchasing in Princess Anne and Norfolk Counties on Route 10, Project C-2-52,
be awarded the low bidder, Tompall-Johnson Co., Inc., Norfolk, Va., at
their bid of \$20,570.00 for early strength cement, and that 10% additional
be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, making
a total of approximately \$33,000.00 chargeable to this project. Motion
carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Truxton, that the following
permits be granted under the rules and regulations of the Commission.

W. T. Andrews, Richmond, Va., to rebuild entrance to National Cemetery on Route 39.

Appalachian Electric Power Co., Lynchburg, Va., to erect 7 new poles, 1 guy, and construct 2300v single phase distribution line along and across Route 18 and across Route 31E.

Appalachian Electric Power Co., Roanoke, Va., to construct five crossings over Route 17 between Trinity and Troutville.

Appalachian Electric Power Co., Bluefield, West Va., to erect an extension to present 4000v power line over and along Route 11E between Saltville and North Holston.

Appalachian Electric Power Co., Bluefield, West Va., to erect single phase 2300v distribution line over and along Route 35, in Giles County.

Arlington County Board of Supervisors, Clarendon, Va., to install 3/4" water service to premises of Isabella Dadd, Route 31.

J. C. Ashley, Bristol, Va., to construct entrance to filling station on Route 18, about 600 ft. east of Bristol City Limits.

Elmer G. Atkins, Sperryville, Va., to grade entrance to filling station and tourist camp on Route 31, about two miles west of Sperryville.

Brunswick Chapter, U. D. C., Lawrenceville, Va., to erect granite boulder at intersection of Routes 31 and 402, three miles south of Midway.

C. H. Carter, Steeles Tavern, Va., to construct entrance to filling station and tourist camp on Route 38 about 0.8 mile north of Midway.

C. & O. Railway Co., Richmond, Va., to paint river gauge on north piers of highway bridges over James River at Scottsville and Midway.

C. & P. Telephone Co., of Va., Richmond, Va., to excavate one type "Y" manhole on west side of Route 31, about 1800 ft. south of Warwick Avenue.

G. E. Clarkson, Rose Hill, Va., to construct approaches to filling station on Route 10.

Oakman Plumbing Co., New Market, Va., to lay 4" sewer pipe and 3/4" water pipe under and across Route 31, about 200' east of Water Street, for service connection.

Town of Fairfax, to make service connection for Bertram W. Jensen, on Route 38.

Town of Fairfax, to extend 1 1/2" main across new Route 31I for service connection to proposed gas station of R. Holtzel.

Town of Falls Church, to make water pipe connections for servicing residences on Route 31.

J. O. Ferguson, Roane Mill, Va., to grade entrance to filling station on Route 35, half mile south of Roane Mill.

George Transfer Co., Washington, D.C., to move 12' Erie Crane from Washington, D.C. line to Alexandria over Route 31.

Harrison Sanitary District No. 1, Richmond, Va., to lay sewer along Gary Street from entrance to Pagoda, 222 ft. west; and construct one 4' manhole.

W. C. Long, Big Stone Gap, Va., to set crushing plant partially on right of way of Route 28, south of Miami; to be removed in thirty days.

B. L. Mason, Jonestown, Va., to construct entrance to store and filling station on Route 10, at McP. Hill Rd.

G. H. Mathews, Williamsburg, Va., to construct entrance to filling station on Route 36, about one mile north of Williamsburg.

B. R. Morris, Alberta, Va., to grade entrance to filling station on Route 31, one mile south of Alberta.

Roslyn Gas Co., Claremont, Va., to install 3/4" gas service at 414 Clark Road, Route 28.

R. S. Short, Stanley, Va., to build entrance to filling station on Route 318, half mile west of Stanley.

R. G. Snow, Dyke, Va., to drive 3/4" water line under Route 704 near Dyke, for house service.

J. M. Tidwell, Suffolk, Va., to grade entrance to filling station on Route 14.

V. S. Bureau of Public Roads, Washington, D.C., to operate roughness indicator over Routes 31, 33 and 36.

Virginia Electric & Power Co., Richmond, Va., to erect a crossing of 3 #4 TAWP service wires over Route 14 just north of intersection of Warwick Road.

Virginia Electric & Power Co., Norfolk, Va., to install 4.33 miles 2.3 kw. 3 phase poles, about 1.4 miles west of Hedges Ferry Bridge, 47 poles to be set, 4 anchor guys and 5 crossings, on Route 10.

Virginia Electric & Power Co., Fredericksburg, Va., to erect three wire crossings and 1 head guy crossing over Route 37.

Virginia Electric & Power Co., Petersburg, Va., to erect pole line on Route 35.

Virginia Electric and Power Co., Richmond, Va., to erect crossings over Route 41, of 3 $\frac{1}{4}$ primary wires, and one 5/16" guy wire.

Virginia Electric and Power Co., Richmond, Va., to erect service connection over Route 36, half mile east of Dumasville.

Virginia Electric and Power Co., Richmond, Va., to erect two primary wires and one guy wire crossing over Routes 15, 30 and 407 in Chesterfield County.

Virginia Electric and Power Co., Richmond, Va., to erect a crossing of three primary wires over Route 15 about three miles southwest of Richmond.

Virginia Electric and Power Co., Richmond, Va., to erect a crossing of three service wires over Route 420 about 3/4 miles south of intersection of Dumbarton Road.

Virginia Public Service Co., Alexandria, Va., to erect 110v crossing over Route 51 from VPS pole #8 to pole opposite, near Pohick.

Virginia Public Service Co., Charlottesville, Va., to cross Route 28 with 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ 1/8 1000 conductors, about half a mile north of Geoghegan.

H. C. Watson, Oakley, Va., to construct entrance to filling station on Route 34, for H. L. Gillies.

H. C. Watson, Oakley, Va., to construct entrance to filling station at Birdman, on Route 34.

W. L. Woody, Madison Heights, Va., to make an entrance to filling station at intersection of Routes 15 and 317.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. East, that the bid on Bituminous Material for surface treatment and patching, submitted by the Mexican Petroleum Corporation, be rejected. The Mexican Petroleum Corporation, in a previous bid that was low, failed to specify the material on which it bid, and requested that they be allowed to correct this error. To give the low bidder an opportunity to correct its error, all bids were rejected, and readvertised. The Mexican Petroleum Corporation thereupon raised its price considerably over former bid. The State Highway Commission is of the opinion that such was unfair to the State, and hereby orders that no further bids be received from this company. Award of contract to the lowest bidders other than the Mexican Petroleum Corporation is as follows -
