

Minutes of the Meeting of the State Highway Commission
of Virginia, Held in Roanoke, Lynchburg, Orange and
Richmond on April 13,14,15 and 16, 1937.

On Monday afternoon, April 12th, Commissioners H. G. Shirley, Wade E. Massie and S. W. Rawls, proceeded to Roanoke, where they were met by Commissioners East and Wysor, and spent the night. The next morning, the 13th, they held hearings on the tentative allocation of funds for the Salem and Bristol Districts,

After the meeting they proceeded to Lynchburg where they spent the night and on the morning of the 14th held hearings on the tentative allocation of funds to the Lynchburg and Staunton Districts.

From there they proceeded to Richmond and spent the night. On the morning of the 15th they drove to Orange and held hearings on the tentative allocation of funds to the Culpeper and Fredericksburg Districts; returning to Richmond, where the night was spent.

On the morning of the 16th hearings were held on the tentative allocation of funds for the Richmond and Suffolk Districts. After the hearings were concluded in the afternoon, the following business was transacted.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Wysor, that the minutes of the meeting of March 23rd be approved. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the Commission confirm award of contract for insurance on automobiles and trucks for the year beginning noon April 20th, 1937, and ending at noon April 20th, 1938, to the Lumbermens Mutual Casualty Company, Richmond, Virginia, at their bid of \$22,245.13, with dividend of \$4,871.49. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Wysor, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the Commission authorize the usual number of students be given employment during the summer months. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Rawls, that the request of the Superintendent of Schools of Botetourt County for permit to erect waiting sheds on the State highways, be not granted. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that the Commission approve the expenditure of the \$500.00 per mile construction funds to the City of Newport News for 1936-37 on 36th Street within the city, Route 168, rather than on 54th Street, as requested by the City. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the City of Newport News be given the \$500.00 per mile additional construction funds for 1937-38 to be applied to newconstruction. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Rawls, that the City of Alexandria be given the \$500.00 per mile additional construction funds for 1936-37 and 1937-38 to be applied on the improvement of the portion of Henry Street between the north side of Cameron Street and north side of Princess Street, not including the two feet on either side of the Southern Railway tracks.
