Minutes of Meeting of the State Righway Commission of Virginia Richmond, Virginia, April 21, 1965

On call of the Chairman, the Commission met in the Central Bighway Office Suilding, Richmond, Virginia, at 9:00 O'clock, Thursday Morning, April 21, 1960. Present - Hears. H. H. Harris, Chairman, R. P. Berrow, G. Wallace Carper, W. W. Chian, Jr., S. S. Flythe, Borgass E. Helson, S. W. Rawis, W. H. Selater, Jr., and Tucker G. Wetkins, Jr.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, who asked the Commission to stend in a moment of silence in remembrance of the late Semuel D. May, former Chairman.

On motion of Mr. Rawle, seconded by Mr. Carper, the minutes of the maeting of January 7, 1960, as previously mailed to Commission members, were approved.

The following resolution was read by Mr. Berrow and on metion of Mr. Rewls, escended by Mr. Berrow, was adopted, a copy to be sent to the family of Mr. May:

MESCLUTTON ON THE THATE OF SAMUEL DAVIDSON MAY

WHEREAS, Sensel Davidson May was born on July fourteenth, eighteen bundred and minety-five, of a highly regarded family, being the son of Samuel Davidson May, an attorney at law of Taxamell, Virginia, and Hollis Leece May, his wife;

WHERAS, Semual Davidson May took an active part in the civic, social, business and governmental affairs of the Componwealth of Virginia:

MERICAS, his keen some of humor, quiet desenuer, unsecuring nature, sound business judgment and mental soumen won for him the respect and friendship of those who had the good fortune to know him; and

Withhas, Sexuel Davidson May was appointed to the State Highway Commission in mineteen hundred and fifty-three to fill the unexpired term of the late J. B. Biggs, and was thereafter reappointed for an additional term by Quvernor Thomas B. Stauley; and

MERRAS, on August seven, nineteen hundred and fifty-eight, Samuel Devideon May was appointed State Rightsy Consissioner by Governor J. Lindsey Almond, Jr., at a time when the burdens of their office were unparalleled by any other period in the history of the Virginia Department of Rightsys; and

WHITEAS, Samuel Davidson May entered upon his essigned tack with such humility, devotion to duty, some of fairness and patience that he soon became recognized as an outstanding administrator and public officer; and

MESSAS, death came suddenly to Samuel Davidson May during the evening of March third, nineteen hundred and sixty, thereby depriving this Commission of a beloved friend and dedicated fallow public servent;

WHIREAS, it is fitting and proper that the State Highway Countesian express its regret upon the untimely death of Samuel Davidson May.

MOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MEMOLVED, That the State Highway Commission of Virginia hereby expresses it sincers regrets upon the entimely passing of Samuel Davidson May.

PURTHER, ME IT RESOLVED, That the State Highway Commission of Virginia hereby extends sympathy to the family of Samuel Davidson May upon the loss of this devoted husband and father, in this their hour of grief.

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Secretary of the State Highway Commission is hereby directed to send a suitably prepared copy of this Resolution to the family of Samuel Davidson May as a token of the love and appreciation with which he was regarded by his follow members of the State Highway Commission and his many friends and Sellow public servents of the Virginia Department of Highways."

Moved by Mr. Rawle, seconded by Mr. Carper, that WEBBAS, Bule \$1 of the Bules for the Administration of the Virginia Personnal Act of 1942 provides in part that "..., the appointing authority of each agency shall prescribe the hours of duty during which attendance of employees in the egency shall be required. The plaines hours prescribed shall be at least forty hours a week for full-time employment ...;" and WHEREAS, at the present time the Central Office and Equipment Depot employees work 8 hours per day for 40 hours per week, the District, Besidency and Shop Offices employees work 6-1/2 hours per day for 42-1/2 hours per week, and the Field and Shop Forces employees work 9-1/2 hours per day for 47-1/2 hours per week; and WHEREAS, it is the desire of the State Highway Commission as far as presticable to have a uniform work week throughtout the Department to eliminate any inequities in working hours and to work toward that

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MESOLVED: That the work hours for employees of the Highmay Department shall be as follows:

- (1) Control Office and Equipment Depot -5-hour day - 40-hour week
- (2) District, Residency and Shop Offices -8-hour day - 40 hour week
- (3) Flaid and Shop Purces -Printer day - 45 hour week.

AR IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the rate of pay for hourly employees shall be adjusted to enable such employees to receive the same compensation as they presently receive, as nearly as possible. This policy shall become effective on July 1, 1960. Hotion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Carper, that: WHEREAS, the State Highway Commission has herutofore approved the location of a bridge and tunnel project to be constructed by the Chasapeake Bay Ferry Commission (hereafter to be known as the Chasapeake Bay Bridge and Tunnel Commission) across Chasapeake Bay, including approaches and approach highways therato, which will connect the project on the north with U. S. Route Mo. 13 in the County of Morthampton and on the south with U.S. Route Mo. 60 in the County of Princess Arms in the vicinity of Chasapeake Beach; and

WHEREAS, the State Highway Commission, upon finding that there was an organic public need for the operation of said project, granted a permit to the Champeake Bay Ferry Commission for the construction and operation of said project; now, therefore,

BE IT RESCLUED by the State Highway Countseion; Section 1. The urgant public need for the operation of said project still exists.

Section 2. The State Highway Commission will assist and cooperate with the Chesepeaks May Perry Commission in every way possible to bring about the early construction and operation of said project.

Section 3. Subject to the terms of an agreement to be entered into by the State Highway Commission and the Cheseponke Bay Ferry Commission, the State Highway Commission will cooperate in every way possible in the construction of the approaches and approach highways to the Cheseponke Bay Ferry Facility.

Section 4. The State Highway Commission is cognizent of the heavy increase in traffic that will result from this project on Newto 13 from the Maryland line to Route 17 near Portsmouth, Virginia, and on Route 17 from this intersection to the Morth Carolina line. In order to safely carry the traffic over these routes, this Commission will cooperate by expediting the necessary improvements on these two topics as rapidly as funds are available. Motion carried.

The Commission approved a recommendation to set up \$11,599.23 in the fiscal year 1960-61 to bring the Insurance Reserve up to \$42,000.00. It was suggested that consideration might be given to increasing this fund next year.

A request from patrons of the Bulfield School, Inc., for an entrenon from the Charlotteeville By-pass to the school was discussed and on notion by Mr. Rawle, seconded by Senator Helson, the Commission voted to dany the request.

Mr. Frencie Lee, Assistant Attorney General, reviewed legislation passed at the 1960 session of the General Assembly which would affect the Department of Highways.

The Outdoor Advertising Act was discussed at some length and the Commission recommended a pilot study to determine the cost to the Department of carrying out the provisions of the act.
