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Meeting of State Highrey Commission of Virginia Richmond, Virginia April 19, 1962

The State Highway Commission of Virginia met at the Central Highway Office Building, Richmond, Virginia, at 10:00 A.M. on April 19, 1962. The Chairman, H. H. Harris, presided.

On motion of Mr. Schatzr, seconded by Mr. Watkins, the Commission approved the minutes of meeting of March 15, 1962.

WEREAS the Congress and the President of the United States have proclaimed the week of May 20, 1962 as Mational Eighney Week and called upon all Americans to consider and appreciate the value of highways to their own activities and to our national welfare, and

MMERSAS Governor Albertis S. Harrison, Jr. has expressed interest in our plans and very shortly will issue a statement regarding the highway program in Virginia and the Department's special activity during the month of May, and

WHEREAS this period will offer a timely opportunity at the start of the construction season and prior to the allocation of highway funds to reflect on the scope and objectives of this wast undertaking.

Moved by Mr. Flythe, seconded by Mr. Chinn, that WHENEAS, in connection with Boute 608, Project 0608-080-102,0501, in Spotsylvania County, the Commonwealth did acquire all of the lands lying between the old and new locations of said Eoute 608 between a point 25 feet north of survey Station 72400 and a point 25 feet north o: survey Sta. 77+30; and, WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Spotsylvenia County at its meeting on February 13, 1962, did abandon in Accordance with the provisions of Section 33-76,12 of the 1950 Code of Virginia as amended the said section of old location of Route 608 between the Stations eforementioned, which action is of record in the Supervisors' Record Book No. 9, Page 232; and, WHEREAS, the owners of the adjoining lands to the north have requested that the parcel of land so acquired and lying between the old and new locations so described be conveyed to them for a consideration of \$58.50, which consideration is desued adequate by the State Right of Way Engineer; and,

WHEREAS, the State Highway Commissioner has certified in writing that the said parcel of land between the said old and new locations of Route 608, lying north of the new north right of way line of relocated Route 608 between the Survey stations aforesaid is deemed no longer necessary for the uses of the Secondary System of State Highways. NOW, THERSFORE, the conveyance of the said area so certified to the owner or owners of the lands adjoining to the north for the consideration aforesaid, in accordance with the provisions of Section 33-76.11 of the 1950 Code of Virginia as smended, is hereby approved, and the State Highway Commissions I is hereby suthorized to execute in the mane of the Commoswealth a deed or deeds conveying the said lands without warranty to the owner or owners of record of the adjoining property, said conveyance or conveyances to be subject to such conditions or restrictions as the State Highway Commissioner may deed requisite. Hotion carried.

The following committee appeared before the Commission in the interest of an approach road to the Chesapeake Bay Bridge-Tunnel Project, between the North Carolina Line and Route 13:

Lt. Governor Milis R. Godwin, Jr., Measts. Henry Clay Hoffbeimer, II, of Borfolk; Sidney S. Kellam, of Virginia Beach; William H. Hodges, of Morfolk County; Charles Langford, of Emere, Virginia; Joseph M. Tusing, of Portsmouth, Virginia; J. Marren White, Jr., of Morfolk. Mr. Edwin R. MacKethan and Senator Almer Ames were also present.

Lt. Covernor Godwin, as spokessen for the group, requested that the Cosmission have a study made of the use of Houte 166 from Route 13 to a point south of the bridge recently constructed over the Eastern Branch of the Elizabeth River, thence south to the North Carolina Line.

Following further discussion of the matter, Commissioner Marris recommended to the Commission that a detail feasibility study be made, including traffic and earnings studies, for the best route between Route 13 and the North Carolina Line, including South 166, as recommended by Lt. Governor Godwin. Motion was made by Mr. Flythe, seconded by Mr. China, that studies as recommended by the Commissioner be made. Motion carried.

The Chairman stated the May meeting of the Commission would be held at Hotel Rosmoke on the evening of May 23, preceding the hearing on tentative allocations of Interstate and Primary Construction funds for the fiscal year 1962-63, to be held in Rosmoke on May 24 and Richard on May 25.

The meeting adjourned at 12:10 P.M.
