WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Bedford County has requested Industrial Access funds to provide proper secess to the Montvale Petroleum Distribution Center being constructed at Montvale Virginia, by the American Oil Company, The Pure Oil Company, the Gulf Oil Corporation, Cities Service, Incorporated, Texaco, Inc., and the Colonial Pipeline Company, access being estimated to cost \$80,000; and

WHEREAS, the interested companies have advised that their initial investment in plant facilities will involve approximately \$2,500,000 and will provide initial employment for 80 to 100 people; and

MMEREAS, the said companies have advised that they will enter into contracts for their facilities upon notice of favorable consideration of the request for Industrial Access funds; and

WHEREAS, it appears that this request falls within the intent of Section 33-136.1 except that the facilities are not under firm contracts, and has complied with the provisions of the Highesy Commission's policy on the use of Industrial Access funds, including the guaranteeing of right of way.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that \$80,000 from the industrial Access fund for 1963-64 be allocated for the purpose of providing access to the Montvale Petroleum Distribution Center, contingent upon sovice from the interested companies that they have entered into firm contracts for the construction of their plant facilities, and provided further that right of way is furnished at no cost to the Commonwealth.
