Mr. King briefed the Commission on the latest developments regarding the cutback of federal funds. Between now and the end of the current fiscal year, September 30, Virginia will be given about \$59 million in federal money. This is down from the \$139 million anticipated earlier. He stated that tomorrow he plans to meet with Acting Federal Highway Administrator John S. Hassell, Jr., to explore ways that Virginia might be able to finance a larger program.

The next meeting of the Commission will be held on May 15, 1980.
