WHEREAS, the State Highway and Transportation Commissioner has certified in writing that the 20' x 80' easement comprising approximately 0.04 acre, more or less, and lying west of the west proposed right of way line of Route 33 at a point approximately 70 feet opposite approximate Station 204+35 (SEL centerline Route 33) does not constitute a section of the public road and is deemed by him no longer necessary for the uses of the State Highway System.

NOW, THEREFORE, the conveyance of the said easement in accordance with the provision of Section 33.1-149 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as smended, is approved and the State Highway and Transportation Commissioner is hereby authorized to execute a quitclaim deed in the name of the Commonwealth conveying same to the owners of the underlying fee for a consideration satisfactory to the State Right of Way Engineer and subject to such restrictions as may be deemed requisite.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Fralin, seconded by Mr. Mm. Robinson,

that

WHEREAS, in connection with Route 220, State Highway Project 6220-128-105, RW-201, the Commonwealth acquired certain lands from Willie U. Nichols and Ollie Louise Nichols by deed dated July 18, 1973 as recorded in Deed Book 1334, Page 533 in the Office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of the City of Roanoke, and by ordinance entered by the City of Roanoke on December 10, 1979, interest to the northeast half of 25th Street and interest to the southeast half of a 12-foot alley; and

WHEREAS, the adjoining landowner has requested that the Commonwealth convey to him a portion of land lying between the northwest proposed limited access limits of Ramp "E" and the center of a 12-foot alley, along with the Commonwealth's interest in a portion of 25th Street in order that he may more fully develop his lands; and

WHEREAS, the State Highway and Transportation
Commissioner has certified in writing that the land containing
2,910 square feet, more or less, and being shown on the plans for
Route 220, State Highway Project 6220-128-105, RW-201, and lying
between the northwest proposed limited access line of Ramp "E" and
the center of a 12-foot alley, from a point approximately 40 feet
opposite approximate Station 13+20 (Ramp "E" centerline) to a point
approximately 40 feet opposite approximate Station 14+14 (Ramp "E"
centerline) and the Commonwealth's interest in a portion of 25th

Street from a point approximately 40 feet opposite approximate Station 11+90 to a point approximately 40 feet opposite approximate Station 12+20, does not constitute a section of the public road and is deemed by him no longer necessary for the uses of the State Highway System.

NOW, THEREFORE, the conveyance of the said land, in accordance with the provisions of Section 33.1-149 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, is approved and the State Highway and Transportation Commissioner is hereby authorized to execute in the name of the Commonwealth a deed, without warranty, conveying same to the adjoining landowner of record for a consideration satisfactory to the State Right of Way Engineer and subject to such restrictions as may be deemed requisite.

Moved by Mr. Fralin, seconded by Mr. Wm. Robinson,

that

WHERFAS, the Commonwealth of Virginia, Department of Highways, acquired a portion of the lands comprising the Chilhowle Area Headquarters Lot from the County School Board of Smyth County by deed dated November 1, 1957 and recorded in Deed Book 153, Page 343 in the Office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Smyth County; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Chilhowie, the adjacent landowner of record, has offered to exchange 0.485 acre of her property for 0.479 acre of the area headquarters land; and

WHEREAS, this proposed exchange will be advantageous to the Department; and

WHEREAS, the State Highway and Transportation Commissioner has certified in writing that of the land shown on R/W Plat #955, the southwestern 0.479 acre, more or less, does not constitute a section of the public road and is deemed by him no longer necessary for the uses of the State Highway System.

NOW, THEREFORE, in accordance with the provisions of Section 33.1-149 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, the conveyance of the land, so certified, is approved and the State Highway and Transportation Commissioner is hereby authorized to

execute a deed without warranty in the name of the Commonwealth conveying same to the adjacent landowner of record in exchange for a deed to 0.485 acres, more or less, land and subject to such restrictions as may be deemed requisite.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Fralin, seconded by Mr. Wat. Robinson,

that

WHEREAS, in connection with the Fluvanna Correctional Unit #12, the Commercealth acquired certain lands from Sanford Bradbury and Virginia S. Bradbury by deed dated June 23, 1954 as recorded in Daed Book 47, Page 333 in the Office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Fluvanna County; and

WEREAS, the Virginia Electric Cooperative has requested a permanent easement to cross over, upon or beneath a portion of the lands of the aforesaid extending in a southern direction from their existing overhead power facilities to a guard house, for the construction and maintenance of power line facilities; and

WHEREAS, the State Highway and Transportation Countssioner has certified to the Commission that he deems it expedient to convey to the Virginia Electric Cooperative the easement for the said power line.

NOW, THEREFORE, in accordance with the provisions of Section 2.1-6 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, the State Highway and Transportation Commissioner is hereby authorized to execute a deed in the name of the Communwealth conveying such easement to the Virginia Electric Cooperative in such form and subject to such restrictions and conditions as may be deemed requisite.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Fralin, seconded by Mr. Wm. Robinson,

that

WHEREAS, in connection with Route 264, State Highway Project 0264-122-104, RW-201, the Commonwealth acquired certain lands, a portion of which lies outside the right of way limits, from the City of Norfolk, by deed dated February 4, 1961 as

recorded in Deed Book 1570, Page 470; from Henry Turbyfill by Cartificate dated July 10, 1980 as recorded in Deed Book 1543, Page 585, case which has been concluded; and from Edward B. Ives by Cartificate dated July 14, 1980 and recorded in Deed Book 1547, Page 304; all of these instruments are recorded in the Office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of the City of Norfolk; and

WHEREAS, the proposed construction of Route 264 has necessitated the relocation of Virginia Electric and Power Company facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Virginia Electric and Power Company has requested a 15-foot permanent easement to construct, operate and maintain its facilities over, across and beneath a portion of the aforementioned land; and

WHEREAS, the State Highway and Transportation Commissioner has certified to the Commission that he deems it expedient to convey to the Virginia Electric and Power Company such camement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in accordance with the provisions of Section 2.1-6 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, the State Highway and Transportation Commissioner is hereby authorised to execute a deed in the name of the Commonwealth, conveying a 15-foot permanent easement to the Virginia Electric and Power Company in such form and subject to such restrictions as may be deemed proper.

Motion carried.

Mr. James W. Atwell, Management Services Officer, briefed the Commission on the progress of internal audits within the Department. The Commission Internal Audit Committee, established last October and comprised of Messrs. Fralin, chairman, Hooper, and William Robinson, had requested that quarterly reports be presented to the full Commission. This was the first such report.

Mr. Atwell stated that since January the Management Services Division has completed two major audits—one in the affirmative action area and the other in the Preliminary Engineering area. Several findings and recommendations were made in the former study and corrective action was taken. In the latter, no findings or recommendations were made. Presently there are audits under way in the construction area (including

a review of the bidding and estimating procedures which will incorporate the Attorney General's recommendations), the administration of UMTA grants, data processing, and right of way activities. Also included is a cash audit of the funds handled at the Jamestown-Scotland Ferry. In addition, follow-up audits are being carried out in the area of hired equipment and the handling of winter storm damage costs from last year.

Mr. Fralin advised that the Internal Audit Committee had met and reviewed the aforementioned reports and is reasonably satisfied that steps have been taken to correct any discrepancies noted.

The next meeting of the Commission will be held on May 21, 1981.
