MINUTES OF

MEETING OF STATE HIGHWAY AND TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION

WILLIAMSBURG, VIRGÍNIA

April 19, 1984

The monthly meeting of the State Highway and Transportation Commission was held at the College of William and Mary in Williamsburg, Virginia, on April 19, 1984, at 10 a.m. The Chairman, Mr. Harold C. Xing, presided.

Present: Messrs. King, Bane, Brydges, Davidson, Forrester, Guiffre, Humphreys, Quicke, Smalley, Smith and Yaughan.

Mayor Robert Walker, Williamsburg, welcomed the Commission to Williamsburg and then spoke in regard to the importance of the Second Street Extension to move traffic through Williamsburg from the east to the west. Mr. James B. Oliver, Jr., County Administrator for James City County, introduced Mr. Bill Brown from the James City County Board of Supervisors. Mr. Brown spoke to the group regarding the need for putting the Route 199 interchange back into the Six-Year Program. Mr. John E. Mathews, Director of Planning and Community Development of York County, thanked the Commission for the decision on Route 171, and thanked them for consideration of the Yorktown parking ordinance. Mr. Mathews expressed the County's concern for the future regarding the proposed new crossing of the York River and its effects on Route 17 and he also spoke regarding the critical need for the Route 199 interchange.

WHEREAS, the State Highway and Transportation Commissioner has certified in writing that the existing permanent easement located northeast of the proposed right of way line of Route 630, extending in an easterly direction approximately 200 feet, from a point approximately 35 feet right of approximate Station 31+08 (Route 630 survey centerline) to a point approximately 40 feet right of approximate Station 31+30 (Route 630 survey centerline) does not constitute a section of the public road and is deemed by him no longer necessary for the uses of the Secondary System of State Highways.

NOW, THEREFORE, the conveyance of the said portion of easement, so certified, in accordance with the provisions of Section 33.1-154 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, is approved and the State Highway and Transportation Commissioner is hereby authorized to execute in the name of the Commonwealth a deed to the owner of the underlying fee in exchange for a deed to the relocated easement, and subject to such restrictions as may be deemed requisite.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Quicke, seconded by Mr. Smalley, that

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth is the apparent owner of the Southwestern Turnpike in Montgomery County; and

MHEREAS, under Project 1660-01-04, Route 11 was relocated serving the same citizens as before, which new location has been approved by the State Highway and Transportation Commissioner; and

WMEREAS, the old location of Route 11, from the new location opposite Station 521+16.52 west 0.05 mile, including the old bridge over South Fork Roanoke River, was abandoned by the State Highway and Transportation Commission on August 26, 1952; and

WHEREAS, the Montgomery County Public Service Authority has requested a portion of old Route 11 be conveyed to it for the construction of a pump station; and

WHEREAS, the State Highway and Transportation Commissioner has certified in writing that the section of old Route 11, being a strip of land 60 feet in width, running from the west bank of the South Fork Roanoke River to the approximate terminus of Route 748, containing 0.1584 acre, more or less, does not constitute a section of the public road and is deemed by him no longer necessary for the uses of the State Highway System.

NOW, THEREFORE, in accordance with the provisions of Section 33.1-149 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, the conveyance of the land, so certified, is approved and the State Highway and Transportation Commissioner is hereby authorized to execute a quitclaim deed conveying same to Montgomery County Public Service Authority for a consideration satisfactory to the State Right of Way Engineer, subject to such restrictions and conditions as may be deemed requisite.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Quicke, seconded by Mr. Smalley that

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth is the apparent owner of a portion of Columbus Street in the City of Alexandria, and

WHEREAS, the portion of Columbus Street between Church Street and Route 95 (formerly Route 413) was originally included within the right of way and limited access features of Project 0413-100-071, RW-1; and

WHEREAS, by a plan revision dated October 7, 1982, the right of way and limited access line was moved from the east right of way line of Columbus Street to the west right of way line of Columbus Street eliminating the need for that portion of Columbus Street between Church Street and the Interstate; and

WHEREAS, the City of Alexandria has requested that the Commonwealth quitclaim this portion of Columbus Street to them for future development; and

WHEREAS, the State Highway and Transportation Commissioner has certified in writing that the portion of Columbus Street between Church Street and Route 95, comprising a strip of land 65 feet wide, from a point approximately 160 feet right of approximate Station 102+95 (Route 413 survey line) to a point approximately 160 feet right of approximate Station 103+60 (Route 413 survey line), containing 0.12 acre, more or less, land, does not constitute a section of the public road and is deemed by him no longer necessary for the uses of the State Highway System.

NOW, THEREFORE, in accordance with the provisions of Section 33.1-149 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, the conveyance of the land, so certified, is approved and the State Highway and Transportation Commissioner is hereby authorized to execute a quitclaim deed conveying same to the City of Alexandria for a consideration satisfactory to the State Right of Way Engineer, subject to such restrictions and conditions as may be deemed requisite.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Quicke, seconded by Mr. Smalley, that

WHEREAS, in connection with Route 66, State Highway Project 0066-000-102, RW-206, the Commonwealth acquired certain lands, portions of which lie outside the normal right of way from Richard W. Niner and Patricia A. Niner by deed dated August 7, 1979, recorded in Deed Book 1997, Page 1785 and by deed dated July 22, 1971, recorded in Deed Book 1763, Page 40. These deeds are recorded in the Office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Arlington County; and

WHEREAS, the adjacent landowners have requested that certain land, so acquired, lying north of and adjacent to the north revised proposed right of way line (3-17-83) of Route 66 be conveyed to them; and

WHEREAS, the State Highway and Transportation Commissioner has certified in writing that the excess land lying north of and adjacent to the north revised proposed right of way line (3-17-83) of Route 66, from a point approximately 100 feet left of approximate Station 1249+18 (median centerline Route 66) to a point approximately 142 feet left of approximate Station 1250+00 (median centerline Route 66), containing approximately 3,080 square feet, more or less, does not constitute a section of the public road and is deemed by him no longer necessary for the uses of the State Highway System.

NOW, THEREFORE, in accordance with the provisions of Section 33.1-149 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, the conveyance of the said land, so certified, to the adjacent landowner of record is approved and the State Highway and Transportation Commissioner is hereby authorized to execute in the name of the Commonwealth a deed conveying same without warranty for a consideration satisfactory to the State Right of Way Engineer, subject to such restrictions as may be deemed requisite.

Moved by Dr. Forrester, seconded by Mr. Quicke, that

WHEREAS, in accordance with Department policy, the consulting firm of David Volkert and Associates, McLean, Virginia, has been determined to be better qualified to perform the required engineering services and a firm proposal has been received from the consulting firm for Stage I. Preliminary Structure Plans and Estimates; and Stage II, Contract Structure Plans and Estimates, for engineering services in connection with the design of one (1) highway bridge on Sherwood Drive in Colonial Heights and four (4) highway bridges on Route 144 in Prince George County identified as:

Project U000-106-101,860? - Sherwood Drive over Swift Creek - City of Colonial Heights

Projects 0144-074-101,8604 thru B607 - Route 144 (Temple Avenue Extension) over N & W Railway in Prince George County

WHEREAS, compensation for the agreed upon services is on the basis of a Lump Sum Fee of \$154,559.00; and

MHEREAS, careful consideration has been made of the required services and just compensation for same as established and set forth in the Memorandum of Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Commission authorize the execution of an Agreement with David Volkert and Associates for a Lump Sum Fee of \$154.559.00.

Moved by Mr. Guiffre, seconded by Mr. Smalley, that, WHEREAS, in accordance with Department Policy, a firm proposal has been received from the consulting firm of Parsons Brinckerhoff Quade and Douglas, McLean, Virginia, for the preparation of a complete environmental study on the I-95 HOV Lanes Extension from the Route 644/I-95 Interchange in Fairfax County to the Route 619/I-95 Interchange in Prince William County. This work is identified as:

I-95 HOV Lames, Project 0095-029-114, PE102: 0095-076-114, PE102

WHEREAS, the highly specialized nature of the environmental work and the scheduled time for completing this type of environmental study requires augmentation of the Department's environmental staff; and

WHEREAS, careful consideration has been made of these required services and just compensation for same as established and set forth in the MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Commission authorize the execution of a MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT with Parsons Brinckerhoff Quade and Douglas which establishes a maximum total compensation not to exceed \$460,000, which includes a net fee of \$28,656.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Quicke, seconded by Mr. Smalley, that

MHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Section 128 of Title 23 - Highways, United States Code, and FHPM 7-7-5, a Combined Location and Design Public Hearing was held in the Mershall Road Elementary School, Vienna, Virginia, on September 14, 1983 at 7:30 p.m. for the purpose of considering the proposed location and major design features of Interstate Route 66 from 0.86 mile west of the intersection of Nutley Street at Blake Lane to 1.01 miles east of the intersection of Nutley Street at Cedar Lane in Fairfax County. State Project 0066-029-103, C-506, C-513, C-514; Federal Project I-66-1(177)62 and,

WHEREAS, proper notice was given in advance and all those present were given a full opportunity to express their opinions and recommendations for or against the proposed project as presented, and their statements being duly recorded, and

WHEREAS, the economic, social and environmental effects of the proposed project have been examined and given proper consideration, and this evidence, along with all other, has been carefully reviewed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the location and major design features of this project be approved in accordance with the plan as proposed and presented at the said Location and Dasign Public Hearing by the Department's Engineers, and amended to include: (1) an alignment shift of Nutley Street service road approximately 15 feet to the west of Station 18, (2) an alignment shift of Relocated Nutley Street approximately 75 feet to the west of Station 40, and (3) addition of two ramps to connect the westbound collector-distributor road to eastbound Country Creek Road and the Metro southbound access road to the eastbound collector-distributor road.

Motion carried.

Mr. Quicke, chairman of the Internal Audit Committee, presented a report on the Committee's meeting of March 15, 1984. On motion of Mr. Guiffre, seconded by Mr. Brydges, the Commission adopted the report as follows:

The Commission Internal Audit Committee met on March 15, 1984, with members of the Department's Internal Audit Division and reviewed the status of the internal audit recommendations contained in the construction and regional sign shops' audit reports. The Committee accepts the corrective action taken on the construction report as adequate and defers action on the regional sign shops' report until new procedures are developed and implemented.

Following presentation by Mr. Wray on motion of Mr. Humphreys, seconded by Mr. Brydges, the Commission concurred in award of emergency contract by the Chief Engineer on the following project:

Route 30, Caroline County, Washout Damage

Award of contract in the amount of \$300,000.00 to Stanley Construction Company, Inc., Ashland, Virginia.

Motion carried.

Mr. Humphreys advised he was still monitoring the status of the limited access on Route 17 in Spotsylvania County.

Mr. Smith commented that he felt signs should be erected informing the motorist of the location and number of lane closures on the Route 95 construction. Mr. King advised that he would have a committee look into this.

The next meeting will be held in Richmond on May 17, 1984.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:55 a.m.
