MEETING OF COMMONWEALTH TRANSPORTATION BOARD

Richmond, Virginia April 16, 1992 10:00 a.m.

The monthly meeting of the Commonwealth Transportation Board was held in the Board Room of the Virginia Department of Transportation, Richmond, Virginia, on April 16, 1992 at 10:00 a.m. The Chairman, Mr. John G. Milliken, presided.

Present: Messrs. Pethtel, Bacon, Candler, Davies, Hoffler, Dr. Howlette, Malbon, Musselwhite, Smalley, Waldman, Warner, Wells and Mrs. Kincheloe and Dr. Thomas.

Absent: Mr. Mastracco

Moved by Mr. Smalley, seconded by Mrs. Kincheloe, that the Board approve permits issued and canceled from March 1, 1992 to March 31, 1992.

Motion carried.

On motion of Mr. Smalley, seconded by Mrs. Kincheloe, additions and abandonments to the Secondary System from March 1, 1992 to March 27, 1992, as shown by the records of the Department, were approved.

Moved by Mr. Smalley, seconded by Mrs. Kincheloe, that

WHEREAS, by proper resolution, the Boards of Supervisors of Bedford, King George, Loudoun and Patrick Counties have requested that certain roads which no longer serve as public necessities be discontinued as part of the Secondary System of Highways.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that pursuant to Section 33.1-150 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, the Commonwealth Transportation Board finds the following sections of roads are not required for

public convenience and are hereby discontinued as part of the Secondary System of Highways, effective this date.

Bedford County - Route 614 - Section 6 of old location 0.07 Mi

King George County - Route 609 - Section 7 of old location 0.03 Mi

Loudoun County - Route 643 - Sections 1, 2, 3 and 4 of old location 0.36 Mi

Loudoun County - Route 662 - Sections 1 and 2 of old location 0.16 Mi

Patrick County - Route 798 - Section 2 of old location 0.33 Mi

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Smalley, seconded by Mrs. Kincheloe, that

WHEREAS, Route 61 in Tazewell County has been altered and reconstructed as shown on plans for Project: 2392-02; and

WHEREAS, one section of the old road is no longer necessary as a public road, the new road serving the same citizens as the old;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33.1-144 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, 0.25 mile of Old Route 61, designated as Section 1 on the plat dated march 31, 1992; Project: 2302-02, be discontinued as a part of the State Highway System.

Moved by Mr. Wells, seconded by Dr. Thomas, that the Board approve the bids received March 25, 1992, and listed for award on the attached sheets numbered 3A through 3O and authorize execution of contracts by the Deputy Commissioner or Chief Engineer, and approve rejection of those bids listed for rejection and authorize readvertisement with the exception of:

WHEREAS, the Department currently has a Memorandum of Agreement with the firm of Hayes, Beay, Mattern and Mattern, Inc., and it has been determined that a change in the scope of services is necessary to provide stormwater management and detention basin design and erosion and sediment control on the entire project for Project 0058-052-E19, PE-101, C-501; from 0.059 mile east of Route 879 to 0.076 mile west of Route 667 located in Lee County; and

WHEREAS, after cateful review of the additional services required, a firm proposal has been received and just compensation for these additional services has been established and is outlined in this Supplemental Agreement No. 1, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board authorize the execution of this Supplemental Agreement and it shall become a part of the original agreement which currently has a maximum compensation of \$678,676.00.

This Supplemental Agreement No. 1 is in the amount of \$61,306.00 for services and expenses plus a net fee of \$5,140.00 making the total for this supplement \$66,446.00. The total maximum compensation of the agreement including this supplement is now \$745,122.00.

WHEREAS, in accordance with its needs and schedules for implementing its program objectives, the Department has determined that in order to perform the necessary activities to meet those objectives for corridor studies for the improvements to the I-95/I-395/I-495 interchange for Project 0095-029-120, PE-101, located in Fairfax County, it is necessary to supplement its staff; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Department Policy and State Procurement procedures a firm proposal has been received from Howard Needles Tammen and Bergendoff for said services; and

WHEREAS, careful review and consideration has been made of the scope of work and services required and just compensation has been established for these services and is set forth in the Memorandum of Agreement; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board authorize the execution of the Agreement with the firm of Howard Needles Tammen & Bergendoff which establishes a compensation of \$2,466,317.00 for services and expenses plus a net fee of \$130,024.00, making the maximum total compensation not to exceed \$2,596,341.00.

Moved by Mr. Candler, seconded by Mr. Davies, that

WHEREAS, in accordance with its needs and schedules for implementing its program objectives, the Department has determined that in order to perform the necessary activities to meet those objectives for photogrammetric ground control survey and supporting survey activities on a statewide basis, it is necessary to supplement its Location and Design staff; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Department Policy and State Procurement procedures a firm proposal has been received from Bengston DeBell Elkin and Titus, Ltd. for said services; and

WHEREAS, careful review and consideration has been made of the scope of work and services required and just compensation has been established for these services and are set forth in the Memorandum of Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESCLVED that the Board authorize the execution of the Agreement with the firm of Bengston DeBell Elkin and Titus, Ltd. which establishes a compensation of \$900,000.00 for services and expenses making the maximum total compensation not to exceed \$900,000.00.

Moved by Mrs. Kinchelpe, seconded by Mr. Wells, that

WHEREAS, in accordance with its needs and schedules for implementing its program objectives, the Department has determined that in order to perform the necessary activities to meet those objectives for Final Estimates for Culpeper, Fredericksburg, Northern Virginia and Staunton Districts, it is necessary to supplement its staff; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Department Policy and State Procurement procedures a firm proposal has been received from Greenman-Pedersen, Inc., for said services; and

WHEREAS, careful review and consideration has been made of the scope of work and services required and just compensation has been established for these services and is set forth in the Memorandum of Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board authorize the execution of the Agreement with the firm of Greenman-Pedersen, Inc., which establishes a maximum total compensation not to exceed \$2,000,000.00.

Moved by Mr. Musselwhite, seconded by Mr. Malbon, that

WHEREAS, the Department currently has a Memorandum of Agreement with the firm of Anderson and Associates. Inc. to provide engineering design services for the preparation of utility adjustment plans on selected projects through November 19, 1992; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that in order for the Department to perform the necessary activities to meet the schedule for implementing its program of objectives, these services need to be continued through the original time period for Region I, which consists of the Bristol, Salem and Staunton construction districts; and

WHEREAS, careful review and consideration has been made of the scope of work and services required, and the method of just compensation has been established for these services and is set forth in the original Memorandum of Agreement and Supplemental Agreement No. 1; and

WHEREAS, authorization of work will be on projects where utility adjustment plans are needed and authorized by the Department.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board authorizes the execution of this Supplemental Agreement with the firm of Anderson and Associates, Inc., and it shall become a part of the original agreement which currently has a maximum total compensation not to exceed \$500,000.00.

This supplemental Agreement No. 1 increases the maximum total compensation by \$125,000.00 making the total maximum compensation limit, including supplements, \$625,000.00.

Moved by Mr. Musselwhite, seconded by Mr. Malbon, that

WHEREAS, the Department currently has a Memorandum of Agreement with the firm of Langley and McDonald, P.C. to provide engineering design services for the preparation of utility adjustment plans on selected projects through November 19, 1992; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that in order for the Department to perform the necessary activities to meet the schedule for implementing its program objectives, these services need to be continued through the original time period for Region II, which consists of the Richmond, Fredericksburg and Lynchburg construction districts; and

WHEREAS, careful review and consideration has been made of the scope of work and services required, and the method of just compensation has been established for these services and is set forth in the original Memorandum of Agreement and Supplemental Agreement No. 1; and

WHEREAS, authorization of work will be on the projects where utility adjustment plans are needed and authorized by the Department.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board authorizes the execution of this Supplemental Agreement with the firm of Langley and McDonald, P.C., and it shall become a part of the original agreement which currently has a maximum total compensation not to exceed \$500,000.00.

This Supplemental Agreement No. 1 increases the maximum total compensation by \$125,000.00 making the total maximum compensation limit, including supplements, \$625,000.00.

Moved by Mr. Bacon, seconded by Mr. Waldman, that

WHEREAS, in accordance with the statutes of the Commonwealth of Virginia and policies of the Commonwealth Transportation Board, a Combined Location and Design Public Hearing was held in the Bristol District Office Auditorium, Bristol, Virginia, on January 16, 1992 at 7:00 p.m., for the purpose of considering the proposed location and major design features of Old Airport Boad from 0.10 mile west of South Bonham Road to the intersection of Route I-81 in the City of Bristol, State Project U000-102-105, PE-101, C-501; and

WHEREAS, proper notice was given in advance, and all those present were given a full opportunity to express their opinions and recommendations for or against the proposed project as presented and their statements being duly recorded; and

WHEREAS, the economic, social and environmental effects of the proposed project have been examined and given proper consideration, and this evidence, along with all other, has been carefully reviewed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the location and major design features of this project be approved in accordance with the plan as proposed and presented at the said location and Design Fublic Hearing by the Department's Engineers.

Moved by Mr. Davies, seconded by Mr. Waldman, that

WHEREAS, in accordance with the statutes of the Commonwealth of Virginia and policies of the Commonwealth Transportation Board, a Combined Location and Design Public Hearing was held in the Deltaville Community Center, Deltaville, Virginia, on December 19, 1991, at 7:30 p.m. for the purpose of considering the proposed location and major design features of Route 630 from the intersection of Route 3 to Stampers Landing in Middlesex County, State Project 0630-059-P25, C-501; and

WHEREAS, proper notice was given in advance, and all those present were given a full opportunity to express their opinions and recommendations for or against the proposed project as presented, and their statements being duly recorded; and

WHEREAS, the economic, social and environmental effects of the proposed project have been examined and given proper consideration and this evidence, along with all other, has been carefully reviewed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the location and major design features of this project be approved in accordance with the plan as proposed and presented at the said Location and Design Public Hearing by the Department's Engineers with modification to reduce the right of way to the minimum required, reduce shoulder widths to 4-feet, and provide a cul-de-sac at Stampers Landing in lieu of the proposed parking area.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Musselwhite, seconded by Dr. Thomas, that

WHEREAS, in connection with Route 619, State Highway Project 0619-009-153, C-501, the Commonwealth acquired certain lands from Clifton E. Bowyer and Hilda E. Bowyer by instrument dated May 18, 1973, recorded in Deed Book 391, Page 533 in the office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Bedford County; and

WEEREAS, in accordance with Section 33.1-155 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, Route 619 was relocated and the new location serves the same citizens as the old location; and

WHEREAS, at the regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Hedford County held on January 13, 1975, a resolution was passed abandoning as a public road old sections of Route 519, effective January 28, 1975; and

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Commissioner has certified in writing that the land containing 0.26 acre, more or less, and lying north of and adjacent to the north normal right of way limits of Route 619, from a point approximately 25 feet opposite approximate Station 194+50 (Route 619 centerline) to a point approximately 25 feet opposite approximate Station 198+47 (Route 619 centerline) does not constitute a section of the public road and is deemed by him no longer necessary for the uses of the Secondary System of State Highways; and

WHEREAS, the adjoining landowner has requested that the excess right of way be conveyed.

NOW, THEREFORE, in accordance with the provisions of Section 33.1-154 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, the conveyance of the said lands, so certified, is approved and the Commonwealth Transportation Commissioner is authorized to execute in the name of the Commonwealth a deed, without warranty, to the adjoining landowner of record for a consideration acceptable to the State Right of Way Engineer, subject to such restrictions as may be deemed appropriate.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Smalley, seconded by Mr. Bacon, that

WHEREAS, Route 23, State project 6023-097-107, RW-201, in Wise County, was designed as a Limited Access Highway by the Highway Commissioner on May 11, 1967; and

WREREAS, a request was received from Paramont Land Company, Inc. for a break in the limited access right of way to provide an entrance and crossover to the property on Route 23 between Business Route 23 and Route 624; and

WHEREAS, the proposed entrance and crossover would provide access to a shopping center; and

WHEREAS, such break in limited access has been supported by the Town Council and Planning Commission of the Town of Wise, and would support the economic development in the area; and

WHEREAS, Department staff have concluded that providing access in the vicinity of Station 271+00 will meet design criteria and not present a safety hazard to the traveling public; and

WHEREAS, all costs of engineering, construction and resigning associated with the access are to be borne by others; and

WHEREAS, upon completion of the work, all roadway construction within the right of way shall become the property of the Commonwealth.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESCLVED, that in consideration of the above mentioned conditions, the Commonwealth Transportation Board hereby grants a break in the existing limited access line subject to the conditions referred to above and, further, subject to payment of a sum determined by the Department which represents the benefits and amenities realized by the developer in having the access point on Route 23, based on a fair market value appraisal prepared by the Department.

The Commonwealth Transportation Commissioner is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents needed to comply with this resolution.

Moved by Dr. Howlette, seconded by Mr. Hoffler, that

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board at its March 19 meeting named the bridge on Routes 1 and 301 over the Appointtox River the Dr. Martin Luther Ring, Jr. Memorial Bridge; in anticipation of receiving appropriate resolution from the City Council of Colonial Heights, Virginia; and

WHEREAS, the Department has received a resolution adopted by the City Council of Colonial Heights, Virginia on March 24 naming the aforementioned bridge as the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial Bridge.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Commonwealth Transportation Board does finalize its action, pursuant to Section 33.1-250 of the Code of Virginia, by naming the bridge on Routes 1 and 301 over the Appointable River linking Colonial Heights and Petersburg the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial Bridge; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that appropriate markers, as directed by the Department's Engineers, shall be placed calling attention to its designation.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Davies, seconded by Mr. Warner, that

WHEREAS, Section 33.1-75.1 Code of Virginia, prescribes the annual allocation of state funds to provide an equivalent matching allocation for certain local funds designated by the governing body, to be placed in a special fund account known as "County Primary and Secondary Road Fund"; and

WHEREAS, this special fund account "...shall be used solely for the purposes of either (i) maintaining, improving, or constructing the primary and secondary system within such county, or (ii) bringing subdivision streets, used as such prior to July 1, 1982, up to standards sufficient to qualify them for inclusion in the state primary and secondary system..."; and

WHEREAS, Stafford County was allocated funds in the amount of \$200,200 for the Fiscal Year 1991-92 allocation at the July 18, 1991 meeting of the Commonwealth Transportation Board, pending approval of certain specific eligible items of work; and

WHEREAS, the governing body of this county has, with the department, now identified one specific eligible item of work to be financed from this special fund account as indicated on "Attachment A"; and

WHEREAS, it appears that this item of work falls within the intent of Section 33.1-75.1 Code of Virginia, and complies with the guidelines of the Department for use of such funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Commonwealth Transportation Board hereby approves the allocation of these funds as set forth in "Attachment A",
