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MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSION HELD IN RICHMOND, VIRGINIA,

MAY 104, and 2nd, 1923.

On the morning of May 10t, the State Highway Commission, commissing of Masses. H. C. Shirley, W. H. Massis, H. B. Sproul, R. K. Sandars, and I. Walke Trurium, met at their office in Richmond, Virginia, and gave a public hearing to all interested in the allocation of funds made March 28th, 1923, in accordance with Section 7, Chapter 403, Acts of 1922.

From 9:00 A.M. to 11:00 A.M. the Commission heard the Bristol and Salem Districts.

Senator Booker of Halifax County requested an allocation for the section of Route 12 from Clover to the Staunton River, a gap of about two miles. If this stretch was improved it would give a good road from the Staunton River to Danville. He requested the Commission to pass a resolution accepting an advancement under the Robertson Act for the construction of this section and authorizing the surveying of this road as soon as possible.

Moved by Mr. Massis, seconded by Mr. Sproul, that the Conmission accept an advancement under the Roberts on Act for the construction of a section of Route No. 12 in Halifax County from Clover to Stauffen River. Metion carried.

Mr. Martin of Halifax appeared before the Commission and stated that the Town of Halifax had advanced \$50,000.00 under the Robertson Act for the construction of the Streets but that Donk Stant 20s. 65-7 cost Walkey Co. at the time this money was admined it was understood that it would be returned out of the 1922 collections, paid in February 1923, and requested that the Commission make an allocation for the return of this money. The town is very small and a great number of its citizens are colord and it was necessary for them to put up the money for the additional width of the streets and due to the difference in grade of the streets and the sidewalks, a large part of the sidewalks would have to be rebuilt. It has taken all of the resources of the town to pay the \$50,000.00 and they hope the State will return at least a part of the money advanced so that they can do the necessary work. At the time they put up the money they were under the impression that it would be returned the first of February.

Mr. Ellett of Bedford requested that the allocation of \$50,000.00 on Route 10, Bedford-Mast be changed to Villiamont-Rast.

From 11:00 A.M. to 1:00 P.M. the Commission heard the Lynchburg and Richmond Districts.

Mr. Hubbard, member of the Board of Supervisors of Buckingham County, requested the Commission to use the allocation for Route 2 between Dillwyn and Sprouces Corner to construct a soil road from Dillwyn-Morth as this would be of the most service to the people. Mr. Guthrie and Mr. Wood both stated that they thought this would be satisfactory to the people of Dillwyn.

Mr. D. B. Ryland of Lynchburg, requested that the allocation made to the Routes leading out of Lynchburg stand, as they have

desi Shet Se N.S ali Takka Če been bottled up and have no outlet. He stated that they were glad to get the allocation for Route 14 from Locke Mt. to Big Island and also from the end of the improved road to Altavista and request ed that this be not changed.

The minutes of the last meeting of the Commission were then read and it was moved by Mr. Mussie, accounted by Mr. Sanders, that they be approved. Motion carried.

The Commission than recessed for lunch until 2:00 P.M.

From 2:00 P.M. to 4:00 P.M. the Commission heard the Suffolk ? and Fredericks burg Districts.

A large delegation from the Suffelk District appeared before the Commission, represented by Mr. Peaks of Waverly, General C.C. Vaughan of Franklin, Major Watkins, Mr. Howerton and Mr. Stevenson, They requested that the allocation of \$127,000.00 for Route 5 be applied to the Ridge Route rather than to any suggested route through Sussex C.H. They stated that this Old Ridge Route has always been the route which they considered as Route Eq. 5, and they did not ment it changed and that Homeville be written into the allocation.

There were no delegations from the Predericksburg, Richmond, Eulpeper or Staumton Districts and the Commission, therefore, took this as an approval of the allocations made.

Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the allocation made to Route No. 2 from Dillwyn to Sprouses Corner be changed to read from Dillwyn-Morth. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the alloca-

look Mark Mr. 66-2 mt Walder Co. tion made to Route 12, from Chase City to Boydton, be changed to read Chase City, East and West. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sanders, seconded by Mr. Truxtum, that the allocation made to Route 10 from Rest Radford-East be changed to read from the East and of the Bridge over New River east towards Christiansburg. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxtum, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that the allocation made to Boute 5, from Southempton County Line to Sussex be changed to read from the Southempton-Sussex County Line towards Petersburg. Motion carried.

Noved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sanders, that the allocation made to Route 16, Madison Mills to the East End of Project 103, he changed to read Madison Mills to Robinson River. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sproul, that the Chairman be directed to immediately ascertain the Routes on which allocations have been made and which have not been definitely established and notify the Clerks of the Counties through which such Routes run of such establishment. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shifley, seconded by Mr. Sanders, that the final allocation of funds for 1923, be as follows:

Hoved by Mr. Sproul, accorded by Mr. Shirley, that, whereas the Commission is advised by its Attorney, Mr. Hall, that the taking over of a road or bridge heretofore commission would not come under the provisions of the Robertson Act, that the offer of the South Hill Bridge Company to sell the bridge over the Roanoke River at Goodes Ferry to the Commission under the terms of the Robertson Act be declined. Motion carried.

Noved by Mr. Massie, accorded by Mr. Sanders, that a recess be taken until 10:00 A.M. on May 2nd. Metion carried.

MAY 2nd, 1923.

On the norming of May 2nd, the Commission, all members being present, not in the Assembly Room at Tenth and Marshall Sts.
Richmond, Virginia, at 10:00 A.M.and gave a public rehearing on
the location of House 18 from Aften to Martin's Store in Melson
County.

After this hearing the Commission held a regular business assting.

Moved by Mr.Sproul, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the Commissien designate the Route known as the McCall's Cap Route as the established State Highway Route No. 105 between Old Slade Springs and Saltville, provided, that the alignment throughthe underpose of the MAN R.R. be projected on a straight line for fifty feet beyond the top of the embankment of the railroad fill. Motion carried.

Theres, the road leading from the Mouth of Vilson over that is known as County Road No. 12, to the North Carolina Line, Gray-

Motion carried.

Ho. 10 to lete of Wight C.H. known as County Read Me. 1, lete of Wight County, Virginia, having been advertised in accordance with law for a period of thirty days, and a public notice being given that objections to this location would have to be filed in writing in the office of the State Righway Commission on or before April 10th, 1923, at 12:00 c'clock noon; and whereas, no objections were filed; It was moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sproal, that the Commission hereby declares the route so advertised to be an established State Righway in this County, between the points designated and to be known as Route Mo. 108. Motion carried.

Therees, the road leading from Buckingham C.R. over what is known as County Road Ho. 1, to intersect State Highway Ho. 2, at or near Sprouces in Buckingham County, having been advertised in accordance with law for a period of thirty days, and a public notice being given that objections to this location would have to be filled in writing in the office of the State Highway Commission on or before March 26th, 1923, at 12:00 o'clock noon, and whereas, no objections were filed, It was nowed by Mr. Truxtum, seconded

State Short Str. 16-F cont White Co. by Mr. Sproul, that the Commission herebydeclares the route so advertised to be an established State Highway in this County, between the points designated and to be known as State Highway No. 322. Motion carried.

The Commission then recessed for lunch.

Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Mossie, that the read leading into the State Colony for Epileptics and Feeble Minded near Lynchburg, Virginia, be taken over for maintenance only until the location of State Highway No. 18 is finally established and the read leading into the Oclony be immediately put in passable condition. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, escended by Mr. Truxtum, that the follewing hearings be set:

June 6th, at 10:00 A.M. in the Court House at Washington, M. on the location of Raute 21 from Massie's Corner to Warrenton:

June 7th, at 2:00 P.K. in the Court House at Susskx, Wa. on the location of Route 5, from Petersburg to the Southempton-Sussex County Line near Sebrell, Virginia. Motion carried.

Hoved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the request of the Board of Supervisors of Frederick County to locate Route Mc. 7 from Winchester to the W. Wa. Line be taken up later. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sanders, that the request to add to the State System, under the 21% Clause, the section of road from Jonesville to the Tennesses State Line be post posed until such time as there is mileage available and then be

given commideration. Motion carried.

Bjek Stock Re. 18-7 vegt Welder On Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sproul, that the request to add to the State System, under the 21% Clause, the section of read leading into Hopewell, be postponed until such time as there is mileage available and then be given consideration. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sanders, that Harry Buckmar, Patrolman, be appointed traffic officer. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Truxtum, that the request of the Board of Supervisors of Wise County to return the \$13,800.00 advanced under the Robertson Act be complied with and that this money be returned and the work stopped on the section of road on which this money was to apply. Motion carried.

Noved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Massie, that permit be granted P. H. Wray to erect a pole line on the right of may of Route No. 3, from the end of the present line to his dwelling, provided he will agree to allow further extension of this line should there be such a request. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the Board of Supervisors of Emphanmook County be relieved of paying \$7,500.00 on their contribution of \$18,000.00 on Route Rol 7, provided they will turn over to the State \$10,500.00 in view of the fact that a like amount of State Aid funds was used on this road. Notion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sandare, seconded by Mr. Truxtum, that the Commission accept the advancement under the Roberts on Act of \$10,000. Dook Plant No. 84-7 ant Markey Co. for the committuation of a concrete bridge over Gunn's Run and approaches thereto, on Route No. 41, between Charles City and Righmond. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxtum, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that permit be granted the Chesapeaks and Putumo Telephone Companyunder the sough condition, to construct an underground conduit under the Columbia Pike west of Washington and Alexandria Pike. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Massie, that permit be granted the Stocke's Auto Service Company, Inc., to erect and operate telephone lines along State Highway No. 10, known as the Virginia Beach Boulevard, provided that no advertisement of any kind will be allowed on the posts or boxes, other than the regular directory and that this line be connected with the central exchange. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sanders, that the Commission reaffirm their former decision in the selection of Route 15 and that this location be via Greenfield from Afton to Martin's Store. Motion carried.

A delegation from Alexandria, consisting of Messre. Evans,
Jones and Ogden, appeared before the Commission and requested
them to construct Route Ec. 6, known as the Little River Turnpike
with a width of 18 feet instead of 16 feet as called for in the
plane. They stated that in their opinion the heavy traffic on
this road justified the construction of an 18 feet road for a distance of approximately four and one-half miles from the city limits

of Alexandria,

Best Bust Mr. #-? and Maddler Co.

Mr. Riddle of Clintwood appeared before the Commission and requested that they at least give them a rook road from Clintwood to the form of the road so that it would be passable the entire year and requested a portion of the \$400,000.00 advanced under the Robertson Act be used on this section while the location of the road between Hayei and Fremont is being settled, and if possible appropriate sufficient money from the gaseline tax to apply on this section.

Moved by Mr. Sanders, seconded by Mr. Sproul, that if the Board of Supervisors of Dickers on County will pass a resolution requesting the State Highway Commission to use a portion of the money advanced by the Board under the Roberts on Act for the construction of the road between Eagel and Fremont on the road from Clintwood to the Forks of the Road, while the location of the road between Hayel and Fremont is being definitely located, that the Commission will agree to make such transfer. Motion carried.

Hr. H. B. Turner, and Hr. Tisdale, Mayor of Clarksville, appeared before the Commission and presented an order from the Town Council of Clarksville stating that the bridge over the Roanoke River at Clarksville would be turned over to the "tate Highway Commission as of December 31st, 1924. Hr. Turner stated that the Town was anxious to cooperate with the "tate but that the Bridge brought in about \$10,000.00 yearly from tells and that if it was turned over to the Commission before the date mentioned that it would be difficult for the town to pay off its debt and do the

necessary street improvements.

Just Mart No. 6-P certs Briefley Co.

Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Sanders, that the Hayor and Town Council of Clarks ville be notified that the State Highway Commission will pay the cost of repairs on the Bridge over the Roanoks River at Clarksville, not to exceed \$6,000.00 with the understanding that the bridge be turned over to the State Highway Commission, free of tolls, as soon as the read leading from Clarksville to the Earth Carolina Line has been completed by the contractor and accepted by the U.S.Government, but under no circumstances will the Town be asked to suspend tolls before July let, 1924. Motion carried,

There being no further business before the Commission the meeting adjourned.
