MEETING OF STATE HIGHWAY AND TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION CHARLOTTE CH, BEDFORD, CHRISTIANSBURG, LEXINGTON, VIRGINIA

MAY 21, 22, 23, 24, 1923

Denk Mayer Mr. 1627 pratt Wadding Co. EIRUTES OF THE MEETINGS OF THE STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSION, HELD MAY 21, 22, 23, 24, 1923, AT CHARLOTTE O.H. REUPOND, CHRISTIANS-BURG AND LEXINGTON, VIRGINIA.

On the morning of May 21st, the Commission, consisting of Messie. R. G. Shirley, Wade H. Massie, and R. K. Sanders, met in Richmond and proceeded to Charlotte C.H. where they gave a public hearing at 10:00 A.M. in the Court House on the location to be selected for Route No. 20 between Charlotte C.H. and Brookneal.

After the meeting they impected both Router and then prooccided to Lynchburg by way of Appenatton, Concord and the Indian Hill Road to Lynchburg; thence back via Ht. Ather Route and the James River Route. After returning to Lynchburg, the Commission held a meeting at the Virginian Hotel and transacted the following business:

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sandam, that the contract for the construction of Project P265, Route 114, Grundy-Hanger, be awarded to Robert Martin Company, Salem, Virginia, at their bid of \$124,341.52, being the lowest received, and that 105 additional be set as ide to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering, making a total of \$136,775.67 chargeable to this Project. Notion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, a scended by Mr. Sanders, that the contract for the construction of Project F227, Route 12, Henry Co. Line towards Stuart, be awarded to C. B. Hester, Greensboro, M.C. Period Stant Ho. 18-7 part Station Co. at his bid of \$46,917.55, being the lowest received, and that low additional be set aside to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering, and also that \$704.00 be set aside to cover soil rights, making a total of \$52,313.30 chargeable to this Project. Metion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that all bids be rejected on Project 8254, Route 12, Streets of Stuart, on account of being too high, and that this work be core tructed by force account. Motion carried.

Hoved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sanders, that all bide be rejected on Project 292A&C. Route 21, Falls Church-Fairfax, and that this work be constructed by force account, on account of all bids being above our approximate estimate. Motion carried,

Moved by Mr. Sanders, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the contract for the construction of Project P294, Route 21, Luray-Sperryville, be awarded to W. H. Clarke and Company, Charlotterville, Virginia, at their bid substitted May 10th, using the following prices for concrete pipe:

making their bid amount to \$131,537.11, and that 10% additional be set uside to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering, making a total chargeable to this Project of \$144,690.82. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sanders, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the comtract for the comstruction of Project 266, Route 114, Clintwood, No. 6 Park No. 6 P arts Walkley Co. South, be awarded to W. W. Hoxley and Company, Roanche, Virginia, at their bid of \$76,316.76, and that 10% additional be set saids to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering, making a total of \$83,948.43 chargeable to this Project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massis, seconded by Mr. Sanders, that the contract for the construction of Project F271, Route 11, Bridges over Little Indian Greek and Maidem Spring Branch, be awarded to Messre. Scott and Trinkle, Morton, Virginia, at their bid of \$29,764.50, and that 10% additional be set saide to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering, making a total of \$32,740.95 chargeable to this Project. Motion carried.

Noved by Mr. Sanders, seconded by Mr. Massic, that the contract for the commitmation of Project 98-A, Route 12, Staumton-River-Clover, be awarded to W. W. Tuck and Som, Virgilina, Wa. at their bid of \$32,829.83, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering, making a total of \$36,112.81 chargeable to this Project. Motion carried.

Hoved by Mr. Emesie, seconded by Mr. Trustum, that the contract for the construction of Project F166-B, Route 13, Bridge over Passumbey River, be awarded to the Major Construction Company, Front Royal, Virginia, at their bid of \$39,052.16, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering, making a total of \$42,957.37 chargesble to this Project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sanders, seconded by Mr. Massis, that the contract for the construction of Project 294, Route 21, Bridges over Digit (Heat Mr. 16-7 graph Westley Ch. Page Run and Dry Run, be awarded to Mr. H. C. Turner, Roundke, Va. at his bid of \$14,968.99, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering, making a total of \$16,465.36 chargeable to this Project. Motion carried.

Noved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sanders, that the contract for the construction of Project 287, Route 11, Dickers on County Line-Donkey, be awarded to Jones and Conts, Abingdon, Va. at their bid of \$120,089.34, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering, making a total of \$132.098.27 chargeable to this Project. Motion servied.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sanders, that the contract for the construction of Project 214, Boute 32, Bridge over Cary's Brook, be awarded to Baker-Royer Company, Richmond, Va. at their bid of \$5,751.00, and that 10% additional be set maide to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering, making a total of \$6,326.10 chargeable to this Project. Metion carried.

Hoved by Mr. Sanders, seconded by Mr. Massis, that the contract for the construction of Project 281, Route 114, Clintwood—Wise County Line, be awarded to the Clintwood Comptruction Company Clintwood, Virginia, at their bid of \$135,332.38, and that 105 additional be set aside to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering, making a total of \$148,865.61, chargeable to this Project. Motion carried,

Moved by Mr. Messie, seconded by Mr. Sanders, that contract for the construction of Project 155, Route 32, Bridge over Recomm Greek be swarded to Burgoss and Atkieson, Scottsville, Va. at their , Beck Shark No. 18-P -corp. Walter Co. bid of \$9,238.30, and that 10% additional be set saids to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering, making a total of \$10,162.13 chargeable to this Project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sanders, that the contract for the construction of Project 134, Route 14, Lawyers Road-, Altarists be awarded to C. B. Hester, Greensbore, M.C. at his bid of \$22,111.80, and that 105 additional be set aside to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering, and also that \$572.00 be set aside for soil rights, making a total of \$24,894.98 chargeable to this Project. Ection carried.

Hoved by Mr. Sunders, seconded by Mr. Massis, that the comtract for the construction of Project P264, Route MCB, Portamouth-Deep Greek, be awarded to Tunstall-Johnson Company, Morfolk, Wa. at their bid of \$101,922.12, and that 10% additional be set saids to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering, making a total of \$112,114,33 chargeable to this Project. Motion carried.

Noved by Mr. Mannie, seconded by Mr. Sanders, that all bids for the construction of Project F178, Boute 31, Bridge over Grassy Creek be rejected, and that this work be immediately readvertised. Motion carried.

MAY 22nd. 1923

On the morning of the 22nd, the Commission, consisting of Mesers. Shirley, Messie, and Sanders, improved the road leading from Lynchburg by Perrowville and Cyfax and on to Bedford, returning to Lynchburg where they were joined by Commissioner Truzetun, and held a public hearing at 10:00 A.M. in the Chamber of

- Bette Main Ro. 16-P west Walker Co. Commerce Building to all interested in the location of the read between Appointtick and Lynchburg.

After the hearing at Lynchburg the Commission proceeded to Forcet and from Forcet by New London Academy, thence over the Salam Turnpike to Bedford where they held a meeting at the Court Rouse at 3:00 P.M. to all interested in the location of Route No. 10 across Bedford County.

After this meeting the Commission inspected the read leading from Bedford towards Cyfax and the Contral Route parallel with the Railroad thence to Roanoke where they spent the night.

MAY 23rd. 1923.

The next morning the Commission continued their journey to Christiansburg where a public hearing was given to all interested in the location of Houte Eo.10 from Christiansburg across Montegomery County to Radford. After this hearing they impacted what is known as the Mud Pike, the Old Rook Road, Tyler Avenue and Plum Creek Routes, returning as far as Estural Bridge that night, where a meeting was held and the following business transacted.

Hoved by Mr. Massie, accorded by Mr. Sanders, that House No. 20, through Charlotte Countybe located from Charlotte C.H. to a point at or near Phoenix on the most feesible line, and thence to Brocknesl. Notion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sanders, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the location of State Highway No. 10 between Appearation and Concord be by what is known as the Railroad Route, Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sanders, that the loca-

Book Mart He 16-7 and Walky Co. tion of Route No. 10 from Forest through Bedford County bely a Route from the end of the macedam on the Forest-Perrowville High-way to a point to the north of State Aid Highway No. 16, where the best Route can be secured, thence turning to the west and running in a southwesterly direction to intersect said Fo.16 to the west of Elk Greek, thence in a general direction of No.16 and generally paralleling the NAW tracks to Bedford and from Bedford to a point at or near Thexton to intersect the Botstourt County Line near Montrels. Notion carried.

Hoved by Mr. Trustum and seconded by Mr. Sanders, that Mr. Thos. Amory, be appointed epocial traffic officer with police powers as provided by Section 5. Chapter 403, Acts of 1922. Notion carried.

MAY 24th 1923.

On the morning of the 24th the Commission proceeded to Lexington where they were joined by Commissioner Sproul, and a meeting was held in the Court House and a public hearing was given at 11:00 A.M. to all interested in the ladation of the road from Cedar Grove towards Lexington or Cedar Grove to Timber Ridge. After the hearing the Commission examined the two Routes.

After the impaction, it was moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Sanders, that the Location of this Route be from Cedar Grove in the direction of Lexington to intersect Route No.3 at or near few White's Cate, and to be known as State Highway No. 172. Motion carried.

Whereas the Commission desiring to honor and perpetuate the

Back Mark St. 4-7 parkt Woldey (% the name of Commedors Kathew Fontains Maury, who contributed so much to the safety of travel on the sea by charting its great highways. It was moved by Mr. Massis, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that the road leading from Goshen through Goshen Pass via Cedar Grove to Tom White's Gate where it will connect with the Les Highway and thence over the Les Highway to Lexington, be known as the "MAURY HIGHWAY". Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sproul, that the Chairman take no further steps in regards to a publicity man until such time as he thinks necessary. Motion carried.

The Commission then adjourned to meet again on May 29th, 30th and 31st, 1923.
