MINUTES OF THE MEETINGS OF THE STATE HIGHWAY  
COMMISSION HELD MAY 29, 30, & 31, 1923 AT  
STAUNTON, HARRISONBURG, & FRONT ROYAL, VA.

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On the morning of May 29th, the Commission, consisting of Messrs Shirley, Massie, Sproul, and Sanders, assembled at Staunton and from there proceeded to Monterey thence to the West Va. Line where they met and conferred with members of the West Va. Road Commission, and from thence they examined the Route between Monterey and Frost.

MAY 30, 1923.

On the morning of the 30th, Commissioners Shirley, Massie, and Sproul, inspected the roads in the vicinity of Churchville, passing over Route No. 17 to Harrisonburg, where they held a meeting in regards to taking into the State System a connecting road from Harrisonburg up the Dry River thence to the top of the Mountain, at Lawyers Gap, where it would connect with the West Virginia State Highway System from Franklin through Pendleton County. Also the proposed line from Broadway through Broadway, Brock's Gap and connecting with the West Virginia State Highway System at or near Brock's Gap, tapping the Lost River Valley of West Virginia. The Commission examined the Dry River Route as far as the Water Supply for Harrisonburg and after the meeting proceeded to Strasburg where they spent the night.

MAY 31, 1923.

On the morning of the 31st, the Commissioners Shirley, Massie

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and Sproul, inspected the Routes leading from Strasburg to River-  
ton via Waterlick and from Waterlick to Front Royal by the upper  
route. After this inspection, they gave a hearing on the location  
of the Route to be incorporated into the State System between  
Front Royal and Strasburg, as well as between Cedarville and Mid-  
dletown.

Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the Chair-  
man's offer of \$120,737.50, being the appraisal value, for the  
Intermediate Air Service Station at South Richmond, Virginia, to  
the Quartermaster General, U. S. War Department, be confirmed and  
ratified and that the Chairman be empowered to enter into such  
contract or agreement as may be necessary to consummate this pur-  
chase. Motion carried.

There being no further business before them, the Commission  
adjourned.
