Deet Mari Ma St." and Making Co. MINUTES OF THE MENTINGS OF THE STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSION HELD WAY 29, 30, & 31, 1923 AT STAINTON, HARRISONNUM, & PROMY ROYAL, VA.

On the morning of May 29th, the Commission, commissing of Messare Shirley, Massis, Sproul, and Sandam, assembled at Staunton and from their proceeded to Monterey thence to the West Ta.

Line where they not and conferred with mumbers of the West Ta.

Road Commission, and from thence they examined the Route between Monterey and Frost.

KAY 30, 1923.

On the agraing of the 10th, Commissioners Shirley, Massie, and Sproul, impacted the reads in the vicinity of Churchville, passing over Soute So. 17 to Marrisonburg, where they held a most-ing in regards to taking into the State System a connecting road from Marrisonburg up the Dry River thouse to the top of the Hountain, at lawyers Cap, where it would connect with the West Virginia State Righway System from Franklin through Pendleton County. Also the proposed line from Broadway through Broadway, Brook's Gap and commenting with the Yest Virginia State Righway System at or near Broadway day, tapping the Lost River Valley of Yest Virginia. The Countsoion examined the Dry River Route as far as the Water Supply for Marrisonburg and after the meeting proceeded to Streeburg where they event the night.

KAY 31: 1923.

On the morning of the 31st, the Commissioners Shirley, Massie

Book Shad Sto. 16-2 cost Welling Co. and Sproul, impected the Routes leading from Stranburg to Riverton via Waterlink and from Waterlink to Front Royal by the upper route. After this impection, they gave a hearing on the location of the Route to be incorporated into the State Spates between Front Royal and Stranburg, as well as between Cedarville and Middletonn.

Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the Chairman's offer of \$120,737.50, being the appraisal value, for the Intermediate Air Service Station at South Richmond, Tirginia, to the Quartermester General, U. S. War Department, be confirmed and ratified and that the Chairman be empowered to enter into such contract or agreement as may be necessary to consummate this purchase. Motion carried,

There being no further business before them, the Commission adjourned.
