Minutes of the Meeting of the State Highway Commission of Virginia, Held in Rosnoke and Richmond, May 9-10, 1950.

At 1600 P.W. Monday, May 8, the following members of the Commission left Richmond by automobile and drove to Rosnoke -J. A. Anderson, J. P. Harpine, Howard C. Rogers and S. W. Hawls. Mr. B. P. Barrow, Mr. J. P. Hysor and Mr. J. B. Wampler travelled by train and Mr. Tucker C. Vatkins, Jr., travelled by automobile from Bouth Boston, The night was spent at the Hotel Rosnoke. Mr. George C. DeHardit was unable to be present.

At 9:00 A.M. Tuesday, May 9th, the Commission met in the ball room of the Hotel Rosnoke and held public hearings on the tentative allocation of funds for the fiscal year 1950-1951. All those from the Salem, Bristol, Staumton and Lynchburg Districts who were present and so desired were heard by the Commission.

After the hearings Mesers. Mysor, Wempler and Watkins returned home and the other members of the Commission draws to Richmond and spent the night.

On Mednesday morning, May 10, Mr. DeHardit joined the Commission and at 8:00 o'clock the Commission held public hearings on the tentative allocation of funds for the fiscal year 1950-1951 for the Richmond, Fredericksburg, Gulpeper and Suffelk Districts. The Commission heard all those who were present and wished to be heard.
