Since consideration of these tentative allocations will take all of our time we want advise that no matters other than the above will be considered today," Mr. May then introduced the members of the Commission and stated the district each represented. He further stated that with the preliginaries behind up we will immediately proceed with the bearing, and first we will hear from our friends from the Richmond District. The pounties will be called siphabetically and as your county is called please come forward to the microphone and give your name and midgage, and proceed with your approval or disapproval of out tentative primary ellocations in your county." Those from the Richmond, Fredericksburg, Culpaper and Suffolk Districts were then called, and the hearing proceeded as follows:

RICHARD DISTRICT

Dinwiddle County and City of Petersburg - Mr. Herrison Zebmar, Supervisor, of Legimey, presented a statement by the League of Virginia Counties, adopted at their executive board magning on May 15.

. Mr. Rebmer asked that the Commission delay the matching of Federal funds or at least to advise the Federal Government that it would like a slow-down so that it might have the opportunity to stilline some of the funds badly needed to keep the rural reads in travelable condition.

FUBLIC HEARING - Richmond - RICHBOND DISTRICT (CONTINUED)

Delegate Arthur Richardson consurred in Mr. Zehmar's remarks and stated that before he could support a 1¢ increase in gas can be would have to know that "a large portion of it was going to be spent on primary and secondary roads".

Reprice County and City of Richmond - Hr. Tasewell Ellett stated he had been delegated by the Board of Supervisors to commend the Commission for tentative allocations in Henrico County and to request that they be confirmed.

Macklenburg County - Delegate C. W. Cleaton introducted - Mr. Hark I. Burnett, Supervisor, who called attention to a resolution by the Board of Supervisors, sent to the Highway Countseion five or six months ago, asking further improvement of Route 49.

Mr. Cleaten stated that improvements are desired on Route 49 because for a number of years the people in the western part of Merklenburg County, in Lamenburg County and other adjoining counties have been envious to have the road included in the Federal Aid System and that all states except North Caroline have approved the request for inclusion of this route in the Federal Aid System, Mr. May advised him that North Caroline has made request for such designation of this route.

Mr. Cleaton was also interested in a project in the Torm of South Mill. Improvement of a 630 ft. section of street would divert water now draining on a parallel attest and counting considerable damage during heavy rains. This improvement, which would also parallel additional parking on the street, is estimated to cost \$4500.

Mr. Frank D. Herris, Mayor of South Hill, endorsed remarks of Mr. Cleaton in regard to needed improvements in South Hill. Mr. Herris was envious that a project on Soute 47, for which about \$30,000 was allocated last year, be started. He also stated the Town is willing to pay a proportionate part of cost of sidewalks needed on Route 1 north of the town.

FREDERSCHSBURG DISTRICT - No one from this district appeared before the Commission.

CULPRIER DISTRICT

Albertle County and City of Charlottenville - Dr. Arthur A. Newberr request allocation on Soute 29 from Lavingston to the new road outside of Charlottenville.

Mr. George Cachundro, of Scatteville presented the following: Hr. Thacker, undertaker; Mr. Pete Perry, of Charlottesville and Albemarie Chamber of Commerce; Mr. Smith, Chevrolet desler; Mr. Chas. Stane of U. S. Smither Company; Mr. Forest Paulett, desler in building materials; and Mr. Melson Lumpkin, botel operator; all of whom were interested in the recomstruction of a bridge surume James River on Route 20 at Scottsville.

PUBLIC HEARING - Richmond - CULPEPER DISTRICT (CONTINUED)

Hr. Stone stated shipments to the U.S. Rubber Company cannot be hauled across the present bridge because of low load limit. He says they are also handicapped by another bridge two miles north of Scottsville on Route 20, which has a ten ton load limit.

Mr. Onehundro referred to allocation for helping new industries and stated that certainly this new industry should be given due consideration.

Mr. Omobundro called attention to a letter recently sent the Commission by the secretary of the Lions Club at Scottsville, in behalf of this bridge.

Mr. Perry endorsed the request for bridge on Boute 20 and saked additional allocations on Route 29 south of Charlottesville and for sufficient funds ment year to complete the bypess on Route 250. (Statement attached)

Arlington County - Mr. C. G. Stoneburner endorsed allocations as set up and expressed appreciation for them. He also called attention to two, resolutions adopted by the Arlington Planning Comission, one dealing with financing, the other with the setting up of an advance right of way acquisition fund.

Mr. Stoneburner introduced Mr. Eunaberger, who made no comment,

Fairfax County - Mr. W. F. Bettwy, of the Town Council of Vienne, expressed appreciation for the widening of Maple Avenue in the Town. He also asked for reconsideration of their Movember 3 resolution asking that this atreet widening be continued to the east.

Fluvenne County - Col. R. C. Perkins, representing the Buritan Club, endorsed allocation for work on Route 15 north of Dizie.

Loudoun County - Mayor A. F. Anderson, of Purcellville, introduced Nr. L. K. McDaniel, who thenhed the Commission for the work done in the town on Route 7, stating that a recent Paderal Government development has increased traffic through the town. He asked whether it would be possible to get sufficient allocation to compiste the remaining one-quarter mile section in the west end of the town.

Madison County - Delegate D. French Slaughter expressed appreciation for the ellocation on the bypass expand Madison and asked that it be made permanent.

Mr. David F. Berry, representing the Medison Town Council, the Board of Supervisors and the Medison County Planning Countselon, asked that allocation on Boute 29, Medison by-pass be made permanent.

PUBLIC HEARING - Michmond - CULFEFER DISTRICT (CONTINUED)

Orange County - Mr. Howard Knowll, Town Manager, asked that allocation on Route 20 east of Orange be made permanent. He was also interested in proposed relocation of Route 20 and Alternate Route 20 "from the R. R. Crossing." This line crosses his land and he asked that some move be made to clear this matter and to let him know what is going to be done. He also thinks telephone poles on Route 20 from Berboursville to Somerset should be moved as they are restricting travel on this route.

Prince Villian County - Mr. Harry P. Davis, Mayor of the Town of Managers, thanked the Countssion for improvement on Route 234 in the Town of Managers. He stated that although there still exists a bottlenack at the railroad crossing they understand why this has been tied up.

Mr. Davis also thanked the Commission for the allocation on Route 28 through Hansasus and expressed the hope that construction would be started as soon as possible.

SUFFOLK DISTRICT - There was no one from the Suffolk District who wished to be heard.

. After hearing all those present and desiring to be heard the Commission recessed and reasonabled in the Commission Room on the third floor.

Item 10 on the Agenda, the problem of Route 11, Project 1686-08-09-10-12, Right of Way, west of Merion in Smyth County, was again up for discussion. Recent letters pertaining to the problem were reed to the Commission. Mr. Davis, Chief Engineer, reviewed the facts concerning the problem involved. After elengthy discussion it was recommended by the Commissioner that a comittee composed of Mesers. Davis, Harris, Felix, Scieter and himself try to work out a solution and bring a recommendation to the Commission at its next meeting. Mr. May made such a motion and it was seconded by Mr. Rawle, being unanimously carried.
