Minutes

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Meeting of State Highway Commission of Virginia Rosnoke and Richmond, Virginia Nay 23, 24, 25, 1962

The State Righmay Commission of Virginia met at Hotel Rosnoks, Rosnoks, Virginia, at 8:45 P.M. on May 23, 1962. The Chairman, H. B. Harris, presided.

Present: Chairman H. H. Harris, Mesers. W. N. Chinn, Jr., S. S. Flythe, R. S. Bolland, Burgess H. Nelson, W. M. Sciator, Jr., and R. S. Wesver, Jr. Mr. G. Wallace Carper was absent due to illness. Mr. Tucker C. Watkins, Jr. was not present for the meeting on May 23, but did attend the hearing on allocations on May 24.

The meeting receased at 10:20 P.M. until 8:30 A.K. on Nay 24, when a hearing was held on tentative Interstate and Rural Primary Construction Allocations for the fiscal year 1962-63 for the Bristol, Salem, Lynchburg and Steunton Districts. Following the hearing, the Commission again recessed until 9:00 A.M. on May 25, when a hearing was held at Hotel Richmond, Richmond, Va., on the tentative Interstate and Rural Primary Construction Allocations for the Richmond, Suffolk, Predericksburg and Culpaper Districts. A report of these hearings is attached and made a part of these minutes.

On motion of Mr. Sciater, seconded by Mr. Plythe, minutes of the meeting of April 19, 1962 were approved.

Hotion was made by Mr. Plythe, seconded by Mr. Chinn, that Mr. Tucker C. Watkins, Jr. be appointed to the position of secretary of the State Highway Commission, left vacant by the death of Mr. E. P. Barrow. This was unanimously approved.

Moved by Senator Nelson, seconded by Mr. Chinn, that WHEREAS, a number of fatal accidents have occurred at the intersection of Routes 340 and 641 at Ladd in Augusta County; and

WHEREAS, a temporary flashing light has been installed pending the study of a more permanent improvement to eliminate the basard; and

MMEREAS, the Study has been completed and a personent improvement of the intersection can be carried out within the existing right of way at an estimated cost of \$25,000; and

WHEREAS, a sufficient balance exists in the Staunton District Construction Reserve for this purpose; therefore,

HE IT BESOLVED, that \$25,000 is allocated from the Staunton District Construction Reserve to improve the intersection. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Chim, seconded by Senator Melson, that MMEREAS, the Department's traffic engineers used a study of traffic congestion on Route 50 in Fairfax County at the intersection of Graham Road and also at the intersection of Gallows Road and have recommended construction of laft-turn storage lanes to expedite the flow of traffic; and

WHEREAS, the estimated cost of providing left-turn storage lanes at these two intersections is \$12,000, a relatively minor sum in comparison to the benefits to be achieved; and

WHEREAS, there is a sufficient encunt in the Construction Reserve of the Culpeper District to cover this cost; therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED that \$12,000 is allocated from the Culpaper District Construction Reserve for the left-turn storage lanes at the above-described intersections. Motion carried.

Moved by Senator Nelson, seconded by Mr. Sclater, that WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Section 128 of Title 23 - Highways, Buited States Code, a public hearing was held in the auditorium of the Warren County High School, Front Royal, Virginia, at 10:00 A.M. EST, on April 5, 1962, concerning the proposed construction of Interstate Route 66 from the intersection of Interstate Route 81 (South of Middletown) to 0.38 mile east of Intersection of Routes 340 and 522 (North of Front Royal), State Project Q066-034-102, 0066-093-102, Federal Project I-66-1 (14)00.

WHEREAS, proper notice was given in advance and all those present were given a full opportunity to express their opinions and recommendations for or against the proposed development as planned and their statements being duly recorded, and

WHEREAS, the economic effects of the proposed relocation have been examined and given proper consideration, and this evidence, along with all other, has been carefully reviewed, now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the construction of this project be approved in accordance with the plane as proposed and presented by the Engineering Division of the Department of Highways at the public hearing and following Line C-1. This proposed location ties into Interstate Route 81 south of Middletown and is on a relocation, following near Secondary Routes 626 and 627 in Warren County, intersecting with Routes 340 and 522 north of Front Royal. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Flythe, seconded by Mr. Scister, that
WHEHEAS, in accordance with the provisions of Section 128
of Title 23 - Highways, United States Code, a public hearing was
held in the suditorium of the Oakland Elementary School on
Route 97 in Carroll County, at 1:30 P.M., on February 28, 1962,
concerning the proposed construction of Route 97 from 4.3 miles
east of the Grayson County Line to the Blue Ridge Parkway, Carroll
County, State Project 0097-017-102, Federal Project S-922-(3).

WHEREAS, proper notice was given in advance and all those present were given a full opportunity to express their opinions and recommendations for or against the proposed development as planned and their statements being duly recorded, and

WHEREAS, the economic effects of the proposed relocation have been examined and given proper consideration, and this evidence, along with all other, has been carefully reviewed, now therefore,

RE IT RESCLVED, that the construction of this project be approved in accordance with the plan as proposed and presented by the Engineering Division of the Department of Eighways along Alternate Line, shown in green and red combination. This proposed improvement generally follows along the existing road with a relocation from just west of Route 719 to Route 714. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Chinn, seconded by Mr. Holland, that
WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Section 128
of Title 23 - Highways, United State Code, a public hearing was
held in the suditorium of the Loudoun County Office Building,
Leesburg, Virginia, at 10:00 A.M., on May 3, 1962, concerning the
proposed construction of a bypass route at Leesburg, Virginia,
from 0.93 mile west of intersection of Routes 7 and 9 to 1.69 miles
north of North Corporate Limits of Leesburg on Route 15, State
Projects 0007-053 and 0015-053, Federal Project HPS-1(24), Code
2435.

WHEREAS, proper notice was given in advance and all those present were given a full opportunity to express their opinions and recommendations for or against the proposed development as planned and their statements being duly recorded, and

WHEREAS, the economic effects of the proposed relocation have been examined and given proper consideration, and this evidence, along with all other, has been carefully reviewed, now therefore,

HE IT RESOLVED, that the construction of this project be approved in accordance with the plan as proposed and presented by the Engineering Division of the Department of Highways along Line "A". Proposed Line "A" follows along or near existing Route 7 from 0.93 mile west of the intersection of Routes 7 and 9 to near the West Corporate Limits of Leesburg, then passing south of the Town around the asstern boundary of the Town, crossing Routes 15 and 7 and tising into Route 15 north of Leesburg. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Flythe, seconded by Mr. Chinn, that WHEREAS, Route 24 in Campbell County has been altered and reconstructed as shown on plans for Project 0024-015-003,C501; and

WHEREAS, five sections of the old road are no longer necessary as a public road, the new road serving the same citizens as the old road; five sections of the old road are no longer necessary for purposes of the State Highway System, a new road having been constructed in lieu thereof; and one section of the old road is to be transferred to the Secondary System of highways;

MOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33-76.5 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, 0.65 mile of the old road, shown in blue and designated as Sections 1, 2, 5, 6 and 9 on the plat dated November 16, 1961, Project 0024-015-003, C-501, be abandoned as a part of the State Highway System;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that quarterly payments at the base rate of \$300 per mile annually be made to the Town of Bedford on additional streets totaling 1.55 miles that have been brought up to standards required by this section of the Code, affective beginning April 1, 1962 for the quarterly payment due after Juna 30, 1962. The additional mile age of streets eligible for payment, described as follows:

Edmand Street - From Federal Street to Colonial Lane - 0.24 mi.

Reservices Street - From Burks Hill Road to End - 0.09 mi.

motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Flythe, seconded by Mr. Holland, that WHEREAS, the Highway Commission is authorized to make certain maintenance payments to cities and towns for street purposes; and

WHEREAS, the relocation of Route 99 in the Town of Pulaski has been constructed to required standards, request is made by the Town for the re-routing of Route 99 over the new location and necessary mileage adjustments subject to payment to the Town for maintenance; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33-113 of the Gode of Virginia, as amended, the addition and deletion of mileage for payment on primary route extensions within the Town of Pulaski be approved as follows:

Addition of New Location

of Route 99 - - - - - Baginning at the ECL of Pulaski; thence westerly along Third Street to Washington Avenue (U. S. Route 11), a total addition of 1.15 miles.

Deletion of Old Location of Boute 99

Beginning at the ECL of Pulsaki; thence westerly along Dora Highway to Wash-ington Avenue; thence overlapping Route 11 northerly along Washington Avenue to Third Streat, a net deletion of 1.20 wile.

The addition of 1.15 mile and deletion of 1.20 mile, making a net deletion of 0.05 mile, decreases the primary route extensions from 5.78 miles to 5.73 miles for maintenance payments at the base rate of \$4,000 per mile annually for the Town of Pulsaki, effective beginning April 1, 1962, for the quarterly payment due after June 30, 1962; and

AR IT FURTHER RESCIVED, that pursuant to Section 33-113.2 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, mileage adjustments for additions and deletions subject to payment on "Other Streets" to the Town of Pulaski be approved as follows:

Addition of old Route 99, from the ECL of Pulseki westerly along Dora Righway to Washington Avenue, a total addition of 1.20 mile,

Delation of Third Streat, from Union Avenue to Franklin Avenue - 0.34 mile; Second Street from Franklin Avenue to 0.07 mile east of Peake Creak - 0.18 mile, and Third Street from Madison Avenue to Washington Avenue - 0.12 mile; a total delation of 0.64 mile.

The addition of 1.20 mile and deletion of 0.64 mile, making a net addition of 0.56 mile, increases the mileage of "Other Streets" from 36.01 miles to 36.57 miles of approved streets for payment to the Town of Pulsaki at the base rate of \$300 per mile annually, effective beginning April 1, 1962, for the quarterly payment due after June 30, 1962. Motion carried.

Hoved by Senator Nelson, seconded by Mr. Sclater, that WHEREAS, the Town Council of Leesburg, by resolution adopted March 25, 1962, has requested a change in the Town's street maintenance agreement from Section 33-50.1 of the Code of Virginia to Section 33-30.4, due to their expanding street maintenance requirements brought about by annexation and rapid growth in residential development; and

WHEREAS, Section 33-50.1 of the Code of Virginia restricts the Town to 0.25 mile of new street additions per year, their present construction rate of new herd-surface streets is nine times greater than the acceptance limits under this section; now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, that the maintenance agreement with the Town of Leesburg, under Section 33-50.1 of the Code, providing for a 0.25-mile addition of unimproved streets per year, be changed to comply with Section 33-50.4 of the Code, whereby the Virginia Department of Highways will maintain, improve, construct and reconstruct all streets in the Town, having an unrestricted right of way width of not less than thirty feet and a hard-surface width of twelve feet, and any such streets established hereafter by said Town shall have an unrestricted right of way width of not less than than fifty feet and a hard-surface width of not less than twenty feet; and

BE IT FURTHER RESCEVED, that this change will not become effective until July 1, 1962. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Flythe, seconded by Mr.Chinn, that WHEREAS, the construction of the Interstate System results in a combination of systems in the parformance of maintenance operations at interchanges and grade separation structures; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable to establish a policy as to the responsibility for the physical maintenance operations at such interchanges and grade separation structures similar to the policy adopted for service roads on August 18, 1960.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the following policy is hereby adopted by the Highway Commission for the maintenance of interchanges and grade separation structures in connection with the Interstate System;

I. IN CITIES AND TOWNS

A. Interchanges

- (1) Where the Interstate System construction provides an interchange within a city or a town charged with the responsibility for the maintenance of its street system, the Interstate System will be responsible for the maintenance of the complete highway facility within the controlled access limits of the interchange.
- (2) Maintenance payments will not be paid to east city or town for street or road mileage maintained by the Interstate System under the provisions of Section A(1).

B. Grade Separation Structures (without access ramps)

- (1) Where the Interstate route passes under a street within a city or town charged with the responsibility for the maintenance of its street system, the maintenance of the surface and sidewalks of the structure and the approach readways to the back of the shoulder line shall be the responsibility of the municipality. The Interstate System will maintain the remainder of the structure, including the handrails, guardrails, repairs to the structural readway slab and slopes beyond the shoulder line, within the limits of the normal Interstate right of way.
 - (2) Where the Interstate route passes over a street within a city or town charged with the responsibility for the maintenance of its street system, the maintenance of the entire structure and slopes back of the normal ditch or sidewalks shall be the responsibility of the Interstate System. the street roadway underneath the Interstate route shall continue to be the responsibility of the city or town.

II. IN COUNTIES

- A. In all counties, with the exception of Arlington and Renrico, where the Interstate System construction provides a grade separation structure with or without ramps at a primary or secondary route intersection, the maintenance costs will be borns as follows:
 - (1) Where the Interstate route passes under the primary or secondary route, the Primary or Secondary Systems will provide the maintenance funds for the surface and sidewalks of the structure and the approach roadways to the back of the shoulder line. The Interstate System will provide the funds for the maintenance of the remainder of the structure, including the handrails, guardrails and approach slopes, repairs to the structural roadway slab and the pavement, shoulders and slopes of all ramps.
 - (2) Where the Interstate route passes over the primary or secondary route, the funds for the maintenance of the entire structure, ramp pavement, shoulders and slopes will be provided by the Interstate System. The roadway undermeath the Interstate route will be maintained from Primary or Secondary funds.

III. ARLINGTON AND HENRICO COUNTIES - Interstate System

A. Interstate - State Primary Route Intersections

The maintenance of the interchanges and grade separation structures and approaches at all intersections of Interstate and primary routes inArlington and Henrico Counties will be the responsibility of the Virginia Department of Highways and the cost will be apportioned between the systems in accordance with Section II. A(1).

B. Interstate-County Route Intersections

(1) Where the Interstate route passes under a county maintained strest or road, the maintenance of the surface and aidewalks of the structure and the approach roadways to the back of the shoulder line shall be the responsibility of the county. The Interstate System will maintain the remainder of the structure, including the handrails, guardrails and approach slopes, repairs to the structural roadway slab, and the pavement, shoulders and alopes of all ramps within the limits of the normal Interstate right of way.

(2) Where the Interstate route passes over a county maintained street or road, the maintenance of the entire structure and slopes back of the normal ditch or sidewalks, including ramp connections to the edge of the street pavement, shall be the responsibility of the Interstate System. The street roadway underneath the Interstate route shall continue to be the responsibility of the county.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the Commission policy on this matter which was adopted on February 16, 1961, be and the same hereby is rescinded. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Holland, seconded by Mr. Chins, that WHEREAS, a limitation of five acres was established for rest areas by resolution of the Highway Commission of July 28-30, 1953; and

WHEREAS, the existing Interstate System program of design and financing has been established since this resolution was adopted; and

WHEREAS, the Interstate System rest areas meeting national standards and guides adopted for this system by the American Association of State Highesty Officials usually result in an area greater than five acres; therefore,

AR IT RESOLVED that rest areas on the Interstate System be excepted from the limitation of five acres established by the resolution of July 28-30, 1953. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Holland, seconded by Mr. Chinn, that WHRREAS, the County of Norfok and the City of South Norfolk have been chartered as a City, as yet unnamed, effective January 1, 1963; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of South Norfolk by resolution of April 19, 1962, and the Board of Supervisors of Norfolk County by resolution of April 24, 1962, requested the State Highway Department to continue the maintenance of roads and streets, as now operated, through the State fiscal year ending June 30, 1963, for the following reason:

That the portion of the new unnamed city which is now Morfolk County will need time and essistance in the transitory period to transfer the control end juriadiction of the roads, highways, and bridges to the new unnamed city.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the State Highway Commission: That the Department will continue to maintain, construct, and reconstruct the roads, streets, and bridges on the Primary and Secondary Systems within the present County of Horfolk for the period of January 1, 1963 through June 30, 1963, as though the County had not become a city. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Solland, seconded by Mr. Chinn, that WHEREAS, the County of Princess Anne and the present City of Virginia Beach have been chartered as the new City of Virginia Beach, effective January 1, 1963; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Princess Anna County, by resolution of February 12, 1962, requested the Virginia State Highway Department to continue the maintenance of roads and streets, as now operated, through the State fiscal year ending June 30, 1963 for the following reason:

That the portion of the new City of Virginia Beach which is now Princess Anna County will need time and assistance in the transitory period to transfer the control and jurisdiction of the road, highways, and bridges to the new City of Virginia Beach; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the present City of Virginia Beach, by resolution of April 2, 1962, has concurred in the request of the Board of Supervisors of Princess Anna County, with the proviso that this would not affect the status of the present City of Virginia Beach.

MOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the State Highway Commission: That the Department will continue to maintain, construct, and reconstruct the roads, streets, and bridges on the Primary and Secondary Systems within the present County of Princess Anne for the period of January 1, 1963 through June 30, 1963 as though the County had not become a city. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Flythe, seconded by Mr. Holland, that WHEREAS, during recent investigations of Highway construction practices in many states questions have arisen in regard to conflicts of interest on the part of certain highway commission or board members; and

WHENEAS, while no questions have arisen in regard to any conflicts of interest on the part of any member of the Righway Countission of Virginia, it is felt that it would be advisable for this Commission to state its policy in regard to the matter.

NOW, THREEFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That no member of the Highway Commission of Virginia, during his term of office, shall have, directly or indirectly, any financial or other personal interest in any contract or subcontract entered into by the Virginia Department of Highways. Motion carried.

The progress on study of approach roads to the Chasapeake Bay Bridge-Tunnel was discussed. No action was taken,

The Commission approved final allocations of Interstate and Aural Primary Construction Funds for the year 1962-63 as shown on sheets attached to these minutes.

HIGHNAY CONSISSION PUBLIC HEARING ON TESTATIVE ALLOCATION OF INTERSTATE AND RURAL PRIMARY CONSTRUCTION PUMDS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 1962 - 63

SAIRM, BRISTOL, LYMCHBURG, AND STAUDTON DISTRICTS

Rosnoke, Virginis - May 24, 1962

The public hearing on Tentative Allocation of Interstate and Rural Primary Construction Funds for the Piscal Year 1962-63 for the Salam, Bristol, Lyuchburg, and Staunton Districts was held in the Exhibit Hall of Hotel Rosnoke on Thursday, May 26, 1962, beginning at 8:50 A.M.

Commissioner Barris called the hearing to order and extended a welcome to those present. He brought to their attention the fact that the hearing was being held during "Highway Wook." He expressed appreciation to the numbers of the Boards of Supervisors and city and county officials who attended the tours during Highway Wook for the cooperation given. Hembers of the Highway Coumission were introduced and Mr. Harris stated that How. Wallace Carper, of Holesa, was recovering from an operation and could not be present. Engineers from the Richmond Office and the four district engineers representing the four districts which were to be heard! were introduced.

SALEN DISTRICT

Bedford County and Town of Bedford - Delegate Lary Putney expressed appreciation for all consideration in the past on the primary highways and for the tentative allocations made on Boutes 122 and 460 in Bedford County. He stated that the Smith Mountain Dem project was now under way and the traffic in that area had picked up transmitted by Boutes 122, 43, and 24.

Former Member of the House of Delegates, E. T. Ferguson, expressed his interest in Route 24 from Stewartsville to Bosnoke County Line. Be thanked the Commission for all consideration shown in the past. He pointed out that the traffic between Stewartsville and Vinton was transmouse and the road is vary crooked and rough in places. He stated the road needs improvement and would appreciate very much any consideration that could be given in the future. A delegation from Route 24 was presented.

James Tease, Member of the Bedford County Board of Supervisors, spoke in behalf of Route 43 and expressed appreciation for consideration that has been given to the primary rouds in Bedford, particularly Route 297, which was completed last year. Mr. Tease presented a delegation interested in the section of Route 43 from the Town of Bedford to the Compbell County Line. He stated that Route 43 was a direct connecting link from Boute 29 to the Blue Ridge Parkway and Route 11. He pointed out that Route 43 carried connected traffic as well as a great deal of tourist traffic, which will increase due to the Smith Mountain and Leasville Dame. Be stated

the road was inadequate to meet the needs of the traffic, marger and crooked, and some sections were too narrow to be marked with center-line. A resolution from the Huddleston Buritan Club, supporting the project, was presented. Hr. Tooss requested that this road be given all funds evailable to make improvements.

Rev. Haruld Oyer expressed appreciation for the consideration given to request made last year for beginning work on Route 122 and maked that further consideration he given to completing this road, particularly since it is the only highest crossing the lake formed by the Smith Mountain Dam.

James R. Holdren, Executive Secretary of the Sedford County Chamber of Commerce, edded support to all the delegations from Sedford County. He saked that consideration be given to the primary routes in the Swith Mountain Dem ages.

Cerroll County

Releigh Cooley, Mayor of Town of Hillsville, presented a delegation from Carroll County and empressed appreciation for the curb and gutter and sidewalk projects in the Town of Hillsville. He asked that the work continue on these projects until it could be completed. He stated that the people in the Town of Hillsville would like to see Route 52 improved.

Russell T. Fernsworth, Manager of the Carroll-Greyson Chamber of Commerce, thanked the Commission for everything that had been done in the way of road construction and for new Moute 58 coming into the Town of Hillsville from Hoodlawn. He asked that consideration be given to Route 52 south of Hillsville in the Fancy Gap section. He stated this route was narrow, steep and crooked and provided a poor entrance to the state for visitors. He pointed out the number of vahicles using this route and the number of antomobile accidents involving fatalities that had occurred on this section of road from the Borth Carolina Line to Hillsville. He requested the Commission do all possible in future allocations to see that this road is relocated and reconstructed.

R. F. Reynolds, Superintendent of Schools in Carroll County, emphasized again the need for some improvements on Route 52 south from Fancy Gap as related to safety for the school buses. He stated there were 42 children attending school in Earth Carolina because this road was too hazardous for school bus travel. He said they were very grataful for the travendous improvements unde in the school bus routes in Carroll County and were impressed with the road situation. He asked that consideration be given to this particular section, since it was hazardous and needed attention.

Senator Floyd Landreth spoke on behalf of Route 52 between Hillswills and Port Chiswell and Route 58. He pointed out the things that were being done in Carroll County which were covered during the "Mighaey Week" tour and expressed his appreciation as a citizen for everything that has been done in the past.

Frenklin County

Mr. Virgil Goode, Commonwealth Attorney for Franklin County, expressed appreciation for the tentative allocation for Route 116 and asked that it be made permanent. He thanked the Commission for the allocation to build eldewalk from the village of Ferrum to Ferrum Junior College. He called the Commission's attention to the hazardous crossing in the village of Ferrum and asked that serious consideration be given to an overhead bridge over the Horfolk and Western Railroad in the village of Ferrum. He thanked the Commission for the appropriation on Route 122 in Bedford County. He asked that consideration be given to some construction on Route 220 from Franklin County to the North Carolina Line.

Ray Hamilton, representing the citizens of Franklin County, the Ruritan Club of Burnt Chimpey, and the Community Club of Bad Valley, expressed appreciation for the allocation on Route 116 in Rosnoke County and asked that it be extended to Burnt Chimmey, where it will tie into Route 122. He introduced a delegation from Franklin County.

Prince Thornton, Chairman of the Franklin County Planning Countssion, asked that work on Route 116 be given priority so it would not be bypassed in order to get additional work started on Route 220.

Ed Aiken, Executive Secretary of the Franklin County Chamber of Commerce, pointed out that the Franklin County Chamber of Commerce was in wholehearted support of all of the citizens asking for improvements in the Franklin County road system. He said a resolution had been forwarded to all the Commissioners asking for the duallaning of Boute 220.

Giles County

Paul L. Comer, representing the town government of Rich Creek and the Giles County Chamber of Commerce Roads Committee, thanked the Commission for the consideration given in the past in road matters in GilesCounty and for the tentative allocations for 1962-63. He also spoke in behalf of Route 460 between Marrows and Rich Creek. A delegation from Giles County was introduced.

J. A. Moore, General Manager of the Appalachian Power Company Generating Plant at Gien Lyn, pointed out that Houte 460 from Marrows to the West Virginia Line was a detriment to Giles County. He expressed appreciation for the work being done on Houte 460 but expressed particular interest in this section of the road.

Sam Martin, representing the Hoads Committee of theChamber of Commerce and Town of Pearisburg, expressed appreciation for the tentative allocation onRoute 460. He was interested in the section of the road going from the middle of town in Pearisburg to the new high school. Henry County, Patrick County, and City of Martinsville
Delegate A. L. Philpott thanked the Commission for the generosity
to Henry and Patrick Counties and saked that the tentative allocations be confirmed. He asked that the need for sidewalk extending
along Route 220 in the Town of Collinsville be considered. He
also asked for further improvement of Route 37 east of the City of
Martinsville, leading to Chatham. He stated that this was a bad
road and needed improvement. He asked that the project on Route 57
west of Bassettbe continued and a supplemental allocation be made
to continue this project.

Former Governor Thomas B. Stanley welcomed the new members to the Commission. He stated they were very grateful for the consideration being shown to the people in the Martinsville area and asked that the tentative allocations be made parameter. He spoke in behalf of Route 57 in Patrick County and asked that the work be continued, and pointed out the need for dual-laning Route 220 through Franklin and Henry Counties,

Senator W. F. Stone, of Martinsville, expressed appreciation for all that had been done and the splendid job being done with the amount of money allocated. He pointed out three things which he thought should be brought to the attention of the Commission:

- (1) Collingvills-need for sidewalk.
- (2) Boute 57 west asked funds be allocated to keep the project going.
- (3) Boute 57 east of Martinsville to Chathem he asked for a start on this road.

Delagate Robert Clark asked that consideration be given to continuing the project on Route 57 to get it built as fast as possible and expressed appreciation for all that had been done in the past. A delegation from Patrick County was presented.

Prencis T.West, President of Martinaville and Henry County Chember of Commerce, pointed out the need for dual-laning Boute 220 from Boones Mili to the North Carolina Line.

Rosnoke County and City of Rosnoke

W. Bolling Isard, President of Boanoke Chamber of Commerce, presented a letter based on a resolution passed by the Board of Directors of the Chamber of Commerce of Rosnoke thanking the Commission for the tentative allocations. He expressed appreciation for the additional allocations for Rosna 119 and for the allocation to Boute 220 south. He requested they consider the ellocation for Rosna 460 and that it be increased and requested an allocation for improving Rosna 24.

Edwin G. Terrell, Chairman of the Enamoke County Board of Supervisors, presented a resolution requesting construction of sidewalk from the entrance of Hollins College (north side of Route 11) to Route 601. He thanked the Commission for the tentative allocations on Boute 24, 119 and 460, and asked that they be under permanent.

BRISTOL DISTRICT

Bland County

Roger Klutts spoke on behalf of Bland County and expressed appreciation for the routing of Interstate Route 77 through Bland County. Be asked for an allocation to improve Route 42 between Route 21 and the Smyth County line. Resolution from the Ceres Buritan Glub endorsing this request was presented to the Countstion.

Charles Dunn, of Bland County, thanked the Countssion for the allocations for Bland County.

Buchange County

Delogate Joe Breeding congratulated the Commission on the work being done to extend Route 460 to the Texawell County Line and maked that further consideration be given to this route.

Gene Bane, representing the Buchanan County Chamber of Countries and the Better Roads Countries of the State Chamber of Countries, asked that Boute 460 be dual-laned through Buchanan County into Taxamell County. He pointed out that Buchanan County will some day be the largest cosl-producing county in America, due to the new mines being developed.

Frank Porterfield, Town Manager for Town of Grundy, endorsed comments made by Delegate Breading and Mr. Gene Bane and asked that the side-walk project in Grundy be extended in the lower and to the Kentucky Line. He also asked that the back street whind the business district of town be made Alternate Bouts 460.

Bickenson County

Delagate Sykes spoke in behalf of Routes 80 and 83 and empressed appreciation for previous allocations on these two roads and requested the tentative allocations be made permanent.

Supt. of Schools, J. H. T. Sutherland, thanked the Commission for the efforts made to meet the needs in Dickenson County. He emphasized the importance of getting construction underway on Routs 63 from Clincheo to Hayai and asked that sufficient allocation be made to continue this construction.

Grayson County and City of Galax

Monte Cox, representing the Carroll-Grayson Chamber of Commerce, expressed appreciation for consideration previously shows.

Dr. Virgil Cox, representing the City of Galax, and speaking in behalf of Route 58, asked that further appropriations be made to continue the work on to Independence. He asked the Commission to check on the development of Route 21 leading from the North Carolina Line to Independence.

Cam Fields, asked for improvement of Route 56 from Independence to Galax and that Route 221 be abanged to follow Route 58 into North Carolina.

Senator Landreth expressed interest and endorsed the improvements requested on Route 58.

Lee County

Delegate James B. Fugate expressed interest in the completion of Soute 58 and pointed out the need for continuing the work on this route.

Senator J. Rubert Wheeler asked that the tentative allocations be made permanent and asked that the Commission continue the allocations for Route 58 to complete construction.

Mat G. Ewing, Chairman of the Lee County Planning Commission, for the City of Jonesville asked that the tentative allocations be made personant and asked the Commission to supply the necessary funds to continue the construction on Route 58.

Scott County

Benetor Wheeler spoke in behalf of Route 58 and asked that construction continue.

Smyth County and Town of Marion

Walter P. Squart asked that tentative allocations on Boute 107 be made permanent and that work be started as soon as possible.

William Killinger, Chairman of the Chamber of Commerce of the Town of Marion, expressed appreciation for the Interstate work in Smyth County. He asked that the work be continued on the onehalf mile of urban Route 11 project on the west edge of Marion. He also expressed interest in Route 58 south of Smyth County.

Mayor J. G. Peeples, of the Town of Saltville, thanked the Commission for the things done for Smyth County and the Community. He asked that construction on Route 107 be started as soon as possible and pointed out that, with the Olin Mathiesen Chamical Corporation and the U. S. Gypsum Company, they are badly in meed of this access road.

Douglas Clark, speaking in behalf of the Chamber of Commerce and the Town of Chilhovie, expressed appreciation for the allocation on Route 107 and saked that work be started soon.

R. C. Eversole, Plant Managar of the Olin Mathieson Chemical Corporation - Saltville Operations, expressed appreciation for the funds usde evailable for road improvement in Smyth County. He said the chemical corporation was moving more material by truck and asked that the Commission consider at an early date an allocation of industrial access funds for this project.

Senator Landreth spoke in behalf of Smyth County and seked that all consideration possible be given to their requests.

A delegation from Smyth County was presented.

Temewell County, Town of Bluefield, and Town of Richlands
Mr. Delton thanked the members of the Commission for the good things which had been done for Tesewell in past years. He asked the Countssion to provide funds for Boute 460 from Bayen to Buchenen County Line until this section is completed. He pointed out that Taxewell County wholeheartedly concurred in the problem of Route 450 in Suchanan County and hoped for continued work on this route.

Jako Huffman, Vice president of the Michlands Chamber of Commerce. expressed gratitude for the work being done and conurred with Buchanen County in the request for continued work on Houte 460.

Washington County, City of Bristol, and City of Abingdon Ernest Quasinberry asked the Commission to initiate plans for an early survey for State Street and Componwealth Avenue in the City of Bristol to connect with the Interstate Route 81 spur.

Bill Woodward, City Attorney, spoke in behalf of the work needed in the City of Bristol on State Street and Componently Avenue and soked the Commission to give this their early consideration,

Fise County and City of Norton

Bill Kento, representing Wise County Chamber of Commerce and the City of Morton, expressed appreciation for allocations made to Route 23 and asked the Commission to keep in mind future allocations covered in resolution.

Wythe County and Town of Wytheville Nat Pendleton thanked the Commission for the allocations on

Interestate Routes 77 and 81 and Route 11 and saked that they be made permanent.

STAUSTON DISTRICT

Alleghany County, City of Clifton Forms, and City of Covington B. C.Moomaw, Jr., representing Covington-Alleghany Chember of Commerce, the City of Covington, the City of Clifton Forge, and Allegheny County Board of Supervisors, asked that the tentative allocation of funds for highway purposes in the Covington-Alleghany County area be made permanent.

Rockingham County and City of Harrisonburg

T. R. Cooley, representing Harrisonburg-Bockingham Chamber of Commerce, asked thes the tentative allocations be unde peruspent. He asked that the work on Boute 33 be continued to Route 340, pointing out that the slow traffic to the top of the mountain was very bad. He expressed appreciation for allocation made for the Timberville group and asked that attention be given to Route 256.

Mayor Coyner, of Timberville, thanked the Commission for allocation made for Boute 42 cowing to Timberville and asked that it be made permanent. He pointed out that any consideration given to widening Main Street in Timberville would be greatly appreciated.

A representative of the Shanandoah Valley Airport Commission expressed appreciation for allocation made for Route 256 from Route 11 to Grottoes and asked consideration be given to increasing the allocation.

Mr. Wilharger, of the Town of Grottoes, expressed interest in Boute 256 and told the Commission that anything they could do would be greatly appreciated.

LYNCHBURG DISTRICT

Amberst County

Jack F. Thomas, President of the Amberst Chamber of Commune, presented a delegation and expressed appreciation for the tentative ellocation made to Route 29 north of Lynchburg. He esked that if possible the allocation be increased and that it be continued each year until completed.

Barl Brown, member of the House of Delegates, expressed appreciation for tentative allocation and asked that it be retained and increased if possible.

Apposettox County

Senetor Moses expressed appreciation for appropriation made to Houte 460 and stated he would like to see the Tood completed.

Dr. Lawson, Mayor of the Town of Appenattox, thanked the Commission for the tentative allocation made to the Town of Appenattox for curb and gutter and sidewalk. He said he would like to see the allocation increased to finish the project to the east corporate limits.

Buckingham Councy

Secator Moses spoke in behalf of Buckinghen County and thanked the Commission for the appropriation to Route 50.

Campbell County and City of Lynchburg

B. F.Ginther, Jr., President of Brookmeal Chamber of Commerce, expressed interest in Route 501. He presented a delegation from Brookmeal and requested that an immediate allocation be made for the reconstruction of Boute 501 north from Brookmeal through Campbell County.

Lawrence H. McWane, representing the Lynchburg Chamber of Commerce, pointed out the need for dual-laming Route 460 from Richmond to Rosmoks. He asked the Commission to take this into consideration.

Ton Class, Number of the Appropriations and Boads Committee of the House of Delegates, concurred with Mr. McWans on getting Route 460 dual-laned from Richmond to Rosnoke. He asked the Commission to go over the statements made at a recent meeting and the reasons they felt a better road was necessary. He asked that consideration be given to improving Boute 29 since it is considered a vital road to Virginia and to other states.

A representative from Soute 24 in Compbell County expressed appreciation for the work done on this route in completing it from Rustburg to Concord School. He asked that consideration be given to finishing this one mile with sidewalk from Concord School to Route 460.

Senator Moses thanked the Commission for the appropriation made to Route 45 and asked that Comberland County not be forgotten.

Melson County

The Executive Secretary of the Melson County Chamber of Commerce thanked the Commission for the ellocation to Houte 29 and esked that the work be continued through Melson County. He expressed appreciation for the allocation to Route 151 in the Gulpaper District and asked that this work be continued until the project is completed.

Oder P. Carter, President of the Melson County Chamber of Commerce, thanked the Commission for the allocation made on Route 29. He pointed out that they felt Route 151 through Welson County was just as important as Route 29. He asked that consideration be given to completing Route 151 and to improving Route 56 from Tyro to the Bockbridge County Line.

Paul Mays, representing the HelecoCounty Men's Club, the Euritan Club, and the Chamber of Commerce, thanked the Commission for the consideration given to locating Route 64 through their county.

Senator Moses spoke in behalf of the counties in his district and saked that all consideration possiblebs given to the requests.

Pittsylvania County

Mr. Thompson said they were very grateful for what had been done for Pittsylvania County and seked that consideration be given to Route 57 between Chathan and Martinsville, He concurred with Senator Stone on this matter.

James Parsons urged the Commission to appropriate for the first time funds necessary to begin planning for the construction of Route 57 from Chathem to Martinsville to correct the baserdoos condition it is creating in Pittsylvania County and Henry County.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:30 P.M.

HIGHWAY COMMISSION PUBLIC HEARING ON THE TENTATIVE 1962-63 PRIMARY SYSTEM ALLOCATIONS FOR THE RICHMOND, SUFFOLE, PREDERICKSBURG AND CULPEPER DISTRICTS Richmond, Virginia - May 25, 1962

The public hearing on the tentative 1962-63 Primary System allocations to the Richmond, Suffolk, Fredericksburg and Culpeper Districts was held in the Winter Garden of Rotel Richmond on May 25, 1962, at 9:00 a.m.

- Mr. H. H. Harris, State Highway Commissioner, introduced the members of the Commission, as follows: Mr. W. M. Chinn, Jr., Predericksburg District; Mr. W. M. Solater, Jr., Bristol District; Mr. S. S. Plythe, Salem District; Mr. Richard S. Holland, Suffolk District; and Judge R. S. Weaver, Jr., Richard District.
- Mr. T. C. Watkins, Jr., Lynchburg District, Senator Burgess E. Welson, Staunton District, and Mr. G. Wallace Carper, Culpeper District, were unable to be present.
- Mr. Harris elso introduced Mr. F. A. Davis, Deputy Commissioner and Chief Engineer; Mr. D. B. Fugate, Assistant Chief Engineer; and Mr. A. B. Eure, Fiscal Director.
- Mr. Sam Englehardt, Jr., Highway Director of the Alabama State Highway Department, who attended the hearing for a While, was introduced by Mr. Harris.

The counties in each of the four districts were called alphabetisally and persons wishing to speak were invited to do so.

RICHMOND DISTRICT

- Route 1 Delegate C. W. Cleaton, South Hill, asked that the third lane on Route 1 on the north side of South Hill be rebuilt -- he said the original road was built in 1942.
- Route 6 Anting County Engineer for Henrico County, Mr. A. T. Dotson, asked for the continuation of the improvement west from Gayton Road.
- Boute 40 A number of people requested the improvement of Route 40 in Lunenburg and Nottoway Counties, particularly from Kenbridge to the Nottoway River. Some of those who spoke were Delegate R. Maclin Smith, Kenbridge; Mr. Harry Wellone, Victoria, representing the Chamber of Commerce; Mayor W. O. Brame of Victoria;

Mr. L. W. Coleman, Chairman of the Board of Supervisors of Dinwiddle County; and Councilman J. P. Batto of McKenny.

Route 49 - Improvement was requested for the section from Nottoway River to Crewe. Spokesmen for this improvement were Senator John Temple, Petersburg; Senator J. C. Hutcheson, Lawrenceville; Delegate C. W. Cleaton; Delegate R. Maulin Smith; Mayor A. G. Hutcheson, Chase City; Councilman Garland E. Moss, Chase City; Mr. J. P. Strickland, Town of Victoria; Delegate Llewellyn H. Irby, Blackstone; and Mr. Harry Vellone, Virgilina, representing the Flagavalina Highway Association.

Route 92 - Improvement and straightening from Chase City to Boydton in Mecklenburg County was requested by Senator J. C. Hutcheson, Lawrenceville; Delegate C. V. Cleaton; J. D. Harrelson, Town Manager, Chase City; Mayor A. G. Hutcheson, Chase City; Mr. Qarland Moss, Vice Mayor, Chase City; and Mr. R. C. Tucker, Chase City.

It was stated that a petition was presented last year,

Route 138 - Delegate C. V. Cleaton requested improvement from the intersection of Route 137 near Kenbridge south to the intersection of Route 1 near South Hill.

Route 360 - The improvement of this route from the city limits of Richmond through Henrico County was requested by Mr. A. T. Dotson.

SUFFOLK DISTRICT

Routes 10 and 258 at Smithfield - The numerous floodings that have occurred recently have meant a large loss in men-hours and in damage to sutemobiles for those working at the several large industries in Smithfield. Requests for the correction of the condition where these routes cross Pagan River and Cypress Creek were made by Delegate Shirley T. Holland, Windsor; Mayor Robert T. Delk of Smithfield; also, Smithfield Town Manager, Colonel J. D. Branch, and Mesers. J. E. Turner, Tow Ross and P. D. Gwethmey, III.

Route 17 - Request was made for the dual-laning of this route from the George P. Coleman Bridge to the City of Hewport Hews. Mr. G. Duane Holloway, Commonwealth's Attorney for York County, headed a large delegation. Delegate Lewis McMurran, Newport News, Mr. Irvin Fuller, and Delegate Russell M. Carneal, Villiansburg, also spoke.

Letters urging this improvement were presented from Mr. Mark C. Hopkins, Manager of the Manufacturing Department, Yorktown Refinery of the American Oil Company; and Captain J. P. German, U. S. Coast Quard, Reserve Training Center, Yorktown. Also, a petition was presented.

Route 60 - A large delegation headed by Mr. Nelson Sutton, Jr., urged the improvement of Route 60 from Lightfoot to Anderson's Corner. It was stated that large numbers of tourists use this approach to Williamsburg; also, that because of the limited capacity of the bridge over the C&O railroad at Toeno it cannot be used by large buses or the fire equipment.

Others who spoke were Delegate Russell M. Carneal; Mr. Wesley Sheldon, President of the James City County Chamber of Commerce; Mr. Maurice Hyssion and Mr. J. P. Yancey.

Helelander, President, Route 60 Corporation; Mr. S. B. Sheldon, Sheldon Wood Products, Toano; Mr. Frank B. Anderson, Director, James City County Civil Defense; Doctor H. H. Ashbury, Superintendent, Eastern State Hospital; Mr. H. M. Stryker, Mayor, City of Williamsburg; Mr. Carlisle H. Humelsine, President, Colonial Williamsburg; and Mr. Maurice Q. Tessin, President, Williamsburg Chamber of Commerce.

CULPEPER DISTRICT

Route 20 - Delegate D. French Slaughter, Jr., requested that the \$25,000 set up in the 1962-63 tentative allocations for the intersection of Routes 3 and 20 be transferred to Route 20 east of Unionville, Grange County.

Doctor Monroe Waugh, Chairman of the Board of Supervisors of Orange County, stated that about 14 years ago the Orange County citizens through a bond issue had had this route stabilized. Other speakers were Mr. S. Page Higginbotham, Commonwealth's Attorney for Orange County; Mr. Henry C. DeJarnette, Clerk of the County; Mr. Porter Davis, Daputy Sheriff; Mr. C. A. Utz, Member of the Board of Supervisors.

Resolutions requesting the improvement were presented, as follows: Board of Supervisors of Orange County, May 8, 1962; the Town Council of Orange, May 14, 1962; Orange Ruritan Glub, January 5, 1962; and the Orange County Chamber of Commerce, May 16, 1962.

Route 28 - Delegate Tom Frost requested the improvement of this route in Fauquier County.

Route 29 - A large delegation headed by Senator E. O. McGue, Jr., requested the continued improvement of Route 29 from Charlottesville to Culpeper, which is the goal for the Route 29 Improvement Assn. It was stated that Route 29 carries more traffic than any other

route in the state that is not going to be paralleled by an Interstate route.

Other speakers requesting the improvement of Route 29 were Delegate Tom Frost; Mr. Edwin G. Adair, Jr., Culpeper; Mr. Marshall Long, Oulpeper; Judge Davis F. Berry, Madison; Mr. Sterling W. Lame, Chairman, Board of Supervisors of Greene County; Mr. Starke Powell, Greene County; Mr. Ralph Murphy, Greene County; Mr. Newton Lohr, Madison; Sheriff C. E. Lillard, Madison.

Routes 522 and 33 - Mr. R. A. Christian, Mineral, reported a sharp curve on Route 33 where it goes into Route 522 at Cuckoo.

Mr. C. G. Stoneburner, Arlington County, thanked the Commission for the Urban projects set up in the tentative allocations and requested improvements on Route 50 into Washington and Route 244.

FREDERICKSBURG DISTRICT

Route 208 - Request was made for the improvement of Boute 208 in Spotsylvania County, which connects with Routes 522 and 1, also Secondary Route 606. Speaking for this improvement were Mr. Edward Jones, Jr.; Mr. J. B. Stevens of the Walton Lumber Corporation, Pendleton; Mr. B. A. Christian, Mineral; Mr. V. G. Dickinson, Spotsylvania County.
