MINUTES

of

Meeting of State Highway Commission of Virginia Rosnoke and Richmond May 22 - 24, 1963

The State Highway Commission of Virginia met at Hotel Bosnoke, Rosnoke, Virginia, on the evening of May 22, with the Deputy Commissioner, Mr. F. A. Davis, presiding. Members present were Messrs. W. R. Chilton, S. S. Flythe, R. S. Holland, George C.Landrith W. M. Scleter, Jr., and R. S. Wesver, Jr.

Public bearings on tentative allocation of Interstate and primary construction funds for the fiscal year 1963-64 were held at Hotel Rosnoke on May 23 for the Bristol, Salam, Lynchburg and Staunton Districts, and at Richmond on May 24 for the Richmond, Suffolk, Fredericksburg and Culpaper Districts. Minutes of these bearings are attached.

PUBLIC HEARING Hay 23, 1963 BOTEL BOADUKE - CRYSTAL BALLBOOM

The public hearing for the Primery Tentative Allocations was held for the Salem, Bristol, Lynchburg and Staumton Districts in the Crystal Ballroom of Hotel Rosnoke on Thursday, May 23, 1963, beginning at 8:30 A.M.

Mr. F. A. Devis, substituting for Commissioner H. H. Harris, calle the hearing to order and stated that Mr. Harris was unable to be at the hearing due to illness. He said Mr. Harris expressed his sincers regret of not being able to be at the hearing. Mr. Davis introduced the members of the Righmay Commission and then pointed out that the hearing was for the purpose of getting views on the tentative allocations made last March by the Righmay Commission.

SALEM DISTRICT

MEDIFORD COUNTY AND TOWN OF REDPORD

Delegate Lacey Putney stated he was very pleased to come and appear before the Commission. He expressed their appreciation for the allocation on Route 460, the allocation for improving Route 122 between Bedford and Honeta, and also the approval of Industrial Access Funds for the road for the oil terminal in the Montvale area. Delegation of about seven people from Bedford County were presented.

James A. Tesas, vice-chairman of the Bedford County Board of Supervisors, spoke on behalf of Houte 43 in Bedford County. He pointed out there was a great need for improving Route 43 from the Town of Bedford to the Campbell County Line due to the road being used constantly since the Lasaville Dan had been completed. He also stated that Route 43 was the only major highway accessible to this dan, and it is used not only for commercial and business interests but by tourists. Houte 43 commercs with Houte 29 to the Blue Ridge Parkway and Route 11 and now the new Interestate Route 81 in Buchanen, and is very narrow and crooked. Mr. Tesas stated they they would appreciate anything the Commission could do to improve this highway and urged that they consider it at the earliest possible moment. Mr. Tesas stated be was sorry for Mr. Harris not being able to be at the hearing and wished him a speedy recovery.

E. D. Overstreet, member of the Board of Supervisors of Bedford County, expressed his appreciation and thanks for the consideration given to Boute 460, and also for their consideration in the access funds for the cil turbinal at Montvale. He pointed out this would mean a lot to Bedford County. He also spoke in behalf of the statement made by Mr. Teass and asked that it be given consideration.

James Holdren, Hanager and director of the Bedford County Chamber of Country, expressed his appreciation for the consideration given to the highways in and around Bedford and asked that they be given the same consideration in the future.

John Pulcher, president of the Carroll County Bank in Hillsville expressed his appreciation for the opportunity to appear before the Commission and also thanked them for the allocation and work that has been done in Carroll County. Hr. Fulcher presented a delegation of about twelve people from Carroll County.

Dale Gallimore, a partner in a Hilleville radio etation, spoke for the Carroli County delegation. He said the most pressing problem for the county is the condition of Houte 52, particularly the 17-mile portion south of Hillsville to the Horth Caroline State Line. He pointed out that this route was constructed during the period from 1925-1929 for a maximum of five-tons, and that truckers consider this route as the most hazardous section of road between Horth Caroline State Line and the Great Lakes. Mr. Callimore asked that something be done now to improve conditions on this section of Route 52.

Abbu Perry Alderman, attorney in the Town of Hillsville, seked the Commission to make permanent the tentative allocation for an extension of curb, gutter and etreet widening in the Town of Hillsville. He also added his support to what Mr. Gallimore said concerning Boute 52 on Fancy Gap Nountain.

Senator 8. Floyd Landreth, speaking for Carroll County, stated there was very little that he could add to what had been brought by the businessess from Carroll County. He expressed his great concern at the illness of the Countssioner and hoped he would soon be fully and completely recovered and back to his place of responsibility. He added his support to the work on Boute 58 entering the Town of Hillsville, Route 52 (Fancy Cap Road) and the section on Boute 97 which needed to be completed.

FRANKLIN COUNTY AND TOWN OF POCKY MOUNT

Mathan B. Butcherson, member of the House of Delegates, thanked the Commission and the Righmy Department for what had been done for Franklin County the past few years. He maked that the testative allocation for Route 116 be approved, and if more could be added it would be appreciated. He also brought out the need for an overpass on Route 40 at Ferrum. He suggested that Route 220 leading from Homoke to the North Caroline Line be dual-leade, and that Route 122 be given consideration as it was getting in bed shape.

Senator William F. Stope spoke as a member of the Righmay Study Commission and stated he realized there was a need for roads over the entire state. He stated he wanted to thank the Commission "from the bottom of my heart for the job you are doing". He said he realized the Highmay Department needed wore woney and they were trying to get additional funds for the department.

Hobert Clark, spanking in behalf of Patrick County, requested the continued building of Houte 57 in Patrick County between Route 8 and the Henry County line. He esid they were very grateful for the interest of the Highest Countiesion in this road. He pointed out that it serves many people in that area and also serves as an access into Bassett, Henry County and Route 220. He stated there was only about eight miles left and asked the Countssion to "please as fast as you can give us money to continue and finish the eight miles on Houte 57 from its present terminus to Houte 8".

Sem Gueler, chairman of the Board of Supervisors of Henry County, thanked the Countssion for what had been done. He stated he would like to concur in the talk made by Virgil Goods and said he felt that Route 220 had been overlooked. He asked that Route 57 east of Martinszille going to Chatham be taken into consideration for the future and to improve in some way. He also pointed out that Route 108 needed attention.

Junior Fuller, chairman of the Boads Committee for the Chamber of Commerce of Martinsville and Henry County, thanked the Commission for what is being done on Route 58 east. He asked that strong consideration be given to the building of Route 220 south to the North Carolina line.

A. L. Philpott said that Boute 57 west in Patrick County should be made an industrial access road since it serves a number of industries. He thanked the Commission for the allocations on Route 58 and Boute 57, and for the work being done on Alt. Boute 57 between Stanleytown and Bassett Forks. He said he noticed there was nothing included for Boute 220 southof Martinsville nor Boute 57 east of Martinsville leading to Chathen. He asked that serious condideration be given to these two vital roads. Mr. Philpott presented a patition from the residents of Bouty County endorsing future improvements of Boute 57.

MUNICIPALITY COUNTY, YORK OF BLACKSBURG, TORS OF CHRISTIANSBURG, AND CITY OF RADFORD

Kenneth Devore, speaking on behalf of the City of Radford and Montgomery County, thanked the Commission for the tentative allocations and for the work that has been done on Boute 460 between Christiansburg and the Town of Blacksburg. He asked that Route 460 be completed and improved over the two mountains. He also pointed out the need for improving Boute 100 between Pearisburg and Dublin, Mr. Devora thanked the Commission for the allocation on Boute 8 in the Town of Christiansburg and added his support to the work needed in Pulaski and Montgomery Counties. Virgil H. Goode, Commonwealth's Attorney for Frenklin County, asked that consideration be given so Route 116 until it was completed. Mr. Goode pointed out the need for the overpass over the Morfolk and Western Railway at Ferrum, and asked that it be one of the first things on the agenda in that section of the county. He also made an appeal for the dual-laning of Route 220 from Rosnoke to the Morth Carolina line. He pointed out that the section of Route 220 from Rosnoke to the Morth Carolina line atands at the top bracket in Virginia in traffic.

Prince Thornton, speaking on behalf of the Chamber of Commerce of Franklin County, as Chairman of the Committee of Roads, Streets, and Highways, the Burnt Chimney Buritan Club and the Franklin County Planning Commission, asked that construction be continued on the remaining six miles of Boute 116 going into Burnt Chimney. He asked the Commission to complete this road at the earliest possible datu and increase the allocation if possible. Mr. Thornton said a recent traffic count on Boute 220 has shown a 5 to 10 per cent increase on the portion of the highway from Roanoke to Borth Carolina in one year. He said it was bed for the whole area when the American Automobile Association suggests that travelers not use Boute 220 because of a "follow-the-leader" situation on the two-lane portions of the highway.

A delegation of about ten people was presented at the bearing in babalf of Boute 116.

CILLS COUNTY

P. L. Comer, beaker from Rich Creek and member of the Good Reads Committee of the Giles County Chember of Commerce, wished Commissioner Harris a speedy recovery and presented a delegation of seven people from Pembroke, Marrows, Rich Creek and Pearisburg. All were in support of Bouts 460 and asked for continued improvement to this route. Hr. Comer thanked the Commission for the consideration given in the past and asked that the tentative allocations be made parameter after the meeting. He said there was no need to point out the basardous traffic conditions existing on Route 460 and asked that the Commission "continue to give us as much as you can as fast as you can towards the completion of Boute 460".

MERKY COUNTY, PATRICE COUNTY AND CITY OF MARTINSVILLE

Thomas B. Stanley, said they were very grateful for the tentetive allocations made to their area and thanked them for the consideration given and asked that the tentative allocations be made permanent. Cov. Stanley stated that he hoped they would give some money in the next allocations for Houte 220 as it has become a very heavily traveled road. Gov. Stanley suggested a study of the possibility of bypassing Collinsville and Martinsville with a road cutting off present Route 220 at Baseatt Forks and joining the highway again near the Martinsville Doront plant.

John Lewisy, Town Hanager and speaking on behalf of the Tota Council of the Town of Christiansburg, thanked the Councilson for the tentative allocations for resurfacing Route 8 in the town this year, and maked that they be made permanent.

FULASKI COUNTY AND TOWN 44 PULASKI

Alax Resmon, attorney for Pulsaki County and speaking for the Pulsaki County delegation, said the New River Valley area is on the threshold of a boom and the development of Houte 100 is the key to crossing that threshold. Mr. Harmon pointed out that with the completion of Interstate Route 81, a transmission amount of traffic will spill onto Houte 100 at Newbern. He said the most urgent need is the tying of the interchange at Newbern with the New River Valley Airport.

C. E. Richardson, chairmen of the New River Valley Industrial Countesion, expressed appreciation for the allocation made on Boute 460 through Montgomery and Giles Counties. He also expressed appreciation for the work being done in Carroll County on Routes 52 and 58. He stated that the section of road from the intersection of Boute 81 just east of Dublin to the airport needed attention. He thanked the Countesion for what had been done and saked that something be done for Boute 100.

Senator D. Woodrow Bird congratulated the members of the Commission for the excellent job being done in his district and throughout the entire Commonwealth of Virginia. Senator Bird spoke in behalf of Route 100 and asked that consideration be given this route on into Penrisburg. He also expressed his appreciation for the allocations in Bland County.

Hon. Qurest Moore, member of the House, expressed appraciation to the Commission from the people of the Town of Pulseki and Pulseki County for all the work being done in that area. He stated he only wanted to emphasise the things that had been said regarding Route 100. He thanked the Commission for the opportunity of appearing before them and saked that immediate thought be given to planning improvement of Boute 100.

G. B. Jackson, mayor of the Town of Pulaski, president of the New River Airport Countssion and chairmen of the Fulaski County Chapter of Commerce Roads Countites, asked for improvement of Route 100 especially the section between the Route 81 interchange mear Resbern and the el roort. He pointed out that the interchange with Route 100 and Route 11 at Dublin is not satisfactory and is very dangerous. He expressed appreciation for what the Commission had given them in Pulaski County and thanked them for their consideration.

Cherlie Burton, executive secretary of the New River Velley Industrial Commission, pointed out that Boura 100 and Boura 460 were very important to the New River Valley, and added his support to improving these two routes.

MOANOKE COUNTY, CITY OF ROAMOKE, TOWN OF SALEM AND TOWN OF VINTON

Senator William B. Hopkins, representing the City of Boanche, thanked the Commission for the fine progress being made on Interstate Boute 81 and the Interstate Spur Houte 581. He also thanked them for the tentaive allocations for Hoancke County and other parts of the Salem District. He pointed out the need for a dual-lane highway between Boancke and Richmond since the Bureau of Public Boads had reached the decision to build Interstate Route 64 along the southern corridor. He stated that Franklin and Henry Counties had presented an excellent case for dual-laning Boute 220 from Boancke to the North Carolina line and wanted to go on record as whole-heartedly supporting this position. He called their attention to the allocation on Route 24 and thanked them for the allocation but fait it was unrealistic to think that it would handle the traffic to Smith Mountain Dam,

He felt that it should be connected with the road Kentucky has built up to the Virginia line.

Gene Bain brought out the fact that sidewalks were needed in the Town of Grundy and saked the Commission to look into it and see if something could be done in the immediate future. He also asked that the Commission consider the river bypass road as Alternate Boute 460. He thanked the Commission for the fine cooperation that was given after the flood on March 12.

Natton Lester, chairman of the Chumber of Commerce, thenked the Commission for the things being done for the county and saked them to comtinue alloting funds to Route 460 on through.

DICKERSON COUNTY

Senator Long, speaking for Dickenson County's delegation, thanked the Countssion for the tentative allocations made for Noute 80 and Route 83. He asked that priority be given to Noute 83 between Clincheo and Haysi so it could be completed and the road from Haysi to Kentucky line (Routs 80) should be completed as early as possible. He presented a delegation of about twenty people from Dickenson County.

Delegate Tow Glass expressed the deep appreciation of the people in that area to Mr. Watkins for his years of service, He thanked the Commission for their continued support in the Lynchburg area and particularly on Boute 29.

RITTSYLFARIA COUNTY AND CITY OF DANVILLE

Howard Hylton, executive vice-president of the Denville Chamber of Commerce and representing Danville, endorsed the tentative allocations and asked that they be usde permanent. He renewed a request previously made for a survey to be conducted toward relocating and rebuilding Boute 360 from Danville to Boute 304. He asked for an allocation for rebuilding the east bound lane of Route 58 from Danville east to the Municipal Airport Road. He requested that a project be started as quickly as possible to build a four-lane highway on Boute 29 from Danville and on to Lynchburg. He also eaked that a new bridge be constructed across the Dan River over the Robertson Bridge at Alternate Route 29. He urged the Highway Countain on to place this project in high priority and to expedite its planning and construction. Mr. Hylton expressed appreciation to Mr. Matkins for the outstanding service be has given.

Senator Landon R. Whatt expressed gratitude to Mr. Watkins for his service and expressed appreciation for the fine service received from the Highway Commission. Senator Wyatt endorsed the program set out by the Commission and especially the work on Houte 29. He stated he would like to see Route 29 built all the way to Culpaper.

PUBLIC HEARING ON PRIMARY SYSTEM ALLOCATIONS FOR 1963-64 John Marshall Hotel, Richmond, Virginia May 24, 1963

Devis, Deputy Commissioner presided at the public hearing on the tentative 1963-64 Primary System allocations for the Richmond, Fradericksburg, Gulpeper and Suffolk Districts, which was held at the John Marshell Hotel on Friday, May 24, at 9:00 a.m. Mr. H. H. Harris, Commissioner was unable to be present because of illness.

Mambers of the Coumission present were, Mr. W. Banadell Chilton, Predeticksburg District; Mr. S. S. Flythe, Salen District; Mr. R. S. Holland, Buffolk District; Judge R. S. Vesver, Jr., Bichmond District; Mr. George C. Landrith, Culpeper District; and Mr. W. M. Scieter, Jr., Bristol District.

RICHADED DISTRICT

- Int. Routes 1 and 46 Delegate J. C. Butcheson of Lawrenceville requested improvement for this intersection.
- Routes 15, 49 and 58, Town of Clarksville Mayor Sisemore requested an allocation for the improvements (curb, gutter and widening) for Main Street in the Town of Clarksville. Delegate W. C. Cleaton also requested this improvement.
- Boute 40 Mayor Brane of Victoria requested an allocation for Houte 40 between Victoria and Kambridge.
- Bouts 4? Mr. J. D. Harrelson of Chase City requested an allocation to continue improvement on Route 47 east to corporate limit of Chase City.
- Houte 49 Mr. Herry Wellons, President of the Flagaveline Highway Association requested the improvement of Route 49. Others interested in this route were Mayor Sissmore, Delegate Cleaton.
- <u>Route 58</u> Delegate Butcheson requested that Route 58 west of Lawrenceville be improved in the next fiscal year and after that the section east of Lawrenceville. Improvement east of Lawrenceville was requested by Mr. John D. Rawlings. Mr. Wellons requested improvement of Route 58 between Virgilina and Clarkeville.
- Route 92 Mr. Garland Mose of Chase City (Vice Mayor and Vice Pres. of the Flagsysline Association) requested an allocation for Route 92 between Chase City and Boydton, for widening. Improvement for Route 92 was also requested by Delegate Claston and Mr. Clarence Tucker of Chase City.
- Route 137 Delegate R. Maclin Smith of Kenbyldge requested improvement, also Delegate Cleaton.
- <u>Noute 138</u> Delegate Smith urged improvement to sid the tobacco industry.

<u>Route 208</u> - Delegate Francis Gouldman requested the improvement of Route 208 in Spotsylvania County from the Louise County line to Spotsylvania Court House.

CULPUPER DISTRICT

- Bouts 15 Senator Berold Purcell requested the improvement of this route in Louise County.
- <u>Boute 20</u> Delagate D. French Slaughter, Jr., spoke on behalf of this route and urged that work be done each year. Mr. Robert Thraves, a member of the Board of Supervisors of Albemaris County requested that the unimproved section of about 1.25 miles be improved. This was also requested by Senator E. O. McCue, Jr.
- <u>Route 22</u> Senstor Purcell requested improvement on Route 22 between Louise and Mineral, near which the County High School is located.
- Boute 28 Delegate Tom Frost spoke on behalf of Route 28 in Fauquier and Prince William Counties. Mr. John Stone amphasized the need for the improvement of Boute 28 as important to the economy of Fauquier County, particularly the milk production. Mr. John Gallaher wents an additional lane on Boute 28 between the Town of Managese and Managese Park, and said that Mr. Breeden will make a grant of right of way for this purpose. Mr. Joseph Johnston and Mr. H. C. Sharp orgad the improvement of Boute 28 saying that in 1961 it was carrying 9,000 wehicles per day.
- Boute 29 A large number of people were present to request the improvement of Houte 29 between Charlottesville and Warrenton, Among these were Delegate French Slaughter; Senstor McGue; Mr. Gilbert Campbell of the Charlottesville and Albemarie County Chamber of Commerce, who presented a statement; Mr. V. Wright Harrison, President of the Virginia Mational Bank; Mr. Randloph H. Perry; Mr. William R. Hill; Mr. Dave Shackelford; Mr. James Bowen, Charlottesville City Manager; Delegate C. A. Paxson. Mr. Davis F. Berry of Greene County emphasized the need to reserve right of way for Houte 29.
- Routs 33 Senetor Purcell requested improvement of Route 33 in Louisa County.
- Route 50 Mr. C. G. Stoneburner urged that other funds then Pederal Aid Urban be found to finance Boute 50 and other projects in Arlington.
- Route 123 Mr. W. C. Sharp requested improvement of Boute 123 between Routes 1 and 95.

Route 208 - Senator Purcell protested the condition of Boute 208 in Louisa. He said it was worse then most secondary roads in other counties.

Int. Routes 236, 264, 617, and 649 at Annendals - This intersection was called the trading center of a community of 40,000 people, and its improvement was urged by Mrs. Anne Wilkins, a member of the Beard of Supervisors of Fairfax County.

Route 244 - Mr. Bob Taylor requested improvement of Route 244, Columbia Pike from the Arlington County line to Annandale. Mr. Stoneburner also urged this improvement.

SUFFOLK DISTRICT

Route 58 - Mr. Woodrow Livesty, President of the Franklin Chamber of Commerce requested the improvement of Route 58 between Franklin and Courtland. Mayor Edward H. Brooks, Jr., of Courtland requested funds for curb, gutter and sidewalks in Courtland. He wished to know how much right of way would have to be denated.

Boute 60 - Mr. Andrew J. Maloney of the James City Chamber of Connerce had a letter from Delegate Carnesl, who could not attend requesting the continued four-laning of Houte 60 west of Williamsburg to the intersection of Houtes 168Y and 30. He presented two copies of a booklet, "Project Progress!" issued by the James City County Chamber of Counters.
