MEETING OF STATE HIGHWAY AND TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION

Richmond, Virginia

May 16, 1985

The monthly meeting of the State Highway and Transportation Commission was held in the Central Office in Richmond, Virginia, on May 16, 1985, at 10:00 a.m. The chairman, Mr. Harold C. King, presided.

On motion of Mr. Davidson, seconded by Mrs. Kincheloe, the minutes of the meeting of April 18, 1965, were approved.

WHEREAS, the land, so acquired, was purchased from the subject landowners as a borrow pit in connection with the Suffolk By-Pass; and

WHEREAS, Management has recommended that a portion of this land lying south of the south proposed right of way line be conveyed to the Paul D. Camp Community College; and

WHEREAS, the State Highway and Transportation Commissioner has certified in writing that the 150.295 acres, more or less, land lying south of the south proposed right of way line of Route 58, from a point approximately 560 feet opposite approximate Station 505+00 (proposed EBL Route 58) to a point approximately 134.74 feet opposite approximate Station 578+75 (proposed EBL Route 58) does not constitute a section of the public road and is deemed by him no longer necessary for the uses of the State Highway System.

NOW. THEREFORE, the conveyance of the land, so certified, to the Paul D. Camp Community College in accordance with the provisions of Section 2.1-504.3 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, is approved and the State Highway and Transportation Commissioner is hereby authorized to execute in the name of the Commonwealth an agreement conveying same for a consideration satisfactory to the State Right of Way Engineer and subject to such restrictions as may be deemed requisite.

MHEREAS, in accordance with Chapter 202 of the Acts of Assembly of Virginia of 1973, the Richmond-Petersburg Turnpike Authority was dissolved on June 1, 1973 and all the powers, properties, covenants, obligations and agreements of the Richmond-Petersburg Turnpike Authority were transferred to the State Highway Commission; and

WHEREAS, the adjacent landowner has requested that a portion of the lands, so acquired, be conveyed in order that the adjacent property may be more fully enhanced; and

WHEREAS, the adjacent owner has held an easement for parking purposes on the property since 1965; and

WHEREAS, the State Highway and Transportation Commissioner has certified in writing that the narrow strip of land lying south of and adjacent to the south normal right of way limits of I-95 at the intersection of Robin Hood Road and the I-95 southbound ramp, from a point opposite approximate Station 1898+72 (construction centerline, Contract No. A-4-G) to a point opposite approximate Station 1902+17 (centerline Turnpike, Contract No. A-5-G), containing 0.218 acre, more or less, does not constitute a section of the public road and is deemed by him no longer necessary for the uses of the State Highway System.

from Tyson-McLean Joint Venture, et al., by deed dated November 23, 1981, recorded in Deed Book 5626, Page 33 in the Office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Fairfax County; and

MHEREAS, the Federal Aviation Administration has requested the conveyance of the lands, so acquired, lying within the present northwest quadrant of the Dulles Airport Access Road - Route 123 interchange as part of an agreement involving an exchange of lands necessitated by the relocation of Idylwood Road and the Dulles Access Highway Extension (Project DTOO-967-101, RM-202); and

WHEREAS, the State Highway and Transportation Commissioner has certified in writing that the lands containing approximately 0.8432 acre, more or less, comprising a portion of the northwest quadrant of the Dulles Airport Access Road - Route 123 Interchange, lying on the north side of and adjacent to the north existing right of way and limited access line, and being all the lands acquired by deed dated November 23, 1981, recorded in Deed Book 5825, Page 33 in the Office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Fairfax County is deemed by him no longer necessary for the uses of the State Highway System.

NOW, THEREFORE, the conveyance of the said lands, so certified, in accordance with the provisions of Section 33.1-149 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, is approved and the State Highway and Transportation Commissioner is hereby authorized to execute in the name of the Commonwealth a deed conveying same to the Federal Aviation Administration in exchange for other lands as may be deemed satisfactory by the State Right of Way Engineer and subject to such restrictions as may be requisite.

Moved by Mr. Vaughan, seconded by Mr. Smalley, that

WHEREAS, Section 33.1-221 of the Code of Virginia provides a fund to "... be expended by the Commission for constructing, reconstructing, maintaining or improving access roads within counties, cities and towns to industrial sites on which manufacturing, processing or other establishments will be built under firm contract or are already constructed and to publicly owned airports;" and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Salem has, by resolution, requested Industrial Access Funds to serve Billard Paper Company of Roanoke, Inc. within the City of Salem, and said access is estimated to cost \$200,000; and

WHEREAS, it appears that this request falls within the intent of Section 33.1-221 and has complied with the provisions of the Highway and Transportation Board's policy on the use of Industrial Access Funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Virginia Highway and Transportation Commission, in accordance with the authority entrusted under Section 33.1-250 of the Code of Virginia, does hereby declare that the bridge on State Route 10 over the Mestern Branch of the Nansemond River, be named the Reids Ferry Bridge; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that appropriate markers, as directed by the Department's Engineers, shall be placed calling attention to its designation.

MHEREAS, the Commission is empowered to transfer unobligated appropriations among the line items contained in Paragraph C of Item 644 when it becomes evident that the funds are not required by the initial designated recipient program and such is the case for several line item appropriations; and

WHEREAS, these funds may be used to support a maximum of ninety-five percent (95%) of the local or non-federal share of capital project costs for public transportation and ridesharing equipment, facilities and associated costs; and

WHEREAS, the Greater Roanoke Transit Company has requested and is eligible to receive \$391,397 in state aid for capital assistance to support ninety-five percent (95%) of the local or non-federal share of the costs associated with UNTA Project No. VA-05-0035/VA-90-0019;

MOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the sums of \$14,852.20 from C.12, \$136,108.04 from C.13 and \$58,000.00 from C.14 are to be transferred to Item 644 C.11; and

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED, that the State Highway and Transportation Commission authorizes \$391,397 in state aid for public transportation from Chapter 755, [tem 640 C.lil of the Acts of the General Assembly to the Greater Roamoke Transit Company, and that the Deputy Commissioner may obligate additional assistance, if necessary, to match revisions to this project.
