MEETING OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF TRANSPORTATION BOARD

Lynchburg, Virginia

May 18, 1989

The monthly meeting of the Commonwealth Transportation Board was held at the Radisson Hotel in Lynchburg, Virginia, on May 18, 1989 at 10:00 a.m. The chairman, Mr. Ray D. Pethtel, presided.

Present: Messrs. Pethtel, Bacon, Beyer, Davidson, Howlette, Humphreys, Relly, Leafe, Malbon, Musselwhite, Quicke, Smalley and Waldman and Mrs. Kincheloe.

Absent: Dr. Thomas.

Mayor Jimmy Bryan, Mayor of Lynchburg, welcomed the Board to the area. Following his remarks, Mr. Pethtel presented Mayor Brine with a Certificate of Recognition signed by Governor Gerald L. Baliles. In conjunction with a national effort announced by U.S. Department of Transportation Secretary Samuel Skinner, Governor Baliles with this certificate has designated May 1, 1989 as Public Transit and Ridesharing Day in Virginia.

Mr. Will Mays, Nember of the Lynchburg Chamber of Commerce, also welcomed the Board to Lynchburg.

Senator Elliot S. Schewel, representing the 23rd District, welcomed the Board and conveyed the desires of the citizens and representatives of the area to see development of the Fiedmont Corridor as quickly as possible.

Delegate Edward (Ted) R. Harris, Jr., representing the 23rd District, also spoke to the Board regarding development in the area.

Reverand Jerry Falwell, Sr. spoke to the Board regarding the development of the Piedmont Corridor and urged the Board to consider the request for a limited access break on Route 460.

Mr. Pethtel informed the Board of the request of two individuals to offer comments during this public comment portion of the agenda regarding the Board's action taken at the March 16, 1989 meeting to reinstate tolls on the Coleman Bridge effective July 1, 1989. Mr. Pethtel also stated that a resolution had been prepared and would be considered during the meeting regarding this issue.

Nr. Pethtel reviewed the guidelines established by the Board for comments by individuals during the public comment portion of the meeting. Mr. Pethtel asked that the Board suspend the rules to allow comments to be made regarding the reinstatement of tolls on the Coleman Bridge. On motion of Mr. Humphreys, seconded by Mrs. Kincheloe, the rules were suspended to permit comment on this issue.

Congressman Stanford E. Parris, representing the 8th Virginia Congressional District, urged the Board to reconsider its decision regarding the reinstatement of tolls on the Coleman Bridge. A copy of Mr. Parris' remarks is on file at the Department of Transportation office in Richmond.

Mr. Ben Garrett, representing the Citizens for York River Bridge Progress, also asked for reconsideration of the decision regarding the tolls on the Coleman Bridge.

On motion of Mr. Musselwhite, seconded by Mr. Smalley, the minutes of the meetings of March 15, 1989 and April 20, 1989 were approved.

On motion of Mr. Musselwhite, seconded by Mr. Smalley, permits issued and canceled from April 20, 1989 to May 17, 1989, inclusive, as shown by the records of the Department were approved.

Moved by Mr. Musselwhite, seconded by Mr. Smalley, that

WHEREAS, by proper resolution, the Board of Supervisors of Bedford County has requested that a certain road which no longer serves as a public necessity be discontinued as part of the Secondary System of Highways;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33.1-150 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, the following road is discontinued as part of the Secondary System of Highways, effective this date.

Bedford County - Route 654 - From 0.06 mile East Route 655 to 0.14 mile East of Route 655. 0.08 Mi.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Musselwhite, seconded by Mr. Smalley, that the Board approve additions, abandonments and other changes to the Secondary System from April 3, 1989 to April 28, 1989, inclusive, as shown by the records of the Department. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Musselwhite, seconded by Mr. Smalley, that

WHEREAS, Route 50 in Clarke County has been altered and reconstructed as shown on plans for Project 0050-021-101, C-501; and

WHEREAS, two sections of the old road are no longer necessary as a public road or for purposes of the State Highway System, as the new road serves the same citizens as the old;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33.1-148 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, 0.15 mile of Route 50, Project 0050-021-101, C-501 be abandoned as a part of the State Highway System.

Moved by Mr. Musselwhite, seconded by Mr. Smalley, that

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board is authorized under Section 33.1-41.1 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, to approve payments to cities and certain towns for street maintenance purposes; and

WHEREAS, certain principal-minor arterial roads and/or collector-local streets within the corporate limits of the Town of Luray are eligible for such payment: and

WEARS, under the authority of Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the Town of Luray, for maintenance payments on local streets meeting the required criteria;

NOW, THEREFORE, 92 IT RESOLVED, that quarterly payments to the Town of Luray for local streets be increased by 0.42 centerline mile. This increase is a result of additions of local streets as described on tabulation sheet numbered 1 for the Town of Luray dated April 4, 1989. The tabulation sheets are on file in the Department's Urban Division.

The street net additions totaling 0.42 centerline mile increase the total mileage to 20.74 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments.

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board is authorized under Section 33.1-41.1 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, to approve payments to cities and certain towns for street maintenance purposes; and

WHEREAS, certain principal-minor arterial roads and/or collector-local streets within the corporate limits of the City of Chesapeake are eligible for such payment; and

WHEREAS, under the authority of Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the City of Chesapeake, for maintenance payments on streets and roads meeting the required criteria;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that quarterly payments to the City of Chesapeake for streets and roads be increased by 12.67 centerline miles. This increase is a result of additions of minor arterial and local streets as described on tabulation sheets number 1 through 6 for the City of Chesapeake dated April 27, 1989. The tabulation sheets are on file in the Department's Urban Division.

The street net additions totaling 12.67 centerline miles increase the total mileage to 743.49 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that quarterly payments to the City of Portsmouth for streets be increased by 5.04 centerline miles. This increase is a result of additions of collector-local streets as described on tabulation sheets numbered 1 through 4 for the City of Portsmouth dated April 26, 1989. The tabulation sheets are on file on the Department's Urban Division.

The collector-local street additions totaling 0.54 centerline miles increase the total mileage to 335.37 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments.

NOW, THEREPORE, BE IT RESCLVED, that quarterly payments be made to the City of Norton for adjusted mileages of minor arterial roads and collector streets meeting the required criteria under the aforementioned section of the Code effective July 1, 1989. The adjusted mileage eligible for payments is described on tabulation sheet number 1, dated April 11, 1989. This tabulation sheet is on file on the Department's Urban Division.

The adjusted minor arterial roads mileage totaling 4.14 centerline miles increases the total centerline mileage of minor arterial roads in the City of Norton from 0.00 miles to 4.14 miles of approved atreets approved to maintenance payments.

The adjusted collector street mileage totaling 4.14 centerline miles, decreases the total centerline mileage of collector-local streets in the City of Norton from 71.5 miles to 3.01 miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that quarterly payments be made to the Town of South Hill for roads be increased by 1.42 centerline miles. This increase is a result of additions of arterial roads as described on tabulation sheet number 1 for the Town of South Hill dated March 15, 1989. The tabulation sheet is on file on the Department's Urban Division.

The road net additions totaling 1.42 centerline miles increase the total mileage to 7.65 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments.

WHEREAS, certain principal-minor arterial roads and collector-local streets within the corporate limits of the City of Roanoke are eligible for such payment; and

WHEREAS, under authority of said Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the City of Roanoke, for maintenance payments on streets and roads meeting the required criteria;

NOW, THERBFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that quarterly payments be made to the City of Roanoke for streets and roads be increased by 1.26 centerline miles. This increase is a result of additions and deletions of local streets and roads as described on tabulation sheet number 1 through 2 for the City of Roanoks dated April 4, 1989. The tabulation sheets are on file on the Department's Urban Division.

The streets net additions totaling 1.26 centerline miles increase the total mileage to 442.54 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments.

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board is authorized under Section 33.1-41.1 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, to approve payments to cities and certain towns for street maintenance purposes; and

WHEREAS, certain principal-minor arterial roads and/or collector-local streets within the corporate limits of the Town of Abingdon are eligible for such payment; and

WHEREAS, under authority of said Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the Town of Abingdon, for maintenance payments on streets and roads meeting the required criteria;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESCLVED, that quarterly payments be made to the Town of Abingdon for streets and roads be increased by 1.82 centerline miles. This increase is a result of additions and deletions of local streets as described on tabulation sheets number 1 through 4 for the Town of Abingdon dated April 11, 1989. The tabulation sheets are on file on the Department's Urban Division.

The street and road net additions totaling 1.82 centerline miles increase the total mileage to 50.14 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Musselwhite, seconded by Mr. Smalley, that

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board is authorized under Section 33.1-41.1 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, to approve payments to cities and certain towns for strest maintenance purposes; and

WHEREAS, certain principal-minor arterial roads and/or collector-local streats within the corporate limits of the Town of Wytheville are eligible for such payment; and

WHBREAS, under authority of said Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the Town of Wytheville, for deletion of maintenance payments on roads meeting the required criteria.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that quarterly payments be made to the Town of Wytheville for roads be decreased by 0.19 centerline mile. This decrease is a result of deletions of roads as described on tabulation sheet number 1 for the Town of Wytheville dated April 11, 1989. The tabulation sheet is on file in the Department's Urban Division.

The road net deletion totaling 0.19 centerline mile decreases the total mileage to 6.61 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments.

Moved by Mr. Musselwhite, seconded by Mr. Smalley, that

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board is authorized under Section 33.1-41.1 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, to approve payments to cities and certain towns for street maintenance purposes; and

WHEREAS, certain principal-minor arterial roads and/or collector-local streets within the corporate limits of the City of Salem are eligible for such payment; and

WHEREAS, under authority of said Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the City of Salem, for maintenance payments on streets meeting the required criteria;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that quarterly payments be made to the City of Salem for streets be increased by 2.98 centerline miles. This increase is a result of additions of local streets as described on tabulation sheets numbered 1 through 2 for the City of Salem dated April 4, 1989. These tabulation sheets are on file on the Department's Urban Division.

The street additions totaling 2.98 centerline miles increase the total mileage to 100.17 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments.

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board is authorised under Section 33.1-41.1 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, to approve payments to cities and certain towns for street maintenance purposes; and

WHEREAS, certain principal-minor afterial roads and collector-local strests within the corporate limits of the City of Danville are eligible for such payment; and

WHEREAS, under authority of said Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the City of Danville, for maintenance payments on streets and roads meeting the required criteria;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that quarterly payments to the City of Danville for streets and roads be increased by 1.32 centerline miles. This increase is a net result of additions and deletions of local streets as described on tabulations sheets numbered 1 through 3 for the City of Danville dated April 11, 1989. The tabulation sheets are on file in the Department's Orban Division.

The street and road net additions totaling 1.32 centerline miles increase the total mileage to 280.09 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments.

These tabulation sheets are on file in the Department's Urban Division.

The street net addition totaling 0.30 centerline mile increases the total mileage to 97.68 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments.

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board is authorized under Section 33.1-41.1 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, to approve payments to cities and certain towns for street maintenance purposes; and

WHEREAS, certain principal-minor arterial roads and/or collector-local streets within the corporate limits of the Town of Vinton are eligible for such payment; and

WHEREAS, under authority of said Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the Town of Vinton, for maintenance payments on streets meeting the required criteria;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that quarterly payments to the Town of Vinton for streets be increased by 0.17 centerline mile. This increase is a result of additions of local streets as described on tabulation sheet number 1 for the Town of Vinton dated April 5, 1989. This tabulation sheet is on file in the Department's Urban Division.

The street additions totaling 0.17 centerline wile increase the total mileage to 31.99 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments.

Moved by Mr. Beyer, seconded by Mr. Malbon, that

WHEREAS, the Route 17 crossing of York River at Gloucester Point and Yorktown has become increasingly congested, with projected continued growth in vehicular demand; and

WHEREAS, among the various alternatives studied, Alternative 12A was the best alternative in meeting current and future traffic demands, had the least environmental impact, and was the only option which could be reasonably funded, and the Commonwealth Transportation Board had existing authority to reinstitute tolls under the Revenue Bond Act; and

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board on March 23 chose Alternative 12A and reinstituted tolls effective July 1, 1989; and

WHEREAS, a resolution authorizing a voter referendum to consider an amendment to the Virginia Constitution authorizing 9E pledge bonds passed the 1989 General Assembly, is due in the 1990 General Assembly session, and a statewide voter referendum may be held in 1990, and pledge bonds may be implemented by action of the General Assembly in its 1991 session; and

WHEREAS, the availability of 9E pledge bonds will create an entirely new mechanism for full or partial funding of Alternative 12A or make possible the Commonwealth Transportation Board choice of a different funding mechanism, or a different toll structure; and

WEBREAS, the practical application of a Special Transportation District such as was used in the Route 28 improvements in Loudoun and Fairfax Counties may provide an additional means of funding this Alternative, when used in conjunction with 9E pledge bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Board's March 23 decision makes it possible to continue preliminary engineering for the reconstruction of the Coleman Bridge using funds from the toll revolving account; and

WHEREAS, the deferral of the reinstitution of tolls may lead to higher tolls and/or further delay in bridge reconstruction, in the event 9E pleage bonds are not applied; and

WHEREAS, representatives of local government have requested a delay in the reimposition of tolls in order to seek alternative funding from federal, state, local, and private accrea;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Commonwealth Transportation Board reaffirms that the construction of Alternative 12A through tolls on the Coleman Bridge represents the best possible public policy decision for the Commonwealth Transportation Board given funding mechanisms currently authorized by the Virginia General Assembly; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Commonwealth Transportation Board defers implementation of tolls until no garlier than July 1, 1991, in order to give the General Assembly and the voters of Virginia the opportunity to act on 9E pledge bonds, to give local governments the time to pursue the applicability of a Special Transportation District, and to give the Virginia Department of Transportation the opportunity to continue planning to meet the needs of the citizens of the Niddle Peninsula and the Worth Hampton Roads Peninsula, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Virginia Department of Transportation and its consultants undertake an extensive Public Information Program for the citizens of the affected counties, to develop better public understanding of the bridge reconstruction process.

- all necessary right of way and utility adjustments being provided at no cost to the Commonwealth; and
- documentary evidence being submitted that a total eligible capital outlay of not less than \$400,000 has been expended for the facilities occupied by the industry for production at this site.

WHEREAS, Section 33.1-221 of the Code of Virginia provides a fund to "... be expended by the Board for constructing, reconstructing, maintaining or improving access roads within counties, cities and towns to industrial sites on which manufacturing, processing or other establishments will be built under firm contract or are already constructed and to publicly owned airports;"; and

WHEREAS, the Frederick County Board of Supervisors has, by resolution, requested industrial access funds to provide for adequate access to the facilities of Butler Manufacturing Company located adjacent to Route 669, and said access is estimated to cost \$115,000; and

WHEREAS, it appears that this request falls within the intent of Section 33.1-221 and has complied with the provisions of the Commonwealth Transportation Board's policy on the use of industrial access funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that \$115,000 of the Industrial Access Fund he allocated to provide adequate access to the recently completed facilities of Butler Manufacturing Company located in Frederick County, Project 0669-034-217, M501, contingent upon

- any necessary right of way and utility adjustments being provided at no cost to the Industrial Access Fund; and
- 2. documentary evidence being submitted by Frederick County that the industry's facilities, with a total eligible capital outlay of not less than \$1.15 million, have been constructed or are under firm contract for the construction and operation of this firm's manufacturing facilities at this site.

WHEREAS, on March 16, 1989, the Commonwealth Transportation Board allocated \$152,000 to assist in providing adequate access to the proposed facilities of ClarCor Precision Products Group located in the Ashland Business Park off Ashcake Road in the Town of Ashland in Hanover County, Project 9999-166-268, M501, subject to certain contingencies; and

WHEREAS, this allocation is insufficient to finance the total estimated eligible project cost; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the cancellation of the Industrial Access Fund allocation previously approved for Project 1314-042-267, M501, additional funding is now available to assist in providing adequate access to the site of Clarcor Precision Products Group; and

WHEREAS, the staff of the Department of Transportation has recommended approval of a supplemental allocation to assist in the financing of the project's estimated cost; and

WHEREAS, it appears that this request falls within the intent of Section 33.1-221 and has complied with the provisions of the Commonwealth Transportation Board's policy on the use of industrial access funds.

NOW, THEREPORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Commonwealth Transportation Board's action of March 16, 1989, is hereby amended to provide an additional \$149,750 allocation of industrial access funds (\$148,000 unmatched and \$1,750 matched dollar-for-dollar) to this project thereby providing a total allocation of \$301,750 to Project 9999-166-268, M501.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this allocation shall be subject to all contingencies prescribed by this Board's resolution of March 15, 1989, with the exception of contingencies #3 and #4 which are tevised as hereinafter indicated;

- 3. the provision of suitable documentation, satisfactory to the Department, that ClarCor has expended or entered into firm contract to expend at least \$3,035,000 for qualified capital outlay on the subject site by March 16, 1991;
- 4. presentation of appropriate billing and certification by the Town of Ashland for reimbursement of the actual cost incurred on eligible items in the construction of this project. Such billing shall not exceed \$301,750 and be in accordance with the following schedule

WHEREAS, on February 19, 1987, the Commonwealth Transportation Board allocated \$230,000 to assist in providing adequate access to the proposed facilities of Ceramic Technology, Inc. and the Wardell Industrial Park located in Tazewell County, Project 1219-092-330, M501, subject to certain contingencies; and

WHEREAS, one such contingency to this allocation was the reimbursement of the Industrial Access Fund for all costs incurred in this project's construction not justified by the eligible capital outlay of qualified industrial development within this park on April 1, 1989; and

WHEREAS, due to the unanticipated delay in this project's completion, the County has requested an extension in the time limit for suitable industrial development to occur within this park; and

WHEREAS, the staff of the Department of Transportation has recommended approval of a one (1) year extension of this time.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Commonwealth Transportation Board's action of February 19, 1989, is hereby amended to provide an additional one (1) year (i.e. April 1, 1990) for the determination as to the amount of eligible capital outlay by qualified industrial development which has located within this park.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this allocation shall be subject to all contingencies prescribed by this Board's resolution of February 19, 1987, with the exception of contingency #3 which is revised as indicated above.




ESTIMATE OF REVENUES HIGHWAY MAINTENANCE AND OPERATING FUND FISCAL YEAR 1989 - 90



NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that this Board hereby consents to the annual audit procedure described in the foregoing paragraph.

WHEREAS, there has been enacted by the House of Delegates and by the Senate of the General Assembly of Virginia an act entitled "Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Facilities Bond Act of 1989," such act constituting Chapter 620 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Virginia of 1989 (the "Act"); and WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Treasury Board of the Commonwealth of Virginia (the "Treasury Board") is authorized, subject to the approval of the Governor, to sell and issue bonds of the Commonwealth of Virginia in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$33,915,000 plus financing expenses for the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds, for paying and the cost of the widening of the Dulles Toll Road from four to six lanes, of which the two new lanes shall be designed for use as High Occupancy Vehicle Lanes, from Route 7 at Tyson's Corner in Fairfax County to Route 28 at Sully road in Loudoun County, all in accordance with the provisions of Section 9 (c) of Article X of the constitution of Virginia; and

WHEREAS, the Act authorizes the Virginia Department of Transportation to fix, revise, charge and collect rates, fees and charges for or in connection with the use of the Dulles Toll Road and any improvements thereon, and the different parts and sections thereof and to pledge the same to the payment of principal of and interest on such bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Treasury Board proposes to sell all of the above bonds (the "Bonds") on or about June 14, 1989;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Commonwealth Transportation Board that;

Section 1. Definitions. All terms herein, unless otherwise defined, shall have the meanings set forth in Article I of the Memorandum of Understanding, dated as of February 1, 1987 ("Memorandum of Understanding"), between the Treasury Board and the Commonwealth Transportation Board.

Section 2. Pledge of Revenues. The Board hereby pledges the Net Revenues of the Dulles Toll Road to the payment of principal of and interest and premium, if any, on the Bonds as the same become due and payable.

Section 3. Memorandum of Understanding. The Memorandum of Understanding, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit A, is hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 4. Operation of Toll Road. The Board covenants that for so long as the Bonds are cutstanding the Board will not enter into any operating lease, management contract or similar agreement with any person or entity other than a governmental unit, for all or any portion of the Dulles Toll Road, if such action will result in the interest on the Bonds becoming subject to gross income under Federal Law.

Section 5. Further Authorization. The officers and agents of the Board are hereby authorized and directed to take such further action as may be necessary or appropriate in furtherance of the issuance and sale of the Bonds and to perform all acts and do all things required by the Bonds, the Memorandum of Understanding and this resolution for the full, punctual and complete performance of the terms, convenants, provisions and agreements contained therein and herein.

MEMORAHDUM OF UNDERSTANDING, DATED AS OF FEBRUARY 1, 1987, BETWEEN THE TREASURY BOARD AND THE COMMONWEALTH TRANSPORTATION BOARD REGARDING COMMONWEALTH OF VIRGINIA \$57,100,000 TRANSPORTATION FACILITIES REFUNDING BONDS, SERIES 1987A

This Memorandum of Understanding sets forth certain agreements by and between the Treasury Board and the Commonwealth Transportation Board regarding the issuance and sale of Commonwealth of Virginia \$57,100,000 Transportation Facilities Refunding Bonds. Series 1987A (the "Series 1987A Bonds"). A description of the Series 1987A Bonds, the proposal for their public sale and other matters relating to the Series 1987A Bonds are set forth in the Notice of Sale and Bid Form with respect to the Series 1987A Bonds, a resolution of the Treasury Board adopted on December 17, 1986, and a resolution of the Virginia State Highway and Transportation Board, as predecessor to the Commonwealth Transportation Board adopted on December 18, 1986.

ARTICLE I

Definitions

Unless otherwise defined herein, all capitalized terms used herein shall have the meanings set forth below.

"Act" means the Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation facilities Refunding Bond Act of 1986, Chapter 7 of the 1986 Special Session Virginia Acts of the General Assembly.

"Additional Bonds" means any Additional Bonds issued pursuant to Article V of the Treasury Board Resolution.

"Board" means the Commonwealth Transportation Board.

"Bonds" means the Series 1987A Bonds and any Additional Bonds.

"Bond Fund" means the fund created pursuant to Section 202 hereof for payment of principal of and interest on the Bonds, consisting of the Principal Account and the Interest Account.

"Oulies Toll Road" means the Dulles Toll Road, consisting of roadways and related improvements located parallel to the Dulles Airport Access Road and constituting part of the System.

"Tairfam County Note Repayment Account" means the account created hereunder from which payment of principal of the Note shall be made.

"Interest Account" means the account created because which is a part of the Bond Fund from which payments of interest on the Bonds shall be made when due and payable.

"Loan" means the loan from fairfax County in an amount of up to \$5,000,000 to assist in paying costs of construction of the Dulles Toll Road.

"Maintenance and Replacement Tund" means the fund created pursuant to Section 203 hereof.

"Memorandum" means this Memorandum of Understanding between the Treasury Board and the Board dated as of February 1, 1987.

"Net Revenues" means revenues received from tolls, rates, fees and charges for or in connection with the use of the Dulles Toll Road and any other roadways and improvements which may become part of the System, less such amounts as may be required to pay the ordinary operating and maintenance costs of the Dulles Toll Road and such other roadways and improvements as may become part of the System.

'Note' means the revenue bond issued by the State Highway and Transportation Commission on December 22, 1981 to evidence the Lasn.

"Principal Account" means the account created herounder which is a part of the Bond Fund from which payments of principal of the Bonds shall be made as the same become due and payable.

"Revenue Fund" means the fund created pursuant to Section 201 hereof in which all revenues from tolle, rates, fees and charges for or in connection with the use of the Dulles Toll Road and any other roadways and improvements becoming part of the System shall be deposited.

"Series 1982 Bonds" means the Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Facilities Bonds, Series 1982, in the aggregate principal amount of \$37,000,000.

"Series 1987A Bonde" means the Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Facilities Refunding Bonds, Series 1987A, in the aggregate principal amount of \$57,100,000.

"System" means such readways and related improvements, including the Dulles Toll Road, located or to be located in the Northern Virginia area and connected to the Dulles Toll Road, the acquisition or construction of which is authorized by the Ceneral Assembly of Virginia to be financed by the issuance of Additional Bonds.

"Treasury Board Resolution" means the resolution adopted by the Treasury Board on December 17, 1986, authorizing the issuance and sale of the Series 1987A Bonds.

ARTICLÉ 11

Establishment of Funds; Deposits and Transfers

Section 201. Establishment to Revenue Fund. All revenues received from talls, rates. Isses and charges for or in connection with the use of the Dulles Toll Road and such other roadways and improvements as may become part of the System shall be deposited in the State Treasury in the Revenue Fund which shall be maintained by the State Treasurer. All expenses of maintenance, repair, and operation of the Dulles Toll Road and such other roadways and improvements as may become part of the System will be paid by the Board from the Revenue Fund. To the extent that soneys in the Revenue Fund are insufficient to pay such costs of maintenance, repair and operation, the Board intends to pay such costs from its regular appropriations. The State Treasurer shall satablish such accounts within the Revenue Fund as may be required by any legislation or resolution supplemental to the Treasury Board Resolution with respect to (i) the issuance of any Additional Bonds or (ii) any roadways or improvements becoming part of the System.

Section 202. Establishment of Bond Fund. There is hereby established and created a special fund, designated the "Bond Fund", which shall be held by the State Treasuret. Interest accrued on the Series 1987A Bonds to the date of delivery shall be deposited in the Interest Account. The Bond Fund shall consist of the following accounts: (1) Principal Account, from which payments of principal of the Bonds shall be made as the same become due and payable, whether at maturity or by redemption prior to maturity and (2) Interest Account, from which payments of interest on the Bonds shall be made as the same become due and payable. Moneys in the Bond Fund, Principal Account may be used by the Treasury Board for the accelerated retirement of Bonds, either by purchase or optional or mandatory redemption, the Treasury Board to determine the timing and the amount of such purchase or redemption of Bonds in accordance with the provisions of such Bonds.

Section 203. <u>Establishment of Maintenance and Replacement Fund</u>. There is hereby established and created a special fund, designated the "Maintenance and Replacement Fund", which shall be held by the State Treasurer. The Board shall pay certain costs of the System, including, without limitation, insurance and sattractdinary maintenance such as resurfacing, major bridge painting, equipment replacement and other expenses not recurring annually from funds in the Maintenance and Replacement Fund and to the extent such funds are inadequate, the Yound in the Maintenance and Replacement Fund are not pledged to the payment of Principal of or interest on the Bonds.

Section 204. <u>Fairfex County Note Repayment Account</u>. The Board hereby establishes a special account to be held by the

State Treasurer designated the "Fairfax County Note Repayment Account" which account is hereby pledged to, and charged with the payment of the principal of the Note. The State Treasurer may, at the option of the Board, and shall upon payment in full of the principal of and interest on the Series 1982 Bonds, deposit the Net Revenues, after making the deposits to the Bond Fund and the Maintenance and Replacement Fund required by Section 205(a) and (b) hereof, in the Fairfax County Note Repayment Account until the Note is paid in full, unless otherwise agreed upon by the Board and Fairfax County, Virginia.

Section 205. Transfers from Revenue Fund. Promptly in each month, the State Tressurer will transfer from the Revenue Fund the amount held in the Revenue Fund on the last day of the preceding month, after deducting such amount as the Board then determines to be necessary for the payment of the expenses of ordinary maintenance, repair and operation of the Dulles Toll Road and such other roadways and improvements as may become part of the System, to the following Funds in the following order:

- (a) In the Bond Fund in the Principal Account or Interest Account, as the State Treasurer deems appropriate, such amounts as may be required to make the total amount then in the Bond Fund equal to (i) the amount of interest which will become due within the next six months on all Bonds then outstanding and (ii) the amount of principal of the Bonds which will become due within the next twelve months, including any Bonds subject to mandatory redemption;
- (b) in the Maintenance and Replacement Fund, such amount as may be determined by the Board to be necessary to provide a reserve for payment of the costs of extraordinary maintenance and repair;
- (c) in the Fairfax County Note Repayment Account to the extent set forth in Section 204; and
- (d) to the extent permitted by law, to the Sperd to be used for additional improvements to the Dulles Toll Road or for deposit in the Transportation Trust Fund or for such other use as the General Assembly may designate.

Section 206. <u>Disposition of Balances in Funds after</u>

<u>Rivent of Bonds</u>. After the principal of and presius, if any, and interest on all of the Bonds and all expenses and charges in connection therewith have been paid or provision therefor has been made, any balance remaining in any fund shall be paid to the Board.

ARTICLE III

Miscellaneous

Section 301. Operation of System: Tolls. The Board shall establish and enforce reasonable rules and regulations governing the use and operation of the Dulles Toll Road and any other roadways in the System.

The Board shall adopt a schedule of tolls which, together with other revenues available for such purposes, will at all times produce. Without any State aid, Net Revenues sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the Bonds as they become due and psychia and to provide for contributions to the Maintenance and Replacement Fund as provided in Section 205 above.

The Board shill classify tolls in a reasonable way to cover all traffic so that the tolls may be uniform in application to all traffic falling within any reasonable class regardless of the status or character of any person, firm or corporation participating in the traffic. No reduced rate of toll shall be allowed within any such class except through the use of commuter or other tickets or privileges based upon frequency or volume of use, and no free vehicular passage shall be permitted over the Dulles Tall had except to those persons referred to in subsection A of section 33.1-252 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as smended, or any successor provision, and except as to any segments of the Dulles Toll Boad where it is not feasible to collect tolls.

Section 302. Elimination of Deficite: Other Funds. The Board intends to include in each biunnial budget of the Virginia Department of Transportation requests to the Covernor and the General Assembly for appropriations to pay to the Revenue Fund such amounts as may be necessary to eliminate any deficits in the Bond Fund and the Maintenance and Replacement Fund. Any available federal, state, and local funds may be used to pay the expenses of the maintenance, repair, and operation of the System, and the interest on and the principal of the Bonds.

Section JO3. <u>Sudget and Reports</u>. The Board will annually prepare a budget for the Dulles Toll Road and any other roadways in the System for the ensuing fiscal year estimating the gross tell revenues and the expenses of maintenance, repair and operation, and setting forth the amount to be transferred to the Maintenance and Replacement Fund. The Board will prepare monthly and annual reports of operations. Copies of the annual budgets and the monthly and annual reports will be filed with the Treesury Board.

The State Treesurer shall furnish to the Board quarterly reports showing the belances in each account of the Revenue Fund. I would and Maintenance and Replacement Fund and any interest and from the investment of each account.

Section 304. Hotice of Deficiency. In the event that amounts in the Bond Fund are insufficient to make payments of principal of or interest on the Bonds as the same become due, whether at maturity or by any mandatory redemption, and it is necessary to obtain funds from the General Fund of the Commonwealth of Virginia to make such payments, the Treasury Board shall promptly notify the Governor in writing.

Section 305. Amendment. The Treasury Board and the Board may amend this Memorandum of Understanding, provided that any such amendment shall be in writing and, provided further, that any such amendment shall not, in the judgment of the Treasury Board and the Board, adversely affect the interests of the holders of the Bonds.

Section 306. Application of Proceeds of Series 1987A Bonds. The proceeds of the Series 1987A Bonds shall be applied by the State Treasurer as follows:

- (a) \$104,312.53 shall be used to pay the expenses of issuing the Series 1987A Bonds.
- (b) \$25,640.94, representing accrued interest on the Series 1987A Bonds from their date to the date of delivery to the initial purchaser or purchasers thereof, shall be deposited in the Interest Account of the Bond Fund.
- (c) \$56,426,429.02 shall be deposited in the escrow account established to pay the Series 1982 Bonds.

Section 307. <u>Governor's Office</u>. A copy of this memorandum shall be filed in the Governor's office. Any future changes harein not approved by both the Treasury Board and the Board must be approved by the Governor. Any disagreement between the Treasury Board and the Board regarding the System or the Bonds will be submitted to the Governor for resolution.

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth of Virginia is apportioned federal aid each fiscal year for public transportation in urbanized areas of the state with populations between 50,000 and 200,000 under Section 9 of the Urban Mass Transportation Act (UMTA) of 1964 as amended; and

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board has the responsibility for approving the allocation of UMTA Section 9 funds among these urbanized areas even though such funds are provided by UMTA directly to recipients and, therefore are not included in the state budget; and

WHEREAS, such allocations are made upon an equitable distribution to serve the needs of each area and the allocations are to be presented to UMTA in an annual program of projects; and

WHEREAS, the Virginia Department of Transportation has developed a distribution of Section 9 funds for fiscal year 1990 in consultation with the recipients of these funds and this distribution is reflected in the numbers shown below;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the following program of projects shall serve as the fiscal year 1990 distribution for the Governor's Apportionment of UMTA Section 9 funds for the Commonwealth of Virginia; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Deputy Commissioner shall submit the program of projects to UMTA and is authorized to amend the program as may be necessary during fiscal year 1990.

Operating Assistance
