WHEREAS, under the authority of Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the City of Galax for maintenance payments on Minor Arterial Roads and Local Streets meeting the required criteria.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the street mileage eligible for quarterly payments to the City of Galax for Minor Arterial Roads and Local Streets be increased by 0.40 centerline mile. This increase is a result of additions of Minor Arterial Roads and Local Streets as described on tabulation sheet numbered 1 through 1 for the City of Galax, as functionally classified by the Transportation Planning Division dated March 21, 1997.
