Such surety device shall provide for reimbursement to VDOT of any expenses incurred by the Industrial, Airport and Rail Access Fund for this project's construction not justified by the eligible capital outlay of industries served by the project. If, by May 21, 2001, qualified industry has not expended or entered into a firm contract to expend at least \$3,500,000 of eligible capital outlay on parcels served exclusively by this project, than an amount equal to 10% of up to \$3,000,000 and 5% of between \$3,000,000 and \$3,500,000 of eligible capital outlay will be credited toward the project's allocation. This surety may be released or reduced at an earlier date if qualified industry or industries have provided documentation of eligible capital outlay; and

- d. the provision of the required \$25,000 in matching funds by the County; and
- e. VDOT determining eligible capital outlay in accordance with current policy and procedure.

Motion carried. Mr. Cogbill disclosed that he is a practicing attorney with the firm of McGuire, Woods, Battle and Boothe, L.L.P., and the firm is counsel to the Authority that is developing the industrial park. Mr. Cogbill stated he has not participated in the legal representation and could fairly and objectively participate in the discussion and vote on this industrial access request.

Moved by Mr. Porter, seconded by Mr. White, that

WHEREAS, Section 33.1-221 of the Code of Virginia provides a fund to "...be expended by the Board for constructing, reconstructing, maintaining or improving access roads within counties, cities, and towns to industrial sites on which manufacturing, processing or other establishments will be built under firm contract or are already constructed and to licensed, public-use airports; " and

WHEREAS, the Chesterfield County Board of Supervisors has, by appropriate resolution, requested Industrial Access Funds to serve parcels in the Ashton Creek Business Center, located in Chesterfield County, and said access is estimated to cost \$596,000; and

WHEREAS, it appears that this request falls within the intent of Section 33.1-221 and complies with the provisions of the Commonwealth Transportation Board's policy on industrial access.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that \$448,000 (\$300,000 unmatched and \$148,000 matched) of the 1997-98 Fiscal Year Industrial, Airport and Rail Access Fund be allocated to provide adequate access to the Ashton Creek Business Center, located in Chesterfield County, Project 0932-020-305,M501, contingent upon:

1. all necessary right of way, environmental assessments, and utility adjustments being provided at no cost to the Commonwealth; and

- the execution of an appropriate contractual agreement between the County of Chesterfield (County) and the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT), to provide for:
- the design, administration, construction, and maintenance of this project; and
- b. the payment of all ineligible project costs, and of any eligible project costs in excess of this allocation, from sources other than those administered by VDOT, and
- the provision of an appropriate bond or c. other acceptable surety device by the County to VDOT, not to expire before June 21, 2001. Such surety device shall provide for reimbursement to VDOT of any expenses incurred by the Industrial, Airport and Rail Access Fund for this project's construction not justified by the eligible capital outlay of industries served by the project. If, by May 21, 2001, qualified industry has not expended or entered into a firm contract to expend at least \$5,960,000 of eligible capital outlay on parcels served exclusively by this project, than an amount equal to 10% of up to \$3,000,000 and 5% of between \$3,000,000 and \$6,000,000 of eligible capital outlay will be credited toward the project's allocation. This surety may be released or reduced at an earlier date if qualified industry or industries have provided documentation of eligible capital outlay; and
 d. the provision of the required \$150,000 in
- matching funds by the County; and
- e. VDOT determining eligible capital outlay in accordance with current policy and procedure.

Motion carried.

Item 14:

Moved by Mr. Newcomb, seconded by Mr. Neale, that

WHEREAS, Section 33.1-221.1:1 of the Code of Virginia declares it to be in the public interest that access railroad tracks and facilities be constructed to certain industrial or commercial sites; and

WHEREAS, the Culpeper County Board of Supervisors has, by resolution, requested \$150,000 in Industrial Access Railroad Track funds for Cedar Mountain Stone Corporation; and

WHEREAS, it appears that this request falls within the intent of Section 33.1-221.1:1 and is in accordance with the provisions of the Commonwealth Transportation Board's policy on the use of Industrial Access Railroad Track funds; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the funding formula established by said policy, funding may be allocated to this project; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 924, Item 505.A.1., of the 1997 Acts of the General Assembly, funding is provided for Industrial, Airport, and Rail Access projects; and

WHEREAS, the Board believes that this project is for the common good of a region of the Commonwealth and serves a public purpose.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board hereby approves that \$150,000 of the Industrial, Airport, and Rail Access Fund be provided to construct new track to serve Cedar Mountain Stone Corporation, located in Culpeper County, contingent upon:

- 1. All necessary right of way and utility adjustments being provided at no cost to the Commonwealth.
- 2. All costs above \$150,000, which is allocated herein as an industrial rail access grant, being borne by Cedar Mountain Stone Corporation.
- 3. Execution of an agreement acceptable to the Department of Rail and Public Transportation.

Motion carried.

Item 15:

Moved by Mr. Porter, seconded by Mr. Roudabush, that

WHEREAS, in response to a formal request by the Albemarle County Board of Supervisors that Route 631 (Rio Road) between Route 1427 (Hillsdale Drive) and Park Street - Charlottesville NCL be considered for restriction of through truck traffic pursuant to the provisions of Section 46.2-809 of the Code of Virginia, this matter has been carefully reviewed; and

WHEREAS, the Albemarle County Board of Supervisors has conducted a public hearing on this restriction; and

WHEREAS, the routes in question traverse a predominantly non-commercial area; and

WHEREAS, a restriction on the proposed routes would not present any undue hardship; and

WHEREAS, careful consideration has been given to the recommendations received, the available alternate routes and the past practices of the Department.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Route 631 (Rio Road) between Route 1427 (Hillsdale Drive) and Park Street - Charlottesville NCL be restricted to through truck traffic in accordance with Section 46.2-809 of the Code of Virginia.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Porter, seconded by Mr. Grubb, that

WHEREAS, in response to a formal request by the Pulaski County Board of Supervisors that Route 683 (Charles Road) and Route 1021 (Howery Road) between Route 100 (Cleburne Boulevard) and Route 682 (Newbern Road) be considered for restriction of through truck traffic pursuant to the provisions of Section 46.2-809 of the Code of Virginia, this matter has been carefully reviewed, and

WHEREAS, the Pulaski County Board of Supervisors has conducted a public hearing on this restriction; and

WHEREAS, the routes in question traverse a predominantly residential area; and

WHEREAS, a restriction on the proposed routes would not present any undue hardship; and

WHEREAS, proper notice was given by holding a public hearing, posting signs and publishing notices advising the public of the proposed restrictions and requesting written comments; and

WHEREAS, careful consideration has been given to the recommendations received, the available alternate routes and the past practices of the Department.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Route 683 (Charles Road) and Route 1021 (Howery Road) between Route 100 (Cleburne Boulevard) and Route 682 (Newbern Road) be restricted to through truck traffic in accordance with Section 46.2-809 of the Code of Virginia.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Grubb, seconded by Mr. White, that the request by the Pulaski Counnty Board of Supervisors that Route 611 (Wilderness Road) between Route 662 (Lyons Road) and Route F-047 (Possum Hollow Road) be restricted to through truck traffic in accordance with Section 46.2-809 of the Code of Virginia, be denied.

Motion carried.

Item 16:

Moved by Mr. Newcomb, seconded by Mr. White, that

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Section 33.1-46.2 of the Code of Virginia, the Commonwealth Transportation Board may designate one or more lanes of any highway in the interstate, primary, or secondary highway system as high-occupancy vehicle lanes (hereinafter referred to as HOV lanes) for the exclusive use of buses and high-occupancy vehicles to facilitate the rapid and orderly movement of traffic to and from urban areas during peak traffic periods; and

WHERRAS, the HOV designation shall not apply to the use of any such lanes by emergency vehicles such as fire fighting vehicles, ambulances, rescue squad vehicles, law enforcement vehicles, and vehicles of public utility companies when operating in response to an emergency; and WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Section 33.1-46.2 of the Code of Virginia, the Commonwealth Transportation Board may specify the number of passengers required for high occupancy vehicles that use designated HOV lanes and shall specify the hour or hours of each day of the week during which the lanes shall be reserved; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the authority granted under the provisions of Section 33.1-45.2 of the Code of Virginia, the median reversible lanes on I-64 from 0.15 miles west of Granby Street to 0.12 mile west of the Eastern Branch Elizabeth River Bridge eastbound and westbound, the left lanes adjacent to the median on I-64 from 0.12 mile west of the Bastern Branch Blizabeth River Bridge to 0.60 mile west of Indian River Road eastbound and westbound, the left lanes adjacent to the median on I-564 from 1.10 miles west of International Terminal Boulevard to I-64 eastbound and I-64 to 0.28 mile west of International Terminal Boulevard westbound and the left lanes adjacent to the median on the Virginia Beach-Norfolk Expressway (Route 44) from I-64 to 1.20 mile east of Independence Boulevard easthound and westbound are already designated as HOV lanes and are restricted to use of HOVs occupied by two or more persons, buses, and emergency vehicles Monday through Friday between the hours of 5:00 and 8:30 a.m. in the westbound direction, and between the hours of 3:00 and 6:00 p.m. in the eastbound direction.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that in accordance with the authority granted under the provisions of Section 33.1-46.2 of the Code of Virginia, the left lanes adjacent to the median on I-64 eastbound, 0.60 mile west of Indian River Road to 0.30 mile east of Battlefield Boulevard and, on I-64 westbound, 0.15 mile east of Battlefield Boulevard to 0.60 mile west of Indian River Road be designated as HOV lanes and are restricted to use of HOVs occupied by two or more persons, buses, and emergency vehicles Monday through Friday between the hours of 5:00 and 8:30 a.m. in the westbound direction, and between the hours of 3:00 and 6:00 p.m. in the eastbound direction.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the necessary markings and signs be placed to properly advise the public of the restrictions of these roadways.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Virginia Department of Transportation monitor the traffic flows and operating speeds on the designated HOV lanes and report to the Commonwealth Transportation Board any changes in traffic patterns that would indicate a need for adjustments to these operating strategies.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board directs the Department to provide the Virginia State Police with a copy of this resolution and request their cooperation in enforcing the designation.

Motion carried.

Item 17:

Moved by Mr. Newcomb, seconded by Mr. Grubb, that

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board is required by the Code of Virginia Sections 33.1-12(9) and (11) to administer and allocate funds in the Transportation Trust Fund; and

WHEREAS, the 1998 Appropriation Act, Chapter 464 requires that mass transit funds be allocated by the Board in accordance with the statutory formula in Section 58.1-638, Code of Virginia; and

WHEREAS, other sections of the Code of Virginia and the 1998 Appropriation Act, Chapter 464 enacted by the 1998 General Assembly, require certain allocations; and

WHEREAS, the Code of Virginia Section 33.1-391.5 requires the Department of Rail and Public Transportation to administer state and federal funds; and

WHEREAS, Section 9-6.25 of the Code of Virginia allows for the Board to review and comment on budget items not specifically enumerated to the Board by statute; and

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board has received the Department of Rail and Public Transportation's Tentative FY 1998-99 Annual Budget and has made appropriate comments for consideration.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Commonwealth Transportation Board that the recommended tentative allocations required by the various statutes and contained in the Department of Rail and Public Transportation's Tentative FY 1998-99 Annual Budget are approved.

Motion carried.

Item 18:

Moved by Mr. Roudabush, seconded by Mr. Byrd, that

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board is required by the Code of Virginia Sections 33.1-12(9) and (11) to administer and allocate funds in the Transportation Trust Fund; and

WHEREAS, Section 33.1-1-23.1A requires the Board to allocate such amounts as it deems reasonable and necessary for the maintenance of roads on the Interstate, Primary and Secondary Systems; city street payments and payments to counties that have withdrawn from the Secondary System; and

WHEREAS, Section 33.1-23.1B requires the Board to allocate funds for construction on the Interstate, Primary, Secondary and Urban Systems; and

WHEREAS, other sections of the Code of Virginia and the 1998 Appropriation Act, Chapter 464 require certain allocations; and

WHEREAS, Section 9-6.25 of the Code of Virginia allows for the Board to review and comment on budget items not specifically enumerated to the Board by statute; and

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board has received the Department of Transportation's Tentative FY 1998-99 Annual Budget and has made appropriate comments to the Commissioner for his consideration.

NOW, THEREFORE, BB IT RESOLVED by the Commonwealth Transportation Board that the recommended tentative allocations required by the various statutes and contained in the Department of Transportation's Tentative FY 1998-99 Annual Budget are approved.

Motion carried.

Item 19:

Moved by Mr. Neale, seconded by Mr. White, that

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB) is required by the Code of Virginia Section 33.1-12(9) and (11) to administer and allocate funds in the Transportation Trust Fund; and

WHEREAS, Section 33.1-23.1 of the Code of Virginia requires the CTB to allocate funds for the construction and improvements on the Interstate, Primary, Urban and Secondary Road Systems; and

WHEREAS, Section 58.1-638 of the Code of Virginia requires the CTB to allocate funds for mass transit in accordance with the statutory formula; and

WHEREAS, public hearings in each of the nine construction districts have been held by the CTB to receive public comment on the allocation of funds for the Interstate, Primary and Urban Road Systems and Public Transit; and

WHEREAS, new federal highway legislation passed by both the U.S. Senate and the House of Representatives is being considered by a conference committee, which will develop a unified bill for passage by Congress; and

WHEREAS, funding contained in this update is conditional upon continuation of funding in the final version of the authorizing legislation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Commonwealth Transportation Board that the Tentative Allocations of Interstate, Primary, Secondary and Urban Road Construction and Public Transit, Ports and Airports Funds for Fiscal Year 1998-99 are hereby approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Commonwealth Transportation Board that the Tentative Six-Year Improvement Program of projects for Fiscal Years 1998-99 through 2003-2004 for Interstate, Primary and Urban Road Systems and Public Transit are hereby approved.

Motion carried.

Item 20:

The Chair recognized Bill Ketron from the Department of Rail and Public Transportation. Mr. Ketron received the Partnershipping Award from CSX for outstanding industrial development achievements.

- 1/ Chapter 464 of the 1998 General Assembly (Appropriation Act) provides \$3,100,000 of DMV balances and \$3,000,000 of Commonwealth Transportation Funds to the Smithsonian Institution for the National Air and Space Museum Extension in FY 99. An additional \$3.1 million is provided in FY 00. These DMV balances were proposed by the Governor to be part of the highway construction fund.
- 2/ Difference in revenue estimates between April 1997 and April 1998 official revenue estimate.
- 3/ The undesignated find balance is the reconciled amount of the actual revenues and expenditures versus the estimated revenues and allocations for the previously audited fiscal year. This undesignated fund balance is from FY 97.
- 4/ Federal revenue sources are estimated using funding programs and categories as proposed in the Senate version of the resultionized federal transportation bill, ISTEA II, and at a federal funding level of \$22.5 billion
- 5/ Flexibility features of ISTEAH were utilized to smooth transition between federal programs.
- 6/ Federal funding provided as part of the federal appropriation act to essist in capitalizing the State Infrastructure Bank for use on either the highway or transit account.
- 7/ Special Federal funds provided for repair work, general engineering consultant, and the design of two interchanges.
- 8/ Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) funds are provided for road repairs and cleanup from various natural disasters that have occurred.

- 11/ Chapter 464 of the 1998 General Assembly (Appropriation Act) provides \$800,000 in Oil Overcharge funds to the Department of Rail and Public Transportation for paratransit services.
- 12/ This quasi-public agency was founded by the 1996 General Assembly from the Department of Economic Development. Chapter 464 of the 1998 General Assembly (Appropriation Act) directs the Department of Transportation to pay \$450,000 to the Virginia Economic Development Partnership for continued operation of Welcome Centers.
- 13/ Legislation passed during the 1998 General Assembly Session revised the formula for distribution of funds to DRFT. 16/ Chapter 464, 1998 Appropriation Act, appropriates an additional \$1,223,000 in reserve fund proceeds and excess interest earned on Virginia Public Building Authority Bonds for the National Air and Space Muscum Extension.

17/ Chapter 464 of the 1998 General Assembly (Appropriation Act) provides an estimated \$1,100,000 from the General Fund and \$500,000 from the City of Chesapeake as provided by a state/local contract dated June 15, 1997, to the Transportation Improvement Program Set-Aside Fund to pay debt service on revenue bonds issued pursuant to Chapters 233 and 662 of the 1994 session of the General Assembly. A portion of the Set-Aside Fund balance, along with \$1.6 million in revenues, will provide the debt service of approximately \$2.3 million in FY 99.
