

**Minutes of the Meeting of the State Highway
Commission of Virginia, Held
June 12, 13, 14, 1934.**

On the morning of June 12, the State Highway Commission, consisting of Messrs. E. G. Shirley, Wade H. Massie, Secretary, Wm.H. East and S. W. Ewles, met in their office, State Office Building.

The meeting was called to order by the Commissioner.

Moved by Mr. Ewles, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the minutes of the meeting of April 17, 18, 19 and 20 be approved. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Ewles, seconded by Mr. East, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project NRS 739H, Route 300, Bridge over Great Wicomico River, to the low bidder, Snyder Engineering Co., Dover, Delaware, at their bid of \$119,197.75, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, making a total of approximately \$131,000.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. East, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project NEM 18410, Route 1, Raymond Avenue and RF&P Overhead, to the low bidder, Corcoran and Gruman Company, Washington, D.C., at their bid of \$37,232.85, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, making a total of approximately \$41,000.00 chargeable to this project, conditioned on Alexandria putting up the excess amount of cost. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project NEM 454 OH, Route 25, 0.651 Mi. N. SCL Big Stone Gap-SCL Big Stone Gap, to the low bidder, C.D. and C.P. Fugate, Wise, Va., at their bid of \$9,246.52, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, and \$915.20 for guard rail, making a total of approximately \$11,000.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Ewles, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project NEM 889 CB5, Route 11, RCL Toms Brook-SCL Toms Brook, to the low bidder, R. W. Neere & Co., Staunton, Va., at their bid of \$46,824.75, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, making a total of approximately \$51,000.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. East, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project NEM 679F, NEM 679H1, Route 460, WCL Lynchburg-O, 454 Mi. W. WCL Lynchburg, to the low bidder, A. H. Campbell and Co. Inc., and Haynes Construction Co., Chatham, Va., at their bid of \$45,508.55, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, and \$385.00 for guard rail, making a total of approximately \$51,000.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project NEM 1045 E1, Route 59, Bridge over Dan River at Danville, to the low bidder, R. W. Moore and Co., Staunton, Va., at their bid of \$78,798.07, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, making a total of approximately \$87,000.00 chargeable to this project, conditioned on Danville guaranteeing the additional cost. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. East, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project NEM 1040 DE1, Route 1, Streets of Fredericksburg, to the low bidder, Virginia Construction Co., Fredericksburg, Va., at their bid of \$11,540.89, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, making a total of approximately \$13,000.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Bawls, that the Commission award contract for the construction of Project NEM 497 FE1, Route 11, E&W Overhead Crossing and Approaches, to the low bidders, W. N. Jackson and E. D. Crowder, Manassas, Va., at their bid of \$33,361.79, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work; \$1,931.81 for guard rail, and \$1,338.60 for changing telephone, telegraph and signal lines, making a total of approximately \$40,000.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Bawls, seconded by Mr. East, that the Commission award contract for the construction of Project NEM 358 GW, Route 1, Bridge over Little River, to the low bidder, Boston Construction Co. Inc., South Boston, Va., at their bid of \$8,349.65, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, making a total of approximately \$7,000.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the Commission award contract for the construction of Project NEM 1048 AB1, Route 58, Bridge and Approaches Rose Creek, Lawrenceville, to the low bidders, Cobb and Homewood, Inc., Chapel Hill, N.C., at their bid of \$9,154.58, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work; \$242.10 for guard rail and \$5.72 for soil rights, making a total of approximately \$11,000.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. East, that the Commission award contract for the construction of Project NEM 1020, Route 11, Streets of Christiansburg, to the low bidder, Sam R. Finley, Roanoke, Va., at his bid of \$1,579.78, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, making a total of approximately \$3,000.00 chargeable to this project; with the understanding that the Town of Christiansburg will pay the balance necessary over and above the State's amount of \$1,388.68. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Rawls, that permit #7407, Scott County, Routes 58 and 25, issued to Mrs. Pearl H. Highfiel, on April 5, be cancelled, as requested, as the work will not be undertaken. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. East, that permit #14733, Dinwiddie County, Route 400, issued to the Petersburg Telephone Company, February 13, 1933, be cancelled, as the work will not be done. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Rawls, that permit #12660, Goochland County, Route 6, issued the V&P Co., on January 15th, be cancelled as requested, as the work will not be done. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. East, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that permit #12800, Henric Co., Route 60, issued the V&P Co., May 5, 1933, be cancelled as requested, as the work will not be done. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Massie, that permit #12832, Chesterfield County, Route 80, issued the V&P Co., July 20, 1933, be cancelled as requested as the work will not be done. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Massie, that permit #12894, issued to the Appalachian Electric Power Co., Roanoke, Va., on Route 58 in Henry County, be cancelled as requested. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Massie, that permit be granted the Appalachian Electric Power Co., Bluefield, West Va., to erect a 6900v, 110-220v distribution line along west side of Route 38 for service connection. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Rawls, that request of the Appalachian Electric Power Co., Bluefield, West Va., for permit #12437 to erect a 110-220v distribution line along southerly side of U. S. Route 21 in Bland County, be not granted. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. East, seconded by Mr. Massie, that request of the Appalachian Electric Power Co., Bluefield, West Va., for permit #12158 to erect a 6900v, 110-220v distribution line along south side of Route 11 in Wythe County, on Project 422E, be not granted. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that permits be not issued for the year 1935 covering the use of solid tires on equipment of 3 1/2 tons capacity and less, as was done in 1934. Motion carried.

Mr. F. P. Pilsner and Dr. Anderson of Winchester, appeared before the Commission, relative to the G.W.A. projects within the city that have been discontinued and unfinished, asking that the Commission assist them in the completion of the work.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Bawls, that the State Highway Commission join with the City of Newport News in segregating traffic over Huntington Avenue. Motion carried.

Mr. A. J. Channing, Jr., appeared before the Commission and requested permission to cut through the grass plot on Route 2 in front of his service station at the intersection of Chamberlayne Avenue.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that the Commission transfer \$5,870.15 from Project 797 NFB1, Trinity to Intersection of Route 11, to the Approaches to Bridge at Fort Royal, Project 1800A. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. East, that the changes in Route 127 of the primary system in Campbell County be approved in accordance with letter of May 9th with sketch attached, from the Engineer of Surveys and Plans. Motion carried.
