terrated, Empry Powell Berrow was elected to the General Assembly in 1934 as representative from Brunswick County and served in this capacity for three terms before being appointed in 1942 to the Virginia State Righmay Commission to represent the Michaeld District; and

WHERES, he performed his duties as a member of the State Highway Commission with such ability and humility that he was the respect and admiration of the other numbers of the Highway Commission, as well as all others who knew him; and

WHIREAS, death come suddenly to knory Powell Extrow on May 4, 1962, thereby depriving this Commission of a beloved friend and a dedicated fellow public servent; and

this man and beloved friend, whose loss will ever remain an abiding grief, we, numbers of the State Highway Commission, join the best of people who knew him personally and by reputation in paying tribute to his life and memory.

NOW, THERETORS, ME IT RESOLVED: That we, members of the State Highest Countesion, join the numbers of the femily in their grief and express to them our sympathy in their great lone, as well as our deep and electro appreciation for the unselfish services rendered to the Countesion and to the Councessalth by our departed friend,

HE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That this resolution be spread on the official minutes of the Commission and a copy transmitted to the family of Emory Powell Barrow.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Carper, seconded by Mr. Bolland, that

WHITEAS, now snow fonce is meeded in the Culpaper District, at a cost of \$21,000; and

WHEREAS, there are sufficient funds in the Colpaper District Construction Reserve Fund to provide this amount; therefore,

THE IT SECOLVED, that \$21,000 be allocated from the Culpaper District Construction Reserve Fund to pay for this new saw faces.

Motios carried.

Moved by Judge Weaver, seconded by Mr. Scietar, that

WHESEAS, Henrico County is carrying out a program involving substantial expenditures for the improvement of drainage in the Tockshop District in an area where homes and connercial establishments are frequently flooded during beavy storms; and

UMERRAS, enlarged facilities are being provided by the County up to Route 250 at its intersection with Horsepen Road, necessitating the enlargement of the culvert at this point in order to provide adquate run-off; and

WHEREAS, the cost of providing additional drainage capacity is estimated at \$30,000 and is definitely the responsibility of the Highway Department; and

WHEREAS, an adequate amount exists in the Bichmond Distric Construction reserve Fund to cover this amount; therefore,

HE IT RESOLVED, that \$30,000 be allocated from the Richmond District Construction Reserve Fund to provide for the construction of the enlarged culvert. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Bolland, seconded by Mr. China, that

WHEREAS, a request has been received from the Board of Supervisors of Princess Anna County to participate in the cost of rehabilitating and extending a pumping and drainage system on Route 60 in the vicinity of 55th to 64th Streets north of Virginia Beach; and

MHERAS, the estimated cost of the project is approximately \$32,000 of which amount the County proposes to take care of about 50% through the purchase and installation of motors, pumps, and other incidental items and is requesting the Highway Department to take care of the other 50% through formishing and installing an underground drainage system leading to the pumping station; and

WHEREAS, the partial correction of the flooding condition that will result from this expenditure will be of great benefit to the heavy traffic volume using this section of Route 60; and

WHEREAS, the proposed project complies with the Commission's drainage policy and has been determined to be a 50-50 County-Highway Department responsibility; therefore,

RE IT RESOLVED that \$16,000 be allocated from the Suffolk District Construction Reserve Fund for the Highest Department's share of improving the pumping and drainage system. Motion carried.

Noved by Mr. Watkins, seconded by Mr. Holland, that WHEMMAS, in accordance with the provisions of Section 128 of the Title 23 - Highways, United States Code, a public hearing was held in the suditorium of the Volens Elementery School, Volens, Virginia, at 7:30 P.M., on May 9, 1962, concerning the proposed construction of Route 501 from 0.726 Mile south of Volens to 0.728 mile Borth of Volens inHelifax County, State Project 0501-041-106, C-501, Federal Project F 019-1,

MESSEAS, proper notice was given in advence and all those present were given a full opportunity to express their opinions and recommendations for or against the proposed development as placed and their statements being duly recorded, and

WHEREAS, the economic effects of the proposed relocation have been examined and given proper consideration, and this evidence, along with all other, has been carefully reviewed, now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the construction of this project be approved in accordance with the plan as proposed and presented by the Engineering Division of the Department of Highway at the public hearing. This proposed project is a relocation of the existing alignment on Route 501 at Volens. Motion carried.

Moved by Judge Weaver, seconded by Mr. Chinn, then

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Section 128 of Title 23 - Highways, United States Code, a public hearing was held in the Gainesboro Volunteer Fire Department Building, Gainesboro, Virginia, at 10:00 A.M. on May 10, 1962, concerning the proposed construction of Route 522 from the Horth Corporate Limits of Winchester to 5.669 miles north of the North Corporate Limits of Winchester in Fraderick County, State Project 0522-034-101,C-501, Federal Project F-070-1(5).

WHEREAS, proper notice was given in edvance and all times present were given a full opportunity to express their opinions and recommendations for or against the proposed development as planned and their statements being duly recorded, and

MERMAS, the economic effects of the proposed relocation have been exertised and given proper consideration, and this evidence, along with all other, has been carefully reviewed, now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the construction of this project be approved in accordance with the plan as proposed and presented by the Engineering Division of the Department of Higherys at the public hearing. This proposed development will provide a dual lane facility and will utilize so much as practical, the existing facility for one direction traffic initially. Motion carried.

Moved by Judge Weaver, seconded by Mr. Watkins, that WHEREAS, all of the land at the SandstonResidency, located on Moute 60, in Sandston, Virginia, is being used to its fullest capacity; and, WHENEAS, the shape of the lot comes out to a narrow point on the west corner, this corner now being used for employee parking; and, WHERRAS, Jones and Robins, Incorporated, are planning a development to the west of this area, and have offered to exchange an area containing 0.327 acres and fronting on a proposed street adjacent to the northwest side of the highest lot for 0.118 seres fronting on Route 60, the frontage being the leg of a right triangle, and, temmas, this exchange has been recommended by the District, Resident and District Right of Way Engineers as being an equitable exchange; NOW, THEREFORE, in eccordance with the provisions of Section 33-76.6 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended, conveyance of the said 0,118 acre in exchange for the 0.327 core, is hereby approved, and the State Highway Commissioner is hereby authorized to execute a deed sccordingly. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Watkins, seconded by Judge Weaver, that MHERRAS, by proper resolutions the various Boards of Supervisors have requested that certain roads which no longer serve as a public necessity, be discontinued as parts of the Secondary System of Highways:

MOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33-76.7 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, the following roads be discontinued as parts of the Secondary System of Righmays, effective this date:

FITTSTEFANIA COUNTY - Route 729, old location from the intersection of Route 730 south to a point just south of Southern Railtond, Project 0729-071-103,C-501, B-602

PITTSTINAMIA COUNTY - Mowte 652, old legation from Station 85420 northeasterly to Station 100400, Project 0662-071-102,C-501,B-607----- 0.36 mile

IRE COUNTY - Boute 798, old location from Station 550+00 westerly to Station 553470, Project 0798-052-102,0-501,8-601 ----- 0.07 mile

PROJECT COUNTY - Route 607, eld location from Station 143460 northerly to Station 166470, Project 0607-012-102.C-501----- 0.55 mile

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Solater, seconded by Judge Mesver, that WHERAS, Section 33-26 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as spended, sutherised the State Highest Commission to add such roads, bridges and streets as it shall down proper, and to transfer from the Secondary System to the Primary System such roads, bridges, and streets as it shall down proper, not to exceed fifty miles during any one year; and

MERRICAS, it has been requested by the Board of Supervisors of Lee County that present Route 796 from Jonesville south to the Tennessee State Line be restored to the Primary System of Highways as State Boate 70; and

MHEREAS, improvements on present Route 796 have recently been completed including construction of a new bridge and approaches over Powell River; and, whereas, it is now recommended by our Highway Engineers that Recondary Boute 798 be transferred to the Printry System:

NOW, TREMPOSE, RR IT MESOLVED, that under authority of Section 33-26 of the 1930 Code of Virginia, as amended, present Soute 798 beginning at its intersection with Moute 58 in the Town of Jonesville and extending southerly to the Tennesses State Line, a distance of 12.46 miles be transferred from the Secondary System to the Primary System of Highways and designated as State Route 70, effective this date. Motion carried. Hoved by Mr. Flythe, seconded by Mr. Holland, that WHENAS, a cash balance of \$306,809.69 existed as of May 31, 1962 in uniquested hasdeve Mniateograp Funds in the State of Virginia Toll Revenue Bond account with the Mational Bank of Commerce of Morfolk, Trustee, and

WERRAS, \$156,809.89 of this balance is estimated on sufficient to meet the meeds in this fund during the next 12 months,

now, therefore,

BE IT #2501740 by the State Righest Consission that the Trustee be instructed, under provisions of Sec. 602 of the Trust Indenture, to invest for a period of approximately 12 months the remaining balance of \$150,000 in Reserve Maintenance Funds in applicable accurities of the U.S. Government at the highest rate of interest obtainable on the data of said investment. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Warkins, seconded by Mr. Flyths, that WESTAS, the Highway Commission, acting pursuant to Section 46.1-345 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, has previously adopted a resolution reducing the weight limits on cartain highways or sections of highway within the State; and

WHIRAS, engineering studies have been conducted which indicate the meed for removal of the reduced weight limit on a certain portion of Boute 30 in Fairfax County.

NOW, THERMORE, IN IT MESOLVED: That the eight-ton weight limit restriction which is in effect on Noute 50 in Fairfax County is becake removed from that portion of Route 50 between Noutes 550 and 2021.

MR IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the itemised listing of weight reductions on Friency rooms on file in the Meintenance Division be revised eccordingly. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Flythe, seconded by Mr. Carper, that WHENAS, the Virginia Highway Commission at their regular uneting on January 12, 1962, adopted a resolution resolving that all roads and streats having access to the Matienal System of Interstate and Defense Highways at Interchanges, provided for that purpose, shall be designed to the geometric and structural standard of Class I Primary highways for a distance of not less than one-half mile from the Interstate Highway.

WHERAS, the Surezu of Public Roads will not give favorable consideration on a state-wide basis; and

WHIRMS, consideration will be given by the Buresu of Public Boads on an individual location.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLUTED, that the resolution sampled on Japuary 12, 1962, concerning this subject be restinded.

Notice carried.

Moved by Mr. Watkins, seconded by Mr. Holland, that WHEREAS, the 1962 Session of the Legislature adopted a resolution expressing the sense of the General Assembly that the State Righway Department, when acquiring rights of way for high-ways, except Interstate, in advance of the time of construction, should allow signs and notices to remain or be put on such rights of way; and

WERRAS, it is the desire of the State Highway Commission to comply with this empression of legislative intent and to set forth the policy to govern such signs and notices.

NOW, THEREFORE, HE IT RESOLVED: That the State Highway Commission hereby adopts the following policy to govern the erection and/or meintenance of signs on rights of way purchased for future construction:

- Signs and advertising structures will be parmitted only on portions of highest rights of way which lie outside of the normal right of way for present construction.
- Only signs and advertising structures will be permitted which meet all three of the conditions listed below:
 - A. Exected and/or maintained or caused to be exected and/or maintained by the owner or lesses of a place of business or residence immediately adjacent to the right of way upon which the sign or structure is located or sought to be located.
 - B. Located within 250 feet of such place of business or residence.
 - C. Relate solely to merchandise, services or entertainment sold, produced, usualisatured or furnished at such place of business or residence.
- Not more than 2 signs visible to traffic proceeding in any one direction on any highway will be permitted any one business or residence and no sign shall exceed a total area of 80 square feet.
- 4. No person shall erect and/or maintain a sign or advertising structure on highway rights of way unless and until a permit has been obtained from the Highway Department, and all permits issued for such signs and structures shall be subject to the rules and regulations of the State Highway Commission applicable to installations on the highway rights of way.

- 5. Any permit issued for a sign or advertising structure on highway rights of way shall be revoked, if not sooner, at the time that the Highway Depertment begins to make use of such rights of way for highway purposes, and such sign or structure shall be removed from the right of way immediately without expense to the Componently.
- No parmit for any advertising sign or expecture will be issued which is prohibited by any local ordinance.

The above policy is an express exception to Section No. 16 of the Rules and Regulations previously adopted by this Commission.

Motion carried,

Moved by Mr. Carper, seconded by Mr. Chism, that WHEREAS, the State Highway Commission is authorized under Section 33-12 of the Code of Virginia of 1930, as amended, to make any primary highway or portion thereof that has not been named by the General Assembly; and

MESTAS, the Board of Supervisors of Fairfax County, after consideration of the matter of naming the Boats 123 Bypess at McLean, Virginia, has requested the Highway Commission to some this portion of highway the "Bolly Medicon Boulevard;" and

WHERAS, the Highway Commission Seels that such action

would be appropriate.

NOW, THEREFORE, SE IT RESOLVED: That the portion of Boute 123 between the C.I.A. entrance and the Capital Beltway is hereby designated and shall be hereafter known as the "Dolly Madison Bouleverd," Motion carried.

Mr. Paul Stotts reviewed U. S. Senate Bill S-3263 and House Bill BR. 11584, and on motion of Mr. Wetkins, seconded by Mr. Flythe, the Commission voted to endorse this legislation.

A group of citizens from the Suffolk-Sussement County area, beaded by Mr. Stephen D. Caroes, Jr., President of the Suffolk-Sussement Chember of Commerce, was beerd by the Commission. This group advocated the development of existing highways on a westerly route for approach from the south to the Chesaponke Lay Bridge-Tunnel, rather than new construction in the Morfolk County area. So attion was taken,
