# MINUTES OF MEETING OF STATE HIGHWAY AND TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION

# Richmond, Virginia

June 15, 1978

Following a public hearing on tentative allocations of Interstate, Primary, and Urban Construction Funds for the Fiscal Year 1978-79, the Highway and Transportation Commission met in regular monthly meeting at 10 a.m., at the Central Highway Office in Richmond on June 15, 1978. The chairman, Mr. John E. Harwood, presided.

On motion of Mr. Hassell, seconded by Mr. Glass, the minutes of the meeting of May 18, 1978, were approved.

On motion of Mr. Hassell, seconded by Mr. Glass, permits issued from May 18, 1978, to June 14, 1978, inclusive, as shown by records of the Department, were approved.

Motion was made by Mr. Hassell, seconded by Mr. Glass, that cancellation of permits from May 18, 1978, to June 14, 1978, inclusive, as shown by records of the Department, be approved. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Hassell, seconded by Mr. Glass, that the Commission approve additions to the Secondary System from May 18, 1978, to June 14, 1978, inclusive, as shown by records of the Department. Motion carried.

On motion of Mr. Roos, seconded by Mr. Hooper, the Commission approved the purchase of Automobile Liability and Property Damages Insurance (Inquiry No. 4098-FL), based on the low bid submitted by Marsh & McLennan, Inc., and covering 6,500 licensed vehicles owned by the Department and the Central Garage.

Moved by Mr. Roos, seconded by Mr. Crowe, that the Department re-evaluate the costs of the different alternatives for improving Route 640, Project 0640-065-137, M-501, M-502, in Northampton County because of the controversy now surrounding the project.
