WHEREAS, by proper resolution, the Boards of Supervisors of Fairfax and Henry Counties have requested that certain roads which no longer serve as public necessities be discontinued as part of the Secondary System of State Highways.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that pursuant to Section 33.1-150 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, the Commonwealth Transportation Board finds the following segments of roads are not required for public convenience and are hereby discontinued as part of the Secondary System of State Highways, effective this date.

Item 5:

Moved by Mr. Rich, seconded by Mr. Neale, that

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board is authorized under Section 33.1-41.1 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, to approve payments to cities and certain towns for street maintenance, construction and reconstruction purposes; and

WHEREAS, certain Principal-Minor Arterial Roads, Collector Roads and Local Streets within the corporate limits of the Town of Blacksburg are eligible for such payment, and

WHEREAS, under the authority of Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the Town of Blacksburg for street payments on Local Streets meeting the required criteria.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the street mileage eligible for quarterly payments to the Town of Blacksburg for Local Streets be increased by 0.68 centerline mile. This increase is a result of additions of Local Streets as described on tabulation sheet numbered 1 through 1 for the Town of Blacksburg as functionally classified by the Transportation Planning Division dated April 28, 1998.

The tabulation sheet is on file in the Department's Urban Division.

The <u>Local Street</u> additions totaling 0.68 mile increases the total mileage to 78.46 centerline miles of approved streets subject to street payments effective for payment beginning July 1, 1998.

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board is authorized under Section 33.1-41.1 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, to approve payments to cities and certain towns for street maintenance, construction and reconstruction purposes; and

WHEREAS, certain Principal-Minor Arterial Roads, Collector Roads and Local Streets within the corporate limits of the Town of Bridgewater are eligible for such payment; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Bridgewater has expanded its boundary by an annexation effective January 1, 1998; and

WHEREAS, under the authority of Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the Town of Bridgewater for street payments on Minor Arterial Roads meeting the required criteria.

WHEREAS, Article 1.1, Chapter 1, of Title 33.1 of the Code of Virginia requires the CTB to allocate funds for the construction and improvements on the Interstate, Primary, Urban and Secondary Road Systems; and

WHEREAS, Section 58.1-638 of the Code of Virginia requires the CTB to allocate funds for mass transit in accordance with the statutory formula; and

WHEREAS, public hearings in each of the nine construction districts have been held by the CTB to receive public comment on the allocation of funds for the Interstate, Primary and Urban Road Systems and Public Transit; and

WHEREAS, the CTB approved the tentative allocations on May 21, 1998 and subsequently held two additional public hearings on June 11, 1998; and

WHEREAS, funding contained in the final program is the same as included in the tentative program; and

WHEREAS, Congress has passed the Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century or "TEA-21"; and

WHEREAS, necessary revisions to allocate the additional funding from "TEA-21" will be required to the program once apportionments, by category, are received from the Federal Highway Administration.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Commonwealth Transportation Board that the Final Allocations of Interstate, Primary, Secondary and Urban Road Construction and Public Transit, Ports and Airports Funds for Fiscal Year 1998-99 are hereby approved; and, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Commonwealth Transportation Board that the Six-Year Improvement Program of projects for Fiscal Years 1998-99 through 2003-2004 for Interstate, Primary and Urban Road Systems and Public Transit are hereby approved; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board plans to revise the final allocations for FY-99 and the six-year program at a future date in consideration of the recent passage of the Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century.

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Item 20:

Mr. Roudabush, Chairman of the Internal Audit Committee reported on the Committee meeting of May 20, 1998. The Comitee reviewed the reports for audits of Bristol District Data Center, Daily Payments System, Toll Collection System Test-Dulles Toll Road, and Construction Division Plan Room; and resolved follow-up, and accepted as adequate the actions taken, or to be taken, on the reports. Follow-up was presented on the Williams' special investigation; the Broadhanding special project was presented; the Committee requested periodic reports on Y2K; and favorable comments were made about Mr. Dan Marston, Bristol District Administrator, and Mr. Bill Costis, Dulles Toll Road Director. Input for the Internal Andit Plan for PY99 was requested from the Committee.
