WHEREAS, under the authority of Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the City of Danville for street payments on Principal/Minor Arterial Roads, Collector Roads and Local Streets meeting the required criteria.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the road/street mileage eligible for quarterly payments to the City of Danville for Principal-Minor Arterial Roads, Collector Roads and Local Streets be increased by 12.00 centerline miles. This increase is a result of adjustments made by the City to the current Urban Maintenance Inventory.

The Local Street additions totaling 2.85 miles increase the total mileage to 18.30 centerline miles of approved streets subject to street payments effective for payment beginning July 1, 2000.
