Minutes of Special Meetings of the State Highway Commission held in Rosmake, Pulsaki, Hillsville, Calex, Bristol, and Pearisburg, Virginia, and Report of Inspection Trip over 1200 miles of The State Highway System, July Sth-16th, inclusive.

Occadesion, H. P. Beck, Secretary, F. V. Davie, and Horace
Hardway, together with Highway Consissioner, G. P. Coleman,
assembled at the Richmond Hotel, Richmond, at one e'clock on
Wonday, July 5th, and proceeded in automobile over Route Ho,1
of the State Highway System to Regro, thence over Route He,9
to Charlottesville, where they were joined by Wade H. Massie,
Chairman of the Consission, From Charlottesville, the Consission
continued over Route He.9 to Staunton, where the night was spent,

On Tuesday morning, July 6th, the Righmy Consission accompanied by the Highway Consissioner, left Staumton and proceeded in extemption over Route No.3 to Lexington, where they were joined by James A. Mandy, Jr., after which they proceeded to Natural Bridge, where they spent the night as the guests of Consissioner Mandy. During the day the Consission inspected the Buene Vista-Matural Bridge and the Hillott Hill Routes, and also three proposed routes between Lexington and North Mountain, known as Route No.14,

On Vednesday morning. July 7th, the entire Commission, accompanied by the Highway Commissioner, left Fatural Bridge and proceeded over Bouto Ho.3 to Reanoke, where an informal conference was held, in the rooms of the Chamber of Commerce, with the Mayor and the City Commissioners,

After this conference, the Commission proceeded over Nowto No. 10 to Radford, and thouse to Palaski where the night was spent, and as informal conference held with the citizens of Palaski and a Committee from Carroll County, as well as a delagation from Riand County.

Commission, accompanied by Commissioner Coleman, proceeded in sutumobiles to Hillswille in Carrell County ever Route No.12.

At the Court Rouse at Hillswille the County as to the read needs of the County, after which the Highway Countession proceeded over Route 12 to Galax, where they set with a consistee of citizens from County in regard to the location of the State Highway through this County. After this meeting the Countesion proceeded to Cytheville, where the night was spent,

At the Court House in Tytheville & large meeting was held to discuss the road meets of Tythe County and the adjoining County of Bland. A delagation of eithese from Prayeon County was also present at this meeting.

On Friday morning, July 9th, the Commission, accompanied by Commissioner Goleman, left Wytheville and precoeded over Route No.10 to Bristol, where they were set by the
City efficiels, and road matters affecting this locality were
discussed. The Commission then proceeded over Route No.10 to
Oute City, thence to Natural Tunnel and Rattensville, where the
might was opent as the guests of Mr. S. H. Satson.

On Saturday morning, Fully 10th, the Commission

left Pationsville and proceeded in automobiles ever Purell Mountain, over Route 10 to Pennington Cap, Jonesville, thence to Camberland Cap, and returning to Pennington Cap, proceeded over Route He-11 to Mig Stone Cap, where the might was spent.

On Sunday morning, July 11th, the Commission left Big Stone day and proceeded over Boute He.11 to St. Paul, Lebener, Temperall, theree to Blueffeld, West Virginia, where the night was spent.

On Monday morning, July 12th, the Commission left
Himsfield, accompanied by Commissioner Coloren and several officials
and sitisens of Ciles County, and proceeded by way of Princeton,
across Mercer County in Yest Virginia, to Pearleburg, Ciles County,
Virginia, over Route No.23, where a considerable number of citizens
had congregated to neet the Countskien and to discuse the rend mode
of Giles County with the State representatives.

From Fearlaburg the Commission continued ever Route No.23 to Blacksburg, where they were entertained by Dr. Julian B. Burruss, Provident, and associated efficials of V. P. I.

From Blacksburg the Commission proceeded to Christiansburg and thomas over Houte No.10 to Heansks, where the night was spent.

On July 13th, Theaday, the Highway Commission set in regular session at the Hotel Rosmoke, Rosmoke, and proceeded with the transaction of official business.

The minutes of the meetings of June 14, 15, and 16th were read and approved, and an motion of Mr. Hardway the Chairman was authorized to sign the same as correct.

The petition for a rehearing in the Amelia County

ence, concerning the location of Houte Mo.20 between Amelia C.H. and Jebersville, filed by Mr. T. Gray Haddon, Attorney, Richards, Ya., was, on motion of Mr. Davie, rejected, and the Secretary instructed to notify Mr. Haddon that the matter, so far as the Commission was concerned, was disposed of finally.

On motion of Mr. Davis the Highway Cosmissioner
was requested to propage an estimate of the cost of reconstructing
and resurfacing the road from Combris to Mankeburg and to Slusser's
Wine, and report the cost of this work to the Highway Cosmission
at an early date. Also to report any proposed examplements he
might make for soing this work, the Cosmission being of the spinion
that this work should be done at an early date.

Whereas the State Highway Commission did on the 25th day of May, approve and promulgate certain Bules and Regulations concerning the regulation of traffic on State Highways, and

Whereas, after going over some twolve hundred miles of State Highways and meeing the effoot of unrestricted traffic upon the State Reads, the Highway Commission is of the opinion that the traffic regulations heretofore adopted are insufficient, for the proper pretection of the State Highways, and should be amended by reducing the maximum lead per inch in width of tire from 700 to 500 lbs;

THEREFORE BE IT RESCURED that Section 2 is spended to read as follows:

It is forbidden to drive, propel or sparate, or to cause to be driven, propelled or sparated, over any State Rightsy, any vehicle, implement or contrivance, whose group load on any continual shall exceed five hundred (500) pounds for each inch of width of tire on same, when provided with solid tires, from the first day of legander, and four hundred (400) pounds

for each inch of width of tire, when provided with solid tires from December first to May first, and seven hundred (700) pounds for each inch in width of tire, when provided with pastmatic rubber tires, from January first to December thirty-first. Should it, however, he deemed advisable to increase the load per inch in width of tire over earthin mentions of The State Highway System a permit to increase the loading shall be first obtained, as hereinafter provided, but in no case shall the group load on any one wheel exceed seven hundred (700) pounds per inch in width of tire; previded further that the width of solid tires shall be considered as that portion coming in contact with an unyielding surface and the width of presentic tires shall be considered as the total thickness measured from outside to outside of easing at the widest point between trend and rim when fully inflated with air; and provided further that no vehicle, implement, or contrivance whose grees load whall exceed twelve (12) tone shell be moved ar operated over may State Highway, unloss a percit to do so small first he obtained, as hereinafter provided.

After a general discussion of State Highway matters the Commission adjourned and the various members of the Commission proceeded to their respective homes by the most direct route. The majority of the Commission, Memora. H. P. Back, Hornes Hardaway, and F. V. Davie, accompanied by Commissioner Coleman, proceeded in automobile over Houte 10 to Redford City, thence to Paraville and from Faraville over Route 13 to Richard, where the Commission finally disbanded after a most extensive inspection of the State Highways.
