MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE  
STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSION, HELD  
AT NORFOLK, VIRGINIA, JULY 29TH,

1921.

The State Highway Commission, with Wade H. Massie,  
Chairman, Henry P. Beck, Secretary, and Horace Hardaway in  
attendance, met at Norfolk, Virginia, July 29th, 1921,

10 A. M.

Commissioners Frank W. Davis and James A. Mundy, Jr.  
were absent on account of sickness.

On motion of Mr. Hardaway, the minutes of the  
meetings of July 20th to July 23rd, were approved, after  
being read, and the Chairman was authorized to sign the  
same as correct.

After careful inspection and consideration, the  
Highway Commission decides that the appeal of certain free-  
holders of Prince William, protesting against the location of  
that portion of Route No. 21 between Manassas and Warrenton,  
as determined by Highway Commissioner George F. Coleman, is  
not sustained, and that the location of Route No. 21 from  
Manassas, through Greenwich to the end of the Macadam Road  
near Mitchell Harrison's gate, as located by the Highway

Commissioner is therefore confirmed.

The permanent location of that portion of Route No. 14, between New Baltimore, and the end of the Meadon road near Mitchell Harrison's Gate is not finally determined at this time.

After due consideration the State Highway Commission decided that the appeal of certain freeholders of Rockbridge County, protesting against the location of that portion of Route No. 14 between Longdale and Lexington via Collierstown, as determined by the Highway Commissioner, George P. Coleman, is sustained, and the Highway Commission hereby adopts as the permanent location for Route No. 14 between Longdale and Lexington, the location known as the Kerrs Creek Route, commencing in Lexington at Washington Street, thence to the point of divergence where the Kerrs Creek Road leaves the Collierstown Road, thence by the most direct and practical location to end up Kerrs Creek, crossing the North Mountain through Kerrs Creek Gap, and thence on to Longdale.

It appearing to the State Highway Commission from further investigation and an inspection of the Clerk's records at Gate City, and upon the statement of the Clerk that he had not received any official notice from Highway

Commissioner Colman, concerning the location of that portion of Route 10 from Speer's Ferry to Stickleyville day, the Highway Commission rescinds their previous action on this matter, and hereby grants to certain freeholders of Scott County the right to appeal and be heard by this Commission, and the Secretary is hereby directed to notify the Clerks of Scott and Lee Counties, and the appellants through their Attorney of the date and place of this meeting as soon as the same shall have been determined.

On motion of Mr. Hardaway, certain Banks of Wise County, were allowed to advance \$50,000.00 for construction work on Route 11, between Rollin and Riverview, in Wise County, and the Board of Supervisors of Albemarle County were allowed to advance \$300,000.00 for construction work on Route 20, between Charlottesville and the Nelson County line, and the Chairman and Secretary of this Commission were instructed and authorized to enter into the usual contract concerning anticipations in the name, and on behalf of the State Highway Commission, with the above parties.

The Commission granted permission to the Tidewater Automobile Association to erect signs on State Highway No. 10 between Norfolk and Virginia Beach; on State Highway No. 9 between Fortress Monroe and Yorktown; on State Highway No. 9

between Gloucester Point and Saluda; on State Highway No. 8 between Saluda and Fredericksburg; and on State Highway No. 1 between Fredericksburg and Washington.

All work in connection with the erection of these signs to be under the direction and supervision of the Highway Commissioner. This permit to be revocable at any time at the pleasure of the Highway Commission.

The Highway Commissioner recommended the award of the following contracts which received the approval of the Highway Commission, viz:

Project 121-a, Route No. 5, Two reinforced concrete bridges between Setrell and Courtland (Subject to sale of bonds by the County of Southampton)	\$ 13,775.99
Project No. 127, Route 10, 7.67 miles Soil Road between Rives and Bayneville	66,934.93
Project No. 93, Route 10, 4.6 miles Waterhouse Meadow Road between Glenvar and Montgomery County line	94,925.14
Project 76, Route 10, 2.45 miles Concrete and 6.25 miles Soil, between Farmville and Prospect	199,667.27

The Highway Commission heard a delegation from Virginia Beach who desired the extension of the present concrete road to Atlantic Avenue, and on Atlantic Avenue northwardly to a point beyond the Princess Anne Country Club.

The Commission determined to accept the proposition of the Town of Virginia Beach to advance sufficient funds for the extension of the concrete road from its present

terminus to Atlantic Avenue, provided arrangements are made for the paving of Atlantic Avenue.

On motion of Mr. Hardaway, L. V. Parr was granted a permit to erect, construct and maintain a telephone line on and along Route No. 10 in Amherst County; the location of the poles and all work to be under the supervision of the Highway Commissioner, and this permit to be revocable at the pleasure of the Highway Commission.

After careful consideration, and on motion of Mr. Hardaway, the Roanoke Railway and Electric Company, of Roanoke, Virginia, was granted a permit to plant poles and string wires for the transmission of electricity along Route No. 10 in Roanoke County.

On motion of Mr. Hardaway, the following resolutions, regarding the acquisition of right of way for State Highway No. 7, Project No. 92, in Spotsylvania County, were unanimously adopted:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE STATE HIGHWAY  
COMMISSION OF VIRGINIA, That, in the judgment of this  
Commission, it is necessary, requisite, and suitable  
for the alteration, construction, reconstruction, and  
maintenance of a portion of the road embraced in the  
State Highway System, Route # , in Spotsylvania  
County, Virginia, to change the location of said portion  
of said State Highway through the lands of Mrs. D. L. Payne,  
as shown by lines on blueprint map of a portion of said  
road, identified as Sheets 10,11,12 , Project No. 98,  
Route No. # , to be filed in the condemnation proceedings  
to be instituted in the Circuit Court of Spotsylvania  
County, to which said blueprint map reference is here  
made; and

RESOLVED FURTHER That this Commission deems  
it necessary, requisite, and suitable that the right of way  
of said Highway through the lands of Mrs. D. L. Payne,  
as shown on said blueprint map, shall be 50 feet wide, and  
that the center line as shown on said blueprint map shall  
be the center line of said 50 foot right of way;

RESOLVED FURTHER That a profile showing  
the grade line, cut and fills, shown on said blueprint  
map be made a part hereof, and that the grade line shown  
therein be adopted and established;

RESOLVED FURTHER that in the judgment of this Commission it is necessary, requisite, and suitable for the alteration, construction, reconstruction, and maintenance of said State Highway to acquire said right of way over such lands of said Mrs. D. L. Payne that may be necessary to fill out and complete said 50 foot right of way, the additional right of way required over the lands of said Mrs. D. L. Payne, as shown on said blueprint map, being described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the right of way, same being a point in the center line of the highway and a point in the right of way of W. C. Freedius, colored, and said point also being 21900 ft. from the Chancellorsville Cross Roads, measured on the highway and said point also being 6890 ft. from the center of Wilderness Run, measured on the highway, thence N. 17 degrees-34' E 25 ft. to a point in right of way; thence with the said highway and parallel thereto and 25 ft. north of same, N. 72 degrees-26' W 3985 ft. to Sta. 268 plus 60, a point in the right of way of J. L. Dempsey; thence N 17 degrees 34' W 25 ft. to the center line of the highway; thence with the center line of the highway, N 72 degrees-26' W 345 ft. to Sta. 268 plus 30, a point in the center line of the highway; thence leaving said center line N 17 degrees-34' E 25 ft. to a point in the right of way; thence parallel to the center line of the highway and 25 ft. north of same N. 72 degrees-26' W 1630 ft. to Sta. 278 plus 60, a point in the center of Wilderness Run, same also being a point in the property of J. T. Tedd; thence up said Wilderness Run, crossing center line of highway S 17 degrees-34' W 50 ft. to a point in Wilderness Run; thence back up highway and 25 ft. south of said center line and parallel thereto S. 72 degrees 26' N. 4270 ft. to Sta. 235/80, a point in the right of way of Calvin Jones; thence to the center line of the highway N 17 degrees-34' E, 25 ft., to a point in the center line of the highway; thence with the center line of the highway S 72 degrees-26' E, 1630 ft. to Sta. 219 plus 60, the point of beginning. Containing in all 2.08 acres, improved land and 0.98 acres of unimproved land, exclusive of right of way of old road, making a total of 2.96 acres.

RESOLVED FURTHER That C. O'Conor Geelwick  
of Fredericksburg, Virginia, be appointed agent and attorney  
for this Commission, in this matter, and directed to secure  
said right of way through the lands of said Mrs. D. L. Payne  
by gift, purchase, or condemnation proceedings, in accordance  
with the statutes in this State in such cases made and  
provided.

At the conclusion of this meeting, the Commission  
accompanied by officials of Norfolk City and Virginia Beach,  
and the adjoining counties proceeded to Beaufort on Route No. 10,  
where exercises were held to commemorate the completion of this  
Highway and its dedication to public use. These ceremonies  
were attended by a large gathering of citizens, and at their  
conclusion, the procession proceeded to Virginia Beach, where  
the parade disbanded.

The Highway Commission spent the night at Virginia  
Beach, leaving this place on Saturday morning July 30th, 1931,  
for Norfolk, where the Commission finally adjourned, subject  
to the call of the Chairman.
