### Meeting of State Righmay Commission of Virginia Richmond, Virginia July 19, 1962

The State Highway Commission of Virginia met at the Central Highway Office in Richmond, Virginia, at 10:00 A.M. on July 19, 1962. The Chairman, H.H. Herris, presided.

Present: Mesers. H. H. Harris, W. H. Chilton, S. S. Flythe, George C. Landrith, Burgoss H. Nelson, W.M. Sclater, Jr., Tucker C. Markins, Jr., and R. S. Wesver, Jr. Mr. H. S. Holland was absent due to the death of his mother.

On motion of Mr. Sciater, seconded by Semator Helson, the minutes of the meeting of June 21, 1962, were approved.

Motion was made by Mr. Bolater, seconded by Benator Helson, that permits issued from June 20, 1962 to July 18, 1962, inclusive, as shown in records of the Department, be approved. Motion carried.

On motion of Mr. Sciator, seconded by Senator Helson, cancellation of permits from June 20, 1962 to July 18, 1962, inclusive, as shown in records of the Department, was approved.

On motion of Judge Weaver, seconded by Mr. Science, the Commission approved the Annual Operating and Maintenance Budget for Toll Revenue Facilities for the fiscal year September 1, 1962-August 31, 1963. Copy of this budget is attached to and made a part of these minutes.

The Commission heard Mr. David J. Mays, General Gounsel for the Virginia Highway Users, in regard to U. S. Senate Bill 8-3243 and U. S. House Bill HR 11583 dealing with transportation rates for bulk shipments. Following Mr. Mays' presentation, motion was made by Judge Weaver, seconded by Mr. Plyths, that the Commission ask the Attorney General for an opinion as to the legal affect of the proposed legislation in regard to highway construction and as to whether or not this legislation favors one mode of transportation over another. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sclater, seconded by Senator Relson, that the Commission reject bids received July 11, 1962, for the construction of Project 0413-029-002,1801, Houte 413; 1.163 miles B. Rt. 350-Rt. 617 (Back Lick Road), Fairfax County, the low bid being 16.3% over estimate, and the project be readvertised. Motion carried.

Moved by Senator Welson, seconded by Judge Weaver, that WHEREAS, the construction of a new high school in Augusta County just north of the intersection of Routes 11 and 616 makes it desirable to lower the slope on Route 11 to improve the sight distance for traffic entering the intersection from the school; and WHEREAS, the estimate cost of the proposed work is \$3,000; and

WHEREAS, there is a sufficient amount in the Staunton District Construction Reserve Fund for this purpose; therefore, EE IT RESOLVED that \$3,000 be allocated from the Staunton District Construction Reserve Fund to improve the sight distance at this intersection. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Landrith, seconded by Mr. Wetkins, that WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Section 128 of Title 23 Highways, United States Code, a public hearing was held in the auditorium of the James Madison High School, Vienna, Virginia, Fairfax County, at 10:30 A.M., March 8, 1962, concerning the proposed construction of Route 7 from 0.257 miles North of the Intersection of Route 495 to 0.379 Mile south of Dulles Airport Access Road and Route 123 from 0.592 mile west of the Intersection of Route 7 (at Tyson's Corner) to 0.305 mile west of the intersection of Route 495, State Project 0007-029-103,C501 and 0123-029-103,C-501.

WHEREAS, proper notice was given in advance and all those present were given a full opportunity to express their opinions and recommendations for or against the proposed development as planned and their statements being duly recorded, and

MEMERAS, the economic effects of the proposed relocation have been examined end given proper consideration, and this evidence, along with all other, has been carefully reviewed, now therefore,

RE IT RESOLVED, that the construction of thisproject be approved in accordance with the plan as proposed and presented by the Engineering Division of the Department of Highways, at the public hearing. This improvement will follow along Route 7 and provide a relocation of Route 123. This proposed work will include an interchange with Routes 7 and 123 with necessary connections and ramps. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Landrith, seconded by Mr. Watkins, that WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Section 128 of Title 23 - Highway, United Stres Code, a public hearing was held in the County Board Room, Room 202, Arlington County Court House, Arlington, Virginia, at 10:00 A.M., on April 3, 1962, concerning the proposed construction of Routs 50 from 0.076 mile West of Intersection of Arlington Ridge Road to the Intersection of Court House Road in Arlington County, State Project 0050-000-101, C501, Federal Project U-101-1(14),

WHEREAS, proper notice was given in advance and all those present were given a full opportunity to express their opinions and recommendations for or against the proposed development as planned, their statements being only recorded, and

WHEREAS, the economic effects of the proposed relocation have been examined and given proper consideration, and this evidence along with all other has been carefully reviewed, now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the construction of this project be approved in accordance with the plan as proposed and presented by the Engineering Division of the Department of Highways, providing for expansion of the existing facility and necessary grade separation structures and interchanges.

This proposed improvement will expand the existing four lane facility to six lanes and provide the necessary grade separation structures and interchanges, between Arlington Ridge Road and Court House Road. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Watkins, seconded by Mr. Flythe, that MREREAS, the Town of Vinton, having a population in excess of 3,500 prior to the 1960 Census, was eligible for maintenance payment under Sections 33-113 and 33-113.2 of the Code of Virginia; and

WHEREAS, according to the 1960 Census, the Town of Vinton's population dropped below 3,500; and

WHEREAS, according to Section 33-113 of the Code of Virginia, the Town continued its eligibility to receive maintenance payments on the primary route extensions within the Town; and

WHEREAS, the 1962 Legislature amended Section 33-113.2 of the Code of Virginia giving the Town of Vinton eligibility for maintenance payments on their streets not a part or extension of the Primary Bystem; now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, that effective July 1, 1962, 15.17 miles of streets not a pert or extension of the State Righway Primary System within the comporate limits of Vinton, that are presently eligible for maintenance payment under Section 33-50.2 of the Code of Virginia from secondary funds, be made eligible under the authority of Section 33-113.2 of the Code of Virginia as amended by the 1962 legislature for maintenance payments at the base rate of \$300 per mile annually. WHEREAS, one section of the old road is no longer necessary as a public road, the new road serving the seme citizens as the old:

NOW, THEREFORE, RE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33-76.5 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as smended, 0.13 mile of the old road on Project 1130-A between Station 229+20 and intersection of Route 633, shown in blue and designated as Section 1 on the plat dated June 5, 1962, be abandoned as a part of the State Highway System. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sclater, seconded by Judge Wesver, that WHEREAS, Houte 6 in Goodhland County has been altered and reconstructed as shown on plana for Project 0006-037-103,C502; and

WHEREAS, one section of the old road is no longer necessary for purposes of the State Sighteny System, a new road baving been constructed in lieu thereof;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33-76.1 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, 0.15 mile of the old road, shown in yellow and designated as Section 1 on the plat dated March 1, 1962, Project 0006-037-103, C-502, be discontinued as a part of the State Highway System. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sclater, seconded by Judge Weaver, that WHENEAS, Alternate Route 58 in Wise County has been altered and reconstructed as shown on plans for Project 7058-097-101-C501,C502, and

WHEREAS, one section of the old road is no longer necessery as a public road, the new road serving the same citizens as the old, and two sections of the old road are no longer necessary for purposes of the State Highesty System, and three sections of the old road are to be transferred to the Secondary System;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33-76.5 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as smended, 0.04 wile of the old road, shown in blue and designated as Section 2 on the plat dated April 26, 1962, Project 7058-097-101,C-501,C502,be chandoned as a part of the State Highest System;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33-76.1 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, 0.12 mile of the old road, shown in yellow and designated as Section 1 and 6 on the plat and project referred to hereinabove, be discontinued as a part of the State Highway System;

BE IT ALSO FURTHER RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33-27 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, 0.22 mile of the old road, shown in red and designated as Section 3, 4 and 5 on the plat and project referred to hereinabove, be transferred from the Primary System to the Secondary System of Highways. Motion carried.

Moved by Judge Weaver, seconded by Mr.Landrith, that WHEREAS, by proper resolution the various Boards of Supervisors have requested that certain roads which no longer serve as a public necessity, be discontinued as parts of the Secondary System of Highways:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuent to Section 33-76:7 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, the following roads be discontinued as parts of the Secondary System of Highways, effective this date:

- TLOYD COUNTY Route 761, from intersection of Route 758 east to present and of maintenance -- 1.80 mi.
- GOOCHIAND COUNTY Houte 633, five sections of old location between intersection of Houte 672 and intersection of Route 634, Project 0633-037-102,0-501, N-601 ------ 0.63 mi.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Watkins, seconded by Judge Weaver, that WHEREAS, under authority of Section 33-113.2 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended, request is made by the City of Lynchburg for payment at the base rate of \$300 per wile summally on additional streets meeting required standards:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that quarterly payments at the base rate of \$300 per mile annually be made to the City of Lynchburg on additional streets totaling 2.68 miles that have been brought up to standards required by this section of the Code, effective beginning July 1, 1962 for the quarterly payment due after September 30, 1962. The additional mileage of streets eligible for payment, described as follows:

Moved by Mr. Landrith, seconded by Mr. Sclater, that Whereas, in the statement on Waysides, adopted by the Highway Commission at their meeting on September 25, 1941, there were listed five areas which the Department had obtained from the Mational Park Service; Through overeight an area on Route 55 in Fauquier County, obtained in the same manner, was omitted, and it is now desired to correct this arror; therefore, the fourth paragraph of the resolution of September 25, 1941 is hereby revised to read:

"This involved six areas, located as follows: Route 1 - Macklenburg; Route 11 - Draper Mountain (Pulaski); Route 60 - Amberst; Route 29 - Pittsylvenia; Route 2 - Hanover; Route 55 - Pauquier." Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Watkins, seconded by Mr. Flythe that WHERMAS, the Board of Supervisors of Princess Anne County at its regular meeting at the Courthouse on May 28, 1962 adopted the following resolution: "RR IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors requests the State Righway Department to place Route 615 in the Primary System from Oceana to Route 60. HE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Primary Route 190 be extended from Kempaville (165) to Robbins Corner(166)", and

WHEREAS, the resolution was forwarded to the Highway Commission by the County Engineer of Princess AnneCounty, and WHEREAS, a study of these requested additions to the Princey System was made and found not to warrant inclusion in the Princey System; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that after due consideration and study by the State Highway Commission, these requested additions to the Princey System are hereby denied.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Highway Commission hereby adopts the warrants for the installation of traffic signals as set forth in the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devises to govern the installation of traffic signals by the Highway Department.

- 4. The holding of joint westings and conferences of men interested in the development and improvement of all phases of highway engineering.
- 5. The reporting and publishing of findings that are of general interest and value, and which add to fundamental knowledge or facilitate the application of sound practices. Motion carried.

- (b) Thirty Days' written notice of the proposed public hearing, showing the time and place, shall be given to the Clerk of the Circuit Court of the County in which the road is proposed, in accordsace with Section 33-17 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as exended.

# II. For Federal Aid Primary Projects and Federal Aid Urban Projects.

A Public Hearing shall be held, or a willingness to hold a Public Hearing be stated in public advertisement.

### III. For Federal Aid Secondary Projects.

A Public Hearing shall be held, or a willingness to hold a hearing if a written request is received, shall be advertised on Federal Aid Secondary Projects in accordance with Federal and State statutes.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all prior action by this Commission in regard to conditions relative to holding Public Rearings on establishment of highways be and the same is hereby repealed and rescinded.

Motion carried.

Mr. R. B. Ball appeared before the Commission to ask reconsideration of his request for an entrance to his property from Soute 73 in Hanrico County. Judge Weaver made a notion that the Commission grant the entrance on the limited-access section of Route 73 to the shopping center, the entrance to be developed at the expense of Mr. Ball and in accordance with plans and specifications furnished by the engineers of the Department of Highways. The motion was seconded by Senator Melson and carried.
