WHEREAS, the Commonwealth in connection with Route 13. State Highway Project 1284-A-3, acquired from the National Bank of Commerce; Norfolk, Virginia; Substitute Trustees for Caldwell Hardy Estate by deed dated June 12, 1942, as recorded in the Office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Princess Anne County, now the City of Norfolk, in Deed Book 213, Page 9, a parcel of land containing 2.13 acres, more or less, as Parcel No. 1 of said deed; and

WHEREAS, a portion of the land as acquired was not used in connection with the construction of the said project; and

WHEREAS, the City of Norfolk has requested that we convey to them a permanent 10-foot utility easement (drainage) over the southern portion of the land lying west of the west proposed right of way line from a point opposite approximate survey Station 404 + 21 to a point opposite approximate survey Station 404 + 31; and

WHEREAS, the State Highway Commissioner has recommended the conveyance of the said easement to the City of Norfolk.

NOW, THEREFORE, in accordance with the provisions of \$ 2.1-6 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended, the conveyance of such easement is deemed expedient and the State Highway Commissioner is hereby authorized, after first obtaining the consent of the Governor in writing, to execute a deed in the name of the Commonwealth conveying same under such terms and conditions as he may deem requisite and for such consideration as may be acceptable to the State Right of Way Engineer.

WHEREAS, in connection with Route 13, State Highway Project 1284-A-3, the Commonwealth acquired from the National Bank of Commerce; Norfolk, Virginia; Substitute Trustees for Caldwell Hardy Estate by deed dated June 12, 1942, as recorded in the Office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Princess Ame County, now the City of Norfolk, in Deed Book 213, Page 9, a parcel of land containing 2.13 acres, more or less, as Parcel No. 1 of said deed; and

WHEREAS, a portion of the lands so acquired was not used in connection with the construction of the said project and the adjoining landowners have requested that the unused portion of this land be conveyed to them; and

WHEREAS, the State Highway Commissioner has certified that the portion of said land lying west of the west proposed right of way line from a point opposite approximate survey Station 404+21 to a point opposite approximate survey Station 407+30 does not constitute a section of the public road and is deemed by him to be no longer necessary for the uses of the State Highway System.

NOW, THEREFORE, the conveyance of the said parcel of land, in accordance with the provisions of \$ 33-76.6 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended is approved, and the State Highway Commissioner is hereby authorized to execute, in the name of the Commonwealth, a deed or deeds conveying same without warranty, to the owner or owners of the adjoining lands of records, at a price satisfactory with the Department and subject to any restrictions he may deem requisite.

Spurgeon all the land they owned lying north of the north proposed right of way line as recorded in Deed Book 341, Page 1, in the Office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of said County; and

WHEREAS, in order to return the land to private ownership, it is proposed that same be advertised for sale for receipt of sealed bids, reserving, however, the right of the Commonwealth to reject any and all bids; and, provided the bids are not satisfactory, to negotiate a sale with any person interested at a price satisfactory with the State Right of Way Engineer; and

WHEREAS, the State Highway Commissioner has certified that the parcel so acquired lying north of the north proposed right of way line from a point 55 feet opposite survey Station 483+25 (centerline W.B.L.) to a point 55 feet opposite survey Station 484+30 (centerline W.B.L.) is not needed for the uses of the State Highway System and that the sale of same is deemed by him to be in the public interest.

NOW, THEREFORE, in accordance with the provisions of Section 33-117.4 of the 1950 Code of Virginia as amended, it is the judgment of this Commission that the sale of the parcel of land so certified is in the public interest and the State Highway Commissioner is hereby authorized to execute a deed in the name of the Commonwealth conveying the said parcel without warranty for a consideration satisfactory to the State Right of Way Engineer.

WHEREAS, the State Highway Commissioner has certified that the residue so acquired lying southwest of and adjacent to the southwest right of way line of Jackson Street from a point 30 feet opposite survey Station 114+63.13 (centerline Jackson Street) to a point 30 feet opposite survey Station 115+03.12 (centerline Jackson Street), is not needed for the uses of the State Highway and that the sale of same is deemed by him to be in the public interest.

WHEREAS, the State Highway Commissioner has certified in writing that the old right of way lying between the new northeast right of way line and the center of old Route 637 from a point 60 feet left of Station 44+50 to a point 30 feet left of Station 50+50 of the above project does not constitute a section of the public road and is deemed by him no longer necessary for the uses of the State Highway System.

NOW, THEREFORE, the conveyance of the said parcel so certified to the owner or owners of record of the adjoining lands, in accordance with the provisions of Section 33-76. 11 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended, is hereby approved and the State Highway Commissioner is hereby authorized to execute in the name of the Commonwealth a deed or deeds without warranty accordingly and at a price satisfactory to the State Right of Way Engineer.

WHEREAS, on the 22pd day of April, 1968, A.M. Johnston Construction Company entered into a contract with the State Highway Commission for the repair of certain structures on Route 95 in Fairfax County in connection with Project No. 0095-029-104, B629, B630, B631, B632, B633; and

WHEREAS, it became obvious during the course of the construction that the results were unsatisfactory; and

WHEREAS, the cause for the failure in the work was not due to the neglect or efforts of our contractor, but rather due to the impracticality of the materials, operations and design to meet the structural demand; and

WHEREAS, approximately fifty-six percent (56%) of the contract had been completed; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed undesirable to pursue the present contract further; and

WHEREAS, Section 104.02 of the Virginia Department of Highways Road and Bridge Specifications requires a supplemental agreement when the original contract is decreased by more than twenty percent (20%); and

WHEREAS, the above mentioned contractor has indicated that he is willing to accept the reduction in the contract at no increase of unit prices.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the State Highway Commissioner is hereby authorized to enter into on behalf of this Commission a supplemental agreement terminating this contract.

WHEREAS, Section 33-136.1 of the Code of Virginia provides a fund for fiscal 1967-68 of \$1,500,000 to "... be expended by the Commission for constructing, reconstructing, maintaining or improving access roads within counties, cities and towns to industrial sites on which manufacturing, processing or other establishments will be built under firm contract or are already constructed."; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Louisa County has by proper resolution requested the use of industrial access funds to provide access from Route 33 east of Louisa to the new plant of Fablok Mills, Incorporated, in Louisa County, estimated to cost \$20,000; and

WHEREAS, it appears that this request falls within the intent of Section 33-136. I and has complied with the provisions of the Highway Commission's policy on the use of industrial access funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that \$20,000 from the industrial access fund for 1967-68 be allocated for the purpose of providing proper access to the new plant of Fablok Mills, Incorporated, being constructed just east of the town of Louisa and east of Route 33 in Louisa County, Project 0761-054-124, C501, contingent upon the necessary right of way and adjustment of utilities being provided at no cost to the Commonwealth.

THAT the State Highway Commission express its gratitude to the Marion Chamber of Commerce, which invited the Commission to hold its July, 1968 meeting at Marion in recognition of the service of the Honorable William M. Sclater, Jr., Bristol District member of the Commission, to the highway program in Virginia, and

THAT the Commission extend its deepest appreciation for the Chamber's most generous hospitality and the enjoyable entertainment it afforded the members of the Commission, their wives, the Department staff members and their wives on this memorable visit in the Great Southwest of the Commonwealth.

#### MOTION CARBIED.

Mr. Robert Garnett, Cashier of the Bank of Marion, made a brief talk to the Commission and presented a gift to Mr. Sciater from the Bank, in appreciation of his services as a member of the Commission. Mr. Sciater's term expired June 30, 1968 but he will continue to serve until a replacement has been appointed.

After adoption of resolution designating limited access beyond the end of the Bedford By-pass, it was suggested that this policy be followed on a state-wide basis and some measure of control be obtained beyond the ends of all by-passes on the arterial network. Mr. Fugate appointed the following committee to study this matter and make a report at the August meeting of the Commission:

Mr. G. L. Baughan, Chairman, Judge R. S. Weaver, Jr., and Mr. Earl A. Fitz-patrick.

The following committee was appointed by the chairman to study a revised policy for regulation and administration of waysides and rest areas:

Mr. George C. Landrith, Chairman and Mr. W. Ransdell Chilton. The committee is to make a report at the August meeting.

On motion of Mr. Landrith, seconded by Mr. Chilton, the Commission approved preliminary budget covering maintenance and operation of Toll Facilities under State of Virginia Toll Revenue Bonds (Series 1954) for the bond year September 1, 1968 to August 31, 1969, as shown by attached sheets.

WHEREAS, Section 33-136.1 of the Code of Virginia provides a fund for fiscal 1967-68 of \$1,500,000 to "...be expended by the Commission for constructing, reconstructing, maintaining or improving access roads within counties, eities and towns to industrial sites on which manufacturing, processing or other establishments will be built under firm contract or are already constructed."; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Chesapeake has by resolution requested the use of industrial access funds to aid in providing proper access to the new facility being constructed by Bay Warehouses, Incorporated, adjacent to the Norfolk and Western railway between Cavalier Boulevard and Military Highway (Route 13), estimated to cost \$150,000; and

WHEREAS, certain rough grading, draining, et cetera, has been performed by others and this request includes the completion of the grading, sub-base, base, surface, and shoulders for a 24-foot pavement; and

WHEREAS, it appears that this request falls within the intent of Section 33-136.1 and has complied with the provisions of the Highway Commission's policy on the use of industrial access funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that \$150,000 from the industrial access fund for 1967-68 be allocated for the purpose of assisting in the providing of proper access to the new facility being constructed by Bay Warehouses, Incorporated, adjacent to the Norfolk and Western railway between Cavalier Boulevard and Military Highway (Route 13) in the city of Chesapeake, Project 9999-131-101, C501, contingent upon (1) the necessary right of way and adjustment of utilities being provided at no cost to the Commonwealth; (2) the entering of the corporation into firm contract for the construction of its facility; and (3) the providing of any funds necessary over the \$150,000 from sources other than the industrial access fund
