<u>Title</u>: DECLARING INTENT TO REIMBURSE EXPENDITURES WITH PROCEEDS OF FEDERAL HIGHWAY REIMBURSEMENT ANTICIPATION NOTES

WHEREAS, the State Revenue Bond Act, Sections 33.1-267 et seq. of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, and Chapters 1019 and 1044 of the Acts of Assembly of 2000 ("Chapters 1019 and 1044") authorize the Commonwealth Transportation Board (the "Board") to issue Commonwealth of Virginia Federal Highway Reimbursement Anticipation Notes to finance certain transportation projects:

WHEREAS, the Board intends to issue a series of such notes, the interest which is to be tax-exempt, in an aggregate principal amount not now expected to exceed \$350,000,000 (the "Notes") to finance, as needed on a cash-flow basis, portions of projects described in the third enactment of Chapters 1019 and 1044 (the "Projects");

WHEREAS, the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2 thereunder, provide that proceeds of tax-exempt obligations may be used to reimburse a previously paid expenditure provided that certain criteria are met; and

WHEREAS, the Board intends to pay certain expenditures with respect to the Projects prior to the issuance of Notes to finance portions of the Projects and to receive reimbursement for such expenditures from proceeds of the Notes;

Resolution of the Board New Business: "Anticipation Notes" July 20, 2000 Page 2

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMONWEALTH TRANSPORTATION BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

- The Board intends to issue the Notes to pay costs of the Projects.
- 2. The Board intends to receive reimbursement from proceeds of the Notes, when issued, for expenditures made not more than 60 days prior to the date of this Resolution related to the Projects that are paid prior to such issuance.
- 3. Each expenditure reimbursed with proceeds of the Notes will be, unless otherwise approved by the Board's bond counsel, either (a) of a type properly chargeable to a capital account under general federal income tax principles (determined in each case as of the date of the expenditure), (b) a cost of issuance with respect to the Notes, (c) a nonrecurring item that is not customarily payable from current revenues, or (d) a grant to a party that is not related to or an agent of the Board so long as such grant does not impose any obligation or condition to repay any amount to or for the benefit of the Board.
- 4. The Board intends to make a reimbursement allocation, which is a written allocation that evidences the Board's use of proceeds of the Notes to reimburse an expenditure, no later than 18 months after the later of the date on which the expenditure is paid or the related Project is placed in service or abandoned (but in no event more than three years after the date on which the expenditure is paid).
- 5. The Board recognizes that exceptions are available under the applicable Treasury Regulations which also may permit reimbursement for certain (a) preliminary expenditures incurred prior to commencement of construction, (b) expenditures in an amount not in excess of the lesser of \$100,000 or five percent of the proceeds of the Notes and (c) expenditures for long-term construction projects of at least five years duration.
- 6. The Board intends that adoption of this Resolution shall constitute "official intent" within the meaning of Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2.
 - This Resolution shall be effective immediately.

WHEREAS, in Section 33.1-221.1:3 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended (the "Virginia Code"), the General Assembly of Virginia (the "General Assembly") declared its intent that there shall be developed an adequate, modern, safe and efficient transportation network in Northern Virginia to be known as the Northern Virginia Transportation District Program (the "NVDT Program");

WHEREAS, the State Revenue Bond Act, Section 33.1-267 et seq. of the Virginia Code, and Chapter 12 of the Acts of the Assembly of 1989, Special Session II, as amended by Chapter 538 of the Acts of the Assembly of 1999 ("Chapter 538"), authorize the Commonwealth Transportation Board (the "Board") to issue revenue bonds to finance the NVTD Program;

WHEREAS, the Board intends to issue one or more series of tax-exempt Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Revenue Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed the \$104,300,000 increase in bond issuance authorized by the 1999 Session of the General Assembly pursuant to Chapter 538 (the "Bonds") to finance the NVTD Program Category 3 projects increased or added by the third enactment of Chapter 538 (collectively, the "Project");

WHEREAS, the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2 thereunder, provide that proceeds of tax-exempt obligations may be used to reimburse a previously paid expenditure provided that certain criteria are met; and

WHEREAS, the Board intends to pay certain expenditures with respect to the Project prior to the issuance of Bonds to finance the Project and to receive reimbursement for such expenditures from proceeds of the Bonds;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMONWEALTH TRANSPORTATION BOARD AS FOLLOWS:

- The Board intends to issue the Bonds to pay costs of the Project.
- The Board intends to receive reimbursement from proceeds of the Bonds, when issued, for expenditures made not more than 60 days prior to the date of this Resolution related to the Project that are paid prior to such issuance.
- 3. Each expenditure reimbursed with proceeds of the Bonds will be, unless otherwise approved by the Board's bond counsel, either (a) of a type properly chargeable to a capital account under general federal income tax principles (determined in each case as of the date of the expenditure), (b) a cost of issuance with respect to the Bonds, (c) a nonrecurring item that is not customarily payable from current revenues, or (d) a grant to a party that is not related to or an agent of the Board so long as such grant does not impose any obligation or condition to repay any amount to or for the benefit of the Board.
- 4. The Board intends to make a reimbursement allocation, which is a written allocation that evidences the Board's use of proceeds of the Bonds to reimburse an expenditure, no later than 18 months after the later of the date on which the expenditure is paid or the related Project is placed in service or abandoned (but in no event more than three years after the date on which the expenditure is paid).
- 5. The Board recognizes that exceptions are available under the applicable Treasury Regulations which also may permit reimbursement for certain (a) preliminary expenditures incurred prior to commencement of construction, (b) expenditures in an amount not in excess of the lesser of \$100,000 or five percent of the proceeds of the Bonds and (c) expenditures for long-term construction projects of at least five years duration.
- 6. The Board intends that adoption of this Resolution shall constitute "official intent" within the meaning of Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2.
 - 7. This Resolution shall be effective immediately.
