tary, F. V. Davie and Horace Hardaway, accompanied by Righmay Commissioner, G. P. Column, assembled at the Richmond Hotal, Richmond, Thursday norming, August 19th, and proceeded over State Highway No.19 to Columbia and Fork Union, thence over Route No.2 northward through Palmyra to Route No.9, thence to Staumton, where the party was joined by Commissioner James A. Mundy, Jr. The party remained for the night at Staumton and Left early on the morning of the 20th over Houte No.3 for Normt Jackson, where the party was not by Nr. W. H. Manuic, the Chairman.

On August 20th at the Mount Jackson Hotel, Mount Jackson a business meeting of the Occasionion was held, with all members present, namely, W. H. Massis, Chairman, H. P. Beck, Secretary, Jenes A. Mandy, Jr., Hornes Hardaway, and F. W. Dayle.

The minutes of the meetings of July 29th and 30th were read and on motion of Mr. Davie were approved and the Chairman authorised to sign the came.

The application of the Board of Supervisors of Fairfax County to be allowed to advance Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) to anticipate the regular allocation for the purpose of constructing a portion of Route No.6, was considered and on motion of Nr. Hardaway the proposition of Fairfax County was

accepted and the Chairman and Secretary were authorized and empowered, in the name and on behalf of the State Highway Commission, to enter into the usual contract with Fairfax County.

On notion of Mr. Mundy, A. B. Bristow was appointed appealal traffic officer in place of R. C. Sibley, resigned, and Floyd Saora appointed special traffic officer in place of George B. Hundley, resigned.

At the request of the Highway Commissioner, the following notice in regard to the movement of traction engines, etc., cent cut on August 7th to Engineers and Employees of the State Highway Department, was approved by the Commission:

"Until further notice you will please consider
Bection 1 of Traffic Regulations emouded to read as follows:

death will be considered as having month tires. Traction engines and tractors, when having threshing outfits, will be allowed on roads in the State System whonequipped with cleate on the driving wheels of width of not less than 2½ inches, when so placed and kept on the driver that not less than two cleats shall touch the ground at all times; also that such engines or tractors shall be so equipped to maintain on the front wheels a guide tire of not less than 2 in these on tractors of 18 M.P., or less; 2½ inches on 25 M. P., or less, and 3 inches on 30 M.P., or less, 15

On motion of Mr. Davis the contrast with Surry County, allowing the said County to advance Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000) for the construction of State Highway No.10 through Surry County, was approved and the Chairman and Secretary of the Highway County, was expressed and empowered to enter into said contrast in the name and on behalf of the Countssion with Surry County, after certain changes had been made in the original contrast as proposed

by the efficers of Surry County; these changes being in the nature of requiring an indomnifying bond from the banks receiving this money.

On motion of Hr. Mundy, an additional allocation of \$35,000 was made for the purpose of emstructing the streets of Graham, Tamevell County, Virginia; the streets proposed to be constructed being a portion of The State Highway Ho.11.

On matics of Mr. Hardsony, \$50,000 was allocated to Route No.10 between Abingdon and Greendale for new construction, the Town of Abingdon to furnish the necessary right of way. In making the above allocation the Commission decided to suspend all sporations on the road from Mandow View to Descapene.

On motion of Mr. Mandy, additional allocation of \$30,000 was made for the purpose of recurfacing that portion of Route Mo.1 between Richmond and Solomon's Store.

On motion of Mr. Davie, the appeal of certain freehelders of Varrick Court, from the decision of G. P. Coleman, Highway Commissioner, in regard to the location of that portion of Route Me. 9 lying between Lee Hall and Villiameburg, was referred to Chairman Massie with instructions to setmit the questions at issue to the Atterney General of the State for his opinion as to the legal status of the matter, after the Chairman had received from the Highway Commissioner may records which might be in the Highway Commissioner's office affecting this location.

On notion, the Commission adjourned and proceeded northward over Route No.3 to Windwater, Commissioner Mundy departing for his home at Natural Bridge.

At Winduster the Commissioners were the guests of

Honogable H. F. Byrd, State Senator.

Commissioner Davie, returned to his home from Vinchester, and the remaining members of the Commission, namely; w. H. Massis, H. P. Beck and Hornon Hardway, accompanied by Highway Commissioner, C. F. Coleman, proceeded in an unofficial capacity, and at their own expense, on a tour of inspection from Windoster through West Virginia, Pennsylvania, New Jersey and Maryland, for the following four days, August 21, 22, 23, and 24, returning to Washington, D. C. for the night of the 24th.

On August 25th from the Raleigh Hotel, Washington, three members of the Commission, namely, V. H. Passio, Horace Hardsony and M. P. Beck, accompanied by G. P. Coleman, producted to Chain Bridge and thence ever Boute 21 to Falls Church, Fairfax, Manages, and Marrenton, meeting at the above places delegations of representative son in regard to the proposed improvement of State Highways in this section.

At Varrenton Commissioner Massis left for his home in Bappahamnock County and Highway Commissioner Coleman proceeded over the Southern Railway to Resnake to attend the namual specing of the League of Virginia Municipalities.

The remaining members of the Commission, namely, H. P. Back and Horaco Hardsony, returned to Richmond from Warrenton by way of Fredericksburg over Route No.1.
