PIHUTER OF THE MERTING OF THE STATE HIGHWAY CONCUSSION HELD AT PAINTRA AND MONTERBY, VIRGINIA, AUGUST 29, & 30, 1923.

On the morning of the 29th, of August, 1923, the State
HighwayCommission, all members being present, left Richmond and
drove to Palmyra where a public hearing was given on the location
of State Highway No. 32, from Palmyra to Cordonsville.

After this hearing the Commission impacted the Routes including the Green Spring Valley and the Route parallel to the Railroad tracks.

They then proceeded to Staumton where they spent the night.

On the morning of the 30th, the Commission proceeded to Monterey in Highland County where a public hearing was given for the matablishment of the Route between Monterey and the West Va.

Line. The two routes under consideration were, one by Hightown to the top of the Mountain and the other in the direction of Front.

After the hearing the Commission on route to Staumton held a mosting and the following business transacted:

Hoved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Sanders, that the roads in the various Faticual Forests, as outlined in the letter of the Chairman, to the Bureau of Public Roads, be approved. Motion carried.

Moved by Er. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Truxtun, that Mr.

Book Mont No. 19-3 cost Walkley Co. Ford and other citizens of Martinsville obligated, he notified that due to the work that has been done on contract called for in the agreement, the Commission could not release them from the amount to be advanced under the Roberts on Act, but if they are willing to put up \$35,000.00 of this amount immediately, the balance specified in the agreement would not be requested. Motion carried.

Hoved by Kr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Sanders, that the Chairman be instructed to notify Mr. Channing Ward that the State Highway Commission will agree to enter into an agreement to take over the proposed bridge across the Rappahannock Riverst Tappahannock after it has been constructed and when funds are available at actual cost less depreciation; the amount of depreciation to be agreed upon previous to signing of the agreement; Provided that plans and specifications are submitted for the approval of the Commission and that the construction be subject to the Commissions inspection at all times. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sproul, that the Chairman be authorized to spend the allocation set as ide for Route 29 in Olemonter on the improvement of this route from the intersection of Boute 291 north through Olemonter C.R. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Sproul, that at the request of General Butler, Commander-General of the Marine Corps, the following traffic officers be appointed to take charge of traffic during the reproduction of the Battle of New Market, covering the period between September 15th and 30th, 1923; Dock Chap Ity, 66-P coll Walks Co. lat Sgt.
